POPEYES BAHAMAS BOWL WEEK 2 NOTEBOOK

THIS WEEKEND: Every team in Conference USA and the MAC plays non-conference games, beginning Thursday night with Arizona going to UTSA for a 8 p.m. ET game on Fox Sports 1. Defending SEC East champ and AP No. 24 Missouri travels to Toledo Saturday for a Noon ET showdown on ESPN. The MAC plays four Big Ten and three SEC opponents, while C-USA has a pair of games each vs. SEC and Big Ten schools, including Florida Atlantic going to AP/USAT No. 2 Alabama at Noon ET Saturday (SEC Network).

FIRST PASSPORT STAMPS: A total of 15 of the 26 teams in C-USA and the MAC got their first victories on the opening weekend, including Ohio, which won the MAC opener 17-14 over Kent State on Saturday. UTSA spoiled Houston's new stadium opener 27-7.

FIRST FOR COACHES, TOO: WKU's **Jeff Brohm**, UAB's **Bill Clark** and Eastern Michigan's **Chris Creighton** won their first game at their new schools in Week 1. It was Brohm's first game as a college head coach.

FIRST C-USA/MAC BATTLES: In a battle of Bowling Greens, WKU (Bowling Green, Ky.) beat preseason MAC favorite Bowling Green (Ohio) 59-31 at WKU Saturday behind senior QB **Brandon Doughty**, who threw for a school-record 569 yards and a C-USA record-tying six TD passes. Marshall beat Miami 42-27 as Herd junior RB **Devon Johnson** rushed 19 times for 151 yards and two TDs. Teams from C-USA and the MAC, which will face off in the **Popeyes Bahamas Bowl**, will play each other three more times in 2014: Ohio at Marshall & Eastern Michigan at Old Dominion (Sept. 13) and Marshall at Akron (Sept. 20).

WEEK 1 INDIVIDUAL HONORS

QB Brandon Doughty, WKU: The senior shattered WKU single-game records with 569 pass yards and six TD passes in a 59-31 victory over Bowling Green to earn C-USA Offensive Player of the Week honors.

LB Jens Jeters, UTSA: The senior had five tackles, recovered a fumble and forced a fumble in UTSA's 27-7 victory at Houston to earn C-USA Defensive Player of the Week honors.

DB Richard Leonard, FIU: The senior set an FIU school record with 148 punt-return yards on five attempts - including a 71-yarder - vs. Bethune-Cookman for C-USA Special Teams Player of the Week recognition.

QB Kyle Pohl, Akron: Threw four TD passes and 308 yards in a 41-0 victory over Howard, including three TD tosses in the first six minutes for MAC East Division Offensive Player of the Week honors.

S Nate Holley, Kent State: The sophomore had 18 tackles, forced two fumbles and recovered one in a loss vs. Ohio for MAC East Division Defensive Player of the Week honors.

K Josiah Yazdani, Ohio: The junior's 44-yard FG as time expired gave Ohio a 17-14 victory over Kent State for MAC East Division Special Teams Player of the Week recognition.

RB Jarvion Franklin, Western Michigan: The freshman had WMU's second-best RB debut with 163 yards and three TDs in a loss at Purdue for MAC West Division Offensive Player of the Week honors.

DB Tony Annese, Central Michigan: The sophomore led CMU with two interceptions and two tackles in a 20-16 victory over Chattanooga for MAC West Division Defensive Player of the Week honors.

LB Nathan Adams, Eastern Michigan: The sophomore blocked a punt and returned for a first-quarter TD in a 31-28 victory over Morgan State for MAC West Division Special Teams Player of the Week recognition.
