POPEYES BAHAMAS BOWL WEEK 12 NOTEBOOK

C-USA EDITION (November 13-15)

PASSPORT STAMPED (BOWL ELIGIBLE): Bowling Green (7-3), Central Michigan (6-4), Louisiana Tech (7-3), Marshall (9-0), Northern Illinois (8-2), Rice (6-3), Toledo (6-4), Western Michigan (6-3). **AT CUSTOMS (ONE WIN SHY):** Middle Tennessee (5-4), Ohio (5-5), UAB (5-5), UTEP (5-4).

C-USA THIS WEEK: Conference USA begins its week Thursday night as Southern Miss (3-7, 1-5 C-USA) goes to UTSA (2-7, 1-4 C-USA). Saturday, the biggest game of the day is in Huntington as No. 21 *USA Today/AP* and East Division leaders Marshall (9-0, 5-0 C-USA) host surging Rice (6-3, 4-1 C-USA), which has won six straight. Two other teams that are one win shy of bowl eligibility will try to reach six wins as Middle Tennessee (5-4, 4-1 C-USA) heads to FIU (3-7, 2-4 C-USA) and UTEP (5-4, 3-2 C-USA) hosts North Texas (3-6, 1-4 C-USA). In the only non-conference game, Army (3-6) visits WKU (4-5, 2-4 C-USA). The Hilltoppers kept their bowl hopes alive with a come-from-behind victory over UTEP last Saturday.

MAC SATURDAY: Miami (2-8, 2-4 MAC) goes to Central Michigan (6-4, 4-2 MAC), and Western Michigan (6-3, 4-1 MAC) will try to run its win streak to five as it hosts cross-state rival Eastern Michigan (2-7, 1-4 MAC).

MACTION RECAP: Wednesday night, Bowling Green (7-3, 5-1 MAC) clinched the conference's East Division title and a berth in the Marathon MAC Championship Game on Dec. 5 after a 30-20 victory over Kent State (1-9, 0-6 MAC), and UMass (3-7, 3-4 MAC) defeated Ball State (3-7, 2-4 MAC) 24-10. Tuesday, Northern Illinois (8-2, 5-1 MAC) pulled into a tie for the West lead after beating division rival Toledo (6-4, 5-1 MAC) 27-24, and Buffalo (4-6, 2-4 MAC) kept its bowl hopes alive with a 55-24 victory over Akron (4-6, 2-4 MAC).

STREAKING: Twelve FBS teams are on winning streaks of at least five games, and C-USA is home to three: Marshall (10, including last season's Military Bowl), Rice (six) and Louisiana Tech (five). C-USA is the only league with three teams on winning streaks of five or more games.

FRANKLIN MINT: Western Michigan freshman RB **Jarvion Franklin** has 1,330 yards rushing, fourth in FBS. He has the second-most yards by a freshman in MAC history, trailing only former Temple RB **Bernard Pierce** (1,361) in 2009. Franklin leads the nation in both rushing TDs (22) and scoring (132 pts.; 14.7 ppg).

WEEK 11 INDIVIDUAL HONORS

QB Brandon Doughty, WKU: The senior completed 23 of 34 passes for 324 yards and three TDs while helping to erase a 13-point deficit in a 35-27 victory over UTEP for C-USA Offensive Player of the Week honors.

DB Wonderful Terry, WKU: The junior intercepted a fourth-quarter pass and returned it 90 yards for the game-winning TD in a 35-27 victory over UTEP for C-USA Defensive Player of the Week honors.

KR J.J. Nelson, UAB: The senior returned a kickoff 100 yards for a TD, his third return score of the season, and had 200 all-purpose yards in a loss to Louisiana Tech for C-USA Special Teams Player of the Week recognition.

RB A.J. Ouellette, Ohio: The freshman had 155 rushing yards on 29 carries and two TDs and catcaught two passes for 11 yards in a 37-14 win over Buffalo for MAC East Division Offensive Player of the Week honors.

DB Nick Johnson, Bowling Green: The freshman had nine tackles, two interceptions and three pass breakups in a 27-10 win at Akron for MAC East Division Defensive Player of the Week honors.

K Josiah Yazdani, Ohio: The junior made all three of his field-goal attempts of 19, 28 and 33 yards and all three PAT kicks to help the Bobcats defeat Buffalo, 37-14 for MAC East Division Special Teams Player of the Week recognition.

RB Jarvion Franklin, Western Michigan: The freshman had 182 yards and three TDs on 29 carries in a 41-10 win at Miami for MAC West Division Offensive Player of the Week honors.

DB Anthony Brooks, Northern Illinois: The sophomore had four tackles, one pass break-up and a key interception return for a TD in a 35-21 win at Ball State for MAC West Division Defensive Player of the Week honors.

K Jeremiah Detmer, Toledo: The senior made all three of his field-goal attempts of 26, 28 and 45 yards and three PATs in a 30-20 win at Kent State for MAC West Division Special Teams Player of the Week recognition.

POPEYES BAHAMAS BOWL PARTICIPANT SELECTION

The highest-ranked conference champion by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee from the American Athletic, Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West or Sun Belt will play annually in one of the College Football Playoff bowls (**VIZIO Fiesta**, **Cotton & Chick-fil-A Peach** bowls for the 2014 season) if it is not selected for the Playoff Semifinals.

C-USA's champion will select which bowl it would like to attend, and the remainder of the selections will follow, with no particular set order of bowls. C-USA has 2014 tie-ins with the **Popeyes Bahamas**, **Boca Raton**, **Gildan New Mexico**, **Hawai'i** and **Zaxby's Heart of Dallas** bowls, with a secondary tie-in with the **Duck Commander Independence Bowl** (if either ACC or SEC does not have enough eligible teams).

The **GoDaddy Bowl** has first choice of a MAC bowl-eligible team, and the remainder of the selections will follow, with no particular set order of bowls. The MAC has 2014 tie-ins with **Popeyes Bahamas**, **Boca Raton**, **Famous Idaho Potato**, **GoDaddy** and **Raycom Media Camellia** bowls, with secondary tie-ins with the **San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl** (if Navy is not bowl-eligible), ESPN owned-and-operated bowls (such as **Gildan New Mexico**, **Bitcoin St. Petersburg** or **Birmingham** bowls) and the **Quick Lane Bowl** (if either ACC or Big Ten does not have enough eligible teams).

The participants for the **2014 Popeyes Bahamas Bowl** will be announced **Sunday, December 7**.
