RAIDERS COMPETE IN 5TH BOWL UNDER STOCKSTILL

▶ Middle Tennessee will face Western Michigan in the second annual Popeye's Bahamas Bowl on Dec. 24 for the Blue Raiders' fifth bowl game in the FBS era.

QUICK HITTERS

▶ The Blue Raiders have been bowl eligible seven times in 10 years and the Bahamas Bowl will be the fifth bowl game in the FBS era.

▶ Middle Tennessee has 20 players on its roster with a degree in hand for the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl.

▶ This will be the first football game MT has ever played on the date of December 24.

▶ In MT's seven wins it is averaging 529.7 yards of total offense and allowing just 324.1.

▶ MT is averaging 44.3 points a game at home and 24.2 on the road.

▶ TE Terry Pettis ranks **6th** nationally in yards per catch at 21.2. That total would also rank 6th best for a single-season at MT.

▶ WR Richie James has **45** receptions in his last five games combined.

▶ WR Richie James is averaging 8.3 receptions a game this season as a freshman to rank **3rd** nationally and ranks 1st among freshmen.

▶ Cody Clark's consecutive made PAT streak of 144 ranks as the third longest nationally.

▶ MT's 73 points scored in the conference opener against Charlotte went down as the second most scored in school history and came on the heels of a 70-point outing in game one.

▶ MT had 42 points in the first quarter in win over Charlotte which was a school record for points in a quarter.

▶ When Brent Stockstill started against JSU, he became just the second head coach's son in C-USA history to start at quarterback. In 1997-98, Tyson Helton started at Houston when his dad, Kim Helton, was the head coach.

▶ In their last 32 conference games, MT has a mark of 23-9.

▶ Kevin Byard is **2nd** among NCAA's active players in interceptions per game at 0.40. He also ranks **11st** in total interceptions with 19.

▶ Over the last 42 games, the Blue Raider defense has come up with 53 interceptions. The team had 15 picks in 2013 by eight different players, 13 in 2014

▶ The only announcement about injuries will be provided to the media the day before the game. The list will state if a player is out, probable, questionable, or doubtful.

▶ Kevin Byard has 377 career interception return yards to own the MT record and rank first on the NCAA active list. The NCAA all-time record is 501 by FSU's Terrell Buckley.

▶ Consecutive Starts Leader: T.T. Barber at 40.

▶ Under Rick Stockstill, the Blue Raiders have been involved in 18 games that were decided in the final minute of regulation or overtime. The team is 11-7 in those games and have won seven of the last eight.

▶ Head Coach Rick Stockstill is third on the school's all-time wins list with 64 victories.

▶ In 124 games under Rick Stockstill, the Blue Raiders are +23 in turnover margin.

▶ Middle Tennessee has scored 30 or more points 51 times under Rick Stockstill. The most 30-point games in a season under Stockstill is nine (2009).

INTERVIEWS & POLICIES

Weekly Press Conference

On Mondays at 10:30 AM, in the Kennon Sports Hall of Fame building, selected players and Coach Stockstill meet with the media individually for a press conference. The conferences are weekly and will be held every Monday before a game. Media can park in the area located between the practice field and the weight room on campus. The Athletic Communications Office will transcribe quotes that will be put on GoBlueRaiders.com and also emailed to the Blue Raiders' primary and football lists. A video feed of Stockstill, along with the players, will be available on YouTube.com/GoBlueRaiders.tv

Practice Policies

On a Saturday game week, Middle Tennessee practices are open to the media on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday. Interviews with coaches and players will take place after practice just outside the practice facility. However, players will not be available for any interviews after Wednesday's practice. They will not be available again until postgame. Please adjust the calendar for mid-week games.

Coach Stockstill Interviews

Coach Stockstill is available following each practice, but please let Mark Owens know if you intend to be at practice and would like an interview in advance. If you need to speak with Coach Stockstill by phone, please contact Mark Owens at owens@goblueraiders.com well in advance of the time you need him.

Player Interviews

Middle Tennessee players and assistant coaches are available for in-person or phone interviews Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of a normal game week. Interviews will be conducted after practice. All phone requests MUST be made a day in advance. Please contact Mark Owens for these requests.



PRESS CREDENTIALS

► Media credentials for all Middle Tennessee home games can be obtained by emailing a written request to Mark Owens (owens@goblueraiders.com) in the Athletic Communications Office.

All requests are screened to ensure a working pressbox with priority given to daily newspapers, radio/TV sports directors and other media who cover the Blue Raiders and their opponents on a regular basis.

Guests are not permitted in any working media area. If you wish to bring a guest to any game, contact Mark Owens regarding the availability of tickets.

MEDIA WILL CALL

► Credentials will be mailed for all requests received at least seven days in advance of the specified game. All other credentials should be picked up in the Athletic Communications office the day before the game, or at the Media Will Call window beginning at 9 AM on gameday. Media Will Call is located at Gate 1A of Floyd Stadium on the southwest corner.

BLUE RAIDER TOWER MEDIA ENTRANCE

► To access the pressbox, media members should use the elevator on the west side of the stadium. The pressbox is located on the fourth floor.

SIDELINE REGULATIONS

► In order to gain access to field level, media members and photographers must have a visible credential.

Tripods are allowed on the field but must be at least five yards away from the sideline or end line.

No photographers or media personnel are permitted within the team areas (midfield between the 25-yard lines) at any time. Please work from either side of the team area and move quickly behind the benches when changing ends of the field.

MEDIA SERVICES

► Pregame notes, rosters and programs are provided to working media in the pressbox prior to kickoff. Quickie stats will be distributed in the press box after each quarter and at the conclusion of the game.

Final game packets will be available in the pressbox following interviews.

Coach Stockstill will be available for comments and questions in the Green Room located in the southeast corner of Murphy Center approximately 15 minutes following conclusion of the game.

The Athletic Communications office will transcribe a portion of the postgame comments from Stockstill, the visiting head coach, and selected Blue Raider players.

Prior to Coach Stockstill's session, requested Middle Tennessee players will be made available in the Green Room. Requests for specific players should be submitted to the MT Athletic Communications staff in the pressbox before or during the fourth quarter.

The Middle Tennessee locker room is closed to the media at all times. The visiting coach will be made available outside his locker room in the southeast corner of the stadium.

PHOTOGRAPHER ROOM

► A photographer work area is setup prior to each game in the southeast corner of Murphy Center. Tables and internet access will be setup just outside the Green Room for use by all photographers.

BOWL HISTORY

► The Popeye's Bahamas Bowl marks the ninth bowl Middle Tennessee has participated in during its football history but the fifth in the FBS era. The Blue Raiders faced Central Michigan in the 2006 Motor City Bowl (lost 31-14), then defeated Southern Miss (42-32) in the 2009 New Orleans Bowl to cap a 10-3 season. MT went on to the 2011 GoDaddy.com Bowl where they fell to Miami, OH (35-21) before falling to Navy in the 2013 Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl (24-6). Prior to the FBS era, the Blue Raiders competed in the 1956 Refrigerator Bowl, the 1960 and 1961 Tangerine Bowl, and the 1964 Grantland Rice Bowl.

PERMANENT CAPTAINS

► The highest honor in the Blue Raider football program is to be voted a Permanent Team Captain at the conclusion of the regular season. This year's captains, as announced on Dec. 4, is linebacker T.T. Barber, safety Kevin Byard, offensive tackle Darius Johnson, and defensive tackle Pat McNeil.

JAMES AN ALL-AMERICAN

► Receiver Richie James earned First Team USA Today Freshman All-America honors after posting a school record 100 receptions for 1,220 yards in 2015. James becomes the fourth freshman all-american in school history and the third under Rick Stockstill.

POST-SEASON AWARDS

► MT had 13 players honored by Conference USA for post-season awards. The Raiders had four first team All-C-USA winners (T.T. Barber, Kevin Byard, Jaylen Hunter and Richie James), two second team members (Ed Batties & Jeremy Cutrer), five on the honorable mention team (William Eads, Cavellis Luckett, Pat McNeil, Maurquice Shakir, Brent Stockstill) and four on the All-Freshman squad (Chandler Brewer, Darius Harris, Richie James, Brent Stockstill). Quarterback Brent Stockstill was also voted the league's Freshman of the Year.

STRONG SENIORS

► The 2015 Senior Class enters the bowl game with 29 victories the past four years, which goes down as the most ever by a class in MT's FBS era (since 1999). It's also the most since the 1995 class won 30 games. The class has also been bowl eligible all four years.

GOOD IN NOVEMBER

► Under Rick Stockstill, the Blue Raiders have enjoyed success down the final stretch of the season in November. Over its last 30 games in the month of November, the Blue Raiders are 21-9 and have won 12 of its last 15. Overall under Stockstill MT carries a 24-13 mark in November.

TOTAL OFFENSE RECORD FALLS

► Middle Tennessee enters the bowl game with a new school record 5,504 yards of total offense. It goes down as just the sixth time in school history, Middle Tennessee has surpassed the 5,000-yard mark in total offense for a season (four of those under Stockstill) and the third year in a row.

DEFENSE STEPPING UP

► The Blue Raider defense has been key in the team's success this season and is having its best year under Tyrone Nix. The unit enters the bowl game allowing 388.3 yards a game which is its best since giving up 386.9 in 2010. They are also giving up 25.1 points per game which goes down as the team's best mark since 2009 (23.7).

STOCKSTILL SETS C-USA FRESHMAN PASSING MARK

► With 322 passing yards against North Texas, quarterback Brent Stockstill set a new Conference USA freshman record. Stockstill, who now has 3,678 yards on the season, broke the previous mark of 3,128 yards set by former Southern Miss and current Cleveland Browns QB Austin Davis in 2008.

JAMES ADDS TO RECEPTIONS MARK

► Wide receiver Richie James set a new single-season receptions record when he hauled in nine passes at FAU to give him 82 on the season. James broke the previous mark of 76 set by Kerry Wright in 2004 and enters the bowl game with 100 total catches. His 100 grabs ranks 8th all-time for a single-season in C-USA history and he needs 14 more to tie the all-time mark.

1,000-YARD MAN

► With 198 receiving yards (3rd most in school history) at FAU, WR Richie James became just the second player in MT history to record 1,000 receiving yards in a season. James now has 1,220 yards this year after posting 85 against UTSA and is now chasing the single-season mark of 1,280 established by Kerry Wright in 2003. James currently ranks third nationally in receptions and 11th in receiving yards.

TOP DUO IN SCHOOL HISTORY

► The receiving tandem of Ed Batties and Richie James officially became the top duo for a single-season in school history following the win over Marshall. James and Batties have now combined for 177 receptions this season to break the previous mark of 134 set by Kerry Wright (74) and Chris Henry (60) in 2004. James now has 100 receptions on the season while Batties has added 77.

BATTIES ADDS TO TD RECORD

► With a touchdown grab in overtime against Marshall, senior Ed Batties broke the single-season record of 11 set by Kerry Wright in 2004. Batties now has 13 on the season to rank **sixth** nationally and needs one more to tie for fifth on the all-time C-USA list. For his career, Batties now has 16 touchdown catches to rank tied for sixth all-time at MT.

STOCKSTILL TIES CAREER RECORD

► QB Brent Stockstill, who already owns nearly ever freshman passing record, tied the career mark for 300-yard passing games with his 322-yard effort against North Texas. Stockstill is tied with Wes Counts who had seven from 1998 to 2001. Stockstill had his school record streak of four straight 300-yard passing games come to an end at UTSA.

► Freshmen Brent Stockstill and Richie James have turned into a lethal combination for the Blue Raider offense this season. The duo is the first 3,000 yard passing and 1,000-yard receiving combo in school history and the pair still has a bowl game to play.

BYARD SETS CAREER RECORD

► Senior Kevin Byard broke a 33-year old Middle Tennessee record when he hauled in his 18th career interception against North Texas on Senior Day. Byard broke the school record set by James Griffin (1979-82). Byard now has 19 career picks and is tied for first nationally among active players.

7 TIMES IN 10 YEARS

► In 10 years under Rick Stockstill, Middle Tennessee has reached bowl eligibility seven times and six times in the last seven years. The Blue Raiders have been bowl eligible under Rick Stockstill in 2006, 2009, 2010, 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2015. The seven bowl eligible years during the 10-year span is more than any FBS team in Tennessee and equals the most of any program in C-USA.

IMPORTANCE OF WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

► Winning the turnover battle is critical in collecting victories in football. Under Rick Stockstill, MT has a mark of 43-13 when winning the turnover battle and is 35-5 during bowl eligible years (2006, 2009, 2010, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015). Over the last 48 games (since 2012), MT is 18 -2 when winning the turnover battle.

90-YARD DRIVES

► The Blue Raiders have put together 19 scoring drives of 90 or more yards under Rick Stockstill. MT had four in 2011, and three each in 2012 and 2009. The Raiders had two in 2014 with a long of 95 yards set in the season opener against Savannah. The longest drive under Stockstill was a 99 yarder in a 2007 win at Louisiana-Monroe.

DEFENSIVE SCORES UNDER STOCKSTILL

► Under Rick Stockstill, the Blue Raider defense has scored 23 defensive touchdowns and 18 have come since 2009. Of the 23 scores, 15 have been interceptions and eight have come by way of fumble returns. In 2013, MT had six defensive scores but had just one in 2014.

LOOKING FOR 100

► During its history, Middle Tennessee owns an impressive 159-54-1 (.745) record when a back gains 100 or more yards rushing. Under Rick Stockstill, a Blue Raider has reached the 100-yard mark 44 times and the team has a 37-7 mark in those games.

30 IS MAGIC

► Under Rick Stockstill, the Blue Raiders are 48-3 when scoring 30 points or more. The three losses came at Louisville in 2007 when the Raiders fell, 58-42, at Troy in 2011, 38-35, and at home against WKU in 2011, 36-33 (2OT).

► Under Rick Stockstill, the Blue Raiders have rushed for 200 or more yards 44 times and 36 have come since 2009. A complete list can be found on far right column.

OFFENSE UNDER FAULKNER

► OC Buster Faulkner took over the play-calling duties full-time in 2012 and in those four seasons the Blue Raiders have tallied 9,056 yards rushing or 184.8 yards a game. The 9,056 yards is the most at MT in a four-year period since 1991-1994 when the Raiders piled up 9,566 yards.

► In 2015, the offense set school records in total offense, passing yards, touchdown passes, completions, and attempts. Also stand just six points from setting a new scoring record.

► Team has three games of 600 or more yards under Faulkner.

► Guided a 2015 unit that has scored 70 or more points twice in a single-season for first time in school history. The 73 points against Charlotte was second most by an MT team.

► The 2015 team scored 42 points against Charlotte in the first quarter which went down as a school record for points in a quarter.

► The Blue Raiders have also recorded 97 rushing touchdowns in Faulkner's four full seasons and that total is the largest in a four-year span since 2000-2003 when MT had 115 ground scores.

► The Blue Raiders have amassed over 5,000 total yards of offense in three straight seasons for the first time in school history. MT has just six seasons all-time with more than 5,000 yards of total offense (1990, 2001, 2009, 2013, 2014, 2015).

► Faulkner's unit has averaged over 400 yards of offense in three straight seasons for the first time in school history.

► Faulkner's offense is scoring at a 29.9 per game clip (1,466 points) and have scored over 30 points a game in back-to-back seasons for first time since 2000-2001.

► Raiders are 161-for-197 in the red zone for an 81.7 per cent clip under Faulkner.

► MT has been strong on third down under Faulkner. In his three-plus years, MT has completed 312 of 705 third down conversions for an impressive 44.2 percent.

► MT has gained more than 500 yards of total offense in a game 11 times.

► Faulkner has had nine different players rush for 100 or more yards in a game.

► The Blue Raiders own 224 scoring drives and 88 have been under 2:00. In 2015, MT has six TD drives of under one minute.

► The longest scoring drive by time has been 6:56 in a win over WKU in 2014.

► QB Brent Stockstill set freshman single-game records in passing yards (381 vs LA Tech), touchdown passes (5 vs Charlotte), completion percentage (85.1 vs Charlotte), and completions (36 vs LA Tech) in 2015.

► QB Brent Stockstill set the MT freshman single-season passing record after just six games in 2015 and set the overall school passing mark after only nine contests. He also set the all-time single-season C-USA freshman scoring mark.

► In 2013, MT had five different players top the 100-yard rushing mark in the same season for the first time in the FBS era (since 1999). Jordan Parker, Reggie Whatley, Austin Grammer, Shane Tucker, and Jeremiah Bryson all recorded at least one 100-yard game in 2013.

► The combination of 25 receptions by Ed Batties and Richie James against Illinois was a new school record.

► In 2015, the receiving duo of Richie James and Ed Batties became the most potent single-season duo in school history with a combined 177 catches through 12 games.

► WR Richie James set a new single-season receptions mark in 2015 and also became just the second player in school history to gain 1,000 receiving yards in a season. His 100 receptions is also a new C-USA freshman record.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

► In 2015, the offense set school records in total offense, passing yards, touchdown passes, first downs, completions, and attempts. Also stand just six points from setting a new scoring record.

► MT scored five touchdowns against Charlotte in a total of 97 seconds.

► MT averaged 8.9 yards per play in win over Charlotte which ranked as the third best total in school history.

► Over the last 15 home games, MT is averaging 42.5 points a contest (637).

► In three years of C-USA action, MT has rushed for 5,220 yards in 24 league games. That averages out to 217.5 yards a game.

► In rushing, MT ranked 30th nationally in 2014 and 31st in 2013.

- ▶ MT is ranked 34th nationally in scoring in 2015 at 34.3 points per game. In Stockstill's first year (2006), that figure would have ranked 15th nationally.
- ▶ MT has registered over 5,000 yards of total offense in a season six times in its history and four of those have come under Rick Stockstill.
- ▶ QB Austin Grammer became the first quarterback in the Rick Stockstill era to throw for over 200 yards in each of his first seven games.
- ▶ Middle Tennessee is averaging 458.7 yards per game of total offense in 2015 and that goes down as the third most in school history and the highest under Rick Stockstill. The all-time mark is 481.4 yards set by the 2001 team that finished 8-3.
- ▶ The Blue Raiders have scored 54 touchdowns in 2015 which ranks as the second most in school history. The all-time record is 56 by the 2001 team.

DEFENSE UNDER NIX (SINCE 2012)

- ▶ Middle Tennessee allowed 182.6 yards on the ground in 2014 which went down as its fewest since 2009 (136.8). Team ranks 35th nationally in 2015, allowing 141.3 per game.
- ▶ Middle Tennessee compiled 29 total interceptions in 2014 and 2015 which goes down as the fourth-best two-year total in the FBS era (since 1999).
- ▶ The Blue Raider defense forced 33 turnovers in 2013 that led to 85 points, including 65 in league play. More importantly, the unit scored five touchdowns (4 INT, 1 FR) which is the most in the FBS era (since 1999).
- ▶ Over the last 37 games, MT has averaged 2.0 sacks (74) and 5.2 TFLs (192) a contest.
- ▶ There have been 23 total defensive scores in the Rick Stockstill era and 11 have come under Tyrone Nix.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- ▶ In the last three games, MT's defense has allowed 913 total yards (304.3) and 10.3 points a game while holding the opposition to a combined 10 of 37 on third down (27%).

- ▶ They have also allowed just 10 total second half points.
- ▶ The Blue Raiders currently rank 7th nationally in defensive scores (4), rank 14th in interceptions (16) and 22nd in turnovers gained (24).
- ▶ The unit ranks 5th nationally in red zone defense at .711.
- ▶ Overall, the Blue Raiders have 53 interceptions over their last 42 games. Middle Tennessee ranked 36th nationally in total interceptions with 15 in 2013 and all 15 picks were by eight different players. MT was 38th in 2014 with 13 picks.
- ▶ Safety Kevin Byard has led the Blue Raiders in interceptions each of the last three seasons. Byard is trying to become the first player in MT history to lead the team in picks four years in a row.
- ▶ Linebacker T.T. Barber is trying to become the first Blue Raider to lead the team in tackles three straight years.
- ▶ MT forced 28 turnovers in 2012, 33 in 2013 and 20 in 2014. The Raiders have 24 so far in 2015.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- ▶ Since 2013, Middle Tennessee owns nine blocked kicks which ranks tied for 8th nationally during that span.
- ▶ After blocking five kicks in 2014, the Blue Raiders picked up where they left off by rejecting a field goal against JSU. Newcomer Jeremy Cutrer was credited with the block while Jamarcus Howard picked it up and ran 63 yards for a TD. Cutrer also recorded a blocked FG against Marshall.
- ▶ In 2014, Middle Tennessee's special teams units enjoyed a productive season. The unit returned two punts for touchdowns, blocked two field goals, and blocked two punts and an extra point, while ranking 11th nationally in punt returns and 33rd in kickoff returns.
- ▶ PK Cody Clark has hit 32 career field goals which ranks seventh on MT's all-time list. He needs three more to tie for fifth place (35).
- ▶ PK Cody Clark has 240 points which ranks fifth all-time at MT in points scored by kicking. He needs 22 more points to surpass Kelly Potter for fourth place.
- ▶ With 10 PATs in the opener against JSU, junior Cody Clark set the new consecutive made PAT record. Clark has now

hit all 144 of his extra points to break the previous mark of 100 set by Garth Petrilli (1992-93).

▶ PK Cody Clark's game-winning 46-yard field goal in overtime against Marshall went down as his career long.

▶ Three current players came away with their first career blocked kicks in 2014. DL Raynard Felton rejected a FG in the season opener against Savannah; S Kevin Byard blocked an extra point in the win over Southern Miss and Chase Pennycuff tipped a punt at Minnesota.

▶ Under Rick Stockstill, the Blue Raiders have blocked 35 kicks in 124 games (18 FGs, 13 punts, 4 PATs).

▶ Two current Blue Raiders own punt returns for touchdowns. WR Ed Batties ran one back 61 yards last year in the win over Savannah, while Kevin Byard brought one back 76 yards in a win at ODU. It was Byard's first career return.

RAIDER ROUNDUP

▶ The top scoring quarter in the Rick Stockstill era is the second quarter. Here is a combined total for each quarter: 1st - 825 points; 2nd - 993 points; 3rd - 679 points; 4th - 851 points, and 43 in overtime.

▶ Under Rick Stockstill, the Blue Raiders have scored on their opening possession 41 times in 124 games (28 TDs) while the opposition has scored 38 times on its first possession of the game.

▶ When both teams are held under 20 points, the Blue Raiders are 3-1 under Rick Stockstill.

▶ As a FBS (I-A) member (203 games), the Blue Raiders have scored 50 or more points 17 times.

▶ The Blue Raiders are 73-13 in the FBS era when leading at the half and are 80-10 when leading a game entering the 4th quarter during that time.

▶ When trailing at the half, the Blue Raiders are just 18-85 in the FBS (I-A) era.

▶ The Blue Raiders have scored in 227 of their last 233 games and broke a string of scoring in 55 straight when they were shutout at Tennessee in 2011. MT, which has a current streak of 36 games, has been shutout five other times during the FBS era. The Blue Raiders were shutout 10-0 on the road against UL-Monroe in 1999, 55-0 in 2000 at Florida, 59-0 at Oklahoma in 2006, a 44-0 setback at LSU in 2007, and 45-0 at Arkansas State in 2012. MT has scored in 106 straight home games (last shutout was 9/23/1995 vs Murray State).

▶ Largest Margin of Victory in the I-A era: 59 points vs Charlotte 9/19/15 (73-14) ... Largest Margin of Defeat in the I-A era: 59 points vs Oklahoma 9/23/06 (59-0).

RAIDERS IN THE NFL

▶ MT currently has six players on NFL rosters. Erik Walden (Colts), Benny Cunningham (Rams), Jamari Lattimore (Jets), Josh Walker (Packers), Jimmy Staten (Chiefs), and Sammy Seamster (Saints).

ACADEMICS A TOP PRIORITY FOR RAIDERS

▶ Academic success at MT has been a high priority for 10th year coach Rick Stockstill. Under his reign, the Blue Raiders have seen 152 of 158 (96%) student-athletes earn their degree entering the 2015 season. MT, who also owns an impressive APR score of 992 to rank 7th nationally for 2013-14, has been publicly recognized by the NCAA for APR success twice in the last five years. Also under Stockstill, the Blue Raiders have taken home six Academic

All-District honors and produced an Academic All-American.

PLAYER NOTES

BRENT STOCKSTILL

▶ C-USA Freshman of the Year.

▶ His 3,678 passing yards through 12 games is tops in the country among freshmen and is a new MT single-season and C-USA freshman record. UCLA's Josh Rosen is second with 3,351 yards. He also leads all freshmen in touchdown passes with 27.

▶ The NCAA freshman passing record is 4,057 yards by Jameis Winston in 2013 and Brent Stockstill is 380 yards from breaking that mark. He is also within reach of Jared Lorenzen's freshman completion record of 321 set at Kentucky in 2000.

▶ With 3,719 career passing yards, Stockstill ranks 10th on MT's all-time passing list. All but 41 of his passing yards have come in 2015.

▶ Has seven 300-yard passing games this season which is a new single-season record at MT. His seven 300-yard games also ranks tied with Wes Counts for the all-time career record.

▶ Set a new school record with four straight 300-yard passing games in 2015. Saw streak end at UTSA.

▶ Had a career-high 381 passing yards against LA Tech which ranked as the fifth most in school history for a single-game. Also against the Bulldogs he set school records in completions (36) and attempts (56).

▶ His 27 touchdown passes this season is a new school record and breaks the previous mark of 23 set by Dwight Dasher in 2009.

▶ His five touchdown passes against Charlotte equaled the second most in school history and the most ever by a freshman.

▶ In his first collegiate start against JSU, Stockstill completed 24 of 30 passes for 348 yards and four touchdowns. All were highs for a first time starter in MT history.

▶ Stockstill's completion percentage of 85.1 (23-27) against Charlotte went down as the fourth best in school history and the best-ever by a freshman.

▶ His season completion percentage of 66.7 ranks 4th best at MT.

JORDAN PARKER

▶ Currently has 2,609 career rushing yards to rank 8th all-time. The senior needs 145 yards to surpass Eugene Gross for 7th place on the all-time list (2,753).

▶ Parker's 11 career 100-yard rushing games rank 7th most in school history. Nine of his 11 100-yard games have come against conference foes.

▶ Rushed for a career-best 158 yards in road win over ODU in 2014. Also had 156 yards on the ground against WCU in 2013.

▶ Turned in a career-high three rushing TDs against Charlotte in 2015 to go with a 62-yard scoring run on way to his 142-yard effort. Averaged 10.1 yards a carry.

▶ Parker set the freshman rushing record at Middle Tennessee with 851 yards in 2012. His yardage came in just six starts after the season-ending injury to current St. Louis Ram Benny Cunningham. His rushing total also ranked seventh most nationally for freshmen that year.

▶ Parker's 98-yard TD run vs Troy (2012) was the

longest in MT history.

▶ Parker only played 21 total snaps over the last five games of 2013 due to an injury and still managed to lead team in rushing.

SHANE TUCKER

▶ Named to the 2015 Doak Walker Award Watch List.

▶ In 27 career games played, Tucker has scored 20 touchdowns with 15 on the ground and five through the air.

▶ Owns three 100-yard rushing games for his career and all have been on the road. He had 103 yards at Southern Miss in 2013, 101 yards at UTEP in 2014 and 103 yards at FAU in 2015.

▶ Had 25 receptions in 2014 which went down as the most by a running back at Middle Tennessee since Eugene Gross had 33 in 2005. Has 39 career receptions.

▶ Hauled in a career-high six passes for 78 yards in win over Southern Miss in 2014.

ED BATTIES

▶ Needs just 40 yards to become the third player in MT history to record 1,000 receiving yards in a season. He would join teammate Richie James and former standout Kerry Wright.

▶ His 13 touchdown receptions this season is a new single-season school record. Batties owns 16 for his career to rank tied for 6th.

▶ Owns five career 100-yard receiving games (four this season) which is tied for 5th most in MT history.

▶ Ranks 6th nationally in touchdown catches, 33rd in receiving yards and 21st in receptions per game.

▶ Set a new school record with 13 catches at Illinois for a career-high 175 yards and two scores. He broke the previous record of 12 shared by Kendall Newson and Tyrone Calico. The 175 yards was the most under Rick Stockstill and ranked 7th all-time.

▶ Registered five receptions for 120 yards and a personal-best three touchdowns in 2015 win over Charlotte. The three TD's equaled the single-game record accomplished nine other times.

▶ Had eight catches for 123 yards in 2015 opening win over JSU.

▶ His 122 career receptions ranks 5th all-time and he needs 10 more to surpass Tavarres Jefferson for fourth (131).

▶ Has 1,434 career receiving yards to rank 8th all-time at MT. He needs 61 more yards to overtake Malcolm Beyah for 7th.

▶ Returned a punt 61 yards for a touchdown against Savannah State.

▶ His season average of 8.6 yards a punt return in 2014 ranked 32nd nationally.

▶ Had seven or more receptions in a game four times in 2014 and already has passed that with five in 2015.

RICHIE JAMES

▶ Named USA Today First Team Freshman All-American while also earning a spot on the C-USA All-Freshman team.

▶ His 100 receptions this season is a new single-season record at MT and leads all freshmen nationally. It's also the most ever recorded by a freshman in C-USA history.

▶ His 100 catches rank 8th on C-USA's all-time single-season list. He needs one more grab to tie



for 6th place, four to tie for 5th, six to tie for 4th and 10 to tie for 3rd. The all-time record is 114.

- ▶ Is just the second player in school history to record 1,000 receiving yards in a single-season at MT.
- ▶ Owns four career 100-yard receiving games.
- ▶ Caught a career-high 12 passes for 141 yards and a touchdown at Illinois.
- ▶ Had 11 catches for 98 yards vs North Texas.
- ▶ Hauled in 10 catches for 95 yards against No. 2 Alabama.
- ▶ Had seven catches for 141 yards and two scores at WKU.

KEVIN BYARD

- ▶ Named to the Jim Thorpe Award Watch List and the Senior Bowl Watch List for 2015. Marks third straight year to be included on the Jim Thorpe list.
- ▶ Has accepted an invitation to play in the 2016 Senior Bowl.
- ▶ In 48 career games played, Byard has forced or gained 25 turnovers (19 INTs, 5 FF, 1 FR).
- ▶ Currently has 307 total tackles for his career which ranks 6th on MT's all-time list. Is one of just seven players all-time at MT to register 300 career stops.
- ▶ His first career punt return went for 76 yards and a touchdown at ODU (2014). It also ranked as the longest punt return in MT's FBS era and ninth longest in school history.
- ▶ Owns 19 career interceptions to own Middle Tennessee's career record. He broke a 33-year old mark set by James Griffin from 1979-82 (17).
- ▶ Ranks 14th nationally among active players in passes defended with 35 for his career.
- ▶ His 377 interception return yards makes him MT's all-time leader and currently puts him No. 1 on the NCAA active list. The all-time NCAA record is 501 yards set by Florida State's Terrell Buckley.
- ▶ Has four interception returns for TDs which is a MT career record.
- ▶ Equaled the school record in 2012 with two interceptions returned for touchdowns (vs Memphis, Troy) and matched that in 2013 (FIU, USM).

▶ Earned First Team Freshman All-American honors in 2012 by the FWAA.

T.T. BARBER

- ▶ Named to the 2015 Lombardi Watch List and was also on the 2014 list.
- ▶ Currently has 323 total tackles for his career to rank 4th on MT's all-time list. Is one of just seven players all-time at MT to register 300 career stops.
- ▶ Ranks 16th nationally among active players in total tackles.
- ▶ Owns seven career interceptions.
- ▶ He has 34.0 TFLs for his career which ranks 4th on MT's all-time list. Barber needs two more to tie Anthony Hicks for 3rd.
- ▶ Has eight double digit tackles games for his career, including a career-high of 15 set against BYU in 2013.
- ▶ Earned first team all-conference honors and was named Team MVP by the media at the Armed Forces Bowl in 2013. Was a second team all-league winner in 2014.

JEREMY CUTRER

- ▶ Ranks second on team with three interceptions and ranks 16th nationally in passes defended with 1.5 a game.
- ▶ Also has two blocked field goals and a fumble recovery.

Winning on the field, off the field and having a first-class football program from top to bottom is the goal of any University at the highest level of intercollegiate athletics. That is exactly what Middle Tennessee has as a result of the leadership of Head Coach Rick Stockstill.

In his 10th season at the helm of the Blue Raiders and among the longest tenured coaches in the country, Stockstill has captured a league title, won the 2009 New Orleans Bowl, made five bowl appearances, been bowl eligible seven times, earned two public recognition awards from the NCAA for APR success, appeared on television 92 times, produced six of the top eight crowds in Floyd Stadium history, and had back-to-back eight-win seasons for the first time in 21 years.

Under his watch, the Blue Raiders have also produced six all-American's, including one academic all-American, three defensive players of the year, and two bowl game MVP's. Middle Tennessee also became the first Sun Belt team to win 10 games in a season, and set the Floyd Stadium single-game attendance record. He also has four NFL Draft picks with Erik Walden in 2008, Chris McCoy in 2010, Rod Issac in 2011, and Jimmy Staten in 2014.

The veteran leader put the Blue Raiders in the 2015 Popeyes Bahamas Bowl after going an impressive 4-0 in the month of November behind a record-setting offense and a bend-but-don't break opportunistic defense. The Blue Raiders produced 13 players honored by Conference USA for post-season awards, including four first team members, four on the All-Freshman Team and the league's Freshman of the Year in Brent Stockstill and a First Team All-American (Richie James).

Stockstill, who owns upsets over Maryland (2008 and 2009) and Georgia Tech (2012), has also shown a commitment to academics during his tenure. The Blue Raiders have gone from an APR score of 892 to a very impressive 992, the biggest increase of any program in the country. The Blue Raiders were also crowned with the Sun Belt Conference Academic Award on two occasions (2006-07, 2007-08) and earned two public recognition awards from the NCAA for APR success (2011, 2012). For his efforts, Stockstill was inducted as an honorary member into Phi Kappa Phi Honor Society in April 2010.

After 24 years as an assistant, Stockstill was given the chance to run his own program, and all he did was lead the Blue Raiders to a 2006 Sun Belt Conference championship, help set a new single-season attendance record, and take the program to its first postseason bowl game in the I-A era. Taking a Middle Tennessee team predicted to finish sixth in the Sun Belt during the preseason to a league title, Stockstill ended up as

the 2006 Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year and the Tennessee Sports Writers Association Coach of the Year while also garnering that honor from ESPN.com.

Stockstill's teams have amassed the top four tackles for loss and quarterback sack totals in school history and has produced the conference's top touchdown scorer twice. Individual players have 83 All-Conference honors, two Player of the Year Awards, four different National Player of the Week winners, and a Freshman of the Year.

Born Dec. 23, 1957 in Sidney, Ohio, Stockstill grew up in Georgetown, Ky., and then moved to Fernandina Beach, Fla., where he was inducted into the Fernandina Beach Hall of Fame in 2006. He was a three-year letterman at Florida State as a quarterback, where he was team captain and earned Honorable Mention All-America honors in 1981 under Coach Bobby Bowden. During his career at FSU, the Seminoles had two top-10 final Associated Press rankings and had wins over powers Notre Dame, Pittsburgh, Ohio State, and Nebraska. Stockstill, who received his bachelor's degree from FSU in 1982, made three bowl trips with the Seminoles.

Stockstill and his wife, the former Sara Fleischman, have a son, Brent, and a daughter, Emily.

RICK STOCKSTILL

2-Time Conference Coach of the Year

Winning on the field, off the field and having a first-class football program from top to bottom is the goal of any University at the highest level of inter-collegiate athletics. That is exactly what Middle Tennessee has as a result of the leadership of Head Coach Rick Stockstill.

In his 10th season at the helm of the Blue Raiders and among the longest tenured coaches in the country, Stockstill has captured a league title, won the 2009 New Orleans Bowl, made five bowl appearances, been bowl eligible seven times, earned two public recognition awards from the NCAA for APR success, appeared on television 92 times, produced six of the top eight crowds in Floyd Stadium history, and had back-to-back eight-win seasons for the first time in 21 years.

Under his watch, the Blue Raiders have also produced six all-American's, including one academic all-American, three defensive players of the year, and two bowl game MVP's. Middle Tennessee also became the first Sun Belt team to win 10 games in a season, and set the Floyd Stadium single-game attendance record. He also has four NFL Draft picks with Erik Walden in 2008, Chris McCoy in 2010, Rod Issac in 2011, and Jimmy Staten in 2014.

The veteran leader put the Blue Raiders in the 2015 Popeyes Bahamas Bowl after going an impressive 4-0 in the month of November behind a record-setting offense and a bend-but-don't break opportunistic defense. The Blue Raiders produced 13 players honored by Conference USA for post-season awards, including four first team members, four on the All-Freshman Team and the league's Freshman of the Year in Brent Stockstill.

After winning eight games in 2012 and being left out of a bowl game, Stockstill showed his bounce back ability once again by leading the Raiders to another eight-win season and a trip to the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces bowl. The Blue Raiders were among the national leaders in turnovers gained (5th), turnover margin (T12th), fewest penalties (14th), third down conversions (25th) and rushing (31st).

Some regard the 2012 season as his best coaching job after leading the Blue Raiders to the nation's biggest win improvement from the previous year. His seventh MT squad went 8-4, won an FBS school record five road games, received votes in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll three straight weeks, and upset ACC Coastal Division Champion Georgia Tech. Along the way, he produced a freshman all-American, eight all-conference players, and a national offensive player of the week.

In 2010, Stockstill's team battled back from a tough start to make back-to-back bowl games for the first time in school history. The coach also had an Academic All-American in Jeremy Kellem, the SBC Defensive Player of the Year in Jamari Lattimore, and a total of nine players who were recognized on the All-Conference team.

The 2009 season was one for the record books as that squad accomplished what few believed possible with an FBS-record 10 wins, a final ranking of 33rd nationally in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll, a bowl victory, a seven-game winning streak, the most Sun Belt victories in school history, five road victories, and a second straight undefeated month of November. It all resulted in Stockstill being named Sun Belt Conference Co-Coach of the Year and 11 players earning All-Conference honors, including co-Defensive Player of the Year Chris McCoy, who was taken in the 7th round of the NFL Draft by the Miami Dolphins. To top things off, quarterback Dwight Dasher earned New Orleans Bowl MVP honors and became just the fourth player in NCAA history to pass for more than 2,500 yards and rush for 1,000 yards in the same season.

Stockstill, who owns upsets over Maryland (2008 and 2009) and Georgia Tech (2012), has also shown a commitment to academics during his tenure. The Blue Raiders have gone from an APR score of 892 to a very impressive 992, the biggest increase of any program in the country. The Blue Raiders were also crowned with the Sun Belt Conference Academic Award on two occasions (2006-07, 2007-08) and earned two public recognition awards

from the NCAA for APR success (2011, 2012). For his efforts, Stockstill was inducted as an honorary member into Phi Kappa Phi Honor Society in April 2010.

After 24 years as an assistant, Stockstill was given the chance to run his own program, and all he did was lead the Blue Raiders to a 2006 Sun Belt Conference championship, help set a new single-season attendance record, and take the program to its first postseason bowl game in the I-A era. Taking a Middle Tennessee team predicted to finish sixth in the Sun Belt during the preseason to a league title, Stockstill ended up as the 2006 Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year and the Tennessee Sports Writers Association Coach of the Year while also garnering that honor from ESPN.com.

Stockstill's teams have amassed the top four tackles for loss and quarterback sack totals in school history and has produced the conference's top touchdown scorer twice. Individual players have 83 All-Conference honors, two Player of the Year Awards, four different National Player of the Week winners, and a Freshman of the Year.

During the 2006 championship run, Stockstill and his staff developed an All-American, 11 All-Conference players, 11 SBC Player of the Week winners, a consensus National Defensive Player of the Week (Damon Nickson won the Walter Camp and the Bronco Nagurski awards), and the school's all-time sacks leader (Erik Walden). Much of the team's success was attributed to their play on the road that year; the Blue Raiders won four conference road games. Only 10 other teams nationally could stake that claim.

Along with his extensive background in collegiate coaching circles, the driven and determined Stockstill has had the advantage of working alongside some of the greatest minds in college football history.

Stockstill, who made his way to Murfreesboro after spending the previous two years at South Carolina, has worked with legendary coaches Lou Holtz, Steve Spurrier, Danny Ford, Tommy Bowden, Ken Hatfield, and Tommy West.

Stockstill demonstrated the ability to develop and coach big-time players throughout his career as an assistant. He joined the Gamecock staff in December 2003 and immediately made an impact in recruiting. Stockstill coached the Gamecock tight ends and served as recruiting coordinator in 2005 and was the wide receivers coach in 2004.

Before joining Holtz's staff at South Carolina, Stockstill was the offensive coordinator at East Carolina in 2003.

In his first year at South Carolina, Stockstill coached Troy Williamson to one of the best seasons ever for a Gamecock receiver. Williamson made 43 receptions for 835 yards (75.9 per game average) and seven touchdowns. Williamson's 835 receiving yards put him among the single-season leaders at USC, along with his seven touchdowns. Williamson was taken as the seventh pick in the 2005 NFL Draft by the Minnesota Vikings.

In addition to his on-field coaching at Carolina, Stockstill coordinated the signing of a top-20 recruiting class for the Gamecocks in his first season and was recognized as one of the top 25 recruiters in the nation by Rivals.com.

From 1989 to 2002, Stockstill was on the coaching staff at Clemson, where he helped lead the Tigers to some of their most proficient offensive performances in school history. He served in a variety of capacities during his tenure with Clemson, working as recruiting coordinator, wide receivers coach, co-offensive coordinator, passing game coordinator, and quarterbacks coach. One of his prize pupils was All-America wide receiver Rod Gardner, who was the number 15 pick of the 2001 NFL Draft. Stockstill played an integral role in Clemson's offense, which set more than 100 school records from 1998 to 2002.

Stockstill is credited with recruiting Clemson's all-time leading rusher (Raymond Priestler), third all-time leading passer (Woodrow Dantzler), and

number three and number four all-time leading receivers (Derrick Hamilton and Rod Gardner). As a coach, Stockstill has been a part of 17 bowl games, including five as a head coach.

Stockstill also has coaching experience at the University of Central Florida (1985-88), where he tutored wide receiver Shawn Jefferson, who went on to a 13-year career in the NFL, and at Bethune-Cookman College (1983-84).

Born Dec. 23, 1957 in Sidney, Ohio, Stockstill grew up in Georgetown, Ky., and then moved to Fernandina Beach, Fla., where he was inducted into the Fernandina Beach Hall of Fame in 2006. He was a three-year letterman at Florida State as a quarterback, where he was team captain and earned Honorable Mention All-America honors in 1981 under Coach Bobby Bowden. During his career at FSU, the Seminoles had two top-10 final Associated Press rankings and had wins over powers Notre Dame, Pittsburgh, Ohio State, and Nebraska. Stockstill, who received his bachelor's degree from FSU in 1982, made three bowl trips with the Seminoles.

Stockstill and his wife, the former Sara Fleischman, have a son, Brent, and a daughter, Emily.

David Bibee is in his second stint at Middle Tennessee, having joined Rick Stockstill's staff in 2008 after two years at Chattanooga. Bibee is in charge of the Blue Raider safeties for the eighth straight season.

Under Bibee's guidance, current safety Kevin Byard has turned into one of the best to don the blue and white. Byard, a first team all-conference pick in 2014 and 2015 and a three-time Jim Thorpe Award candidate, ranks first all-time at MT with 19 interceptions and owns the career mark in return yards with 377. After a career-high 106 tackles and five interceptions in 2013, Byard came back with six picks in 2014. Byard has registered 61 tackles and four interceptions in 2015.

Bibee was faced with breaking in two new starters in 2012 so he turned to Byard and Jajuan Harley. The pair registered 74 tackles each, combined for seven interceptions and forced three fumbles. Byard went on to earn FWAA Freshman All-American honors and Harley was a two-time Defensive Player of the Week winner.

The 2011 campaign saw the Blue Raiders rank 44th nationally in pass defense thanks to a career year by safety Eric Russell. Russell led the team in tackles and interceptions, while ranking second in tackles for loss.

Bibee's 2010 unit was once again very solid behind the play of All-Conference pick Jeremy Kelleem, Kevin Brown, and Derrick Crumpton. The threesome combined for 15 pass breakups and helped the Blue Raiders have the nation's 30th ranked pass defense.

In 2009, his safeties had eight interceptions, nine tackles for loss, 12 breakups, three sacks, and three fumble recoveries in helping the Blue Raiders finish second in the Sun Belt in pass defense. Kelleem and Brown were 4th and 6th on the team in tackles, and Kelleem earned First Team All-Conference honors.

Bibee, who has 34 years of coaching experience including 27 on the collegiate level, has served as an assistant coach at Ole Miss, North Alabama, Middle Tennessee, Austin Peay State, Appalachian State, South Carolina, Tennessee Tech, Clemson, East Tennessee State, and Chattanooga.

He has coached a Super Bowl Most Valuable Player in former Dallas Cowboys cornerback Larry Brown, seven All-Americans including the Blue Raiders' all-time tackles for loss leader Dennis Mix, and nine NFL draft picks. His list of draft picks coached includes former Blue Raider great James Griffin; Clemson safety Antwan Edwards, a first-round selection by the Green Bay Packers; and former Baylor High School and Virginia kicker Kurt Smith of the San Diego Chargers. Bibee has also had five different safeties at MT earn conference player of the week honors.

Prior to his stint at Chattanooga, Bibee worked in the local high school ranks as head football coach at Baylor School in Chattanooga from 2000 to 2005. He guided the Red Raiders to the Division II state semifinals in 2000 and 2005. After the 2005 season, Baylor defensive lineman Jacques McClendon was elected Division II Class AAA Mr. Football Lineman of the Year and was later drafted by the Indianapolis Colts in the fourth round.

McClendon received a scholarship to play football at the University of Tennessee, and 24 other players went on to sign scholarship agreements.

Bibee's coaching career began at Tennessee, where he served as a student assistant for Coach Bill Battle. He moved on to the staff at Ole Miss in 1978.

He left Ole Miss to coach the defensive secondary and work as recruiting coordinator at North Alabama for one year and held the same positions for one year at Middle Tennessee (1980).

Sparky Woods hired Bibee at Appalachian State in 1984 to be his assistant head coach, recruiting coordinator and secondary coach. Bibee helped the Mountaineers compile a 38-19 overall record during that span, with back-to-back Southern Conference titles in 1986 and 1987.

Bibee joined Woods at South Carolina in 1989 to work as assistant head coach, co-defensive coordinator, and secondary coach.

He was part of Mike Hennigan's first coaching staff at Tennessee Tech in 1996, holding the posts of defensive backs coach and recruiting coordinator for the Golden Eagles for one season. He coached alongside former Atlanta Falcon Head Coach Mike Smith.

Prior to heading to the Baylor School, Bibee coached the secondary and outside linebackers at Clemson from 1997 to 1999, where he was on staff with Stockstill. Working for head coach Tommy West, Bibee helped the Tigers to a Peach Bowl berth in 1997.

Bibee is a 1977 graduate of the University of Tennessee, where he earned a bachelor's degree in health education. He played football for the Volunteers from 1973 to 1976 and was a member of the 1973 Gator Bowl team and the 1974 Liberty Bowl squad.

Bibee is married to the former Lisa Carter of Savannah, Tenn. The couple has three daughters, twins Ashlee and Allison, and Lindsay, and five grandchildren.



KODI BURNS

Wide Receivers / 1st Season / 6th Bowl
Auburn, 2011

Kodi Burns is in his first season on Rick Stockstill's staff as an assistant coach for the Blue Raiders. Burns currently coaches the Middle Tennessee receivers.

In his first season at Middle Tennessee, Burns led two all-conference receivers to multiple school records. Freshman Richie James collected all-conference first team and freshman team honors with his single season school record 100 receptions and 1,220 receiving yards, both of which led all freshmen nationally.

Senior Ed Batties, an all-conference second team selection, added 77 catches, the second most in MT single season history. He also totaled 960 yards and 13 touchdowns, another new single season school record.

Burns comes to Middle Tennessee after one season as the running backs coach at Samford where the Bulldogs finished 7-4. Burns coached sophomore Denzell Williams to first team all-conference honors after he rushed for 918 yards and 16 touchdowns, and led the SoCon in scoring.

Burns spent the 2013 season as an offensive graduate assistant at Auburn, working under head coach Gus Malzahn and offensive coordinator Rhett Lashlee. Burns was a part of the staff that took Auburn from a 3-9 record in 2012 to a 12-2 mark in 2013. The 2013 Tigers won the Southeastern Conference title, and played in the BCS National Championship game.

In his season on the Auburn staff, Burns helped coach and develop Heisman Trophy finalist Tre Mason, as well as wide receiver Sammie Coates, who ranked third in the nation in yards per catch. He also assisted with the implementation of the offensive system and with game planning while at Auburn.

Prior to coaching at Auburn, Burns spent the 2012 season working as an offensive graduate assistant under Malzahn and Lashlee at Arkansas State. During his only season at ASU, Burns helped lead the program to the Sun Belt Conference championship, posting a record of 10-3 overall and 7-1 in conference play. The team also earned the program's first bowl win, defeating Kent State, 17-13, in the GoDaddy.com Bowl.

While working at Arkansas State, Burns helped coach Sun Belt Conference Offensive Player of the Year and all-time leading passer Ryan Aplin. He also helped coach Freshman All-America wide receiver J.D. McKissic.

Burns played both quarterback and wide receiver at Auburn from 2007 to 2010. During the 2010 season, Burns was a wide receiver on Auburn's BCS National Championship team. He also played in the Outback Bowl in 2009 and was the Most Valuable Player of the Chick-fil-A Bowl in 2007.

Burns earned his Bachelor of Science Degree in exercise science from Auburn in 2011. He is also currently pursuing his Master's Degree from Auburn.



STEVE ELLIS

Recruiting Coord./Corners / 7th Season / 4th Bowl
Nicholls State, 2003

Steve Ellis is in his seventh season on Rick Stockstill's staff and his first as recruiting coordinator. Ellis is handling the cornerbacks for the seventh straight year.

In 2015, Ellis led a group of cornerbacks that collected six interceptions and 31 pass breakups, led by three interceptions and 13 pass breakups from second team All-C-USA pick Jeremy Cutrer. Sophomore Michael Minter finished fifth on the team in tackles with 50 despite missing the first two games of the season.

Ellis, who spent his first two years as cornerbacks coach and special team's coordinator for the Blue Raiders, took over the role of defensive coordinator in January 2011. Ellis then had the title of co-defensive coordinator/cornerbacks coach from 2012 to 2014.

Under the direction of Tyrone Nix and Ellis, the 2013 unit improved 29 spots in the national rankings for total defense while ranking fifth overall in turnovers gained and 17th in red zone defense. Ellis' cornerback group saw Kenneth Gilstrap and Jared Singletary produce career years while Sammy Seamster was one of the most improved players on the team. Seamster is currently in the NFL with the Miami Dolphins.

Ellis once again teamed with Nix in 2012 to make vast improvements on the Blue Raider defense. The unit improved 48 spots in the national rankings in scoring defense, 29 in rushing defense, and made a jump of 10 in total defense from 2011.

Ellis produced a First Team All-Conference selection in Rod Issac and helped the defense lead the league in pass defense for a second consecutive season in 2010. Starters Issac and Arness Iknor accounted for four interceptions and 10 pass breakups, and Issac scored twice. Issac was also taken in the fifth round of the 2011 NFL Draft by the Jacksonville Jaguars.

Ellis' special teams were solid once again (with six blocked kicks) and produced First Team All-Conference picks in placekicker Alan Gendreau and punter Josh Davis.

In 2009, Ellis' cornerbacks had 152 tackles, nine interceptions, 12 tackles for loss, 2.5 sacks, and 21 pass breakups on their way to leading the Sun Belt Conference in pass defense and interceptions. Seniors Marcus Udell and Alex Suber were tabbed First Team All-Conference as Udell led the league with seven interceptions and Suber had 12 pass breakups while ranking 28th nationally in passes defended.

His special teams blocked eight kicks, hit 18 of 22 field goal attempts, had 1,119 yards in kick returns, downed 22 punts inside the 20-yard line, and had seven punts of 50 yards or more. Sophomore placekicker Alan Gendreau earned First Team All-Conference honors.

Ellis made his way to Murfreesboro after serving the previous six seasons at Nicholls State, where he was the defensive coordinator his final three years. Ellis, who also served as the team's pro liaison and supervised academic progress, was the team's safeties coach in 2003 before taking over the linebackers in 2004 and 2005.

The Stringer, Miss., native became one of the youngest defensive coordinators in the country when he was named to the position prior to spring drills in 2006. He guided the Colonels to conference best marks in scoring defense and pass defense, and Nicholls finished the 2006 season ranked 19th nationally in total defense.

In 2007, Ellis' unit led the Southland Conference in total defense, pass defense, and interceptions and was second in scoring defense. Overall, NSU ranked 33rd nationally in total defense.

In six seasons at Nicholls State, Ellis' players won seven First Team All-Conference honors, four National Player of the Week awards, three All-American honors, and two conference Newcomer of the Year awards and garnered a defensive player of the year accolade.

During the summer of 2008, Ellis participated in the NFL Coaches Fellowship Program with the Pittsburgh Steelers under Head Coach Mike Tomlin. Ellis worked with the defensive backs under the guidance of legendary defensive coordinator Dick LeBeau. He participated in the same program with the Buffalo Bills in 2010.

He started for three seasons for the Colonels as a defensive back before sitting out his senior season after suffering a knee injury during the fourth game of the 2002 campaign against Southern University. While with the Colonels, Ellis was named to the All-Southland Conference team all three seasons he played and registered over 200 career tackles and five interceptions for the Colonels. Ellis, the team captain in 2001, was second in the Southland Conference with 104 tackles during the 2000 season.

The 35-year old was a four-year letterman as a quarterback and defensive back at Stringer High School before continuing his playing days at Nicholls State. Ellis earned his bachelor's degree in secondary education from Nicholls State in 2003.

Ellis, and his wife Regina, have a daughter Deja and a son Caleb.



BUSTER FAULKNER

Offensive Coord./QBs / 5th Season / 6th Bowl
Valdosta State, 2005

Buster Faulkner is in his fifth season on Rick Stockstill's staff and fourth as the programs offensive coordinator after being elevated to the post in February 2012. Faulkner is also in his fifth year as quarterbacks coach.

Under his tutelage, the Blue Raiders have amassed more than 5,000 yards of total offense in three consecutive seasons for the first time in school history while averaging 31.5 points a game. Through 12 games in 2015 the offense has amassed 5,504 yards, an MT record, while also totaling 411 points, just five shy of the current MT record.

Faulkner also led several record-setting individuals in 2015, as freshman quarterback Brent Stockstill led the way by setting new single season marks for passing yards, passing yards per game, completions, attempts, touchdowns, 300-yard games and consecutive 300-yard games.

Freshman receiver Richie James has caught a school record 100 passes for 1,220 yards, while senior wideout Ed Batties has brought down an MT record 13 receiving touchdowns under Faulkner in 2015. Stockstill and James are the first quarterback and receiver pairing in school history to amass 3,000 yards passing and 1,000 yards receiving in the same season.

The 2013 offense had the second most yards in school history, ranked 31st nationally in rushing, and 25th in third down conversion percentage. The offense also registered seven games of 200 or more yards rushing and had five different players top the 100-yard rushing mark. Quarterback Logan Kilgore became the first signal-caller in school history to have three straight 2,000-yard seasons with all three years coming under Faulkner.

In 2012, the unit keyed the Raiders' 8-4 season by re-establishing the running game and protecting the football. Middle Tennessee ranked 46th nationally in rushing and tied for 28th for fewest turnovers lost. The unit also had four games where they rushed for over 200 yards, produced three different 100-yard rushers, and had a Stockstill era best three scoring drives of 97 or more yards. Wide receiver Anthony Amos and center Micah James both earned first team all-conference honors.

In 2011, Faulkner took over the play-calling duties the final seven games. Faulkner's unit went on to record the fifth most yards of total offense.

Faulkner came to Murfreesboro after serving the 2010 season as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Murray State.

In his lone season at MSU, Faulkner's offense broke 27 school records and finished first in the FCS in total plays, pass completions, and completion percentage. The Racers offense racked up nearly 5,000 yards and produced the first 500-yard passer, 200-yard rusher, and 200-yard receiver in the same game in FCS history. The Racers ranked fifth in total offense nationally in 2010 and the year prior to Faulkner's arrival MSU had a ranking of 115.

In 2010, the Racers offense ranked first in the OVC and fifth nationally with 36.09 points per game, while also leading the league in passing offense and ranking fourth nationally with 313.5 yards per contest. The MSU quarterbacks led the country in completions and completion percentage.

Under Faulkner's guidance, quarterback Casey Brockman had just six starts in 2010 but earned second team all-conference honors and was twice picked as the National Player of the Week. Brockman also garnered three OVC Player of the Week awards en route to finishing first in the league and eighth nationally in passing yards per game. Brockman accounted for 313 yards of total offense per game.

Prior to joining the Racers staff, Faulkner spent the 2009 season as the quarterbacks coach at Central Arkansas. UCA's offense averaged 26.2 points a game and 215.8 yards a game through the air and was ranked in the Top 25 nationally in every offensive statistic.

Faulkner's coaching career began at Valdosta State, where he served as a student assistant helping with the quarterbacks in 2005.

After one season with the Blazers, he served as an offensive graduate assistant at Georgia, working with the offensive line and quarterbacks.

Faulkner returned to Valdosta State in 2007 and served as the quarterbacks coach for two seasons.

In his first season, the Blazers went 13-1 and captured the Division II National Championship as quarterback Willie Copeland passed for 2,903 yards and 27 touchdowns.

Faulkner took over as the offensive coordinator for the Blazers in 2008. VSU averaged 380.8 yards a game in advancing to the quarterfinals as quarterback Chris Hart earned Freshman of the Year honors. Hart accounted for over 3,000 yards and 27 touchdowns.

As a player, Faulkner starred as a quarterback for Valdosta State from 2000 to 2003. In three years with the Blazers, he passed for 7,100 yards and 64 touchdowns while registering a 47-6 record.

As a sophomore, Faulkner earned first-team all-Gulf South Conference honors and honorable mention All-American accolades after going 327-for-503 for 3,941 yards and 44 touchdowns in leading the Blazers to a 14-1 record and a spot in the National Championship game.

He played his senior season at Texas A&M-Commerce, where he passed for 2,861 and 16 touchdowns, while setting 10 school records.

A native of Lilburn, Ga., Faulkner earned his bachelor's degree in history from Valdosta State in 2005.

Faulkner, and his wife, Tia, have one son, Harrison, and two daughters, Hadley and Haisley.



RICK MALLORY

Offensive Tackles/TE / 3rd Season / 17th Bowl
Washington, 1983

Rick Mallory, a veteran coach who spent five seasons as a player in the NFL before beginning his coaching career, is in his third year as offensive tackles/tight ends coach at Middle Tennessee as a member of Rick Stockstill's staff.

Tight end Terry Pettis turned in a career year in 2015 with 28 catches for 593 yards and four touchdowns. He ranked seventh nationally in yards per reception (21.18) and hauled in five passes of 40 yards or more, including 76- and 75-yard touchdowns against Charlotte.

Despite having three different players record starts at left tackle in 2015, the group excelled in pass protection, allowing for a 3,678-yard season from signal-caller Brent Stockstill. True freshman Chandler Brewer, who started the first four games at left tackle, earned a spot on the C-USA All-Freshman team.

In 2014 the Blue Raiders ranked 31st nationally in rushing and had seven games of 200 or more yards on the ground, which was keyed by Mallory's tackles. Isaiah Anderson and Darius Johnson both earned second team all-conference honors to lead the offensive line.

The tackles and tight ends played a major role in the Blue Raiders owning the 31st best rushing attack in the country and producing the most rushing yards at MT since 2002. Under Mallory, the group also helped open holes for five different players to record 100-yard rushing games, while tight end Jacob Corbaley turned in a career year.

Mallory, who has 21 years of college coaching experience, joined Stockstill's staff after spending the 2012 season working in the high school ranks and the 2011 campaign as the offensive line coach at UAB.

Prior to his one-year stint at UAB, Mallory was the director of football operations at Wyoming in 2010 before serving 10 years as the offensive line coach at the University of Memphis.

Preceding his time in Memphis, Mallory was the tight ends coach at the University of Washington, his alma mater, from 1993-98.

From 2000-09 when Mallory was on the staff at Memphis, the Tigers earned five bowl berths in those 10 seasons.

In 2009, Mallory's offensive line helped pave the way for senior running back Curtis Steele to earn first-team All-Conference USA honors as Steele finished No. 7 in the NCAA in rushing and scoring. Memphis ranked No. 3 in Conference USA in rushing offense in 2009, gaining an average of 158.8 yards per game on the ground. Mallory's '09 offensive line allowed an average of only 1.42 sacks per game to rank No. 35 in the NCAA.

The 2008 Tiger offense ranked 22nd in the nation in rushing offense and 26th in total offense, while ranking 21st in fewest sacks allowed. The year prior in '07, Memphis ranked No. 13 in the NCAA in passing offense, No. 23 in total offense and No. 10 in fewest sacks given up.

From 2002-05, Mallory's offensive line unit blocked for running back DeAngelo Williams, who earned All-America honors in both 2004 and 2005. The 2005 Tiger offense ranked fifth in the nation in rushing offense, and the 2004 edition ranked ninth in total offense. In four of his last six seasons at Memphis, Mallory's offensive line led Conference USA in fewest sacks allowed.

During his time at Memphis, he coached six first-team All-Conference USA offensive linemen, one second-team selection, four third-team honorees and five Conference USA All-Freshman team choices.

Prior to Memphis, Mallory coached at Washington for seven seasons, beginning as a graduate assistant coach in 1992. He became a full-time assistant in '93, coaching the tight ends and special teams from 1993-98. The Huskies earned five bowl berths over that seven-year period.

Mallory was a three-year letterman at Washington from 1981-83. As a freshman and sophomore, Mallory played tight end. His junior year, Mallory was converted to offensive guard, and he went on to earn All-Pacific 10 Conference honors his senior season of 1983.

Following his college playing career, the Tampa Bay Buccaneers selected Mallory in the ninth round of the 1984 NFL Draft. He played for the Buccaneers for five seasons from 1984-88.

He and his wife Shannon have three grown sons: Ryan, Adam and Cameron; and three daughters, Naomi, Fiona, and Layla. Mallory earned a bachelor's degree in political science from Washington in 1983.



TYRONE NIX

Defensive Coord./LB / 4th Season / 14th Bowl
Southern Miss, 1995

Tyrone Nix, one of the most respected coaches in the country, is in his fourth season at Middle Tennessee. Nix, who became the team's defensive coordinator in 2015, served as co-defensive coordinator and linebackers coach on Rick Stockstill's staff his first three seasons.

Nix, who coached on the same staff as Stockstill at South Carolina in 2005, made his way to Murfreesboro after four years at Ole Miss.

Under Nix's leadership in 2015, linebacker T.T. Barber and safety Kevin Byard both earned first team all-conference honors while cornerback Jeremy Cutrer earned second team honors and defensive tackle Pat McNeil and linebacker Cavellis Luckett were named honorable mentions. Linebacker Darius Harris also made an appearance on the all-conference freshman team.

The 2015 defense ranked 5th nationally in redzone defense (0.711), 7th in defensive touchdowns (4) and 14th in interceptions (16) while also forcing 24 total turnovers.

In 2014, Nix had five defensive players honored in the post-season by Conference USA. Safety Kevin Byard was a first team pick, linebacker T.T. Barber earned second team honors, while defensive end Shubert Bastien and tackle Pat McNeil were on the honorable mention team. Rookie DJ Sanders had a spot on the All-Freshman team.

The Blue Raider defense once again continued an upward trend under Nix in 2013. The group improved 29 spots in the national rankings from 2012 in total defense, ranked fifth overall in turnovers gained, and were 17th in red zone defense. Linebacker T.T. Barber, a first team all-conference pick, ranked 35th nationally in total tackles and ninth in fumble recoveries while safety Kevin Byard became the NCAA's active leader in interception return yards. DT Jimmy Staten was taken in the 5th round of the NFL Draft by the Seattle Seahawks.

In his first season at Middle Tennessee, Nix's 2012 defense made huge strides in all areas. The unit improved 48 spots in the national rankings in scoring defense, 29 in rushing defense, and made a jump of 10 in total defense from 2011. He also had a FWAA Freshman All-American in safety Kevin Byard, along with all-conference performer Omar McLendon at defensive end.

In four seasons under Nix, the Ole Miss defense was among the nation's best in tackles for loss and sacks. The unit tied for the nation's lead in TFLs in 2008 and topped the Southeastern Conference again in 2009, and in the sacks category, it finished No. 1 in the SEC in 2008 and No. 2 in 2009. In 2010, the Rebels ranked 20th in the NCAA in both areas.

Nix was promoted to Assistant Head Coach in January 2010.

Nix helped the Rebels show marked improvement since the season before his arrival when the team ranked either 11th or 12th in the SEC in total defense, scoring defense, rush defense and pass efficiency defense.

In 2009, Nix's squad rose to No. 3 in the conference and No. 11 in the nation in pass efficiency defense and No. 15 in the nation in both scoring defense and pass defense. The Rebels were fifth in the SEC in total defense in 2008 and 2009.

Nix's first season with the Rebels provided one of the toughest run-stopping defenses in school history. Ole Miss allowed just 85.5 ypg on the ground, which ranked second in the SEC and fourth in the nation. That season produced a pair of All-Americans in first team tackle Peria Jerry and third team end Greg Hardy.

In 2009, defensive tackle Jerrell Powe and safety Kendrick Lewis earned second team All-SEC honors, linebacker Patrick Trahan was a fourth team selection and linebacker D.T. Shackelford was named to the SEC All-Freshman team. Powe earned second team All-SEC distinction again in 2010 along with linebacker Jonathan Cornell, while linebacker Serderius Bryant was on the SEC All-Freshman team in 2011.

Nix's Ole Miss defense produced four NFL Draft choices, including first-round pick Jerry of the Atlanta Falcons in 2009. Safety Jamarca Sanford was also chosen in 2009 by the Minnesota Vikings, while both Lewis and Hardy were drafted in 2010 by the Kansas City Chiefs and Carolina Panthers, respectively.

In 2007, he coached inside linebackers in addition to managing a Gamecock unit that topped the SEC and ranked fifth nationally in pass defense, allowing just 168.8 yards through the air.

The USC defense in 2006 was sixth in the SEC and 29th in the country in scoring defense, surrendering 18.7 points per game, 4.5 fewer than in 2005 despite returning just one starter. Junior college transfer Jasper Brinkley led the team in tackles and earned first team All-SEC accolades at middle linebacker.

In his first year in Columbia, Nix served as co-defensive coordinator and tutored the defensive line. Under his watch safety Ko Simpson earned All-America accolades.

In his 10-year period at Southern Miss, he mentored 12 All-Conference USA selections, four C-USA Defensive Players of the Year and six All-America selections. USM also enjoyed team success, winning four C-USA championships and earning seven postseason bowl berths.

A native of Attalla, Ala., Nix received his bachelor's degree in management from Southern Miss in 1995. He is married to the former Toya Phelps of Vicksburg, Miss., who holds both bachelors and master's degrees from Southern Miss. The couple has one son, Tyvari, and one daughter, Tiah.



MIKE POLLY

Special Teams Coord./RB /3rd Season /3rd Bowl
Georgetown College, 2006

Mike Polly, a former graduate assistant for the Blue Raiders, is in his third season on Rick Stockstill's staff as running backs coach. Polly made his return to Middle Tennessee after spending three years at Murray State overseeing the offensive tackles and tight ends.

Polly's group battled injuries to each of its three veteran running backs in 2015, but still managed to amass 1,779 rushing yards on the season with at least 200 rushing yards in four games.

Freshman Desmond Anderson shined under Polly in the absence of the injured veterans, totaling 144 yards on the ground against FIU and 101 more against Marshall.

In 2014, Polly added the title of Special Teams Coordinator as announced by Stockstill.

Polly's 2014 unit sparked a rushing attack that ranked 31st nationally and second in C-USA as Reggie Whatley and Shane Tucker both came away with career years to earn honorable mention all-league honors. He also had three different backs top the 100-yard mark, while Tucker had the most receptions by a back at MT since 2005.

On the special team's side, Polly engineered three different groups to rank among the top 35 in the country. The Raiders ranked fifth nationally in blocked kicks, were 11th in punt returns and 33rd in kickoff returns.

The 2013 campaign saw Polly produce four different backs that had 100 or more yards rushing in a game while igniting an offense that accounted for 2,591 rushing yards to rank 31st nationally. The top four rushers were all underclassmen and the main reason the offense amassed seven games of 200 or more yards on the ground.

During Polly's three years at MSU, the Racers ranked in the top five nationally in total offense each season while his offensive line helped pave the way for the program's first 1,000-yard rusher in nearly a decade. Polly has added the responsibilities of special team's coordinator in 2011.

In 2012, the Racer offense ranked fifth nationally in total offense, passing offense, and scoring offense. Polly's group also helped all-american signal-caller Casey Brockman rank second nationally in total offense, while all-american receiver Walter Powell was fourth nationally in receptions per game.

The 2011 season saw consistency at the tackle position as Raymond Hopson and Roderick Tomlin combined to start all 11 games. The duo combined to anchor an offensive line that blocked for one of the top offenses in the FCS. Hopson was honored at the end of the season as a second-team all-OVC selection, the first all-conference offensive lineman since 2004.

The Racer offense averaged 460.9 yards of offense and went over 5,000 yards of total offense for just the fourth time in school history.

The offensive line also paved the way for the first 1,000-yard rusher in nearly a decade, and just the 10th in the history of the program. As a team, the Racers rushed for over 150 yards in five games, and closed out the season by eclipsing the 200-yard mark in each of the last two games.

Consistency was also the case with the tackles in 2010 as Hopson and Tomlin combined to start all but one game. The duo anchored the line that allowed just 16 sacks in 515 pass attempts. The Racers allowed one sack or fewer in eight games.

The Racer offense was one of the best in the country as it ranked fourth in passing offense, fifth in total offense and fifth in scoring offense. The line also paved the way for one of the league's best rushing attacks over the second half of the season.

Prior to joining the Racers staff, Polly spent three seasons as an offensive graduate assistant on Stockstill's staff at Middle Tennessee from 2007 to 2009.

In 2009, Polly helped guide an offensive line that paved the way for an offense that accumulated 421.7 yards a game, and allowed just 19 sacks in 436 pass attempts.

The Blue Raiders capped off their best season in school history by defeating Southern Miss in the New Orleans Bowl to finish with a record of 10-3.

He joined the coaching profession at Georgetown College during the spring of 2007 with film break down, overseeing the weight room, and assisting the offensive line coach during spring drills.

The Erlanger, Ky., native played at Georgetown College, where he helped the Tigers to four-straight Mid-South Conference championships. As a co-captain, he was selected to the All-MS-C team as a senior.

Polly's accolades carried over into the classroom as he was a four-time Academic All-MS-C selection, as well as being named a Daktronics NAIA Scholar-Athlete three times.

Polly played his prep ball at Dixie Heights High School, where he was a first-team all-state selection.

Polly, who graduated with a degree in marketing in 2006, was also the recipient of the Georgetown College Scholar Athlete of the Year and the No "1" in Team award, which is selected by faculty, staff and students.

He received his master's in sport management from Middle Tennessee in 2008.



GEEP WADE

Offensive Line /3rd Season /3rd Bowl
Chattanooga, 2001

Geep Wade is in his third year handling the offensive line on Rick Stockstill's staff.

Wade's 2015 group made it possible for the Blue Raiders to put up over 5,000 total yards for the third straight season. The 2015 offensive line paved the way for the 17th ranked passing attack in the nation, while the 2014 unit opened holes for an offense that ranked 30th nationally in rushing.

The 2015 offensive line had three members honored by Conference USA in Jaylen Hunter (first team), Maurquice Shakir (honorable mention) and Chandler Brewer (freshman team) and gave quarterback Brent Stockstill enough time in the pocket to amass a school record 3,678 passing yards.

Led by second team all-conference linemen Isaiah Anderson and Darius Johnson in 2014, the Blue Raiders had four different players rush for more than 100 yards in a game, while quarterback Austin Grammer became the first quarterback in school history to throw for over 200 yards in each of his first seven games.

In 2013, Wade helped develop all-conference performer Josh Walker while engineering a group that helped five different players rush for over 100 yards in a game. The unit also paved the way for an offense that ranked 31st nationally in rushing and led Conference USA in rushing for league games.

Wade made his way to Murfreesboro from Marshall where he coached the offensive line in 2012. His 2012 unit helped Marshall register 365.0 passing yards per game (first in FBS), 534.2 yards of total offense (sixth in FBS) and 40.9 points a game (seventh in FBS), all C-USA highs. His line also withstood the pounding of an FBS-high 90.6 plays per game, and paved the way for 24 rushing touchdowns. The offense also produced just over 20 plays of 10 yards or longer per game to lead the nation.

Wade spent two seasons leading the offensive line at Tennessee-Chattanooga, his alma mater (2002 graduate), while also serving as the recruiting coordinator. He returned to the sidelines for his second stint as an assistant coach at UTC after serving on the Mocs' staff in 2002 following his graduation.

Wade was in charge of the tackles and tight ends during the 2010 campaign, helping Chris Harr (OT) and Garrett Hughes (TE) to first team All-SoCon honors. The play of the offensive line allowed the Mocs to finish 11th nationally in total offense (430 yards per game), while the unit threw for an average of 277 yards, second in the SoCon and eighth nationally.

Wade spent the previous four seasons as an assistant coach at Tennessee-Martin, serving as the offensive coordinator in 2009. In 2008, the Skyhawks posted an 8-4 overall record, ranking fourth in the nation in scoring offense (37.33).

In 2007, Wade and the Skyhawk offense ranked No. 1 in the Ohio Valley Conference in total offense (433 yards per game) and points scored per game (33.36). The team finished first in rushing offense (218.5) in the OVC, 12th in the nation.

Before coming to UT Martin in 2006 with head coach Jason Simpson, Wade was an offensive line coach at Western Carolina and Midwestern State in Texas. He also enjoyed a stint at Tennessee where he was an offensive line grad assistant for the Volunteers in 2004, the same year the team won the Southeastern Conference East Division title and the Cotton Bowl. In 2003, Wade coached the offensive line and served as the recruiting coordinator at Mars Hill College.

Wade was a team captain and an offensive lineman at UTC from 1999 to 2001, earning his degree in Business Management in 2002. He is married to the former Amy Howell of McKenzie, Tenn. They have one daughter, Emma Kate.



TOMMY WEST

Defensive Line / 2nd Season / 19th Bowl
Tennessee, 1976

Tommy West, who has 33 years of collegiate coaching experience, including stints as a head coach at three different schools, is in his second year on Rick Stockstill's staff after spending the 2012 campaign at Southern Miss as the school's defensive coordinator. West was out of coaching in 2013 and was the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at UAB in 2011.

In 2015, the defensive line collected 26.5 TFLs and 10.5 sacks to go along with 20 QB hurries. The unit was led by all-conference honorable mention tackle Pat McNeil who anchored a defense that ranked fifth nationally in redzone defense.

In his first year guiding the defensive line, West's group combined for 35 TFLs and 20.5 sacks as defensive end Shubert Bastien and defensive tackle Pat McNeil earned honorable mention all-conference honors.

West and Stockstill are no strangers as both were on the same Clemson staff together in 1989 and from 1994 to 1998 the two were together again when West served as the Tigers' head coach.

Prior to joining the staff at UAB, West was the head coach at the University of Memphis (2001-09), where he guided the Tigers to five bowl appearances and a 49-61 record in nine seasons.

While leading the Memphis program, West guided the Tigers to some of their best seasons in program history. He helped snap a 32-year U of M bowl drought in 2003 when he led his squad to a 9-4 record, including a victory over North Texas in the New Orleans Bowl. The last time that the Tigers had been extended a bowl invitation was during the 1971 season when Memphis defeated San Jose State in the Pasadena Bowl.

The bowl victory in 2003 propelled Memphis into the spotlight and was the first year of a three-season stretch when the Tigers registered 24 victories. Also in 2003, West became just the fourth coach in school history to claim nine wins in a single season. He was named the Coach of the Year by the Tennessee Sports Writers Association.

West and his Tigers opened the 2004 campaign with a 5-1 record, marking the best start for a Memphis squad since 1967. During that time, West led the Tigers into the national spotlight as Memphis defeated Ole Miss for the second-straight season and was listed No. 25 in the Associated Press Top 25 poll. It was the first time ever that the Tigers were ranked by the national entity.

Prior to becoming the Tigers' head coach, West spent the 2000 season as Memphis' defensive coordinator. The Tigers finished the season ranked No. 1 in the nation in rushing defense (72.7 yards allowed per game) and were fifth in total defense (275.3 yards yielded per contest).

West also spent five seasons (1993 to 1998) as the head coach at Clemson. He coached the Tigers to a win in the Peach Bowl a month after being hired and was a part of four bowl teams during his time at Clemson.

West's first head coaching job came at UT-Chattanooga. He guided the Mocs' program for one season before accepting the head coaching position at Clemson.

West began his coaching career in 1979 when he served as an assistant on the staff at Ole Miss. He then spent two seasons at Appalachian State, elevated to offensive coordinator in 1981.

From 1982-89, West served as an assistant coach at Clemson and was responsible for the outside linebackers. He was part of a coaching staff that led the Tigers to a 69-20-4 record and six Associated Press Top 20 rankings between 1982 and 1989. During that time, Clemson played in five bowl games, winning four, and claimed four ACC Championships.

West left Clemson for his alma mater Tennessee in 1990 and spent one season as the Volunteers' running backs coach. West then traveled to the University of South Carolina, where he was the defensive coordinator in 1991 and 1992. He left the Gamecocks' staff to become the head coach at UT-Chattanooga.

A former multi-sport standout at Gainesville (Ga.) High School, West earned his bachelor's degree from Tennessee in 1976. He was a three-year letterman on the Volunteer football team and twice lettered on the baseball squad. He was drafted by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 1976.

West, 61, has one son, Turner who is currently an assistant coach with the Dallas Cowboys.
