THIS WEEK: Week 12 got underway on Tuesday night as Central Michigan (6-5, 3-4) stunned MAC East-leading Ohio (7-4, 5-2) 27-20 at home as the Chippewas gained bowl eligibility and denied the Bobcats the East Division title. Wednesday, Toledo (9-2, 6-1) remained one game behind Western Michigan in the MAC West with a 37-19 victory over Ball State. Thursday in the American, Houston (8-2) hosts ACC foe Louisville in a key non-conference game. Friday in the AAC, Cincinnati (4-6, 1-5) needs two victories for bowl eligibility, starting with a home game against Memphis (6-4, 3-3). Saturday in the American, SMU (5-5, 3-3) will be bowl eligible with a home victory over East co-leader USF (8-2, 5-1). In Conference USA, two teams need one victory for bowl eligibility as UTSA (5-5) visits Texas A&M and Southern Miss (5-5, 3-3) visits West Division rival North Texas (4-6, 2-4). In the MAC, undefeated Western Michigan (10-0, 6-0) will host ESPN's College Gameday in the morning in Kalamazoo, and Buffalo (2-8, 1-5) in the afternoon.

POLLING PLACE: Western Michigan (MAC) remained No. 14 in the Associated Press Poll and No. 21 in the Amway Coaches' Poll after Week 11. WMU is also No. 21 in the College Football Playoff Rankings (Nov. 15). Houston (AAC), Navy (AAC), WKU (C-USA) and USF (AAC) are receiving votes in the AP poll. Receiving votes in the Coaches' Poll are Houston, Navy, UCF, and Toledo (MAC).

AROUND THE CONFERENCES

In the American, UCF, which didn't win a game last season, has improved by six wins in 2016. It is the second-largest turnaround from a winless season in college football since 2004.

Also, neither division in the American has been clinched as Temple, USF and UCF are battling for the East crown, and Navy, Houston and Tulsa are in the mix for the West title.

In Conference USA, Louisiana Tech has clinched the West Division title. WKU and Old Dominion continue to battle for the East Division crown.

In the MAC, the winner of Toledo-Western Michigan on Nov. 25 will decide the West Division title. In the East, either Ohio or Miami will win the division title.

Offensive Player of the Week

USF QB **Quinton Flowers**: The junior rushed for 210 yards and three TDs and passed for 263 yards and two TDs in a 49-42 win at Memphis.

Defensive Player of the Week

SMU CB **Horace Richardson**: The senior returned a pair of interceptions for touchdowns in a 55-31 victory at East Carolina.

Special Teams Player of the Week

Houston P **Dane Roy**: The freshman punted 11 times for a 44.2-yard average and six landed inside the 20 in a 30-18 victory over Tulane.

West Division Special Teams Player of the Week

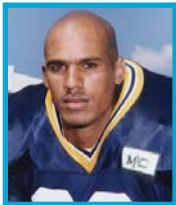
Toledo P **Nick Ellis**: The senior averaged 44.3 yards on six punts in a 31-24 victory over Northern Illinois.



ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT

Each week in 2016, the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl will spotlight an alumni player from each of our partner conferences: the American Athletic Conference, Conference USA and the Mid-American Conference.

JASON TAYLOR (AKRON)



Jason Taylor, a former star NFL defensive end and linebacker, was a two-time first-team All-MAC performer in his college career at Akron from 1993-96.

Taylor was a three-year starter for the Zips. He posted 279 tackles, 41 tackles for loss, 21 sacks, seven fumble recoveries, eight forced fumbles and three interceptions during his four seasons in Akron.

As a senior, he was a first-team All-MAC selection at defensive end after making 64 tackles (43 solo), and he led the team with 10 sacks and 18 tackles for loss. He added four fumble recoveries and three forced fumbles.

In his junior season, Taylor was a honorable mention All-America pick and a first-team All-MAC selection at linebacker. He led the team with 99 tackles, and he added five sacks, 11 tackles for loss and three forced fumbles.

He was selected in the third round of the 1997 NFL Draft by the Miami Dolphins, and he was selected to several All-Rookie teams after starting 11 games at defensive end.

In 2002, Taylor tied the Miami season record as he led the NFL with 18.5 sacks, including a run of eight consecutive games with a sack.

He was the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year in 2006 after posting 13.5 sacks, two interceptions and 10 forced fumbles.

Taylor played 13 of his 15 seasons with the Dolphins, and also spent the 2008 in Washington and 2010 with the New York Jets.

Taylor finished his career with 139.5 sacks, sixth all-time in NFL history. He was a three-time All-Pro, a six-time Pro Bowl selection and was the 2007 NFL Walter Payton Man of the Year.
