THE FACTORY

Toughness. Pride. Resilience. Those key words describe the EMU football program under Head Coach **Chris Creighton**. They are also terms befitting the proud residents of southeastern Michigan and their hardworking demeanor.

Inspired by this region of the state and the student-athletes' own backgrounds, the team has challenged itself to be "E Tough," committed to great effort, sacrifice and triumphing in the face of adversity. In this spirit, the team has nicknamed Rynearson Stadium "The Factory," a place where coaches and staff will go to work each day to help "E Tough" student-athletes become scholars, leaders, champions and impact men. "The Factory" will be highlighted by Division I Football's first gray FieldTurf playing surface.

Since taking over reigns of EMU Football in December 2013, Creighton has rallied the program to "close the gap" between its current status and the pursuit of its true potential. He has studied the school, its surroundings, recruiting base and the current student-athletes. The one common thread throughout has been an uncommon 'toughness' that permeates the program.

In this spirit, the program's E Tough mentality represents:

Team first
Obsessed with getting better
Unwavering in adversity
Great effort
Heart

The concept of the "EMU Gray" field was born during one of the squad's notoriously intense winter workouts in 2014. The squad was challenged to an outdoor practice on the snow-covered Rynearson Stadium field rather than the warm confines of their indoor practice facility. True to their E Tough demeanor, the team accepted the challenge. Throughout each drill of the bitter cold practice, Creighton delivered the message that EMU Football has the will to compete against "anyone, anytime and anywhere... even on a parking lot covered with broken glass." Inspired by his team's toughness and commitment that day, Creighton's idea of an "EMU Gray" field was born and soon shared with administrators.

The new look within Rynearson Stadium, and moniker, "The Factory" serves as visual and name recognition for the program's ideals. They are a constant reminder to the student-athletes that being E Tough means coming ready to roll up their sleeves and to never give in or let up.

"Our colors are green and white but our collars are blue," said Creighton. "The Factory is where our coaching staff goes to work and our players develop. It is our home and one that we will protect. When opponents come to The Factory we want to make it known that they are in for a 60-minute fight. Our goal is to make it one of the toughest places to play in the Mid-American Conference."

Southeastern Michigan has long been viewed as one of the most significant manufacturing centers in the country, and the iconic 'Automotive Capital of the World.' Despite battling difficult times in recent years, local communities' toughness and resilience has been on display, as the region is experiencing a dramatic rebirth.

EMU football student-athletes come from these communities and have brought this toughness to the team. Ypsilanti has its own proud history in the automobile and manufacturing industries. The city was the home of Apex Motors, Preston Tucker and his Preston '48, and the last Hudson automobile dealership. The nearby Willow Run manufacturing complex played a critical role in producing B-24 "Liberator" heavy bombers in the early years of World War II. It was also at this location that Rose Will Monroe, the film and poster representation of "Rosie the Riveter," actually worked as a riveter before becoming the manufacturing icon of the era.

BURDAY BLOCKS

When Head Coach Chris Creighton came onboard in 2014 he helped establish some new EMU initiatives.

- The Wrench a 51-pound pipe wrench given to Coach Creighton. It helps serve as a symbol of the team's mission to "close the gap." The tool's vices represent the gap.
- The Wall prior to running onto the field at home games EMU will break through a cinder block wall.
- Hammers of the Week the coaching staff will select hammers of the week for the big hit of the week. The selected players will have their number put on the sledge hammers used to knock down the wall.
- Turn it Up, Turn It Green a pregame prep rally inside the Convocation Center. The football team will arrive along with a special performance by the EMU marching band.

NASSAU, Bahamas (EMUEagles.com) – The Eastern Michigan University football team will break its 29-year bowl game drought when it participates in the third annual Popeyes Bahamas Bowl Friday, Dec. 23 in Nassau, Bahamas. The Eagles finished the regular season with a 7-5 mark and 4-4 record in conference play. It marked the first winning season in program history since 1995, and the most wins since 1989.

Eastern will meet the Old Dominion University Monarchs in a matchup of the Mid-American Conference against Conference USA. ODU is making its first bowl appearance in program history after finishing the regular season 9-3 and 7-1 in conference play. It is just the second year in which ODU was eligible for a bowl after transitioning from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) in 2011.

Kickoff from Thomas Robinson Stadium is set for 1 p.m. and the contest will be broadcast on ESPN. Steve Levy and Mack Brown will be in the booth, while Kaylee Hartung reports from the sideline. The game will also be aired on WEMU (89.1 FM) with veteran broadcasters **Matt Shepard**, **Rob Rubick** and **Chad Bush** calling the action on the field. WEMU's special 30-minute pregame show from the stadium begins at 12:30 p.m.

LET'S ROLL, LET'S BOWL: The Bahamas Bowl marks the second Division I bowl game in program history, and EMU's first since 1987. EMU is 1-0 in bowl games after a 30-27 California Bowl victory over San Jose State.

ALL-TIME VS. ODU: The Eagles and Monarchs have squared off twice since ODU's resurgence in 2011, as the teams had a home and home in 2014-15. Old Dominion took both sides of the series, winning the 2014 game in Norfolk, 17-3, and the return trip in Ypsilanti, 38-34, in the 2015 season opener.

Practice Procedures

Most practices are open to the media. However, all media are required to make an advance call to the EMU Athletic Media Relations Office to check on the status of practice for a particular day. Failure to do so may result in an individual's removal from the

Head Coach **Chris Creighton** is available to speak to the media via phone Monday-Thursday mornings. Coach Creighton will be available on the Mid-American Conference weekly conference call on Monday mornings. Individual players are available for interviews Monday-Wednesday. Please contact the EMU Athletic Media Relations Office at least 24-hours in advance to set up interviews. Players should not be contacted for interviews at their residences, on their cell phones, via e-mail, Facebook, Twitter and all other social networking entities.

During regular season practices, still photographers and videographers will be allowed to shoot only during pre-practice individual drills, which usually last approximately 15 minutes at the beginning of practice.

Media members covering practices or scrimmages will not be permitted to report any scouting information (formations, personnel groupings, etc.) without first speaking with a member of the EMU coaching staff or the media relations office. Failure to adhere to this guideline could result in the closing of all practices and scrimmages to the media.

First-year players, including freshmen and transfers, will be made available to the media <u>only</u> after they have made a significant contribution or at the coach's discretion.

Interview Policies (Postgame)

Post-game interviews for EMU will be conducted in Media Room A in the Convocation Center at the south end of Rynearson Stadium. The visiting coach will do interviews outside their lockerroom. Both head coaches will be available to the media after a 10-minute cooling off period. Individual players <u>may be</u> available for interviews at the conclusion of the game. <u>The lockerroom is closed to the media at all times</u>.



WHO ARE WE?: The Eagles will come into the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl following one of the most successful seasons in its 125-year history. EMU finished with a winning record for the first time since 1995, most wins (seven) since 1989, and its first bowl appearance since 1987 when EMU won the California Bowl. The Eagles tied the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) mark for biggest turnarounds in 2016, improving on its win total from one win in 2015, to seven this season.

Eastern is led on offense by redshirt junior quarterback **Brogan Roback**, who has put up gaudy numbers in his nine appearances this season, totaling six starts. He finished the regular season with 193 completions for 2,394 yards and 16 touchdowns. He had five 300+ yard games and a season-high of 468 yards. For his efforts, he was named MAC West Offensive Player of the Week three times. The offense gets its start up front from the experienced offensive line, which has 161 combined starts under its belt. The group has combined to allow the 13th fewest sacks in the nation, as well as the second fewest tackles for loss. On the ground, redshirt sophomore **lan Eriksen** led the rushing attack with 741 yards on 175 carries and nine scores. Junior **Sergio Bailey II** was the leading pass catcher with 55 receptions for 799 yards and six touchdowns.

Defensively, the Eagles forced 24 turnovers, good for 29th in the nation and second in the MAC. Redshirt sophomore **Kyle Rachwal** led EMU in tackles with 101 stops, while redshirt senior **Pat O'Connor** had 8.0 sacks, good for 38th in the nation and fourth in the MAC.

MAC-BEST 18 PLAYERS NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-MAC: The 2016 Eastern Michigan University football team had 18 student-athletes representing the Green and White on the 2016 Mid-American Conference Football Academic All-MAC Team, the conference office announced Dec. 13. The 18 Eagles on the list are the most in the MAC and also the most in EMU history.

Making the team were Blake Banham, Jason Beck, Daniel Buschman, Ian Eriksen, Paul Fricano, Cole Gardner, Juan Giraldo, Jeremiah Harris, Clay Holford, Brody Hoying, Jake Hurcombe, Bryce Kemp, Luke Maclean, DaQuan Pace, Robert Pavletich, Brendan Renius, Ike Spearman, and Breck Turner.

Gardner and Renius earned the honor for the third straight season, while Banham, Beck, Buschman, and Pace garnered the award for the second time in their respective careers. In total, 146 student-athletes were named to the team this season.

The Academic All-MAC honor is for a student who has excelled in athletics and academics. To qualify, a student must have at least a 3.20 cumulative GPA and have participated in at least 50 percent of the contests for that particular sport. First-year students and junior college transfers in their first year of residence are not eligible for the award.

EIGHT PLAYERS NAMED ALL-MAC: EMU saw eight of its student-athletes named to All-Mid-American Conference Teams, the league office announced Nov. 30. The eight honorees are the most since the 1996 campaign. Additionally, the eight honorees are the most under third-year head coach **Chris Creighton**, who had just five total postseason MAC award winners during the first two seasons of his tenure, three in 2014 and two a season ago.

For EMU, **Pat O'Connor**, a 2014 First Team All-MAC award winner, led the way and was named to the conference's first team for the second time in his career, while **Austin Barnes**, **Paul Fricano**, and **Cole Gardner** were each named to the second team. In addition, **Sergio Bailey II**, **Jeremiah Harris**, **DaQuan Pace**, and **Andrew Wylie** all garnered All-MAC Third Team honors. Besides O'Connor, every other player earned All-MAC honors for the first time in their careers.

A FIRST FOR THE EAGLES: The Bahamas Bowl will mark the first time in the 125-year program history of the Eastern Michigan program will play a football game outside of the United States.

TRACKING THE MILES: The voyage from Ypsilanti, Mich. to Nassau, Bahamas is a whopping 1,240-mile journey. For comparison's sake, EMU traveled 1,911 total miles in six road games this season, including just 659 for the four road trips within the Mid-American Conference.

WHERE IN THE WORLD IS CHRIS CREIGHTON?: In his head coaching career, Chris Creighton has racked up the frequent flyer miles, coaching games in six different countries. With the stage set for a Bahamas Bowl battle against Old Dominion, Creighton will see that total move to seven as the Bahamas is added to a list that already consists of the United States, Sweden, Austria, Panama, Tanzania, and Germany.

BIGGEST TURNAROUNDS: Eastern Michigan improved on its 2015 win total by six games, from one win to seven in 2016. This is tied for the lead in the FBS for the largest turnaround from 2015 to 2016. UCF, Wyoming, and Colorado all had six-game improvements this season.

BREAKING THE RECORD BOOK: The Eagles have rewritten the record book this season with 103 different all-time top performances, as well as 16 instances where EMU set a new program record. This includes redshirt senior **Pat O'Connor** setting the all-time sack record with 19.5, as well as the team setting the season total offense record with 5,447 total yards.

LOOKING FOR 150: A victory over ODU would give **Chris Creighton** his 150th career victory.

was named the 37th Head Football Coach at Eastern Michigan University, Dec. 11, 2013, by Vice President/

Director of Intercollegiate Athletics Heather Lyke. Creighton will start his third season as the head man at EMU in the 2016 season.

During his 19-year head coaching career, the 46-year-old Creighton has accumulated eight conference titles and an all-time record of 142-67 (.679 winning percentage). He departed Drake with the highest winning percentage in school history (.667) after also posting 63 wins as the head coach at Wabash College and 32 at Ottawa University.

During the 2015 campaign, the Eagles finished the regular season ranked nationally in the top-60 in seven statistical categories to go along with 11 top-five rankings in the Mid-American Conference. EMU finished the year with 39 touchdowns, a mark that is tied for the fifth-most in a single-season during the squad's 124-year history, while its 4,560 yards of total offense is also the fifth most.

On the ground, EMU churned out the 14th-best single-season rushing total at 1,894 yards. Through the air, EMU quarterbacks combined for 2,666 yards passing, ranking seventh in program single-season annals. EMU's passing attack spread the wealth with seven different receivers having 20-or-more receptions, Eastern Michigan was one of just three schools nationally to accomplish that feat.

Individually, Darius Jackson turned in one of the finest seasons in Eastern Michigan history in 2015, setting the school's single-season record with 16 touchdowns. He also became the first EMU tailback since Bronson Hill in 2013 to rush for more than 1,000 yards in a season and is just the 13th player in program history to do so.

In his six seasons at the helm of the Bulldogs, Creighton racked up a 35-13 (.729) record in Pioneer Football League action and a 31-9 (.775) record the last five seasons. Just the seventh DU coach to win 40-or-more games and the fastest to do so, Creighton needed just 60 games to accomplish the feat.

In his time at Drake, Creighton boasted a 30-5 home record and a 21-2 home conference record, going undefeated against five conference opponents. Drake had an 11-game home win streak during Creighton's tenure as well as winning 16-straight home conference games with him at the helm.

The energetic but veteran coach was named a winner of the Giant Steps Award presented by the National Consortium for Academics and Sports as part of National Student-Athlete Day on April 6, 2011. Creighton, awarded in the Coaching category, was one of just five 2011 winners of the Giant Steps Award, given annually to individuals who use sport to positively affect social change, actualizing the mission of the NCAS. The awards honor student-athletes, athletic administrators, civic leaders, coaches, parents, organizations, and other individuals who demonstrate an outstanding ability to manage life on and off the field, and who demonstrate a commitment to the betterment of

As an All-America guarterback, Creighton led Ke-

Chris Creighton | nyon (Ohio) College to its only North Coast Athletic Conference title in 1989 and was named conference player of the year after setting single-season conference records for passing yardage (2,843) and touchdowns (29). He was inducted into the Kenyon College Athletic Hall of Fame in 2008.

> Creighton earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from Kenyon College in 1991 and a master's degree from Concordia (III.) University in 1993.

> Creighton is the first active head coach to be hired at Eastern Michigan since Jim Harkema in 1983. Harkema was the head coach at Grand Valley State University (1973-82) before taking over the EMU program and leading it to its only Mid-American Conference Championship in 1987 and last bowl appearance.

> Chris and his wife, Heather, have two daughters, Hallie and Kate, and a son, Luke.

ROBACK RISING: Redshirt junior **Brogan Roback** has put up gaudy numbers in his nine appearances this season, totaling six starts. He finished the regular season with 193 completions for 2,394 yards and 16 touchdowns. He had five 300+ yard games and a season-high of 468 yards. For his efforts, he was named MAC West Offensive Player of the Week three times. For his career, he has 5,463 yards and 36 passing touchdowns, which ranks fourth and third all-time in program history, respectively, while his 474 completions rank fourth as well.

HISTORIC OFFENSIVE SEASON: The Eastern Michigan offense attained one of the biggest offensive seasons in its history in 2016. The team set the single season record for total offense (5,447), passing offense (3,549), total points (365), touchdown passes (23), and extra points (40), while finishing second in total plays (914), completions (283), and first downs (275) and third in total touchdowns (45).

CALIFORNIA BOWL REWIND: The then-Hurons faced tough odds to defeat the Spartans of San Jose State, as EMU entered the contest as 17-point underdogs. **Jim Harkema's** "Road Warriors" squad overcame the odds as they knocked off SJSU, 30-27. The EMU offense ground out 212 yards rushing, including 130 yards from game MVP **Gary Patton**. The EMU defense also rose to the occasion, holding San Jose State to just 81 yards rushing.

BAHAMAS CONNECTION: Former EMU women's track star **Sevatheda Fynes**, a native of the Bahamas, donned the Green and White during the mid-90's. As an Eagle, Fynes posted program records in the 60m and 200m indoor races, as well as the 100m and 200m outdoor events during her career. After her time at EMU, Fynes won an Olympic silver medal in the 4x100 relay at the 1996 games in Atlanta, Ga. before securing an Olympic gold medal in the 4x100 relay for her native country in the 2000 summer games in Sydney, Australia.

SEVEN EAGLES EARN ALL-MAC HONORS FROM PHIL STEELE: The EMU football team had seven of its student-athletes named to Phil Steele Postseason All-Mid-American Conference Teams, announced Dec. 12. The Eagles only had two named to the list last season. For EMU, redshirt senior defensive lineman Pat O'Connor led the way being named to the first team, while redshirt junior punter Austin Barnes, redshirt freshman placekicker Paul Fricano, and redshirt senior offensive lineman Cole Gardner were each named to the second team. In addition, redshirt sophomore defensive lineman Jeremiah Harris, senior defensive back DaQuan Pace, and redshirt senior offensive lineman Andrew Wylie all garnered All-MAC Third Team honors.

NEW RECEIVERS THRIVING: This season, EMU's five leading receivers are all newcomers. A trio of JUCO receivers have found success donning the Green and White, as juniors **Sergio Bailey II**, **Antoine Porter**, and **Johnnie Niupalau** have totaled 799, 491, and 328 receiving yards, respectively, on the season. Additionally, redshirt freshmen **Nigel Kilby** and **Dieuly Aristilde** have been stellar catching the ball, as they currently have the third and fourth-most receiving yards this year with 437 and 412, respectively. The five players have also combined to catch 19 of EMU's 23 touchdown passes on the season.

ROAD GRADERS: The offense gets its start up front from the experienced offensive line, which has 166 combined starts under its belt. The group has combined to allow the 12th-fewest sacks in the nation, as well as the second fewest tackles for loss. Anchoring the line are four redshirt seniors who have combined to make 141 of the starts, including **Andrew Wylie** (45), **Jake Hurcombe** (36), **Cole Gardner** (31), and **Darien Terrell** (29).

INSIDE THE WINS: The Eagles have posted wins over Mississippi Valley State, Charlotte, Wyoming, Bowling Green, Ohio, Ball State, and Central Michigan. Together, those teams combined for a 35-50 record, while Wyoming and Ohio both finished 8-5 on the year and won their conference's division.

<u>O'CONNOR THE SACK KING:</u> Senior **Pat O'Connor** finished the regular season at 19.5 sacks for his career, making him the program leader since 1998. Former Eagle **Kevin Howe** previously set the record with 17.5 from 2003-06. O'Connor's eight sacks rank 38th in the nation and fourth in the MAC.

PAUL OF DUTY: Redshirt freshman **Paul Fricano** broke the program record for the most PAT's made in a single-season with 40. Fricano finished 40-of-41 this season on extra point opportunities. Fricano is 17-of-22 on field goals, which ranks him 49th in the nation in field goal percentage (5th MAC), as well as 25th in field goals per game (2nd MAC). In all, his 91 points rank third in a single-season for EMU all-time.

<u>O'VERTAKING THE CHARTS:</u> If **Pat O'Connor** and **Chris O'Risky** play in EMU's bowl game, Dec. 23, they will have played in their 49th career game. Additionally, the duo will become the program record holders in game played, having played in more than any other Eagle.

MICHIGAN MAC SCHOOLS MAKE HISTORY: For the first time ever, all three Michigan-based Mid-American Conference schools are headed to a bowl game. Eastern Michigan, alongside Western Michigan and Central Michigan, boast a combined record of 26-11 this season.

EARNING THE EIGHTH: The Eagles head into their first bowl game in nearly three decades in search of their eighth win of the season, currently posting a 7-5 overall record. Eastern Michigan has not posted eight wins in a season since 1987, when EMU finished the season 10-2 under **Jim Harkema**. If the Eagles were to defeat ODU, it would be just the seventh time in EMU's 125-year history that the Green and White have posted eight-or-more wins in a season all-time.

Prior to the Bahamas Bowl, no EMU team has ever played 13 games in a single-season.

MOODY EARNS PFF SECOND TEAM ALL-AMERICAN HONORS: Sophomore Justin Moody was named a Second Team All-American on special teams by *Pro Football Focus*. Moody played in 11 games for EMU but made a statement on special teams. The Richmond, Va. native finished the year with 49 tackles (30 solo, 19 assist) to go along with 1.5 tackles for a loss of three yards. Of those 49 stops, 12 occurred while playing special teams. Moody recorded 10 takedowns on kickoffs and two more on punt returns. In addition, Moody also returned four kickoffs for the Eagles for a total of 71 yards. His longest return was a 27-yarder in a road victory over eventual Mid-American Conference East Division champion Ohio University, Oct. 15.

2,000-AND COUNTING: Redshirt junior quarterback **Brogan Roback** surpassed the 2,000-yard passing mark this season following a 184 yard performance against Northern Illinois, Nov. 16. The Toledo, Ohio native is the first EMU signal-caller since **Walter Church** to throw for 2,000-or-more yards in consecutive seasons. Church tossed for 2,650 yards during the 1998 campaign before following it up with 2,015 in 1999. Roback has 2,039 yards via the air this season after posting 2,304 in 2015.

In total, Roback becomes just the third EMU signal-caller to throw for more than 2,000-yards in multiple seasons. Church did so three times, while **Charlie Batch** managed the feat in 1995 and 1997.

HUGE HANDS HARRIS: Redshirt sophomore **Jeremiah Harris** recorded his second blocked field goal attempt of the season and in his career. The block came in the first quarter of the game against Northern Illinois, Nov. 16. The Eagles held a 7-0 lead when the 36-yard attempt was blocked, and the offensive drive would result in an eight play, 80-yard touchdown drive for the Eagles. Harris' first block came on Sept. 23 versus Wyoming, getting his hands on a 22-yard attempt to try and tie the game at 20 late in the third quarter. He is one of just 29 players in the FBS to block multiple kicks this season.

ROBACK IS MR. 5,000: Redshirt junior **Brogan Roback** is the fourth quarterback in program history to surpass 5,000 yards passing in a career. After entering the NIU game with 4,924 yards, Roback threw for 184-yards on 17 completions, compiling 5,108 career yards through the air, and 34 passing touchdowns. Roback leads the team with 2,394 yards on 193 completions and 16 touchdowns this season.

An emphasis has been placed on securing home-and-home series with other members of the so called "Group of Five" which includes the American Athletic Conference, Conference USA, the Mountain West Conference, and the Sun Belt Conference. In addition, the Eagles will still play one road contest versus a "Power Five School" which includes members from the Atlantic Coast Conference, the Big Ten Conference, the Big 12 Conference, the Pacific 12 Conference, and the Southeastern Conference.

ELECTRIC ERIKSEN: Redshirt sophomore **Ian Eriksen** had a career high game, rushing for 174-yards on 30 carries and two touchdowns in the loss to Northern Illinois, Nov. 16. He also led the team in receiving in this game with four receptions for 48-yards. It was his third 100-yard rushing game of the season and in his career, and the second consecutive game of over 100-yards on the ground.

AUSTIN BARNES NAMED SEMIFINALIST FOR RAY GUY AWARD: Redshirt junior punter **Austin Barnes** was named a semifinalist for the 2016 Ray Guy Award, which honors the nation's top collegiate punter, the Augusta Sports Council announced Nov. 11. The 10 candidates were voted on by a national body of sports writers, coaches, and sports information directors.

BOMBS AWAY BARNES: Redshirt junior **Austin Barnes** was successful punting the ball for the Eagles this season. The Ray Guy semifinalist punted the ball 60 times for an average of 43.73 yards and a career-long of 61 yards. He pinned opponents inside the 20 yard line, 27 times, and had 18 kicks of 50+ yards. His season average ranked 22nd in the country and second in the MAC. His average of 50.0 against Bowling Green, Oct. 1 was an EMU single-game record, while his season average broke the 36-year single-season record. Currently, Barnes ranks second in career average (42.6), while his 7,548 career yardage ranks seventh all-time.

BUMPING UP THE WINS: With seven wins this season, the Eagles have produced more wins than the previous four years combined. Last year, EMU won one game, while the squad won two apiece in the 2012, 2013 and 2014 seasons.

FOCUSING ON THE FUMBLES: EMU's 13 fumble recoveries this season rank them fifth in the country and of course tops in the MAC. Senior **Pat O'Connor** leads the way with four forced fumbles, which is good for fourth in the nation and first in the MAC. Redshirt sophomore **Jeremiah Harris** is next with three and is ranked 28th in the nation (third in the MAC).

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE: Eastern tied the turnover battle, 1-1, against Central Michigan, Nov. 22. In total, Eastern holds a 24-21 TO advantage with a safety, 10 interceptions, and 13 fumble recoveries. Not only is the squad getting the ball back, but it is taking advantage of it and putting points on the board. EMU has turned its 24 turnovers into 85 points, including 11 touchdowns.

CLUTCH ON FOURTH DOWN: EMU has converted on 6-of-10 fourth down tries this season, which ranks 10th in the nation and second in the MAC.

THE DIFFERENCE A YEAR MAKES: In its first season under new defensive coordinator **Neal Neathery** and his 4-2-5 scheme, Eastern Michigan has seen remarkable improvement in its overall defense. Through 12 games this season, EMU has allowed 5,2318 total yards (435.9 per game). Last season, the Eagles had allowed 6,231 yards (519.2 per game). EMU's defense ranks 87th in the country and eighth in the MAC.

EFFICIENT IN THE RED ZONE: Both sides of the ball have got it done this season within the 20 yard lines. The offense has scored on 90.4 percent of its red zone opportunities, which is 19th in the nation and third in the MAC, while the defense has only allowed scores on 82.3 percent of red zone possessions, good for 58th in the nation and fourth in the conference.

COMEBACK KIDS: The 21-point, come-from-behind win over Ball State, Nov. 8, tied the largest deficit overcome by an EMU team in program history. EMU previously came back from 21 points down in 2010 when the Eagles defeated Ball State in overtime at Scheumann Stadium, which also marked the last time EMU defeated BSU.

ROBACK IN THE CLUTCH: Not only did EMU's 21-point come-from-behind victory over Ball State, Nov. 8, tie the program record for the largest in program history, it also marked the third fourth-quarter game-winning drive by redshirt junior **Brogan Roback**. The Toledo, Ohio native marched the Eagles down the field with 1:37 ticks left on the clock, completing 6-of-7 attempts on the drive to set the Green and White up with first and goal with 34 seconds remaining. Redshirt sophomore **lan Eriksen** punched it in from the one yard line and Roback found junior **Sergio Bailey II** for the two-point conversion, lifting EMU to a 48-41 victory.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION: The Eagle offense came alive in the 48-41 win over Ball State, Nov. 8. The Eagles sprung for 622 yards of total offense, including 468 through the air and 154 on the ground. It was the fourth-highest total offensive effort from EMU in program history, and the most since 2012. The 35 first downs were also the second-most in program history behind the 38 against Central Michigan in 2008.

*Secondary bowl backup in San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl **CONDUCTING THE OFFENSIVE MACHINE:** Redshirt junior **Brogan Roback** continued his stellar season with his best game as an Eagle yet in the 48-41 win over Ball State, Nov. 8. The Toledo native threw for a career-high 468 yards on 37-of-71 passing, both of which were career-highs as well, and three touchdown. The 37 completions ranked fourth in a single game all-time, while 71 attempts were third in a single-game all-time. It was the third-most passing yards in a game in program history, and the most since **Andy Schmitt** set the program record with 516 in 2008. The dual-threat QB also got it done on the ground, with a career-high tying 41 yards on eight rushes, as well as his fourth career rushing score. The 468 yards were the 22nd most by an FBS player in a single game this season and the second most by a MAC player. For his efforts, he was named the MAC West Division Offensive Player of the Week for the second time this season.

ROAD KILL: With the 48-41 win over Ball State, Nov. 8, Eastern Michigan picked up its fourth road victory of the season, the first time EMU has accomplished this feat since 1987. That year, EMU won away from home against Miami, Kent State, Western Michigan, and Toledo on their way to a 10-2 season and a California Bowl victory.

PACE WITH THE PICKS: Senior **DaQuan Pace** had two crucial interceptions in the 48-41 win over Ball State, Nov. 8. His first came in the end zone in the fourth quarter to halt a Ball State drive, while his second came at the end of the game to seal the victory. They were just the third and fourth INTs of Pace's career, who is the EMU all-time leader in passes broken up.

BUSCHMAN'S BIG DAY: Redshirt junior **Dan Buschman** had the best day of his Eastern career in the 48-41 win over Ball State, Nov. 8. The tight end had two touchdown catches, totaling 31 yards, which were the first two TD catches of his career. Prior to the game, Buschman had just six catches for 103 yards.

DEFENSE MAKING THE STOPS: Despite giving up 41 points in the win over Ball State, Nov. 8, the defense did not allow a third down conversion until late in the fourth quarter, and held the Cardinals to just 2-of-13 on third downs in the game. The nine punts forced was a season-high for the Eagles.

DROPPING DIMES WITH DIEULY: Redshirt freshman **Dieuly Aristidle** had a breakout game against Miami, Oct. 29, hauling in seven catches for a career-high 193-yards and a score. Aristidle's performance placed him in ninth all-time in the EMU record books for receiving yards in a single game, and it was the most amount of receiving yards for an EMU player since Oct. 9, 2004. Overall, the 193 yards also ranks 25th most in a single-game this season and second-best among MAC wide receivers. Coming into the game, he had just one reception for 20 yards, and now he holds the longest touchdown reception of the season at 75 yards, which was also his first career touchdown. It was the most single-game receiving yards this season for any EMU receiver.

TURNING OVER THE BRONCOS: The Eagles did something no one else has done against No. 20 Western Michigan, Oct. 22, and that was force multiple turnovers on the nationally ranked Broncos. Redshirt sophomore **Jeremiah Harris** had a strip sack in the first quarter, which was recovered by sophomore **Kwanii Figueroa**. It was the second fumble lost by WMU this season. Later in the game, EMU intercepted the first pass of Western's season when redshirt sophomore **Ross Williams** undercut a throw down the middle for the first INT of his career. They were just the second and third TOs of the year for Western.

<u>PUTTING THE PRESSURE ON:</u> When the Eagles took a 17-14 lead in the second quarter against No. 20 Western Michigan, Oct. 22, it was the first time Western had trailed at home in four games this season.

CLUTCH ON FOURTH DOWN: In the game against No. 20 WMU, Oct. 22, Eastern converted on all three fourth down tries, including one that turned into a 29-yard touchdown from **Brogan Roback** to **Antoine Porter**. It was the first fourth down conversion for EMU since the season opener against Mississippi Valley State.

NOT BACKING DOWN AGAINST THE BRONCOS: With the 45-31 defeat at the hands of No. 20 Western Michigan, Oct. 22, the 14-point loss was the closest margin of defeat for EMU against a ranked opponent in 13 tries. The previous low margin of defeat for EMU was 16 when they lost 23-7 to No. 21/20 Michigan State, Sept. 22, 2012. It was also the most points scored against a ranked squad, bettering the 22 put up by EMU last year at No. 9/8 LSU, Oct. 3, 2015.

OFFENSIVE LINE SHINES: The EMU offensive line did not yield a sack against No. 20 Western Michigan. Oct. 22. It was the fourth game EMU has kept the QB clean on the day.

<u>VICTORY IN ATHENS:</u> With the win against Ohio, Oct. 15, the Eagles picked up their first road victory against Ohio since 1994. It was also just the fifth time that EMU has defeated the Bobcats in Athens.

CAREER DAY FOR ROBACK LEADS TO CO-OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE **WEEK HONORS:** Redshirt junior **Brogan Roback** had a career day against Ohio, Oct. 15, passing for a career-best 347 yards on a record 29 completions and three touchdowns, all coming in the second half. It was the fifth threetouchdown performance of his career, and the second of the season. It was the second 300+ yard passing game of Roback's career and it was tied for the 26th best single-game passing performance in program history. For his efforts, he was named a Manning Award Star of the Week as well as the MAC West Division's Co-Offensive Player of the Week for the period ending Oct. 15. It marked the first weekly award of his career and the fifth league accolade by an Eagle this season.

BEST START SINCE 1995: With the 27-20 victory at Ohio, the Eagles moved to 5-2 on the season, their best start since the 1995 campaign.

ROAD VICTORIES: With the victory at Ohio, the Green and White picked up their third consecutive road victory for the first time since 1967. That year, EMU defeated Eastern Illinois, Case Western, and Ferris State on the road. Eastern will next attempt to win its fourth consecutive road game, which has not occurred since 1955 when the team bested Baldwin-Wallace, Western Illinois, Eastern Illinois, and Northern Illinois.

PACE WITH THE PICK: Senior DaQuan Pace had a solid game against the Ohio Bobcats, Oct. 15, picking up a clutch interception in the second quarter to halt an Ohio drive. The INT was his first of the season and the second of his career. He also had another pass breakup to increase his career total to 23, which is the EMU record for breakups since 1998.

SECOND HALF OFFENSIVE TURNAROUND: The EMU offense opened the contest against Ohio with a quick 12 play, 77-yard drive to put three points on the board. However, the offense then could not find a rhythm for the remainder of the half, going three-and-out four of the next six drives with a turnover and missed field goal. Following the half, the Eagles were able to make some crucial adjustments, and went on to score on all four of its second half drives, totaling 24 points. The successful drives were bolstered by EMU going 6-for-8 on third downs in the second half alone.

NEW EAGLES SEE ACTION: A pair of Eagles made their debuts in the team's victory over Ohio, Oct. 15. Both freshman Willie Parker and redshirt freshman Dieuly Aristilde donned the Green and White for the first time in Athens. So far this year, 35 newcomers have seen the field for EMU.

RALLYING TO RYNEARSON: After starting the season 4-1, the best start for the Eagles since 1995, EMU drew its 10th largest crowd in stadium history against Toledo, Oct. 8, with 21,412 on the 96th EMU Homecoming.

SPEARMAN STOPS: Eastern Michigan redshirt senior linebacker Ike Spearman led the Eagles defensively against Toledo, Oct. 8. Spearman tied for the team-lead with 11 tackles (3 solo, 8 assisted) against the Rockets. The 11 stops marked a season-best for the Saint John, Ind. native and marked his most since Nov. 9, 2013 when he posted 13 tackles in EMU's win over Western Michigan.

GETTING TO THE QUARTERBACK: Sophomore **Kwanii Figueroa** recorded the first sack of his career against Toledo, Oct. 8. It was just the third sack given up by Toledo this year, and his fifth total tackle of the season.

KILBY NAMED TO THE JOHN MACKEY AWARD MIDSEASON WATCH LIST: The John Mackey Award has named redshirt freshman Nigel Kilby to its midseason watch list, announced Oct. 12. The first-year tight end is one of 30 Division I tight ends named to the list.

Of the 30 members of the watch list, Kilby is the only freshman to be named to it and is one of just three underclassmen. He is also one of four MAC tight ends to be considered for the honor.

MADE IN MICHIGAN: The 2016 EMU squad boasts 38 players that hail from the Great Lakes State, 21 more than the next closest state.

KILBY NAMED JOHN MACKEY TIGHT END OF THE WEEK: The John Mackey Award named redshirt freshman Nigel Kilby as its Tight End of the Week, Oct. 5. The first-year tight end had a career game in EMU's 28-25 win over Bowling Green State University, Oct. 1. Kilby finished the contest as EMU's leading receiver, notching career-highs with 92 yards on five receptions and a crucial touchdown, which gave EMU a 21-10 lead. This weekly honor was started in 2004 to draw attention to individual play by tight ends during the active season.

EMU RECEIVES VOTE IN THE AMWAY COACHES POLL: EMU received one point in the Oct. 2 release of the Amway Coaches Poll after its 4-1 start to the 2016 season. The Eagles were one of 25 teams outside the top 25 that received votes. The poll is made up of 64 Football Bowl Subdivision head coaches from around the country and all are members of the American Football Coaches Association.

The recognition marks the first time since 1987 that Eastern Michigan has received votes in a national poll. EMU collected 18 points in the final release of The Associated Press rankings following the then-Huron's 30-27 upset of San Jose State in the California Bowl. Should the poll have carried out further, EMU would have been ranked 31st behind Texas (26), Indiana (27), Pittsburgh (28), Wyoming (29), and Penn State (30).

MILESTONE VICTORY OVER THE FALCONS: With EMU's 28-25 win over Bowling Green, Oct. 1, the Eagles defeated BGSU for the first time since 2008. Furthermore, the win was EMU's first MAC-opening road win since the 2005 season, which also represents the last time EMU recorded two road wins in the same season, with victories at Central Michigan, Sept. 24, and at Buffalo, Nov. 19.

SETTING THE PACE: With his two pass breakups against Bowling Green, Oct. 1, senior DaQuan Pace is now the EMU record holder since the stat began being tracked for EMU in 1998. He passed former Eagle Jerry Gaines who had 18 from 2001-04.

TURNER TOPS 100: Redshirt freshman Breck Turner broke the 100-yard plateau for the first time in his career, Oct. 1, against Bowling Green. Turner ran for a career-high 107 yards on 17 carries, including a touchdown. Eclipsing the century mark, Turner became the third different Eagle to rush for 100+ yards this season, joining lan Eriksen and Shaq Vann.

TRICKERY PAYS OFF: The Eagles reached into their bag of tricks against the Falcons, Oct. 1, setting up a score. Brogan Roback took the snap and immediately tossed a screen pass to Isaac Holder who then fired a 64yard strike downfield to Nigel Kilby. Holder's 64-yard completion was the longest play of the game and marked the longest pass by a non-QB since Josh LeDuc tossed a 71-yard completion in 2010.

HOLDER OF MANY TRADES: Redshirt freshman Isaac Holder showed off some of his versatility in the 28-25 win over Bowling Green, Oct. 1. The former high school quarterback completed a 64-yard pass on a trick play to set EMU up in the redzone. On the very next play, the current wide receiver caught his first career TD on an eight-yard reception from **Brogan Roback**.

PASS BREAK UPS: Eastern Michigan's defense stepped up in EMU's 28-25 win over BGSU, especially in the passing game. The Green and White defense totaled 12 pass break ups on the night, the most this season. In fact, the dozen of denials equaled the number the Eagles had accumulated through the first four games of the season, pushing their season total to 24. Jason Beck, DaQuan Pace, and Mike Brown each recorded two in the victory, while six other players added one apiece.

COLE GARDNER NAMED A SEMIFINALIST FOR NFF CAMPBELL TROPHY: Redshirt senior offensive lineman Cole Gardner is one of 156 individuals nominated for this year's William V. Campbell Trophy. The Campbell Trophy is recognized as college football's premier scholar-athlete award. Gardner is pursuing his master's degree in business administration at EMU after graduating in April with a 3.46 GPA in supply chain management.

HARRIS SELECTED MAC WEST DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: In an attempt to tie the game in the third quarter, Wyoming tried a 22-yard field goal, but it would be blocked by Jeremiah Harris to keep the Eagles in the lead, 20-17. The last time an Eagle blocked a field goal was against Northern Illinois on Oct. 25, 2014, when Willie Creear and Mike Steals got a block. Harris was all over the field for the Eagles, forcing a quarterback hurry and blocking a pass at the line of scrimmage in addition to making the momentum shifting block. For his efforts, he was named the MAC West Division Defensive Player of the Week for the period ending Sept. 24. It was the first weekly award of his career.

21 YEARS AGO TO THE DAY: With the win over Wyoming, Sept. 23, Eastern Michigan's overall record moved to 3-1, the best start to a season for EMU since the 1995 campaign. In that season, Eastern Michigan beat Ohio, 31-20, Sept. 23. To put that in perspective, just 32 players on the current roster were born when the Eagles defeated the Bobcats, Sept. 23, 1995. **Johnnie Niupalau**, the oldest Eagle on the squad, was two years, 10 months, and 27 days old the last time EMU opened the season 3-1. Meanwhile the youngest player, **Tyler Lyle**, was not born until three years and 34 days after the Eagles secured the win, as he was born on Oct. 27, 1998.

NO NONSENSE IN THE NON-CONFERENCE: With the 3-1 mark in non-conference play this season, EMU put up its best mark in those games since they first played a four-team non-conference schedule in the 2000 season. In addition, EMU posted two wins over FBS opponents in non-conference play this year, the first time Eastern has done that since 1987 when Eastern defeated Northern Illinois, 32-31, and San Jose State in the California Bowl, 30-27.

BRECK TURNER BREAKING THROUGH: After accumulating just 28 yards in his first three games at EMU, redshirt freshman **Breck Turner** broke through against Wyoming, Sept. 23. Turner broke free for a 50-yard touchdown run which helped spark EMU to a come-from-behind 27-24 win. It was the first TD of his young EMU career, and was also his new career-long rush.

CALHOUN IN THE CLUTCH: "True" freshman **Vince Calhoun** had the biggest game of his young Eagle career against Wyoming, Sept. 23. The Middletown, Ohio native had a career-high eight tackles, including five solo stops, while also forcing a fumble and picking up his first career interception. The pick came late in the fourth quarter and helped seal the 27-24 win for the Eagles. For his efforts, he was selected the College Sports Madness' MAC Defensive Player of the Week.

ROBACK DIRECTS ANOTHER GAME WINNING DRIVE: Seeing his first action of the 2016 season, redshirt junior **Brogan Roback** was immediately tossed into a pressure situation, with his team down four points in the fourth quarter against Wyoming, Sept. 23. Starting with the ball on Wyoming's 47 and 2:37 left on the clock, Roback orchestrated a five-play drive for the game-winning score. It was the third game-winning drive Roback has been a part of in his EMU career. Previously, the Toledo native helped lead the Eagles to victory against Western Michigan in 2013 and Morgan State in 2014.

FRICANO AGAIN NAMED MAC WEST DIVISION SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Redshirt freshman kicker **Paul Fricano** was named the Mid-American Conference West Division Special Teams Player of the Week for the period ending Sept. 17. It marks the second time in the last three weeks that the Rochester, N.Y. native has won the award. Fricano had a perfect game against the Charlotte 49ers from a kicking perspective. Fricano was a perfect three-of-three with field goals of 22, 30, and 36 yards, while he was also four-of-four on PATs. With his kick from 36 yards out, Fricano set a new career-best.

HIGH PERCENTAGE PASSING: In Eastern's road win against the 49ers of Charlotte, Sept. 17, quarterback **Todd Porter** had a very effective day passing the ball. Porter managed to finish the game 24-of-31 passing, marking a completion percentage of 77.4 percent. This figure is the highest completion percentage for an Eagle QB since 2008.

PICKS FOR PICKETT: Sophomore Jaylen Pickett had a career day against the Charlotte 49ers at linebacker. The Zephyrhills, Fla. native secured two interceptions on the day, which were the first two for the squad this season. He was also able to return one of those for a touchdown, marking the first time since last season against Central Michigan, Nov. 27, that EMU had a pick six. Overall, the pair of picks was the 11th time that the Green and White have accomplished the feat since 1999. Most recently, Jermaine Jenkins nabbed two interceptions against Indiana State in 2008.

STRANGE KICKOFF GOES VIRAL: In the Eagles' road win in Charlotte, the Eagles had a very bizarre kickoff at the 3:51 mark in the third quarter. After **Jaylen Pickett** returned an interception for a touchdown, the 49ers were called for multiple personal foul penalties. After totaling the penalty yardage, the Eagles kicked off from the opponent 20-yard line. They attempted an onside kick, but UNCC recovered the ball.

OFFENSIVE ERUPTION: The Eagles' 61-14 win over MVSU saw the offense have a historic day. The Green and White rolled up 61 points, the most scored since 2004. Meanwhile the margin of victory (47) was the largest in a season opener since 2008.

4-2-5 EQUALS SUCCESS: EMU only allowed 201 yards of total offense against MVSU in the debut game of new defensive coordinator **Neal Neathery** and his 4-2-5 system. That marked the fewest yards allowed in a game in the **Chris Creighton** era, which eclipsed the previous careerlow by 166 yards. Additionally, it marked the first time EMU had held an opponent to 14 points-or-less since Oct. 22, 2011, when EMU hung on for a 14-10 win over Western Michigan.

STOUT RUN DEFENSE: In addition to the Eagle offense shining in the season-opener, the defense did a fantastic job of stopping the run. The Delta Devils were only able to muster 23 yards rushing throughout the contest, which is the fifth-fewest surrendered in EMU history, and fewest rushing yards allowed since 2011.

EMU DEFENSES UNDER NEW COORDINATORS: EMU's 61-14 win over Mississippi Valley, Sept. 2, marked the first game the EMU defense was under the direction of **Neal Neathery**. In his first game in charge of the Green and White defense, Eastern held its opponent to the lowest number of yards in a defensive coordinator's debut since the 1983 season. In that year, **Greg Satanski's** squad held the Thundering Herd of Marshall to just 196 total yards.

THREE-TIME CAPTAIN: Redshirt senior **Pat O'Connor** is one of just seven active three-time captains in the FBS this season. The veteran defensive lineman joins New Mexico's Dakota Cox, Colorado's Sefo Liufau, Wake Forest's Ryan Janvion, Minnesota's Mitch Leidner, BYU's Taysom Hill, and Georgia Tech's Justin Thomas. The Chicago native is just the second three-time captain in program history, joining former quarterback **Andy Schmitt** (2007-09).

EXTRA POINT RECORD: When the Eagles scored eight touchdowns in the team's 61-14 victory over MVSU, they also had the opportunity for eight extra point attempts. **Paul Fricano** managed to knock all eight through the uprights, which tied the most in team history, and was the most since 2008. Making his collegiate debut, Fricano also nailed a 35-yard field goal to total 11 of EMU's 61 points in the opener.

SAFETY: In the third quarter against Mississippi Valley, the Eagles forced MVSU to snap the ball out of the end zone, resulting in a safety. This marked the first time since 2005 that the Green and White tallied a safety.

FIRST TOUCHDOWNS ABOUND: A total of six Eagles scored their first touchdowns in the Eagles' season-opener against MVSU, Sept. 2. In his first game behind center for the Eagles, **Todd Porter** tossed three touchdowns, with **Nigel Kilby**, **Antoine Porter**, and **Lavonte Robinson** tallying their first career receiving touchdowns. Two Eagles also notched their first career rushing touchdowns, as **Ian Eriksen** and **Blake Banham** both found the end zone for the first time.

in his first year as the primary running back for EMU.

IT'S FUN KICKING OFF THE SEASON AT HOME!: EMU improved to 74-45-5 (.617) all-time in its home opener with a 61-14 victory over Mississippi Valley State, Sept. 2. Furthermore, the Eagles are now 41-17-1 (.703) when opening the season at home. The MVSU game marked the ninth time in the last 13 years that the Eagles had opened the season at home in Rynearson Stadium.

2016 SEASON: This is the 125th year for the EMU football team. The first year of intercollegiate football in Ypsilanti was 1891, when the team posted an 0-2 record. EMU has fielded a team every year since 1891 with one exception, when the 1944 season was canceled because of World War II.

EXPERIENCED OFFENSIVE LINE: Entering the 2016 season, Eastern Michigan's offensive line was the fifth-most experienced unit in the country according to Phil Steele.

O'CONNOR BACK IN THE MIX: Senior defensive lineman Pat O'Connor returns after missing all of last year with a shoulder injury. Selected a captain for the third consecutive season, the Chicago, Ill. native joins former quarterback Andy Schmitt (2007-09) as the only players in the team's

YOUNG EAGLES: Despite the experience returning for the Eagles in terms of starts, EMU is still a young team with only 18 seniors on the 2016 roster. This marks the 25th fewest seniors in the FBS this season. Only two of EMU's opponents have fewer seniors than Eastern, Missouri and Bowling Green, while Wyoming has just as many with 18.

41st FOR THE MAC: The 2016 season marks the 41st year that the Eagles have been a part of the Mid-American Conference football championship race. EMU was admitted into the league in 1971, but a complete league schedule was not available until the 1976 season.

2016 CAPTAINS: Eastern Michigan University's football team announced its team captains for the 2016 campaign. Providing leadership for the squad will be seniors **Mike Brown**, **Cole Gardner**, **Pat O'Connor**, along with redshirt sophomore **Shaq Vann**.

VANN NAMED DOAK WALKER AWARD PRESEASON CANDIDATE: Shaq Vann was named a preseason candidate for the 2016 Doak Walker Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top college running back. Vann is one of four Mid-American Conference running backs named to the 76-man watch list. The South Bend, Ind. native is looking for a breakout season

CHRIS CREIGHTON NOMINATED TO ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM: Allstate and the American Football Coaches Association announced July 13, that EMU Head Football Coach Chris Creighton was nominated as an Honorary Head Coach for the 2016 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team. Creighton joins Mark Dantonio of Michigan State, Willie Fritz of Tulane, Nick Saban of Alabama, and Mark Richt of Miami as the five Football Bowl Subdivision coaching nominees.

FIVE EAGLES EARN PRESEASON ALL-MAC HONORS: Eastern placed five of its players on the 2016 Athlon Sports Preseason All-Mid-American Conference Teams, the publication announced, June 15. The Eagles had three second-team honorees and two third-team selections. Redshirt seniors **Darien Terrell** and **Pat O'Connor**, as well as redshirt junior **Austin Barnes** were named second team offense, defense and special teams, respectively. Meanwhile, redshirt sophomore **Shaq Vann** and redshirt junior **Luke Maclean** were named third team offense and defense, respectively.

A CHANGE IN THE GUARD: College athletics has long been a male dominated world, but times are changing with Eastern Michigan standing at the forefront of it. The Eagles are the only school at the Football Bowl Subdivision level to boast a female athletic director (**Heather Lyke**) and a female director of sports medicine (**Jennifer Brown**).

Brown, EMU's Associate Athletics Director for Sports Medicine, is just one of eight female athletic trainers to oversee an FBS football team. She arrived in Ypsilanti in 2015 following an 11-year tenure in the Northwestern University Athletics Department where she served as the Associate Athletics Trainer. At NU, Brown worked directly with the Wildcats' football team.


There were few observers that gave the Eastern Michigan University football team any chance of winning a battle with San Jose State University at the 1987 California Bowl.

In fact, the oddsmakers made the Big West Champion Spartans of San José State a 17-point favorite in the matchup with Mid-American Conference champion Eastern Michigan.

But Head Coach Jim Harkema's "Road Warriors" proved that desire and determination could overcome those odds as Eastern recorded a thrilling 30-27 victory.

The EMU offense ground out 212 yards rushing, including 130 yards from MVP Gary Patton in the win. The EMU defense also rose to the occasion, holding San Jose State to 81 yards rushing.

Eastern Michigan's first-ever postseason bowl appearance would be a real challenge as the then-Hurons, ranked No. 3 in the NCAA-College Division national poll, would face off against a Louisiana Tech squad that was the No. 5 squad in the country, in the first Pioneer Bowl in Wichita Falls, Texas.

Head Coach Dan Boisture's squad entered the bowl game as one of the top defensive clubs in the country, allowing just one touchdown in the final five games of the 1971 season.

While the defensive team was prepared for the bowl game, the offensive unit was trying to patch together an offensive backfield that had been crippled by injuries late in the season.

Larry Ratcliff, Eastern's standout tailback, suffered a season-ending knee injury in the seventh game of the season, Oct. 30 against Northern Michigan. Ratcliff's backup, Don Madden, was also sidelined with an injury, leaving the vaunted EMU rushing game looking for a leader.

Seldom-used tailback Tim Packrall stepped in and rushed for a game-high 122 yards on 31 carries but the EMU offense could muster just one score, a 22-yard field goal by Jackson Nunn.

Louisiana Tech added a 91-yard punt return by Wenford Wilborn in the third quarter and the Bulldogs went on to post a 14-3 victory.

That loss was the lone defeat for EMU on the way to a 7-1-2 overall mark in 1971.

Coach Creighton joined fellow coaches Troy Calhoun (Air Force) and Chip Kelly (San Francisco 49ers) along with Global Football President and former Notre Dame quarterback Patrick Steenberge on the tour, which was conducted by Col. Al Hunt, USAF (Retired) and organized by Military Appreciation Partnerships (MAP) in Association with Armed Forces Entertainment. "We do these tours in order to communicate a positive message of awareness to our troops and other overseas personnel that the American people appreciate and support their service to our country," explained Mike Whalen of Military Appreciation Partnerships. Coach Creighton's participation came as a result of his association with Patrick Steenberge of Global Football, with whom he traveled to Tanzania in 2011 to play the first-ever game of college American football on the African continent and led his Drake University squad on a climb of Mount Kilimanjaro. All of the travelers were given the opportunity to observe a takeoff and/or landing from the flight deck of the C-17.

Ramstein Air Base

More than 100 people formed a line before the group's arrival, seeking autographs, photos and conversation at the largest American military community outside the United States. Approximately 50,000 troops, dependents, and DoD support personnel reside there under the command of Brigadier General Jon "Tye" Thomas, Commander of the 86th Airlift Wing. The group visited Landstuhl Regional Medical Center, an overseas military hospital operated by the U.S. Army, which is the largest military hospital outside the continental United States. More than 250,000 individuals have been treated therefrom down range and it is usually the first stop for injured military members returning from the Middle East and is also the major medical center for all of Europe. General Frank Gorenc, Commander, U.S. Air Forces in Europe; Commander, U.S. Air Forces, Africa; Commander, Allied Air Command, headquartered at Ramstein (NATO) met with Kelly, Calhoun, Creighton and Steenberge before they departed for the Middle East. ISA Air Base and NSA, Bahrain

The party of 15 total travelers then headed for the home of the United States Naval Forces Central Command and the U.S. Fifth Fleet. Team MAP started the day at ISA Air Base, near a Patriot Missile base protecting Bahrain, where an NFL-style combine, was conducted for the local troops. Each combine included bench press reps, broad jump, high jump, pro shuttle and the 40-yard dash, with this being the first of four such events on the trip, and it did not take long to recognize the exemplary energy, leadership and enthusiasm that overflowed from the coaches who organized and conducted the events. The ISA Base combine was held on the sand and outdoor basketball court, while at NSA an artificial turf field welcomed the participants. Camp Lemonnier, Djibouti

Djibouti is located on the Horn of Africa, around 6 miles from Somalia and eight miles from Yemen and hosts Camp Lemonnier, the primary base of operations for U.S. Africa Command. Approximately 5,000 U.S. joint, and allied military, civilian personnel, and DoD contractors occupy the camp, where the group was privileged to spend some time with Captain Geoffrey Colpitts, the Commanding Officer. He gave a good insight into the operations and underlined the sacrifices by the troops who serve there. Their deployment is usually for a year, and they are separated from their families for that term. 7-on-7 Following another combine, four teams competed Kelly's Calhoun's tournament as beat squad championship Aviano AFB, Italy

This NATO base in northeastern Italy, located at the foot of the Southern Carnic Alps, provided a beautiful sight with snow in full view and there were two highlight events at Aviano. The coaches were invited to participate in a leadership discussion hosted by Brigadeer General Barre Seguin, the Commander of the 31st Fighter Wing, the only permanently assigned USAF fighter aircraft wing in NATO's southern wing. Participants included his senior officer commanders and senior enlisted leadership, his staff, the coaches and Patrick, as well as former Congressman Jim Marshall and former Assistant Secretary of the Air Force Bill Anderson.

Afterwards, the coaches conducted another NFL Combine with personnel from the 31st Security Forces

Afterwards, the coaches conducted another NFL Combine with personnel from the 31st Security Forces Squadron. Finally, the MAP team met with more than a hundred military children and their parents in a youth center gym to receive photos, shirts, and autographs from the coaches. Once again the genuineness and the warm personalities of the coaches were in clear view as they reached out to the youngsters. **Traveling Football Personnel**

Chip Kelly is currently the head coach of the San Francisco 49ers. Before joining the 49ers, Chip was the head coach of the Philadelphia Eagles from 2013 to 2015. Prior to coaching in the NFL, he was the head coach for the Oregon Ducks from 2009 to 2012, and led them to four consecutive BCS bowl game appearances. In 2007, Troy Calhoun embraced the mission of the Air Force Academy to accomplish what was once considered nearly impossible: building a service academy program that often earns a postseason bid while playing in one of college football's best conferences. In seven of Calhoun's eight years, Air Force has been to a bowl. Chris Creighton is the head football coach at Eastern Michigan University, a position he has held since the 2014 season. Previously, Creighton served as the head coach at Ottawa University in Kansas from 1997 to 2000 and at Indiana's Wabash College from 2001 to 2007 before moving to Drake University in Des Moines for the 2008 through 2013 seasons.

Patrick Steenberge is a former quarterback who played at the University of Notre Dame. He is currently the owner and operator of Global Football, which organizes competitive events for amateur athletes worldwide, allowing them the chance to experience the Global Classroom and play in the Global Stadium. During the past two decades, Global Football has been the largest exporter of American football, having produced games and events in 25 countries on six continents since 1996.





Offensive Onslaught Powers Football to Season-Opening Victory The Eagles had one of their best offensive outputs in program history to down MVSU

YPSILANTI, Mich. (EMUEagles.com) – A historic offensive performance from the Eastern Michigan University football team powered the Eagles (1-0) to a season-opening 61-14 victory over Mississippi Valley State University Friday night, Sept. 2, at "The Factory" inside Rynearson Stadium. A balanced effort led the Eagles to a 61-14 victory over the Delta Devils (0-1).

The Green and White's point total marked the most scored by EMU since 2004, when it also notched 61 against Central Michigan. The final tally also marked the largest margin of victory in a season opener since 2008.

As a team, Eastern ran away with the win behind a balanced offensive attack featuring 281 rushing yards, along with 198 passing yards. In total, the Eagles posted 479 yards of offense, posting a perfect 9-for-9 mark in the red zone. Leading the charge on the ground was redshirt sophomore **Shaq Vann**, who posted a final stat line of 156 yards and two touchdowns, the second 100-yard rushing performance of his career. Just behind him, fellow redshirt sophomore **Ian Eriksen** picked up 97 yards, along with the first two scores of his career.

Through the air, junior **Todd Porter** made his first start donning the Green and White, amassing 171 yards passing and three touchdown on the receiving side, redshirt freshman **Nigel Kilby** caught his first career touchdown and totaled 67 yards. Redshirt freshman **Paul Fricano** had a great day kicking as well, knocking down a field goal, along with drilling all eight of his extra point attempts, tying for the most in program history, and the most since 2008.

On the defensive side of the ball, the Green and White held the Delta Devils to just 201 yards, including only 23 on the ground, the fifth-least in program history, and the fewest since 2011. The defense also forced three fumbles, securing two of them. Through three quarters, the Eagles held MVSU scoreless, as they were able to muster 14 points in the final frame. Redshirt senior Pat O'Connor made his return to the field following an injury last season, erupting for two sacks and three quarterback hurries on the day. Eastern's leading tackler on the day was redshirt sophomore Kyle Rachwal with 10 total, including two assisted tackles for loss. Redshirt sophomore Jeremiah Harris also made his presence known, recovering a fumble.

After a three-and-out by the Eagles to open the game, the EMU defense turned around and forced a quick punt by MVSU to get the ball back early in the first quarter. The EMU offense retook the field and got into rhythm behind stout running from Vann, along with accurate passing from Porter. A 19-yard pass to junior Johnnie Niupalau for 19 started the drive, while a 14-yarder to junior Sergio Bailey II brought the Eagles within the 10-yard line. From there, Vann took the ball on consecutive plays, the latter getting into the end zone for the first score of the game, and putting the Green and White ahead, 7-0.

On the next series, the EMU defense swarmed the MVSU backfield, as O'Connor nabbed a sack, which also forced the ball loose within the 15-yard line. After sorting out the pile, redshirt freshman **Maxx Crosby** came up with the ball, giving Eastern an opportunity to quickly increase their lead. The team did just that, as Eriksen punched the ball in from the five to put EMU up 14-0 with 6:37 remaining in the first.

Like their first series, the defense came up big again on MVSU's next possession, forcing another four and out. After a MVSU punt, the Eagles' offense came out firing yet again, as Kilby erupted for a gain of 34 yards on a pass from Porter over the middle. However, the Eagles couldn't pick up a first down, and elected to go for a field goal, which fell short.

On the ensuing possession, the Delta Devils were able to move the chains for the first time in the game. However, Harris forced another tumble, with the Eagles coming up with it at the MVSU four-yard line. The Green and White quickly capitalized, as redshirt junior **Lavonte Robinson** found the end zone after a short pass from Porter, which was his first career touchdown throw. With 2:43 to go in the first, Eastern ran to a 21-0 lead over the Delta Devils, which carried over to the second quarter.

With less than five minutes to go in the half, Eastern maintained a 21-0 lead. Pinned within their own 10, Eriksen quickly gave the Eagles some breathing room, taking the ball and rushing for 31 yards on the first play of the drive. On fourth and one, the Eagles elected to go for it, with Eriksen bruising his way ahead for seven. Senior **Sam Browning** kept the drive going, catching a pass for 13 to bring EMU to the MVSU 27-yard line. With the clock ticking down to less than a minute in the half, the Eagles went for a shot at the end zone. Although the pass was just out of reach, a MVSU pass interference penalty brought the Grean and White to the 13. On the next play, junior **Antoine Porter** found the end zone for his first career touchdown, which was also Porter's second of the game. With less than 30 seconds to play in the half, the Eagles held a commanding 28-0 lead. The Delta Devils decided to let the clock run down, and Eastern went to the locker room holding a 28-point lead.

MVSU opened the second half with the ball, but they were able to do nothing, as the EMU defense forced another three-and-out. After a fair catch from redshirt sophomore **Blake Banham**, the Eagles got the ball at their own 37. Vann started the drive with a 12-yard rush behind solid blocking from redshirt sophomore **Jimmy Leatiota**. A Porter pass to Bailey picked up another 13, bringing EMU to the MVSU 32, while Vann bulldozed his way through the line for 21 yards, moving the chains to the eight. Dropping back to pass on third-and-goal, Porter found Kilby in the end zone to put seven more on the board after the extra point from Fricano. This marked Kilby's first career touchdown, and furthered Porter's total to three on the day.

A solid return gave the Delta Devils the ball around the 40, however



an illegal block brought the ball back to the nine. After a short rush, another penalty pushed MVSU back to the four-yard line. A sack from redshirt senior **Ike Spearman** and junior **Jason Beck** then forced another MVSU punt near the goal line, allowing EMU to get the ball back with good field position at the MVSU 38.

Porter then threw up a fade to Kilby, who came down with it for a gain of 28 despite tough coverage from the Delta Devils. Although the EMU drive stalled, the Eagles still put points on the board behind Fricano's first career field goal, which came from 35-yards out. With three more on the board, the Eagles increased their lead to 38-0.

The stout defense continued on the next drive, as sophomore Jaylen Pickett forced another MVSU fumble, which along with a penalty, brought the Delta Devils back to the two-yard line. After a near interception from freshman Jalen Phelps, MVSU was forced to punt from the three. A delay of game pushed the ball back even further, and the Delta Devils followed by snapping the ball through the end zone, giving the Eagles a safety, their first since 2005, and two more points on the board to make it 40-0.

Following the safety, Banham posted a huge return of 69 yards to give the Eagles the ball at the MVSU four-yard line. On the first offensive play of the series, Banham got the handoff and carried it into the end zone for EMU's sixth TD on the day. With 5:33 to go in the third, the Green and White commanded a 47-0 lead over the Delta Devils.

MVSU was then able to get across the 50 for the second time on the day, but were unable to move any further. After a punt from the Delta Devils, Eastern got the ball back at their 12-yard line. On the first play of the drive, Vann rumbled his way down the field for a huge gain of 58 yards after breaking a few tackles and tip-toeing his way down the sideline. He kept the trend going, picking up another 13 to put EMU into the red zone, after which he picked up his second touchdown of the day. Fricano's extra point then made the score 54-0 in favor of Eastern.

With the clock winding down to zero on the third quarter, the Eagles went into the final frame holding a 54-0 lead. The Delta Devils were that able to get a drive going, getting into EMU territory for the third time. Pass interference penalties kept the drive alive for MVSU, pushing them to the EMU 26. A short pass to Simms gave the Delta Devils another first down, after which Banks caught MVSU's first touchdown of the day. With 12:28 to go in the half, Eastern still commanded a 54-7 lead.

The MVSU kick off saw redshirt senior **Austin Sanders** return the ball 51 yards with blazing speed to the Delta Devils 49. Eriksen continued to bulldoze his way down the field, picking up 34 yards on four tough rushes up the middle to put EMU within the 10. He was then rewarded for his effort, fighting his way into the end zone for his second touchdown of the day, putting the Eagles up 61-7 after the extra point.

The Delta Devils then put together another solid drive, getting to the EMU one-yard line after a pass from Bray to Banks. From there, Bray dove over the line to give MVSU another touchdown, making it 61-14 with 5:35 left to play.

The Eagles promptly responded with a long drive of their own behind shovel passes from redshirt freshman **James Pensyl** to Antoine Porter, as well as rushes from Banham and redshirt sophomore **Alec Hullibarger**. Eastern continued to bleed down the clock with consecutive rushes. After taking a knee with 30 seconds to go, the Eagles walked away with a dominating 61-14 victory over MVSU.

EMU Football Fall on the Road at Missouri

The Green and White totaled 428 yards of offense on the night

COLUMBIA, Mo. (EMUEagles.com) – The Eastern Michigan University football team battled until the end, but ultimately fell on the road to the University of Missouri, 61-21, Saturday night, Sept. 10 at Faurot Field

Offensively, the Eagles had an efficient day, totaling 428 yards, including 287 in the air and 141 on the ground.

Junior **Todd Porter** led the offense with a career-high 287 yards passing with one touchdown. He also added 46 more yards on the ground, including his first career rushing touchdown. Redshirt sophomore **lan Eriksen** tallied his second straight 90-yard rushing effort with 90 yards on 23 carries and a score.

On the main receiving end of Porter's passes was a pair of wide outs, as juniors **Sergio Bailey II** and **Johnnie Niupalau** both had career-highs with 57 and 58 yards, respectively. Bailey II also picked up his first career touchdown reception, while totaling seven catches on the day.

Missouri started off with an efficient seven-play, 75-yard drive on their first possession that took less than two minutes off the clock. It was capped off by a 36-yard touchdown pass that gave MU the early 7-0 lead.

Two drives later, the EMU offense got moving with a couple passes from Porter to get the offense to the Mizzou 37-yard line. However, the Eagles were halted by a MU interception that took the Tigers down to the EMU 7-yard line.

With Mizzou knocking on the door, the defense turned around and forced a turnover of their own on third and goal. On a QB sneak, redshirt **Ikie Calderon** flew in from the secondary, jarring the ball loose and sophomore **Jaylen Pickett** pounced on it to force the turnover.

With its backs up against the wall, the Missouri defense stood strong forcing an EMU punt, which the Tigers turned into six points with a 54-yard touchdown return as the clock expired in the first quarter. After one quarter, MU held a 14-0 lead.

To start the second quarter, the Eagle offense found its rhythm, starting with a huge 32-yard run from Eriksen to get EMU back into Tiger territory. On the next play, Porter found Niupalau for 21 to get down to the MU six yard line. Three plays later, Eriksen pounded it into the end zone to give EMU its first points of the night, cutting the deficit to 14-7.

After trading possessions, Missouri pieced together another 12-play 86-yard drive to extend their lead. A missed extra point put the score at 20-7 with just under 4:30 to go until halftime. The lead extended on the next drive for MU on just a single play, as the Tigers took an 87-yard screen pass to the house, pushing the score to 26-7 after another missed PAT.

The Tigers kept the pedal on the floor on their next drive, scoring their third consecutive TD with less than a minute until the half, giving them a 33-7 lead into the half.

The Eagles received the ball to begin the second half, but did not make much of their initial drive, punting the ball back to Misouri. On the return, redshirt freshman **Brody Hoying** jarred the ball loose on the tackle and senior **Chris O'Risky** jumped on it near midfield, giving EMU a second chance to begin the half.

EMU made the most of the opportunity with a seven-play scoring drive, cutting into the Mizzou lead.



EMU got to the MU 10-yard line with a nice 30-yard connection to redshirt junior **Dan Buschman**. One play later, Porter found Bailey II in the corner of the end zone, where he made a diving fingertip catch for his first career EMU touchdown.

With the Missouri offense back on the field for the first time in the half, the Tigers picked up where they left off with a quick scoring strike in six plays, capped off by a 52-yard touchdown pass to put the MU lead back at 40-14. The lead extended to 47-14 on Mizzou's next drive, scoring another TD on a 13-yard pass with six minutes left in the third quarter.

Eastern responded on the ensuing drive, putting together a nine-play, 79 yard drive. Led by long passes to senior **Sam Browning** and freshman **Mathew Sexton**, Porter finished the drive off himself with his first career rushing touchdown, a four-yard scamper, cutting the MU lead to 47-21.

In Missouri's first drive of the fourth quarter, the Tigers added to their big lead with an 86-yard drive, giving them a 54-21 advantage. After trading multiple possessions, Eastern found themselves with the ball on their own goal line. Facing immense pressure up the middle, Porter tried to dump off the ball, but it was intercepted in the end zone for a Mizzou touchdown, giving them the decisive 61-21 win.

Strong Defensive Performance Propels EMU to 37-19 Win The Eagles' defense created 21-points off of turnovers in the victory

CHARLOTTE, N.C. (EMUEagles.com) - The Eastern Michigan University football team used an aerial assault and three turnovers to upend the University of North Carolina-Charlotte, 37-19, Saturday, Sept. 17, in non-conference action under the lights at Jerry Richardson Stadium.

Both sides of the ball got the job done for the Eagles (2-1), as the offense sprung for 357 yards, including 285 through the air. Redshirt junior Todd Porter led the attack, finishing with his second consecutive 250+ passing yard day and all of EMU's 285 yards through the air on 24-31 passing and two touchdowns. The 77.4% completion percentage was the highest for the Eagles since 2006.

T. Porter spread the love to nine different receivers on the day, his most common target being junior Antoine Porter, who had career-highs with six catches for 66 yards. The leading receiver was fellow junior Johnnie Niupalau, who had a career-best 72 yards on three catches and his first career TD reception.

The two other Eagle scores came from a reception by redshirt freshman Nigel Kilby and a rush from redshirt sophomore lan Eriksen, the second and fourth TDs, respectively, on the season

Not to be outdone on the defensive side, the Eagles forced three turnovers on the night, including two interceptions from sophomore Jaylen Pickett, one of which he returned for a score. They were the first two interceptions of his career.

For the third consecutive game, EMU held its opponent to under 200-yards on the ground, as UNCC finished the day with 157. Redshirt sophomore Jeremiah Harris was EMU's leading tackler with 10 stops on the night, including one for loss. The Eagles had a total of seven TFLs on the night.

The Eagles led off the game receiving the ball, but faced early adversity as T. Porter was intercepted on his second pass of the game, which was deflected over the middle, setting UNCC up near midfield. The defense, seeing their first action, held the 49ers to a three and out, giving EMU the ball back.

After an EMU three-and-out, Charlotte looked to get something going, but was unable to do so after a sack from redshirt senior Pat O'Connor, which was his third of the season. O'Connor now has 12.5 sacks on his career. Charlotte then punted the ball back after their second consecutive three and out.

Starting with the ball at their own 13, EMU quickly got to midfield with long passes to redshirt sophomore Izaiah Fuller, A. Porter, and junior Sergio Bailey II. Following a short rush, A. Porter sprung a short pass for 24 yards after juking the defender. A horse collar tackle on the play set EMU up on the UNCC five-yard

On the next play, Eriksen rumbled up the middle untouched for the touchdown, his fourth on the year. T. Porter was a perfect 5-of-5 on the drive for 66 yards. After back-to-back scoreless possessions by both teams, EMU held the 7-0 lead into the second

The 49ers opened up the second frame with some consistent ball movement, getting the ball into EMU territory for the first time. They would make it down to the 12 before being halted on third down, forcing the 29-yard field goal, and making the score

The Eagles would answer immediately with a field goal of their own. The drive began with a 12-yard run from redshirt freshman Breck Turner. Four plays later, Eriksen set EMU up in UNCC territory at the 17 with a 32-yard pass from T. Porter. From there, Eastern got it to the two yard-line before the 49ers had a goal line stand, making the Eagles settle for the field goal, and putting them back up 10-3

On the ensuing UNCC drive, the defense returned the favor from earlier with an interception in 49er territory by Pickett. He rumbled to the UNCC 20 on a 21-yard return, setting Eastern up in prime territory. It was the first pick of the season for EMU, and first of Pickett's career.

With the short field, EMU found the end zone for the second time on the night five plays later. Despite a holding call that backed EMU up to the 24, an 18-yard pass to Niupalau set EMU up with first and goal from the six.

After two busted plays, Eastern converted the third down on a passing touchdown to Kilby. The 5-yard strike was the second receiving TD of the year for the tight end, and extended the Eastern lead to 17-3 with about a minute to go until the half.

The 49ers got started on their two-minute drill, advancing the ball down to EMU's 35 before the clock ticked down to three seconds. Forced with the long field goal, the 52-yard attempt was wide right, keeping the tally at 17-3 into the half.



Starting the second half on defense, the Eagles allowed a couple of fourth down conversions, setting UNCC up in EMU territory. The defense stood up once again, however, forcing the second turnover of the night. On an end around, redshirt sophomore Chris Hendricks punched the ball from the carriers' arm, and redshirt sophomore Kyle Rachwal jumped on it, setting Eastern up near midfield. It was EMU's fifth fumble recovery of

EMU wasted little time capitalizing on the miscue, as two plays later, T. Porter found Niupalau down the sideline for a 49-yard strike, both career longs for the duo. Early in the third quarter, Eastern extended their lead to 24-3.

Following a long return on the ensuing drive for UNCC, the 49ers put more points on the board seven plays later with a 25yard field goal, tightening the lead to 24-6 at the nine and a half mark of the third frame.

On the following kickoff, redshirt sophomore Blake Banham set the Eagles up in prime position with a 47-yard return to midfield. Eastern then converted back-to-back third downs, including one on third and 13, to advance to the UNCC 24 yard line. The Eagles couldn't convert the next set of downs, setting up a 36-yard field goal for redshirt freshman Paul Fricano, which he split down the middle, putting the EMU lead back at 27-6. It was a new career-long for the first-year kicker.

The EMU defense continued to give the 49er offense fits on the next drive, forcing their third turnover of the evening. This time, the defense immediately turned it into points as Pickett, on his second INT of the night, housed it from 36-yards out, giving Eastern its biggest lead of the night at 34-6. It was the first pick six since Nov. 27 of last season when Rachwal returned one for six against CMU.

Ending the third quarter on the move, the 49ers finally broke through with their first touchdown of the night on the second play of the fourth quarter, completing an 11-play, 84-yard drive that tightened things up to 34-13 early in the final quarter.

After an EMU three and out, the 49ers continued to move the ball well, scoring their second consecutive TD on an 11-play, 84yard drive culminated by a 28-yard touchdown pass. The extra point was wide left though, putting the tally at 34-19 with just under 10 minutes to play in the game.

That's when EMU went on a clock-melting drive, chewing up 6:24 off the clock on 12 plays. After stalling on the 14 yard line, Fricano converted his third field goal on the day, giving EMU more breathing room and making the score 37-19 with just over three minutes to go.

With the large deficit, UNCC could not get anything else on the board, turning the ball over on downs with under one minute to play, and sealing the 37-19 victory for EMU.

A Pair of Rallies Helps the Eagles Wrangle the Cowboys The Green and White trailed by as many as 14 points in the contest

YPSILANTI, Mich. (EMUEagles.com) - The Eastern Michigan University football victory over the University of Wyoming Friday, Sept. 23, at Rynearson Stadium, The Eagles move to 3-1 on the season and are out to their best start since the 1995

As a team, Eastern notched a total of 500 offensive yards, including 239 on the ground with an average rush of 5.1 yards per carry. Additionally, the Green and White threw for 261 yards, with four receivers notching three receptions or more. The Eagle defense had a spectacular game, holding the Cowboy (2-2) offense to just one offensive touchdown and one field goal throughout the game.

Leading the EMU offensive attack was redshirt sophomore lan Eriksen, who totaled a career-high 120 yards on the ground, along with the go-ahead touchdown. Redshirt freshman **Breck Turner** had a break out game on the ground as well, posting a 50-yard rush for a touchdown in the second guarter.

Behind center, junior **Todd Porter** totaled 214 passing yards with one touch-down. It was his third straight 200-yard passing effort. Redshirt freshman **Nigel** Kibly tallied a career-best 84 yards receiving on four receptions, while junior John-nie Niupalau notched 34 yards and one touchdown. On the defensive side of the ball, EMU held the Cowboys to just 313 offensive

yards, highlighted by only 79 rushing yards on 38 attempts. It was the second time EMU has held its opponent to fewer than 100 yards this season, both coming at home. The Eagle defense forced three turnovers throughout the game, including

two fumble recoveries and a clutch interception in the final moments of the game. Leading the strong Green and White defense was redshirt sophomore **Jeremiah** Harris, who had a spectacular game with one sack and a blocked field goal, Freshman Vince Calhoun (Middletown, Ohio – Middletown) had a great game as well, forcing a fumble and securing the key interception in the fourth quarter. Finally,

redshirt junior **Derric Williams** totaled nine tackles, along with forcing a fumble. The Eagles won the toss to begin the game, and elected to kick and begin the game on defense. The Cowboys picked up a quick first down, but the Eagle de fense clamped down, as a sack by redshirt freshman Maxx Crosby and redshirt sophomore Chris Hendricks put a stop to the drive. After the punt pinned the Green and White at the seven, the EMU offense took the field.

Eastern came out with a balanced attack, quickly advancing to the 35-yard line on four plays. On third down, Porter rifled an accurate pass to Niupalau to keep the drive moving. However, a Porter pass was then intercepted by the Cowboys and returned for a touchdown, putting the Eagles in an early 7-0 hole.

The Eagles retook the field on offense, and Eriksen got the drive started with a

bang. running for 27 yards. Immediately after, Porter completed a long pass to Kilbang, full ming for 27 yards. Immediately after, Porter Completed a rong pass to Air-by for 32, quickly putting the Eagles in Cowboy territory. On third down, Porter at-tempted a home-run ball to junior Sergio Balley III, who made an acrobatic catch on the sideline, but was ruled out of bounds. However, the Eagles did not leave the drive empty-handed, as redshirt freshman **Paul Fricano** converted a career-long 46-yard field goal. With 5:38 remaining in the first guarter, the Eagles trailed 7-3.

Turning around to the other side of the ball, EMU quickly forced a three-and-out, capped off by a sack from Harris, which was the team's second of the day. The stop allowed the Eagles to get the ball back on offense with good field position, as they would begin their drive from their 45. EMU quickly picked up a first down, with Porter looking comfortable in the pocket and firing a third-down pass to Kilby for

11. His next pass, however, was intercepted, giving the ball back to Wyoming.

The Cowboys were able to advance downfield after a personal foul penalty on the Eagles, putting them at the EMU 24 with 1:38 to go in the opening quarter. The defense was able to stop the drive however, forcing a fourth and six at the 20. The Cowboys attempted a field goal, knocking it through to tack on three more. At the conclusion of the first quarter, Eastern trailed Wyoming, 10-3.

The second quarter began with a beautiful short pass to Kilby, who was able to pick up 25 after a Wyoming defender was unable to bring him down on first contact. On the other side of the 50, Porter picked up his third interception of the game on a diving catch from a Cowboy defensive back. Wyoming was then able to pick up consecutive first downs, taking advantage of short curl routes in the pass-

on third-and-three, Wyoming was stopped just short of the marker, and elected to sneak for it on fourth down, ultimately converting and picking up another fresh set of downs. A holding penalty on the Cowboys put Wyoming back 10-yards, but they quickly regained the difference on a 16-yard pass. From there, a pass interference penalty on EMU put the Cowboys at the five, and they then punched it in to go up 17-3 with 9:05 left in the half.

The Eagles got some momentum back on the kickoff, as redshirt sophomore

Blake Banham returned the kick to the 38 after finding a gap through defenders. Strong rushes from Eriksen picked up a first down for EMU, after which Turner found a crease and blazed 50-yards down the field for the first Eagle touchdown of the day, as well as the first of his young career. After Fricano's PAT, the Eagles trailed by seven, 17-10, with 7:49 left to play before halftime.

After nearly picking up a first down on their first pass, redshirt senior Pat **O'Connor** erupted through the line to bring down the running back for a loss of four. The Cowboys were able to pick up the first on the following play, however, putting Wyoming at their own 46. Eastern's defense then forced another fourthdown, as senior **DaQuan Pace** broke up a pass near the sideline. The breakup which was the 18th of his career, moved him into a tie for the EMU program record. After a Wyoming punt, the Eagles took over at their 18. The Green and White were unable to move the ball, however, going three-and-out and punting the ball back to the Wyoming 39.

Eastern's defense got off to a strong start on the ensuing drive, dropping the Wyoming running back behind the line for a loss of three. Like before, the Cowboys ran a short curl route, picking up the first down at midfield. A few plays later, Wyoming threw a screen pass and the receiver was quickly engulfed by Calhoun, who forced a fumble that was picked up by fellow freshman **Kevin McGill**.

Beginning their drive with good field position, the Green and White had nearly 1:30 left in the half to tie the game up. The Eagles did just that, notching three straight plays of nine yards or more, ultimately culminating in a seven-yard touchdown pass to Niupalau. Fricano's PAT then tied the game up at 17 with just 18 seconds before halftime. Wyoming elected to kneel out the half, and the two squads went into the locker room tied at 17.

The Eagles began the second half receiving the ball, immediately converting on a third-and-three after Porter scampered for nine yards to the EMU 41. Porter then followed that up with a quick 14-yard pass to Niupalau, moving Eastern to the other side of the 50. From there, redshirt freshman Isaac Holder notched a catch of 17 to bring the Eagles to the Wyoming 26, after which Eriksen bulldozed his way through the line for a pickup of 11, bringing EMU into the red zone. The Green and White were unable to find the end zone, but Fricano gave the Eagles a 20-17 lead after knocking down a 29-yarder.

Wyoming's first drive of the second half came up empty, only picking up a pair of first downs. The Cowboys were forced to punt from the EMU 48, and Banham fair caught the ball at the nine to give the Eagles another opportunity at putting points



on the board. A pump fake from T. Porter caught the Wyoming defense off guard on the second play of the drive, as the O'Fallon, Ill. native was able to escape the pocket and run for 30. Eastern was unable to pick up another first, however, and redshirt junior **Austin Barnes** was forced to punt, ultimately pinning the Cowboy: at their own 21.

Wyoming quickly picked up a big chunk of yardage, completing a 42-yard pass down the sideline into EMU territory, after which the Cowboys nabbed another 20 on the next play. The Eagles mounted a tough defensive stand, stopping the Cowboys at the one-yard line after a reviewed play. Wyoming elected to go for it on fourth, and the Cowboys were called for a false start penalty, moving them back to the six. Wyoming then elected to go for the field goal, but Harris managed to get a hand on the ball and block the kick to stop the Cowboy threat.

On the first play of the ensuing drive, Porter fired a deep shot to freshman **Mat**-

thew Sexton, who came down with it for a career-long reception of 40 yards. After a short pass for five yards, the clock ticked down to signal the end of third quarter with EMU still clinging to a slim 20-17 lead. Unfortunately, the Eagles were unable to convert on a fourth down attempt, and the Cowboys took over at the Wyoming

The Cowboys then began driving down the field, getting to the EMU 22. With Wyoming dosing in on the red zone, Williams forced a big fumble, and redshirt junior **Ikie Calderon** came up with it to put a halt to the drive. On the other end, Porter then promptly threw another interception, which was brought back for a touchdown, giving Wyoming a 24-20 lead with 12:45 remaining in the game.

A solid return gave Eastern the ball at the 30 to begin the drive, but they were

unable to do anything on the offensive end. Barnes came back on to punt, and a friendly EMU bounce pinned Wyoming at the eight. The Cowboys began their drive with back-to-back first downs, but were then stopped near midfield to force a UW

Beginning at their own 16, redshirt junior **Brogan Roback** entered the game and rifled a pass to Bailey for a first down to the EMU 37. Eriksen picked up nine on the next two plays, after which Roback snuck through the line to pick up another first. After a sack and offensive pass interference penalty, the Eagles faced second and 35. Although Roback completed a pass to Kilby for a gain of 16. Eastern was still forced to punt the ball away, with Barnes booming a punt of 47 yards.

With just 4:10 remaining in the game, Eastern needed to get a stop on the

defensive end to allow the offense a chance to retake the lead. Wyoming ran the ball on consecutive downs to drain clock. On third down, the Eagles blitzed the Cowboys, forcing an incomplete pass, which stopped the clock and also forced Wyoming to punt. With 2:37 left to go, the EMU offense retook the field for one last opportunity to get in the end zone.

Roback began the drive with a long pass attempt to Bailey, which fell incom-

plete, but a defensive pass interference penalty brought the Eagles to the Wyo-ming 29. Roback followed that up with a quick pass to the sideline, and Bailey was able to come up with it and step out of bounds to stop the clock again. The Eagles kept driving, with Eriksen notching another first down. On the very next play, Eriksen burst through the line with a quick jolt of speed, running untouched into the end zone for a clutch touchdown in the final two minutes of play. Following Fricano's PAT, Eastern retook the lead, 27-24, with 1:35 on the clock.

With a three-point lead, the Eagle defense needed to dig in and halt the Cow

boys to secure the win. On the very first play of the drive. O'Connor and redshirt junior **Luke Maclean** burst through the line to sack the Wyoming quarterback for a loss of eight yards. From there, the Wyoming quarterback lofted up a long pass down field, and Calhoun came down with it to give Eastern their third turnover on the day, this one coming at a very clutch moment of the game.

With the less than 1:30 to play, the Eagles continued to run the ball and drain

clock. Unable to pick up a first down, Eastern called a timeout with 25 seconds remaining before punting the ball away. Barnes booted the ball into the end zone, and the Cowboys took over at their 25 with 18 seconds on the clock, Wyoming's first pass fell incomplete after the quarterback was hurried. On the next play, he was flushed from the pocket and forced to run out of bounds after a pickup of seven. The final play of the game featured repeated lateral attempts, but the Cow boys were unable to move forward, with the Eagles bringing down the ball carrier and securing the victory.

Football Pushes Winning Streak to Three with 28-25 Win Over BGSU The victory marked EMU's first MAC-opening road win since 2005

BOWLING GREEN, Ohio (EMUEagles.com) – The Eastern Michigan University football team rattled off its third consecutive win Saturday, Oct. 1, with a 28-25 victory over Bowling Green State University to open Mid-American Conference play 1-0. EMU (4-1, 1-0 MAC) defeated the defending MAC champion Falcons (1-4, 0-1 MAC) for the first time since 2008 and is now 4-1 for the first time since 1995.

It was a tale of two halves, as both teams combined for 14 points in the first and 39 in the second. It was also that way for the EMU quarterbacks, as junior **Todd Porter** led the offense in the first, while redshirt junior **Brogan Roback** guided the offense in the second frame.

T. Porter finished the game with 107 yards on 11 completions, while Roback finished with just under the century mark (91), but had three key touchdown passes. It was Roback's first three-touchdown performance since Sept. 12, 2015, against Wyoming.

As a whole offense, EMU had 474 total yards, including 212 on the ground and 262 through the air. Leading the ground assault redshirt freshman **Breck Turner**, who paced the Eagles with a career-high 107 yards on 17 carries. In addition to breaking the 100-yard mark for the first time in his career, Turner scored his second touchdown as an Eagle. Splitting carries with Turner, redshirt sophomore **Ian Eriksen** added 69 yards on 20 rushes.

In the air, the Eagles completed passes to seven different receivers, maintaining the balance they have displayed all season. Redshirt freshman **Nigel Kilby** finished with five receptions for a career-best 92 yards, including a 64-yard pick up, the longest reception of the game. Kilby's 64-yard reception came on a trick play in which redshirt freshman Isaac Holder (Tampa, Fla.-Sickles) tossed the ball down field after catching a screen pass in the back-field. Junior **Sergio Bailey** capped an impressive day with 40-yard touchdown reception, registering 71 yards on four catches, while junior **Antoine Porter** chipped in 64 yards receiving.

Defensively, the Green and White were lead by a pair of 12-tack-le performances, the most by an Eagle this season. Redshirt sophomore **Kyle Rachwal** registered 12 stops, five solo and seven assisted, recording double digit tackles for the third time this season. Redshirt junior **Ikie Calderon** who also had 12 tackles (seven solo, five assisted) added the first sack of his career, a tackle for a loss, and a pass breakup in strong all-around performance. Meanwhile, senior **DaQuan Pace** recorded his 19th and 20th career pass breakups, making him EMU's all-time leader since breakups were tracked in 1998.

The Eagles began the game on defense and quickly gave up a big play on a screen pass, a 43-yard strike down to the EMU 13 yard line. After three straight pass plays, the Eagles didn't give up another first down, forcing a 30-yard field goal. It soared wide right, keeping the Falcons off the board.

After trading possessions, EMU began its second drive from its own 17. On a third and three-play, Porter's pass was tipped and hung in the air, only to be intercepted by BGSU at the 31, setting them up with a short field.

The Falcons ended up with first and goal from the two, where three straight rush attempts up the middle were stuffed, forcing fourth and goal. That's when BGSU ran a play fake, and completed a short pass for a touchdown, giving them the first points of the day and a 7-0 lead.

Needing a quick response, the Eagles got it on the next drive. In between rushes from Eriksen and Turner, T. Porter completed long passes to Bailey II and A. Porter for 17 and 38 yards, respectively, getting Eastern into the red zone for the first time at the four yard line. Two plays later Turner punched it in for his second touchdown of the season, tying the game at seven.

After stopping the Falcons on back-to-back drives, the Eagles began a long drive at the 10 minute mark of the second quarter. After a 20-yard T. Porter rush on third down to get into Falcon territory, EMU did something it had not done all season, losing a fumble on a botched option play. The miscue gave the Falcons their second turnover of the game, and possession of the ball at their own 28

The defense stepped up for the third consecutive time after the turnover, forcing another punt, and giving EMU one more chance to get points before the half, however they went three-and-out. Despite a hail mary attempt right before the half from BGSU after getting to midfield, the pass was picked off in the end zone by freshman **Vince Calhoun**, keeping the score at seven apiece headed into halftime.

The defensive struggle continued into the second half as both teams failed to tack on any points in the first three possessions. This prompted a change in QB for EMU, with Roback entering the game on the second drive in place of a banged up T. Porter.



BGSU finally broke the stalemate on an efficient 10-play drive midway through the third quarter. The Falcons moved the ball down to the EMU 15 before the defense held their ground, forcing a 32-yard field goal which was converted, giving the Falcons the lead back 10-7 with 7:10 remaining in the third period.

Just like the first time Bowling Green put up points, the Eagles had the immediate answer, this time on three quick strike plays. After a short two yard pass, the Eagles reached into their bag of tricks. On a screen to Holder, he turned around and completed a 64-yard pass to Kilby down the field, setting up EMU at the BG eight. On the very next play, Holder was rewarded for his pass, this time catching the touchdown strike from Roback. Holder's first career TD catch gave Eastern its first lead of the game, 14-10 with 6:10 remaining in the third.

With its first lead of the game, the Eagle defense continued their stout play, forcing a quick three-and-out, giving Eastern Michigan the ball back with an opportunity to extend the lead. The Eagle offense was up to the task, scoring their second consecutive touchdown on the next drive.

This time EMU grinded out a 10-play scoring drive, taking 3:50 off the clock. The first seven plays of the drive saw Eastern ground and pound its way down to the BGSU 33 with runs from Eriksen and Turner. After a 15-yard penalty set Eastern up at the 17, a pass interference call put the ball at the eight. Two plays later, Roback found Kilby over the middle for the score, extending the lead to 21-10 with 1:23 until the fourth quarter.

Facing their biggest deficit, the Falcons got a much needed score early in the fourth quarter on a 10-play, 75-yard drive that cut the Eagle lead to 21-17 with just under 13 minutes to play.

The Eagle offense continued to respond though, as they did on the ensuing drive after the BG score. Beginning the drive with back-to-back strikes to Bailey II, followed by a 14-yard pass to A. Porter, EMU drove into Falcon territory. Three plays later on third and five, Roback rolled out and found Bailey II just in front of the end zone, where he leaped and snagged a would-be interception away from the defender, and rolled in for the score. The 40-yard touchdown strike put Eastern's lead back to 28-17 with just under 10 minutes to play.

Needing to keep up with the Eagles' offensive attack, BGSU went on another efficient scoring drive, this time using 14 plays for 82 yards for the touchdown. A two-point conversion made the tally just three points, 28-25, with 5:22 left in the contest.

Looking to melt the clock down, EMU began to pound the rock on the ensuing possession. Eriksen and Turner split the duties, running for five consecutive first downs to bleed the ticker down to under a minute. On the drive, Turner went over 100 yards on the night. With BGSU out of timeouts, Eastern was able to kneel out the clock, sealing the three-point, 28-25, win.

Eagles Fall in Tough Homecoming Battle Against Toledo EMU kept it close for a majority of the game, but Toledo pulled away in the fourth quarter

YPSILANTI, Mich. (EMUEagles.com) – In front of the 10th largest crowd in Rynearson Stadium history, the Eastern Michigan University football team fell in a tough conference battle against the University of Toledo, Oct. 8, by a final tally of 35-20 on the 96th Homecoming. The Eagles (4-2, 1-1 MAC) kept it close throughout the majority of the game, but the Rockets (4-1, 1-0 MAC) sealed the victory in the final quarter of play by possessing the ball for more than 12 minutes.

As a team, Eastern got most of their offensive production through the passing game, finishing with 255 yards and one touchdown through the air. In total, EMU notched 317 yards on offense with an average of 5.5 yards per play. The Green and White were also solid in the red zone, scoring on all three of their trips.

On the offensive side of the ball, redshirt junior **Brogan Roback** led the EMU attack, throwing for 255 yards and one touchdown. Three different receivers posted at least four receptions on the day, with junior **Sergio Bailey** II leading the way with five catches for a career-best 89 yards. Sophomore **Eddie Daugherty** had a nice game as well, catching four passes for a seasonhigh 74 yards. Finally, junior **Antoine Porter** posted 50 receiving yards, as well as one touchdown. Redshirt freshman **Breck Turner** paced the squad on the ground, picking up his third rushing touchdown of the year.

Redshirt senior Ike Spearman and redshirt sophomore Kyle Rachwal led the EMU on defense, tallying 11 total tackles aplece. Sophomore Kwanii Ffigueroa had a solid game as well, notching a sack in the first quarter. It was just the third sack allowed by the Rockets this season. Finally, freshman Vince Calhoun notched eight tackles and a pass breakup, with five of the stops and the breakup coming in the first drive of the game.

The Eagles won the coin toss to start the game, and elected to defer to the second half. Toledo began the game on the ground, picking up a pair of first downs and getting to midfield within the first few minutes of play. The trend continued, as the Rockets approached the red zone around the 10-minute mark. On a third-and-five, Toledo rifled a pass towards the end zone, which was broken up by Calhoun. Electing to go for it on fourth, Calhoun came up with a big stop near the marker to give the ball to the Green and White.

with a big stop near the marker to give the ball to the Green and White Eastern began their drive at the 15, but were unable to get anything going. Forced to punt, redshirt junior Austin Barnes pinned Toledo within their own 30. After a penalty, the Rockets quickly passed midfield. Redshirt freshman Maxx Crosby came up with a big play to force a loss of three yards, making in 3rd-and-14, after which Figueroa picked up a sack to bring up fourth down. After a touchback, the Eagles got the ball back for their second drive with 3:41 left in the first quarter.

Roback notched his first completion of the game to begin the drive, with redshirt freshman **Nigel Kilby** picking up 14 over the middle. A few plays later, Roback fired another pass to A. Porter for a gain of 15. Unfortunately, the drive stalled at midfield, and Barnes was forced to punt again. The first quarter ended shortly after with both teams even at zero apiece.

The second quarter began with Toledo using the ground game yet again. The Eagles held strong, forcing a third-and-eight at midfield. A false start on the Rockets made it 3rd-and-13, and Toledo was unable to pick up the first down shortly after. After a touchback, the Eagles had another opportunity on offense. Unfortunately, they were unable to muster anything, going three-and-out.

A penalty against the Eagles on the punt gave Toledo solid field position to begin their drive, as they started at the EMU 46. The Rockets picked up consecutive first downs, getting to the 17 with 8:30 left in the half. On the next play, Toledo found the end zone on a long pass to go ahead 7-0 after the PAT.

After a penalty on the kickoff, Eastern began at their own nine. A nice sweep for Bailey II gave EMU some breathing room, moving the ball to the 22. On third down, Roback threw a pass towards the sideline, but the receiver was unable to get his feet down in-bounds. Eastern then punted the ball away with 5:35 left to play in the half.

During the punt, a Toledo penalty moved the Rockets back to the 34, but they promptly moved to midfield on a 16-yard rush. The EMU defense then came up clutch again, knocking down the Toledo running back in the back field for a loss of two on third down. Toledo elected to punt the ball away, and the Eagles fair caught the ball at the 12. Once again, the offense was unable to get moving, as another three-and-out forced EMU to punt. Fortunately for the Eagles, Barnes boomed a long punt, and the Rockets would begin their drive from the 20.

The defense got off to a good start on the drive, as senior **DaQuan Pace** forced a three-yard loss on a screen pass. After nearly notching a pick on third down, the Green and White forced a three-and-out for the Rockets. Punting with 49 seconds remaining in the half, the Eagles would have one final opportunity to put some points on the board before heading to the locker room.

The EMU drive began with a bang, as Roback floated a long pass to Bailey II, who came down with it and was within inches of breaking away for a touchdown. Despite being tackled by his shoestrings, Bailey II got the Eagles into the red zone. The Green and White followed up with three consecutive shots to the end zone, narrowly missing on all three. Eastern then brought out the field goal unit, and redshirt freshman Paul Fricano converted the 34-yarder to make the score 7-3 with eight ticks left in the half. Toledo would elect to kneel out the half, and the two squads went to their locker rooms with score at 7-3 in favor of the Rockets.

Eastern received the ball to begin the second half, with their drive kicking off at the 22. The Eagles promptly picked up a first down after a pair of solid ushes from redshirt sophomore lan Eriksen, after which Turner broke through for a gain of 18 on a screen pass. Turner kept the momentum going, using his vision to spot a gap in the line and gain five yards to pick up another first. The drive continued, as Roback completed a short pass to A. Porter for another fresh set of downs. The Eagles eventually stalled at the Toledo 26, and brought out the field goal unit. Fricano nailed the 44-yard field goal, which was his second of the game, and Eastern trailed Toledo by just one, 7-6, with 10:11 remaining in the third quarter.

The Rockets quickly got on the scoreboard on the ensuing drive, as a receiver snuck behind the defensive backs and found the end zone on a 63-yard pass. Toledo jumped to a 14-6 lead with 9:16 left in the quarter. On the kickoff, both returners bumped into one another while attempting to catch the kick, and the ball fell to the ground with Toledo recovering it at the EMU 16.



The Rockets found the end zone again three plays later, notching their second touchdown within the previous minute. After the PAT, Toledo built their lead to 21-6.

The Eagles began their drive from the 28, and Daugherty found an open area in the defensive backfield to pick up 22 and get to midfield. From there, Turner rushed for five, after which a facemask penalty on Toledo brought the Eagles to the Rockets 25. Bailey then caught a tough ball in traffic to bring EMU to the three. Eastern then notched their first touchdown of the day on an outside rush from Turner. After the PAT from Fricano, Eastern cut the Toledo lead to 21-13 with 6:01 to go in the third quarter.

Eastern's defense came out strong again on the next Toledo drive, forcing a quick three-and-out after the Rockets' third down pass fell short. After the punt, the Eagles got the ball back at the 31. A personal foul penalty on the Green and White forced EMU to begin with a 1st-and-24. A pair of short passes made the third down distance manageable, but pressure on third down forced Roback's pass short. Barnes then came on and boomed a long punt, but Toledo had a nice return and brought it back to the EMU 38.

Fortunately for EMU, a personal foul penalty on the return negated the big yardage, and Toledo began their drive from their own 14. After picking up a first down, Eastern made it third-and-six following a failed long pass. From there, a false start penalty brought the ball back even further. However, Toledo managed to convert on a 13-yard pass. The third quarter then concluded, with the Rockets Still ahead, 21-13.

The Rockets picked back up with another first down, as the receiver barely crossed the plane to pick up a fresh set of downs. A Toledo receiver then found a gap in the defense, picking up 23 and bringing the Rockets to the EMU 28. After rushing for another first down, redshirt senior Pat O'Connor (Chicago, Ill. – Saint Rital) nabbed a tackle behind the line for a loss of one. However, Toledo responded with a touchdown pass two plays later, increasing their lead to 28-13 with 10:52 remaining.

Eastern began their drive with a sweep from Bailey II, who turned on the jets and picked up a first down after a gain of 10. Bailey II was featured in the next play as well, notching eight on a curl route. Daugherty then caught a nice pass for 17, fighting for every yard and refusing to go down. The drive continued with Roback sitting patiently in the pocket and finding Daugherty again for 18. Daugherty continued finding success on the next play, coming down with a tough catch on a corner route to pick up another 17 yards and bring EMU to the five. The drive was then capped off by Roback finding A. Porter in the end zone for an EMU touchdown. With 8:43 remaining in the game, Eastern trailed by eight. 28-20.

Toledo then had trouble handling the kickoff, and Eastern tackled the returner at the 17. The Rockets responded by promptly picking up a first down after a 12-yard pass, after which they nabbed another on an 11-yard pass. Pace then put a stop to the Toledo momentum, dropping the Rockets receiver for a loss of one. However, Toledo's running back then bulldozed his way for a gain of 12 for a fresh set of downs. The defense then forced a third-and-three, but the Rockets converted for another first on a short pass. The long Toledo drive continued with the Rockets rushing their way ahead to the 16. With 2-43 left in the game, the Eagles forced a third-and-six, but Toledo completed a corner pass for another touchdown. The Rockets jumped to a 35-20 lead with just 2-37 remaining in the game.

Eastern began their drive with a quick first down, as Roback scrambled for a gain of four and A. Porter caught a short pass for 14. Roback's next pass was tipped and intercepted at the Toledo 34. Toledo then began to bleed the clock, as the Rockets rushed the ball on three consecutive plays. The clock then reached zero, and Toledo walked away with a 35-20 victory over the Eagles.

Second-Half Surge at Ohio Pushes EMU to 5-2 on the Year Eastern won in Athens for the first time since 1994

ATHENS, Ohio (EMUEagles.com) - The Eastern Michigan University football team accomplished something it has not done since 1967 in the 27-20 road victory over Ohio University Saturday afternoon, Oct. 15, at Peden Stadium. The Eagles (5-2, 2-1 MAC) won their third consecutive road game for the first time since '67, and defeated the Bobcats (4-3, 2-1 MAC) in Athens for the first time since 1994 to move to 5-2 on the season and 2-1 in league play.

The aerial assault of the Eagles carried the day, as redshirt junior Brogan Roback had a day, passing for a career-best 347 yards on a record 29 completions and three touchdowns, all coming in the second half. It was the fifth three-touchdown performance of his career, and the second of the season.

Roback's favorite target on the day was junior Sergio Bailey II, who finished with a career-high 143 yards on eight receptions and a score. It was the first 100-yard receiver of the season for EMU. Also catching TDs on the afternoon were fellow juniors Antoine Porter and Johnnie Niupalau, with Porter totaling a career-best 74 yards, while Niupalau picked up 16.

As a team, EMU out-gained the Bobcats by a final tally of 435-415, including a 347-291 advantage through the air. The Eagles converted 7-of-15 first downs, compared to Ohio's 3-of-11. EMU also won the turnover battle 2-1.

Defensively, junior Jason Beck (Indianapolis, Ind.-Arsenal Technical) led the charge with a team-high 10 stops. Senior DaQuan Pace had the first interception of his season to go along with four tackles and a breakup, while redshirt senior Pat O'Connor finished with two tackles for loss, and a strip sack, which was his 5.5 of the season and 17th of his career, which places him just a half sack away from being the all-time EMU leader since 1998.

The Eagles were the first on the board after shutting down the Ohio offense on their first possession. Led by the passing attack of Roback, the Eagles raced down the field in 12 plays. Roback began the drive completing passes of 12 yards to Bailey II, followed by a 32 yarder to A. Porter, and then a 17-yard strike again to Bailey II to quickly get Eastern down to the Ohio 35.

After a pair of first downs to get into the red zone, the Bobcat defense stepped up, forcing the 22-yard field goal. Redshirt freshman Paul Fricano split the uprights, giving EMU the early 3-0 lead.

The next four drives were three and outs for both teams, quickly moving the clock to under four minutes in the first quarter. The field position was in EMU's favor though, as two of the OU drives started within their own 10.

Ohio's fourth drive of the game, though, got them out of the shadow of their own goalposts, getting to EMU's side of the field at the 38. Eastern's defense stood tall this time, stopping the Bobcats on fourth down, and getting the ball back right before the end of the first quarter.

On the ensuing EMU drive, the first turnover of the game turned the momentum in favor of the Bobcats. On a long third down pass to senior Sam Browning over the middle, the tight end was stripped near midfield, and Ohio recovered for the first turnover of the game.

Nine plays later, Ohio turned the fumble into points on a 22-yard field goal of their own, knotting the score at 3-3 with 10:46 until the

Following another three-and-out by EMU, Ohio began driving again, looking to take their first lead of the game. Three first downs got the Bobcats to midfield, but the drive was halted on a long strike downfield, which was undercut and picked off by Pace, who then returned it 35 yards to the OU 44 yard line. It was the second INT of Pace's career. Despite the turnover, Ohio's defense continued to lock down the Eagle attack, forcing yet another three-and-out.

Much like the OU defense. Eastern's was just as fierce in the first half, as on the next Bobcat drive, EMU got their second turnover of the game. Dropping back to pass, O'Connor came off the edge for the strip sack, which was recovered by redshirt senior Ike Spearman at the Ohio 27, giving EMU's its best field position of the game.

The defensive struggle continued however, as Ohio forced another EMU field goal try, which was off the left post this time, keeping the score 3-3 with 2:54 to go. Looking to put up points before the half, Ohio was unable to get anything going, leaving the score at three-all into the half.

Eastern began with the ball in the second half, and found some of the offensive rhythm it lacked in the first half. Beginning at the 14, a 17-yard run and then a 17-yard pass from Roback quickly got EMU into Ohio territory. A 17-yard screen pass to redshirt sophomore lak Eriksen got the Eagles deeper, and a nine-yard pass to Bailey II moved the Eagles into the red zone.

Ohio's defense kept EMU out of the end zone, though, as a 13yard sack killed the momentum. However, the Eagles came away with points on a 34-yard Fricano field goal, giving EMU the lead

The Bobcats had an immediate response on their first drive of the second half, engineering a 10-play, 71-yard drive for the first



touchdown of the game. It was capped off by an eight-yard run, giving Ohio their first lead of the game at 10-6 with just under four minutes left in the third quarter.

Eastern found the big play it needed on the first play of the very next drive. After starting at its own 34, Roback found Bailey II for about 20 yards, but the shifty receiver shook the only defender nearby, and proceeded to sprint down to the OU nine vard line.

Two plays later, Roback found Niupalau in the end zone for the Eagles' first touchdown of the game. Niupalau's third TD catch of the season gave Eastern the lead back at 13-10 with just under three minutes until the final frame.

This time the Bobcats could not respond, going three-and-out and giving Eastern the ball back at their 37 just before the end of the quarter. The Eagles used the defensive stand to extend the lead on the next drive.

Going 11 plays and 63 yards, EMU pushed its lead to 10, 20-10, to begin the fourth quarter. EMU quickly got to midfield after a rush from Eriksen, and a 10-vard pass to redshirt freshman Isaac Holder. After back-to-back incompletions, Roback found Bailey II for a 13yard gain, putting him over 100-yard receiving in the game and giving Eastern a fresh set of downs at the OU 35.

Redshirt freshman Breck Turner then picked up the next 21 yards on two rushes and a dump-off pass, but a rush for no gain in the middle of the sequence set up a third and three. Coming out of a timeout, Roback floated a pass to the corner, which Bailey II wrestled away from the defender, coming down with his third touchdown pass of the season. The strike made the tally 20-10 with 11:03 to go.

With their backs up against the wall, the Bobcats were able to respond with an eight-play, 90-yard touchdown drive to cut the score back down to 20-17 with 8:07 left in the contest.

The Eagle offense responded one more time on the next drive with a huge, eight-play, 70-yard drive for a touchdown. Roback continued to sling it, with two completions to Bailey II and Porter, before Turner broke free for a 24-yard gain to advance EMU to the Ohio 27. Another first down came after a 2-yard run from Turner and an 8-yard pass to A. Porter, giving EMU first down at the 17.

Three plays later on a third and four, Roback threw for his third TD pass of the game, this time to A. Porter on an 11-yard strike, giving Eastern the 10-point lead back at 27-17 with 3:47 to go.

Needing two guick scores, Ohio got one on the next drive with a 47-vard field goal with just over two minutes left to play. Still needing a touchdown and with only two timeouts left, Ohio attempted the onside kick, but it was secured by the Eagles at the 39.

Still needing one more first down to seal the deal, Turner carried the load with three straight rushes for 12 yards, giving EMU the fresh set of downs, and burning the remaining two OU timeouts. With the game in hand, EMU kneeled out the game, securing the 27-20 victory.

Eagles Come Up Short In 45-31 Defeat at No. 20 Western Michigan Brogan Roback eclipsed the 4,000 yard mark for his EMU career in the loss

KALAMAZOO, Mich. (EMUEagles.com) – Despite having a brief lead in the second quarter, the Eastern Michigan University football team could not keep pace with No. 20 Western Michigan University in a 45-31 defeat Saturday evening at Waldo Stadium. It was the first home deficit of the season for the nationally ranked Broncos (8-0. 4-0 MAC).

Redshirt Junior **Brogan Roback** guided the Eagle (5-3, 2-2 MAC) offense to an efficient 461 yard day, passing for 319 yards with 28 completions on a career-high 44 attempts. He threw for a touchdown, and ran for another. The 319 yards put him over the 4,000 yard mark for his EMU career, making him just the sixth to do so. It was his second straight 300-yard passing game and the third of his career.

Roback's top target was junior **Sergio Bailey II** who had six catches for 93 yards, including a game-long 56-yard catch. The touchdown pass went to fellow junior **Antoine Porter**, who had five catches for 80 yards.

Not to be outdone, the rushing attack had 142 on the ground, led by redshirt freshman **Breck Turner** who finished with 86 yards on 17 carries and a score. The final EMU touchdown came from freshman **Willie Parker**, the first of his career. He finished with 21 yards in the first seven carries of his EMU career. The offensive line paved the way for the run game and also did not yield a sack, the fourth game EMU has kept the QB clean.

Defensively, Eastern forced a pair of Broncos turnover, just the second and third of WMU's season. Redshirt sophomore **Ross Williams** had his first career interception, and the first pick of Western's season. Redshirt sophomore **Jeremiah Harris** had the other turnover with a strip sack, which was recovered by sophomore **Kwanii Figueroa**. It was the 2.5 sack of the season for Harris and his second forced fumble. Junior **Jason Beck** was the Eagle's leading tackler with 12 stops, including seven solo and a half for loss.

WMU began the game with the ball, but were quickly stopped for a three-and-out, giving EMU possession at its own 29. After two short passes to Bailey II and A. Porter set up the Eagles at the 44, Turner sprung for a 38-yard rush into the red zone, but he was stripped from behind at the end of the play, giving WMU the ball back at the 17.

The Broncos wasted little time turning the turnover into points, as six plays later, WMU connected on a 32-yard touchdown pass to take a 7-0 lead at the nine minute mark of the first quarter.

Following a short drive with nothing doing for EMU, Western got the ball back looking to add to the lead. Three pass plays got the Broncos into EMU territory, setting up first and 10 from the 47.

On the next play, Harris came off the edge and reached out, stripping the ball away from the QB. Figueroa was there to snatch it up and rumbled 10 yards with the fumble recovery. It was only the second turnover of the season given up by the Broncos.

Starting with the ball at the WMU 37, the Eagles moved the ball in the red zone on Roback's 13-yard pass to A. Porter. After runs by Turner and Parker set up EMU with first and goal, Roback was the one to run in the score from nine yards out to even the contest at seven-all. That score would hold into the second quarter.

Not long into the second frame, WMU took the lead back, capping an 11-play, 75-yard drive that spanned both the first and second quarter, to put the tally at 14-7.

Needing to keep pace, EMU embarked on a season-high 16-play drive on the ensuing series to put more points on the board. After back-to-back third down conversions, EMU was faced with a fourth and one from the WMU 43. A nine-yard dump-off pass to redshirt junior **Lavonte Robinson** gave the Eagles a fresh set of downs.

Two-plays later, a 15-yard pass to Bailey II gave Eastern first and 10 from the 19. After three plays of no gains, redshirt freshman **Paul Fricano** knocked home the 36-yard field goal to cut the deficit to 14-10.

Following their second fumble of the season earlier in the game, Broncos threw their first interception of the season on the first play of their next drive. Going down the middle, R. Williams undercut the pass and snagged the first pick of his career. After the second turnover of the game, EMU was set up at their own EMU 39.

The next EMU drive got started with a 14-yard rush from Turner, getting Eastern into Western territory. A 16-yard pass two plays later to redshirt junior **Dan Buschman** carried Eastern down to the 33 yard line, followed by an 8-yard run from Roback, setting up second and two from the 25. After an incompletion and a one-yard run, EMU faced fourth and one.

Trying a trick play, Roback dumped off a pass to usual offensive lineman redshirt senior **Cole Gardner**, but he was reported as an ineligible receiver, setting up fourth and six from the 29. Electing to go for it, Eastern went for the endzone with a deep pass to A. Porter, which he hauled in over the shoulder for the go-ahead 29-



yard reception. Porter's fourth TD reception of the season gave Eastern its first lead, 17-14, and gave WMU its first home deficit of the season.

WMU did not take long to erase that deficit, going five plays in 2:21, aided by a 51-yard pass, to retake a 21-17 lead with less than two minutes until the half.

Looking for a quick score before the break, EMU tried a long pass down the sideline on the next drive, but it was under thrown for an interception, giving the Broncos an opportunity to add to the lead before the half. WMU did just that, getting into field goal range at the eight-second mark and kicking a 44 yarder to take a 24-17 lead into the locker room.

Getting the ball to start the second half, Eastern started on their own six but picked up a first down to the 19 after a scramble from Roback. Three plays later, Eastern was forced to punt and a 51 yarder from redshirt junior **Austin Barnes** put WMU at the 27.

On Western's first drive of the half, the Broncos had a productive nine-play, 73-yard drive to add to the lead, making things 31-17 with just over six minutes to play in the third quarter.

Faced with its largest deficit of the game, Eastern went to work looking for an answer. On third and eight of the next EMU drive, Roback had all day in the pocket, and found Bailey II for a huge 56-yard gain down to the Western nine. The pass eclipsed the 4,000 yard mark for Roback's career. On the very next play, Turner found the edge for the nine-yard score to cut WMU's lead back to 31-24. It was Turner's fourth rushing TD of the year.

Western had the response once again on their second drive of the third quarter, going the distance in nine plays this time from 70 yards out to put the lead back to 14. A 31-yard touchdown pass capped the drive, which took 4:04 off the clock, leaving the score at 38-24 with a minute until the final frame.

The Eagle offense could not keep pace on its next drive, which ran into the start of the fourth quarter. EMU picked up one first down, but failed to get a second, punting the ball away for the third time. The Broncos took the opportunity to score for their third consecutive drive of the second half, this time on a 13-play, 80-yard drive, giving WMU the 45-24 lead with 7:55 to play.

Not backing down, EMU went to work on the next drive, needing a score to keep them in the game. The Eagles did just that with a 13-play drive, going 75 yards in 4:04. The touchdown was taken in from two yards out by Parker for the first score of his career, and made things 45-31 with just over three minutes to play.

Needing two more touchdowns, Eastern attempted the onsides kick, but it was recovered by WMU. Western got the clock down to under a minute before punting away to give EMU possession with 42 seconds to go. Despite completing a few passes to get near midfield, the clock ran out, sealing the 14-point defeat.

Eagles Clipped At Home by RedHawks, 28-15

Redshirt freshman Dieuly Aristilde had a career-high 193 yards receiving in the game

YPSILANTI, Mich. (EMUEagles.com) – The Eastern Michigan University football team dropped a tough contest to the Miami University RedHawks, 28-15, Saturday afternoon, Oct. 29, at Rynearson Stadium. The Eagles fell to 5-4 on the season and 2-3 in the Mid-American Conference.

Offensively, redshirt junior **Brogan Roback** finished the game 23-of-39 with 328 yards and a pair of touchdowns. This marks the third consecutive game in which Roback has passed for more than 300 yards, dating back to the meeting at Ohio, Oct. 15. Redshirt freshman **Dieuly Aristilde** had a career day, reeling in a team-high seven receptions for a career-best 193 yards and his first career touchdown. This marked the team's highest individual receiving output since 2004 and was the ninth-best in program history.

The defensive side of the ball saw junior Jason Beck lead the team in tackles, totaling 11 stops, including one for a six-yard loss. Redshirt sophonore Jeremiah Harris had a strong game as well, notching a strip sack for his third sack of the season, and his second fumble recovery of the year. Junior Juan Giraldo had one of his best games of the year, posting four tackles and two big pass breakups, which was a season high.

The game began with the Eagles on defense, and Miami (3-6, 3-2 MAC) quickly ripped off a 45-yard rush on the second play of the game. The Red-hawks then picked up another first down, getting within the EMU 20-yard line. From there, Miami continued to push down the field, nabbing another fresh set of downs at the five to make it 1st and goal. Despite making it 3rd and goal, Miami was able to find the end zone for the first score of the game to go ahead 7-0 with 9:37 to go in the quarter.

The Eagles were unable to muster anything on offense, brining on the punt unit to try and pin the RedHawks deep. Redshirt junior **Austin Barnes** did just that, booming a 60-yarder to pin Miami at their 15-yard line. Despite a penalty against Miami, the Green and White gave it right back with a penalty of their own for a fresh set of downs. After an incomplete pass, the Redhawks broke through the line and found the end zone once again, making the score 14-0 in favor of Miami with 6:15 remaining in the first quarter.

Eastern then re-took the field needing to respond to Miami's hot start. Roback got the drive off to a nice start by rifling a 20-yard pass to junior Sergio Bailey II to approach midfield. From there, redshirt sophomore Ian Eriksen bulldozed his way for nine on two carries, bringing up 3rd and 1. Eriksen was unable to churn out the yard, and Eastern brought on the punt team again. Barnes had another nice punt, and Miami got the ball back at their own II.

The EMU defense had a strong response, forcing a three-and-out after Giraldo had a nice pass breakup on third down. Following the Miami punt, EMU got the ball back at their own 43. Redshirt freshman **Breck Turner** began the drive with a nice rush, finding the edge and picking up 11 to get into RedHawk territory. Facing 3rd and 2, Roback kept the ball on a designed QB run and picked up five for a first down. With that, the first quarter came to an end with Miami leading by a 14-0 margin.

After a sack that made it 3rd and 18, Roback was pressured once again and was forced to throw it away. Barnes then came on for his third punt of the game, with the ball barely getting into the end zone for a touchback. Miami continued to utilize the ground game, picking up more first downs and crossing midfield. With the ball at the EMU 46, redshirt junior **Derric Williams** and redshirt freshman **Maxx Crosby** made a nice stop in the backfield to bring up 2nd and 11. An incomplete pass then made it 3rd and 11, and Giraldo once again came up with a key pass breakup. Miami came on to punt, and the ball went into the end zone for a touchback.

Following a sideline pass that was ruled incomplete, Eriksen picked up six on the ground, after which sophomore **Eddie Daugherty** picked up eight on a pass from Roback. From there, a holding penalty against the Eagles brought the ball back to the 15. Eriksen got the call on first down, hurdling over the line for another gain of six. A pass to junior **Antoine Porter** then picked up eight more to make it 3rd and 6, with Roback then passing underneath to Eriksen for a gain of just four. With it being 4th-and-two, Barnes had another solid punt, once again narrowly having the ball fall into the end zone.

The RedHawks began their drive with some play action, picking up 28 after the receiver found a gap in the defensive secondary. Miami then picked up another first down on an 11-yard pass, but their drive came to an abrupt halt on a huge strip sack by Harris, which was his third sack of the season. The Eagles then took over at their own 44 with good field position and just under four minutes remaining in the half.

Eastern picked up a quick first down after an 11-yard pass to A. Porter, and from there, Roback found Bailey II near the sideline for a gain of 21. With the ball at the Miami 28, the Eagles picked up a yard on two plays, forcing a long 3rd down attempt. Roback then attempted an end zone pass to A. Porter, who caught it, but was ruled out of bounds. The EMU field goal unit then came onto the field, and redshirt freshman Paul Fricano converted a 40-yarder to put EMU on the board. With about 1:30 left until the half, EMU trailed Miami, 14-3. Miami kept the ball on the ground in the ensuing possession, letting the clock tick down as halftime approached. Ultimately, the

RedHawks elected to kneel out the half, with Miami leading 14-3 at the half. Eastern began the third quarter on the offensive end following a touch-back. On the first play, Roback was tripped up behind the line, fumbling the ball and then falling on it for a loss of 12. An EMU penalty brought the ball back even further, making it 2nd and 28 from the EMU six. Facing pressure in the end zone, Roback got rid of the ball to bring up 3rd and long. After heading a long pass downfield, the ball fell incomplete, and Barnes came on to punt from his own end zone. The 61-yard punt took a favorable EMU bounce, with Miami falling on it at their own 33. A penalty against the RedHawks brought the ball back even further, and Miami would begin their drive from the 23.

The RedHawks began with a quick first down, but followed that up with a pass for a loss of six. The Eagles then narrowly missed an interception, bringing up 3rd and long. Miami elected to run, only picking up four yards, forcing the RedHawks to punt. Redshirt sophomore Blake Banham had a solid return, picking up 14 to give the EMU offense solid field position to



begin their drive.

ĒMU began their drive with a gain of seven on back-to-back rushes, but the third down pass fell incomplete. Like he had done all game, Barnes delivered another beauty, pinning Miami at their own 15-yard line. Miami picked up right where they left off, rushing for a quick first down on two plays. On 3rd and five, a facemask penalty went against the Eagles to extend the RedHawk drive and bring them to midfield. The drive continued following back-to-back first downs, brining Miami to the EMU 27. From there, the RedHawks kept moving, getting to the one and eventually punching it in for another touchdown. After the PAT, Miami opened their largest lead of the day, 21-3.

The first play of the drive saw Roback get sacked, but he came right back and completed a pass for a gain of 11 to Aristilde, followed by another for 27 to quickly pick up 38 yards. From there, he fired a long strike downfield, with Aristilde once again coming down with the circus catch for 42 yards, which was a career-long reception. Showing some momentum on offense, Eastern continued the aerial assault, as Daugherty fought his way for a gain of eight to bring EMU within the Maimi 10-yard line. The third quarter came to an end with the Eagles at the Miami three.

Following the short break, EMU narrowly missed a pass to the end zone. The Eagles elected to go for it on fourth down, and that proved to be the correct decision, as Roback flipped a short pass to redshirt freshman **Nigel Kilby** and he ran into the end zone. Eastern attempted a two-point conversion, which fell just short. With 14:51 left in the game, EMU still trailed Miami 21.0.

Miami quickly picked up a first down on consecutive passes to get to the 43, after which senior **DaQuan Pace** broke up a pass to force 3rd and 7. After bringing multiple defenders on a blitz, Miami completed a pass over the middle, with the receiver finding a hole in the defense and running untouched into the end zone. After the PAT, Miami opened up a 28-9 lead with 12:39 left in the game.

Needing to make up some ground, EMU began their drive with a short pass to Kilby for a short gain. On the ensuing play, Roback threw a beautiful pass to Aristilde, who avoided a shoestring tackle and ran 75 yards into the end zone for his first career touchdown. Despite failing on the two-point conversion, the Eagles made it a 13-point game, 28-15, with 11:43 remaining.

Trailing by 13, the Eagles needed to come out and get a quick stop. Miami began to chew the clock, picking up a first down on consecutive rushes. The trend continued, as the RedHawks picked up two more runs of five for another fresh set of downs. EMU's defense then held Miami to short gains on the next two plays, bringing up 3rd and 8. The RedHawks attempted to rush for the first down, but only picked up two on the play. The Miami punt fell into the end zone, and EMU would get the ball back at their own 20.

The Green and White continued attacking the Miami defense from the air, as the team posted consecutive first downs on passes from Roback. After a pass for seven yards to Kilby, Roback then scrambled from the pocket and picked up four for another first down. On fourth down, Roback's pass fell incomplete, and Miami took over on downs with about three minutes left.

The RedHawks continued to run the ball and drain clock, forcing the Eagles to use their timeouts. Eastern managed to stop the Miami rushing attack, and the RedHawks came on to punt with 2:45 remaining in the game. Eastern kept fighting, picking up a fresh set of downs on passes from Roback. A fourth down heave from Roback to Aristilde kept things rolling, after which the Green and White picked up another first down. Eastern then threw up another long pass towards the end zone, with this one coming down in the hands of the RedHawks, effectively sealing the game with Miami coming out on top, 28-15.

Eagles Become Bowl Eligible with Historic Come-From-Behind Victory EMU's 21-point comeback tied a program record for the largest in school history

MUNCIE, Ind. (EMUEagles.com) - The Eastern Michigan University football team overcame a 21-point first quarter deficit to defeat Ball State University, 48-41, Tuesday night at Schuemann Stadium to become bowl eligible for the first time since 1995. The 21-point comeback tied the largest deficit overcome by an Eagles team in program history.

"When you see veteran players out there, who have put absolutely everything into this program, and want it so badly to succeed, at the end of the game, those are the guys that made this happen," said Head Coach Chris Creighton. "I don't know if I have ever been in a better locker room, I am just so proud of our

The EMU offense carried the day, totaling a seasonhigh 622 yards of total offense, including 468 through the air and 154 on the ground. It was the fourth-most total offense by EMU in program history and the most since 2012.

Orchestrating the Eagle attack was once again redshirt junior Brogan Roback who had a careerhigh 468 yards passing on 37-of-71 passing, both of which were career-highs as well. He threw for three touchdowns on the night. It was the third-most passing yards in a game in program history, and the most since Andy Schmitt set the program record with 516 in 2008. The dual-threat QB also got it done on the ground, with a career-high tying 41 yards on eight rushes, as well as his fourth career rushing score.

On the receiving end of his passes were 10 different wide outs, led by redshirt freshman Dieuly Aristilde who had his second straight 100+ yards receiving day with 107 on six catches. Roback tossed a touchdown to junior Sergio Bailey II, while the other two were hauled in by redshirt junior Dan Bucshman. The pair of TD catches were the first of his career.

On the ground, redshirt sophomore lan Eriksen was the bell cow, toting the ball 25 times for 109 yards, his second 100-yard rushing effort of the season and his career. He also scored a pair of rushing touchdowns and had a career-high 71-yards receiving on five catches.

Defensively, the Eagles had plenty of highlights, despite giving up 41 points, 14 of which were due to a short field. EMU forced a season-high five turnovers, two interceptions and three fumble recoveries. Both picks came from senior **DaQuan Pace**, who led EMU in tackles with eight stops on his birthday. Meanwhile, redshirt senior Pat O'Connor had 1.5 sacks to bring his career total to 18.5, the most by an Eagle since the stat began being tracked in 1998. EMU also held Ball State without a third down conversion until the fourth quarter, and the Cardinals were just 2-of-13 on the evening.

After falling behind, 21-0, the Eagles scored 19 unanswered points to pull within two of the Cardinals minutes before halftime. Redshirt freshman Paul Fricano's 34-yard field goal put the Green and White on the board with seconds remaining in the first quarter.

In the second quarter, the EMU defense forced backto-back three-and-outs, setting the Eagle offense up for a nine-play, 49-yard drive, capped by Roback's first touchdown pass of the night. Hauling in the first score of his career, Buschman's catch in the endzone made the score, 21-9, in favor the BSU. Eastern Michigan added another score on an Eriksen rushing TD, before Fricano split the uprights from 25-yards out. A quick



strike by Ball State before the half gave the home team a 28-19 lead at the break.

The Eagles capitalized on a Cardinal miscue in the third quarter, turning a muffed punt return into seven points on a 3-yard Roback rushing touchdown with 10:08 to play in the period. EMU went on to take its first lead of the night nearly six minutes later, as Roback connected with Bailey II for a 16-yard TD recep-

Through three quarters of play the Eagles clung to a five-point, 33-28, lead.

Eastern extended its advantage to 40-28 on the first play of the fourth quarter, as Buschman registered his second touchdown of the game, a 30-yard reception from Roback. Ball State responded roughly one minute later, before taking a one-point lead with 1:35 remaining.

Trailing 41-40 with no timeouts left, Roback completed 6-of-7 attempts, including a circus catch by Johnnie Niupalau to put the Eagles on the doorstep of the go-ahead score with just over 30 seconds to play. With first and goal from the BSU 1, Eriksen punched it in, finding the endzone for the second time on the night. The Eagles elected to go for two and converted, as Roback slung a pass to Bailey II to take a 48-41 lead with 27 seconds remaining.

Turning possession back over to the Cardinals, the Green and White defense held strong, eventually sealing the victory with Pace's second interception of the night to become bowl eligible for the first time since

"I know we are bowl-eligible, but that does not mean we are bowl-guaranteed," Creighton added. "We still have lots of work to do and much to improve on. Our goal has always been to be bowl eligible, so we are moving closer to that each game. I know this isn't the best step or the guaranteed step into this goal, but it was a monster step forward for us."

NIU's Second Half Comeback Spurns EMU in Overtime The game marked the first overtime contest for EMU since 2013

YPSILANTI, Mich. (EMUEagles.com) – The Eastern Michigan University football team dropped an overtime contest to Northern Illinois University, Wednesday, Nov. 16, at Rynearson Stadium. The Eagles (6-5, 3-4 MAC) raced to a 21-0 lead, but the Huskies (4-7, 4-3 MAC) came back in the second half to ultimately secure the overtime victory. 31-24.

Eastern Michigan's rushing attack prowed to be very strong throughout the game, as the squad totaled 291 yards rushing on 56 attempts, good for 5.2 yards per carry. Redshirt sophomore lan Eriksen had a fantastic game, rushing for a career-best 171 yards and two touchdowns. Redshirt junior quarterback Brogan Roback surpassed the 5,000 career passing yards milestone, throwing for 184 yards and one touchdown on the day. Eriksen was the top receiver on the day as well with 48 yards, while junior Sergio Bailey II had 40 yards and one touchdown. Redshirt freshman Paul Fricano finished the day with one field goal, in addition to three PAT's. With those three point after attempts, Fricano tied the EMU record for successful PATs in a single season with 38.

The defensive side of the ball saw redshirt sophomore Kyle Rachwal lead the

The defensive side of the ball saw redshirt sophomore **Kyle Rachwal** lead the way with 11 stakles, in addition to pulling down the second interception of his career, Fellow redshirt sophomore **Jeremiah Harris** also had a solid game, blocking a field goal for the second time in his career. Finally, freshman **Vince Calhoun** stuffed the stat sheet with 10 total tackles, including one for loss, while breaking up a pass.

Eastern began the game on offense, picking up two first downs after a clutch third-down catch on the sideline from Bailey for 20 yards. Roback continued his strong start to the game, finding Eriksen for a gain of 20 out of the backfield. On the very next play, Eriksen found a hole in the line and burst through for a 27-yard touchdown. After the PAT, Eastern opened a quick 7-0 lead with 12:26 remaining in the first outside.

NIU had a solid kick return to the EMU 48, but quickly went three-and-out after a strong series from the Eagle defense. The Huskies then looked like they were going to go for it on fourth down, but punted it away for just 14 yards. Eastern took over at their own 29, notching a quick first down on a screen pass to redshirt freshman Isaac Holder (Tampa, Fla. – Sickles). The Green and White couldn't muster anything on the next three plays, however, and redshirt junior **Austin Barnes** boomed a 48-yard punt to pin the Huskies at their own 12.

Although the Eagles got NIU into back-to-back third down situations, the Huskies were able to convert on both occasions, and moved across midfield. A penalty against the Green and White gave Northern 15 yards, moving them to the 19. After a loss of five and an incomplete pass, the EMU defense held the Huskies to just a gain of five, bringing up fourth down. NIU elected to attempt a 36-yard field goal, but it was blocked by Harris.

Eastern kept the momentum rolling, nabbing a first down after some shifty running from Eriksen. EMU rode the hot hand on the next play, and Eriksen delivered with a 29-yard rush to push the Eagles to the NIU 40-yard line. Despite being set back five yards by a penalty, sophomore **Eddie Daugherty** picked up 11 on the next play to bring up second down and short. The Eagles elected to rush on third down, which proved to be a good decision, as Eriksen rumbled his way for nine yards. After picking up another fresh set of downs, Roback found Bailey in the end zone for the squad's second touchdown of the day. With 1:56 remaining in the first quarter, Eastern held a 14-0 lead over the Huskies.

The defense continued to control the Huskie offense, as NIU went three-and-out once again, with redshirt freshman Clay Holford notching a big tackle-for-loss to kick off the drive. After the punt, EMU got the ball back yet again at their own 17. Roback kicked off the drive with a quarterback keeper, finding a seam to pick up 19. The first quarter then came to an end with the Eagles remaining ahead, 14-0.

The first play of the second quarter saw junior **Antonie Porter** make a reception before breaking a tackle and picking up 10 yards down the sideline for a first down. Facing second and long, Roback stood strong in the pocket and fired a bullet to redshirt junior Dan Buschman for a gain of 25, putting EMU back across midfield once again. Roback and Eriksen then combined to rush for 14 yards, but Roback next pass went off of the receiver's hands and was intercepted by NIU at the 21.

next pass went off of the receiver's hands and was intercepted by NIU at the 21. The Huskies were able to pick up a pair of first downs to approach midfield, but then faced third down at the EMU 48. Freshman **Kevim McGill** then notched a nice pass breakup on the next play to prevent the Huskies from gaining any more ground. After the punt, Eastern's offense retook the field at the 21. On the second play of the drive, Roback was flushed from the pocket and found Daugherty for a gain of 24, moving the chains to the 45. Facing third down, Roback was pressured in the pocket, escaping down the sideline for a gain of 15 and a fresh set of downs. Eastern was then unable to move the ball any further, and Fricano came on to attempt a 40-yard field goal. His kick went wide, and the Eagles came up empty on the drive.

Three consecutive rushes gave NIU a first down at their own 39, but they then faced third down. Electing to throw, the NIU pass went off the receiver's hands, and Rachwal snatched it out of the air for an interception, giving the Eagles excellent field position at the NIU 33 with 3:48 left in the half. After a pass to the end zone fell incomplete, Roback kept it himself on the ground for a gain of four, which was followed by a NIU penalty for 15 more. The offense continued moving down the field, and notched a first down at the five to bring up first-and-goal. Three plays later, Eriksen bulldozed his way into the endzone for his second touchdown of the day. A successful PAT made the score 21-0 with the Eagles on top, and just 1:12 remained in the first half. The Huskies decided to keep the ball on the ground for their drive, letting the clock run. At the half, EMU held a commanding 21-0 lead over Northern Illinois

The Huskies began the second half with a bang, as Jordan Huff was able to elude multiple EMU defenders and rumble into the endzone from 60 yards out to put the Huskies on the board. A successful PAT made the score 21-7 with the Eagles still in front. Following the kickoff, Eastern was able to pick up a quick 15 yards after a NIU penalty on the first play of the drive. Like he had done in the first half, Eriksen nabbed another first down on back-to-back rushes. The team approached midfield, but was unable to get anything going and would then punt the ball away. Barnes' punt traveled 33 yards, and Northern would return their offense to the field at the 21.

The NIU ground attack continued, as the Huskies picked up 15 yards on two rushes for a first down. Facing third down, NIU was unable to connect on a short pass, forcing another punt. The punt took a favorable bounce for Northern, and the Eagles would begin their drive from the eight-yard line. EMU couldn't get any momentum on their drive, and would go three-and-out without picking up a first down. Putting out of his own end zone, Barnes booted a 46-yard punt, and a personal foul penalty on NIU would set the Huskies back 15 more yards, ultimately nutting Northern at their own 144.

putting Northern at their own 34.

The EMU defense came out strong once again, notching a tackle-for-loss on the first play of the drive, and a near interception on the second. Third down saw NIU only move forward four yards, forcing another punt from the Huskies. Eastern began their drive at the 28, quickly converting on third down after a Roback keeper. Like Northern, EMU couldn't connect on their third down pass and would punt once again.



Northern would strike quickly once again, as the Huskies completed a short pass on second down, which turned into a 74-yard touchdown after a missed tackle. With 5:32 left in the third, EMU still held the lead, 21-14. On the ensuing drive, the Eagle offense could not find a rhythm once again, and Barnes would come on to punt. Northern kept their momentum going, however, rushing 57 yards into the endzone on their first play of the drive. However, the play was overturned, as the NIU ball carrier stepped out of bounds at the 18-yard line. The EMU defense responded well to the tough situation, holding the Huskies and forcing a fourth down field goal attempt. The attempt went through the uprights, and Eastern clung to a slim four-point lead, 21-17, with 2:36 to go in the quarter.

The Green and White got within one-yard of a first down, but were forced to

The Green and White got within one-yard of a first down, but were forced to punt it away once again. NIU moved the ball 13 yards in three plays, which ended the third quarter with the Eagles ahead 21-17. The final quarter opened with the Huskies moving to the EMU 27 following a 10-yard pass. On the next play, the Huskies rolled into the endzone after a 27-yard rush, giving the Huskies a 24-21 lead after the PAT.

Needing to respond on the offensive end, the Eagles came out and quickly moved 11 yards on two plays. From there, back-to-back carries by Eriksen gave Eastern another first down, moving the ball to the EMU 45. Roback then rocketed a pass down the field, which fell incomplete, but a pass interference penalty on the Huskies moved EMU across midfield to the 40. Redshirt sophomore Blake Banham then came into the game, rushing three times for 29 yards, putting EMU at the 11. A penalty against the Eagles put them in a hole, and Roback's next pass was intercepted, putting a stop to the Green and White's best drive of the second half.

Facing an early third and long, Eastern was unable to bring down the Northern QB, and he scrambled for 13 and a fresh set of downs. Following another first down, Eastern brought down the NIU ball carrier behind the line for a loss of four. The Huskies weren't able to convert on third down, and would attempt a 46-yard field goal, which hit the bottom upright, keeping the score at 24-21 in favor of Northern Illinois.

Taking over at their own 30, Eastern moved nine yards in two plays, bringing up third and short. Roback was able to sneak through the line, assisted by an offsides call against NIU, giving EMU a first down near midfield. Eriksen kept the drive moving, posting consecutive rushes of six to keep the chains moving, Banham then came in and picked up another first down as the clock continued to tick down near the 3:30 mark. The ground attack continued, as Roback kept the ball himself and ran for seven to the NIU 21. Facing third down, Roback ran the ball once again, picking up a first down at the 10 with less than two minutes to go. EMU moved the ball three yards on the next two plays, setting up a third down from the seven. Roback then attempted a fade pass, which fell incomplete, bringing up fourth down. The EMU field goal unit then came onto the field, and Fricano nailed it to tie the game at 24 with 43 seconds remaining.

A Squib kick from senior **Brendan Renius** would give NIU the ball at the 25, and 42 ticks of the clock to work with. On the first play, the NIU QB kept the ball, rushing up the middle for 22 yards. The final play of the quarter was a long strike to the end cone, which fell short, but a penalty against NIU gave them another opportunity following the five-yard loss. NIU elected to just take a knee, bringing up overtime.

Overtime began with the Huskies on offense quickly securing a first down on a 13-yard pass. They then moved the ball eight yards on two rushes, bringing up third and short. Although ENU kept Northern out of the end zone, they did pick up enough for a first down from the one-yard line. Calhoun then came through, bringing down the runner for a loss of one. On the next play, NIU found the end zone, and the PAT made it 31-24.

Needing a touchdown to tie it up, the Green and White used the ground game to pick up eight on two rushes. Banham was then dropped for no gain, bringing up fourth and short to decide the game. Eastern was unable to punch it through, giving the Huskies the overtime victory, 31-24.

EMU Completes 7-5 Regular Season with Last-Second Victory Over CMU The Green and White scored with 21 seconds left to secure the victory

YPSILANTI, Mich. (EMUEagles.com) – The Eastern Michigan University football team capped off a historic regular season with a late come-from-behind victory over Central Michigan, today, Nov. 22, at Rynearson Stadium by a final tally of 26-21. With the victory, the Eagles (7-5, 4-4 MAC) finished a season with seven wins for the first time since 1989.

A number of notable accomplishments came with the game against the Chippewas (6-6, 3-5 MAC). To begin, redshirt freshman **Paul Fricano** broke the EMU record for successful PAT's in a season, picking up a pair today to bring his season total to 40. Additionally, the Green and White had 538 yards of offense, bringing their season total to 5,447, breaking the old record of 5,010 yards set in 2008. Finally, Head Coach **Chris Creighton** picked up his 10th win at EMU, becoming the 10th coach in program history to accomplish the feat.

becoming the 10th coach in program history to accomplish the feat.

On the offensive end, redshirt junior **Brogan Roback** had a strong day, throwing for 355 yards and a pair of touchdowns, one of them coming in the final 30 seconds of the game. Junior **Sergio Bailey II** was Roback's top target on the day, as he finished with six receptions for 104 yards and the critical late-game touchdown catch. Redshirt freshman **Dieuly Aristide** had a strong day as well, totaling four catches for 92 yards and a score. On the ground, redshirt sophomore **Blake Banham** had a career day, totaling a career-high 120 yards on the ground with a touchdown, as well as 53 yards receiving.

The Eagle defense was paced once again by redshirt sophomore **Kyle Rachwal**, who totaled 13 tackles on the day. Redshirt senior **Pat O'Connor** tallied his eighth sack of the year in the first quarter, forcing a fumble in the process. The end of the game was sealed when redshirt sophomore **Jeremiah Harris** came up with the first interception of his career on the final play of the game.

The Eagles started the game on defense, as strong special teams play put the Chips at the 16-yard line to start the game. Central began the game with a short pass, which turned into a 35-yard gain after a missed EMU tackle. From there, the EMU defense clamped down, putting a stop to the drive after a big sack from O'Connor. After getting the ball back, the Green and White moved the ball to midfield after a strong rushing attack from Banham. Electing to go for it on fourth down, Banham found a gap in the line and carried the ball all the way to the endzone for a 50-yard touchdown, which was his second of the year. Following the PAT, Eastern opened an early 7-0 lead. With that PAT, Fricano became the all-time EMU leader in PAT's made in a season.

The defense came out strong again on the next drive, forcing a Central threeand-out. The punt was downed at the EMU 18-yard line, and the Eagles would come onto the field looking to repeat their first offensive drive. Facing an early third down, junior **Antoine Porter** caught a short pass and fought for 10-yards to move the Green and White to the 36. On second down, Roback rifled a pass down the sideline and junior **Johnnie Niupalau** was able to keep a foot inbounds for a gain of 25, moving EMU into Chippewa territory. Eastern then took a shot at the endzone, but it was intercepted by CMU, who then returned it to the 19.

Central quickly picked up a first down, but then faced a third-and-long situation. A long pass over the middle looked to be complete, but junior **Juan Giral**do was able to break it up, bringing the Central punting unit back on. With the offense back on the field, Roback found Aristilde for a first down, as he picked up 11-yards and moved the chains to the 37. Facing some pressure, Roback was then able to escape the pocket and rumble his way for a first down. The Maumee, Ohio native continued to utilize his legs, as he notched another fresh set of downs after a 15-yard gain. The first quarter then came to a close with Eastern leading 7.0

The second quarter began with EMU receiving a 15-yard penalty, moving them back to the CMU 42. That proved to be no issue, however, as Roback heaved up a long pass to the endzone, and Aristilde caught it in stride for his second touchdown of the year. After another Fricano PAT, the Eagles extended their lead to 14-0.

The Chippewas returned the favor at the beginning of their next drive, picking up 43 yards on a long pass over the middle. CMU then elected to use the ground game, picking up five yards on two rushes. Facing third-and-five, Central moved back to the air attack and picked up a fresh set of downs, putting them at the EMU 19. Eastern's defense then forced the Chips into another third down, but Cooper Rush again completed a short pass for a first down. Central finally bulldozed their way into the endzone for a touchdown, and made the score 14-7 after the PAT.

Roback began the drive with back-to-back completions, moving the chains to the 39. Facing fourth down, Eastern elected to punt, but the Chips ran into the kicker, giving the Eagles a fresh set of downs. Eastern was then able to pick up nine, but had a penalty on the third down play, bringing up third-and-16. EMU was unable to convert, and the punt team came out to try and pin the Chips deep. Redshirt junior **Austin Barnes** did just that, as his punt was downed at the CMU 12.

After giving up a long drive last time around, the EMU defense held the Chippewas to a quick three-and-out, taking less than a minute off the clock. The Central punt traveled just 38 yards, and the Green and White would begin their drive with solid field position at the EMU 46. On the second play of the drive, redshirt freshman **Nigel Kilby** held onto a tough pass over the middle, giving the Eagles a first down across midfield. A penalty set Eastern back 15 yards, but Kilby responded with a 15-yard reception over the middle to put EMU back where they were to begin with. With just 45 seconds left on the clock, Eastern called a timeout facing third-and-four at the CMU 24. Unable to pick up the first down, the fidd goal unit came on to atempt a 41-yard kick. Fricano's kick went wide right, and the Eagles came up empty on the drive.

Central took over at their own 24 with 34 seconds to work with. After moving to the 28, a Chippewa receiver found a hole in the defense and picked up 35 yards to move to the EMU 37. A penalty against Central put the Chips back five yards, but also took six seconds off the clock. With just seven ticks remaining in the half, CMU utilized a timeout. Central elected to pick up a couple and attempt the long, 55-yard field goal. The kick had the distance, but was just wide, and the two teams went to the locker rooms with EMU ahead 14-7.

EMU received the ball to start the third quarter, beginning their drive from

EMU received the ball to start the third quarter, beginning their drive from the 25. After being tackled behind the line on the first play, Roback completed back-to-back passes for gains of seven and 11, respectively, moving the chains to the 42. Roback then was sacked on the next series, setting up a third-and-20. Although he had plenty of time to throw, nobody could get open, and the pass fell incomplete. The EMU punt team came on, and Barnes booted a 43-yarder to pin the Chips at their own 25.

CMU began their drive on the ground with consecutive pickups of five. O'Connor narrowly missed a sack on the following play, after which the Chips



then picked up nine and crossed midfield. After bulldozing their way for a first down, Central then faced third-and-seven. Cooper Rush fired a pass over the middle, but Central's receiver was unable to hang on, forcing CMU to punt. Beginning at their own nine, the Eagles quickly picked up 26 yards on a

Beginning at their own nine, the Eagles quickly picked up 26 yards on a pass to Bailey II. Following a holding penalty that brought up second-and-18, Banham nabbed 10 on a pass from Roback. The next play was very similar, as Banham reeled in a 27-yarder down the sideline. The aerial assault continued with Bailey II catching a pass for 28 yards down the opposite sideline, setting up first-and-goal from the 10. The Green and White were unable to find the end-zone, and Fricano came on to attempt a short 23-yarder. His kick sailed through the uprights, and the Eagles took a 10-point lead, 17-7, with 4:28 remaining in the third quarter.

The EMU defense came on strong again, forcing a quick three-and-out. Central's punt sailed 28 yards, and the Green and White would begin their drive near midfield at their own 47. After only picking up one on the first play of the drive, a nice cut from Banham gave him room to pick up 22, moving the chains to the CMU 30. The drive stalled there, however, and Fricano came on once again to attempt a 41-yard field goal. Like the previous drive, his kick was good, pushing the lead to 20-7 in favor of the Green and White.

The Chips concluded the third quarter with back-to-back gains of 16 and 13, respectively, putting them at the EMU 48 to begin the final quarter. A holding penalty against the Eagles gave the Chips 10 free yards, moving them to the 38. After a gain of 10, another EMU penalty tacked on five more yards. The drive kept moving from there, as CMU nabbed another fresh set of downs following a 10-yard ush. With the ball at the five and Central facing third-and-two, the Chippewas dove into the endzone on an outside rush for their second score of the game. With the PAT going through the uprights, Central cut the EMU lead to 20-14.

With a little trickery on the return, junior Jaron Johnson picked up 44 yards to begin their drive across midfield at the CMU 46. EMU couldn't move much further, however, and the squad punted the ball away to the 15. After an incomplete pass downfield, the Eagles broke up a short pass to bring up third-andlong. Central's pass attempt was just high, and the Chippewas would punt the ball away near their own endzone.

With 10:09 remaining in the game, Eastern got the ball back at midfield. Like the previous drive, the Eagles couldn't get anything going on the offensive end, and Barnes once again pinned the Chips deep at their own 14. Facing an early third down, Central was able to convert and move to the 34-yard line. Central continued using the pass, nabbing 14 yards down the sideline to get to midfield. The Green and White held the Chips on third-and-short, bringing up fourth-and-one. CMU decided to go for it, and broke through the line for 41 yards to tie the game at 20. With the successful PAT, the Chippewas had their first lead of the game, 21-20, with 2:34 left in the game.

With this likely being their last drive of the game, Eastern began from the 28, picking up five on a short pass to Banham. The next play saw Aristilde brid own a tough, acrobatic catch near the sideline for a gain of 30 to move the chains to the CMU 37. Eastern then advanced the ball five more yards on the next three plays, bringing up fourth-and-six from the Central 33-yard line. EMU called a timeout with 37 seconds left to decide what to do, ultimately bringing the offense back onto the field to try and pick up six more yards. Aristilde hung on to a tough pass over the middle to secure a first down for EMU as the clock continued to tick down.

On the very next play, Roback connected with Bailey II in the corner of the endzone for an incredibly clutch touchdown with 19 seconds left in the game. Being up five, Eastern went for two to try and make it a seven-point game. The two-point attempt fell incomplete, however, and the Eagles held onto a five-point lead, 26-21, with 21 seconds remaining.

After the kick, just 17 ticks of the clock remained for the Chips. Although Central gained 16 yards down the middle on a short pass, the play took 11 seconds off the clock. The game would end with a CMU pass attempt to the end zone being intercepted by Harris, securing the victory for EMU by a final tally of 26-21.






There were few observers that gave the Eastern Michigan University football team any chance of winning a battle with San Jose State University at the 1987 California Bowl.

In fact, the oddsmakers made the Big West Champion Spartans of San José State a 17-point favorite in the matchup with Mid-American Conference champion Eastern Michigan.

But Head Coach Jim Harkema's "Road Warriors" proved that desire and determination could overcome those odds as Eastern recorded a thrilling 30-27 victory.

The EMU offense ground out 212 yards rushing, including 130 yards from MVP Gary Patton in the win. The EMU defense also rose to the occasion, holding San Jose State to 81 yards rushing.

Eastern Michigan's first-ever postseason bowl appearance would be a real challenge as the then-Hurons, ranked No. 3 in the NCAA-College Division national poll, would face off against a Louisiana Tech squad that was the No. 5 squad in the country, in the first Pioneer Bowl in Wichita Falls, Texas.

Head Coach Dan Boisture's squad entered the bowl game as one of the top defensive clubs in the country, allowing just one touchdown in the final five games of the 1971 season.

While the defensive team was prepared for the bowl game, the offensive unit was trying to patch together an offensive backfield that had been crippled by injuries late in the season.

Larry Ratcliff, Eastern's standout tailback, suffered a season-ending knee injury in the seventh game of the season, Oct. 30 against Northern Michigan. Ratcliff's backup, Don Madden, was also sidelined with an injury, leaving the vaunted EMU rushing game looking for a leader.

Seldom-used tailback Tim Packrall stepped in and rushed for a game-high 122 yards on 31 carries but the EMU offense could muster just one score, a 22-yard field goal by Jackson Nunn.

Louisiana Tech added a 91-yard punt return by Wenford Wilborn in the third quarter and the Bulldogs went on to post a 14-3 victory.

That loss was the lone defeat for EMU on the way to a 7-1-2 overall mark in 1971.



As the snow came down on a frigid day in Ypsilanti, the EMU offense mustered just 65 yards in a setback against Bowling Green, Nov. 23, 2013. The offensive output marked the third time an EMU team was held under 100 yards since the 1968 season. During the 1992 campaign, the Eagles gained 89 yards at the Glass Bowl in Toledo, Nov. 14, 1992. EMU also fell one yard shy of the century mark, racking up 99 total yards of offense versus Akron in 1976.

DIVERSITY MILESTONE

On Oct. 23, 2010 when Eastern Michigan University and the University of Virginia met on the football field, another milestone on the landscape of diversity and opportunities for coaches and administrators in intercollegiate athletics was realized. Not only did the game mark the 1,000th for the Eastern Michigan football program, it will also be a noteworthy day for minority football coaches and athletic directors on the Division I FBS and FCS levels (excluding historically black colleges).

Mike London (football coach) and Craig Littlepage (athletic director) of the University of Virginia hosted Ron English (football coach) and Dr. Derrick Gragg (athletic director) of Eastern Michigan University. This group has the distinction of achieving a unique milestone on the landscape of intercollegiate diversity in sport. Although no official NCAA record currently exists, the 2010 Eastern Michigan vs. Virginia football game was believed to be the first football game on the Division I level with the opposing coaches and athletic directors being African-Americans.

QUARTERBACK RUSHING ATTACK

The Eagles were led by a career day out of quarterback Reginald Bell **Jr.** en route to a 37-27 victory over the University at Buffalo, Oct. 11, 2014. Bell threw 8-for-13 for 144 yards and one touchdown, but the Golden State native truly shone in his rushing. He led all players with 202 rushing yards and three touchdowns on the ground, including a pair of 70+ yarders. With touchdown runs of 71 and 72 yards, Bell became the first Eagle in EMU history to run for two 70+ yard touchdowns in one game.

The redshirt freshman was also the first Eastern quarterback to rush for over 200 yards; the previous high for a quarterback was Alex Gillett, who ran for 189 yards in a win over Ball State, Oct. 16, 2010.

Bell acted as the catalyst for the Green and White, as the offense went from 73 yards of total offense to 484 yards after he went into the game with 4:15 left in the second quarter. The feat marked the first time since Nov. 9, 2013, that EMU had turned in more than 400 yards of total offense, the last time being against Western Michigan University in a Rynearson Stadium MAC matchup. Additionally, Bell ran 10 times for 104 yards in the third quarter alone, when EMU outgained Buffalo 204 yards to 42.


