BAHAMAS BOWL WEEK 2 NOTEBOOK

HURRICANE IRMA: The Bahamas Bowl staff, ESPN Events and conference partners send out our best wishes and prayers to those affected in the Bahamas and the Caribbean by Hurricane Irma, and those still in harms way as it approaches the Southern US.

SOUTHERN HOSPITALITY: Because of the potential impacts from Hurricane Irma in Florida and Georgia, UAB, which is on the road at Ball State Saturday, and the City of Birmingham are hosting FIU's game vs. Alcorn State Friday night at Legion Field. UAB is also assisting Conference USA partner FIU, as several of the Panthers' fall sports teams have relocated to Birmingham for the duration of the hurricane threat.

WEEK 2 KEY GAMES: There is one conference game in Week 2, as Rice travels to UTEP in the first Conference USA league game of 2017 on Saturday. Also in C-USA, Louisiana Tech hosts the SEC's Mississippi State on Saturday. In the MAC, 2016 champion Western Michigan visits the Big Ten's Michigan State on Saturday and Central Michigan is at Kansas of the Big 12.

BOWL GAMES ARE BETTER IN THE BAHAMAS: *In the first three years, the Bahamas Bowl has ...*
 • *Become the bowl of future champions.* The first two champs - WKU (2014) and Western Michigan (2015) - won their respective league titles the next year. WKU won C-USA in 2015 & 2016, while WMU won the MAC in 2016 with an undefeated regular season and played in a New Year's Six bowl.

C-USA WEEK 1 NOTES: Playing for the first time in 1,007 days, UAB returned to the field with a 38-7 victory over Alabama A&M in front of the largest crowd (445,212) to watch a UAB game at Legion Field ... North Texas opened the season with a 59-14 victory over Lamar, as the Mean Green set a school-record with 668 yards of total offense.

MAC WEEK 1 NOTES: Central Michigan RB **Devon Spalding** scored on a 4-yard run in the third overtime on Thursday as the Chippewas topped Rhode Island, 30-27 ... Senior QB Logan Woodside threw for 314 yards and junior placekicker Jameson Vest kicked a career-best four field goals to lead Toledo to a 47-13 victory over Elon.

North Texas RB **Jeffrey Wilson**: The senior had 12 rushes for 176 yards and three touchdowns in a 59-14 victory over Lamar.

Defensive Player of the Week

Louisiana Tech LB **Dae'Von Washington**: The junior had two interceptions and 26 return yards in a 52-24 victory over Northwestern State.

Special Teams Player of the Week

Marshall KR **Keion Davis**: The junior brought back a pair of kickoff returns for touchdowns and 106 kick return yards in a 31-26 victory over Miami (Ohio).

2017 BAHAMAS BOWL PARTICIPANT SELECTION

The highest-ranked conference champion by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee from the American Athletic, Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West or Sun Belt will play annually in one of the College Football Playoff bowls (Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic, PlayStation Fiesta Bowl or Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl for the 2017 season) if it is not selected for the Playoff Semifinals.

Conference USA has secured guaranteed commitments with six bowl partners for the 2017 season, as well as one secondary agreement: **Bahamas, Bad Boy Mowers Gasparilla, Boca Raton, Gildan New Mexico, R+L Carriers New Orleans** and **Zaxby's Heart of Dallas Bowls** are primary agreements. The **Independence Bowl** in Shreveport, La., is a secondary agreement, should the ACC or SEC not be able to provide a bowl-eligible team. There is no set selection order among C-USA's bowl partners.

The MAC has 2017 primary bowl tie-ins with **Bahamas, Dollar General, Famous Idaho Potato** and **Raycom Media Camellia Bowls**. The MAC has secondary 2017 bowl agreements with **Boca Raton, Frisco** and **Quick Lane Bowls**. The Dollar General Bowl has first selection in 2017, and there is no order of selection for the remaining three primary MAC tie-ins.

The **2017 Bahamas Bowl** participants – selected from among bowl-eligible teams in Conference USA and the Mid-American Conference – will be announced by the bowl, ESPN Events and conference partners once finalized.
