MAKERS WANTED BAHAMAS BOWL WEEK 4 NOTEBOOK

WEEK 4 PREVIEW: The MAC plays eight different FBS conferences in Week 4, with the exception of the Pac-12 as conference schools take on ACC (Florida State), Big Ten (Rutgers), Big 12 (Iowa State), SEC (Ole Miss), American Athletic (Cincinnati), Conference USA (WKU), Mountain West (Nevada) and Sun Belt (Georgia State). The MAC has one conference game as Miami goes to Eastern Michigan in a East Division contest. In C-USA, Florida Atlantic plays in-state rival UCF on Friday night in a matchup of defending conference champions. Saturday, C-USA plays three ACC schools as Old Dominion hosts Virginia Tech, Marshall hosts NC State and FIU travels to Miami. One conference game is also on the schedule as Rice visits Southern Miss in a West Division contest.

C-USA vs. MAC: The second and last regular-season game in 2018 between Conference USA and the MAC will be Saturday as WKU travels to Ball State. Earlier this season, Marshall (C-USA) beat Miami in the other C-USA vs. MAC matchup.

BIG WINS OVER POWER 5: Both Conference USA and the MAC posted victories over Power 5 opponents last week. North Texas (C-USA) went on the road to Arkansas and beat the Razorbacks 44-17 behind one of the most unique plays in college football this season. North Texas' **Keegan Brewer** stood still at his own 10-yard line after fielding a punt. Arkansas defenders thought he had made a fair catch, but Brewer suddenly took off and raced 90 yards for a touchdown. Akron (MAC) beat Big Ten opponent Northwestern 39-34. The Zips trailed 21-3 at halftime and scored three second-half touchdowns on defense in the victory. It was the second MAC victory over the Big Ten this season.

MAKERS WANTED BAHAMAS BOWL PARTICIPANT SELECTION

The highest-ranked conference champion by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee from the American Athletic, Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West or Sun Belt will play annually in one of the College Football Playoff bowls (**PlayStation Fiesta Bowl** or **Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl** for the 2018 season) if it is not selected for the Playoff Semifinals.

Conference USA has secured guaranteed commitments with six bowl partners for the 2018 season, as well as two secondary agreements: The **Makers Wanted Bahamas, Cheribundi Tart Cherry Boca Raton, Gildan New Mexico, Hawai'i, R+L Carriers New Orleans** and either the **Bad Boy Mowers Gasparilla** or the **SERVPRO First Responder Bowls** are primary agreements. The **Walk-On's Independence Bowl** in Shreveport, La., is a secondary agreement (should the ACC or SEC not be able to provide a bowl-eligible team), as is the **DXL Frisco Bowl**. There is no set selection order among C-USA's bowl partners.

The MAC has 2018 primary bowl tie-ins with **Makers Wanted Bahamas, Dollar General, DXL Frisco, Famous Idaho Potato, and Raycom Media Camellia Bowls**. The MAC has secondary 2018 bowl agreements with the **Quick Lane Bowl** (should the ACC or Big Ten not be able to provide a bowl-eligible team) and other ESPN owned-and-operated bowl games.

The **2018 Makers Wanted Bahamas Bowl** participants – selected from among bowl-eligible teams in Conference USA and the Mid-American Conference – will be announced by the bowl, ESPN Events and conference partners once finalized.
