#MACTION EDITION (November 4-5)

PASSPORT STAMPED (BOWL ELIGIBLE): Central Michigan (6-4), Louisiana Tech (6-3), Marshall (8-0), Northern Illinois (6-2), Western Michigan (6-3). **AT CUSTOMS (ONE WIN SHY):** Bowling Green (5-3), Middle Tennessee (5-4), Rice (5-3), Toledo (5-3), UAB (5-4), UTEP (5-3).

THIS WEEK: The MAC's November mid-week schedule of MACTION begins with two games each on Tuesday and Wednesday. Tuesday night, both road teams have a chance to clinch bowl eligibility as East Division leader Bowling Green (5-3, 3-1 MAC) visits Akron (4-4, 2-2 MAC), and West Division leader Toledo (5-3, 4-0 MAC) goes to Kent State (1-7, 0-4 MAC). Wednesday night, Buffalo (3-5, 1-3 MAC) is at Ohio (4-5, 2-3 MAC) in a key East Division battle, and Northern Illinois (6-2, 3-1 MAC) will try to keep pace in the West as they travel to Muncie to play Ball State (3-5, 2-2 MAC). The MAC has no Saturday games this week.

All six Conference USA games are Saturday. No. 22 *USA Today*/No. 23 AP and East Division leaders Marshall (8-0, 4-0 C-USA) will try to keep its perfect season alive at Southern Miss (3-6, 1-4 C-USA). West Division leader Louisiana Tech (6-3, 5-0 C-USA) goes to Birmingham to play UAB (5-4, 3-2 C-USA). The Bulldogs have won four straight, and the Blazers need one victory for bowl eligibility. Rice (5-3, 3-1 C-USA), the hottest team in C-USA with a five-game win streak, hosts UTSA (2-6, 1-3 C-USA). UTEP (5-3, 3-1 C-USA), one win shy of bowl eligibility, goes to WKU (3-5, 1-4 C-USA). FIU (3-6, 2-3 C-USA) heads to Old Dominion (3-6, 1-4 C-USA) and Florida Atlantic (3-6, 2-3 C-USA) plays at North Texas (2-6, 0-4 C-USA).

FRANKLIN MINT: Western Michigan freshman RB **Jarvion Franklin** has 1,330 yards rushing this year, the second-most season rushing yards by a freshman in MAC history, trailing the 1,361 by former Temple RB **Bernard Pierce** in 2009. Franklin leads the nation in both rushing TDs (22) and scoring (132 pts.; 14.7 ppg).

TOSSING IT AROUND: Conference USA is second in FBS in quarterbacks with 20 or more TD passes with four (Pac-12 has 6); WKU's **Brandon Doughty** is tied for fourth with 25, Old Dominion's **Taylor Heinicke** is tied for eighth with 23, Louisiana Tech's **Cody Sokol** is 12th with 22 and Marshall's **Rakeem Cato** is tied for 18th with 20.

POPEYES BAHAMAS BOWL PARTICIPANT SELECTION

The highest-ranked conference champion by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee from the American Athletic, Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West or Sun Belt will play annually in one of the College Football Playoff bowls (**VIZIO Fiesta, Cotton & Chick-fil-A Peach** bowls for the 2014 season) if it is not selected for the Playoff Semifinals.

C-USA's champion will select which bowl it would like to attend, and the remainder of the selections will follow, with no particular set order of bowls. C-USA has 2014 tie-ins with the **Popeyes Bahamas, Boca Raton, Gildan New Mexico, Hawai'i** and **Heart of Dallas** bowls, with a secondary tie-in with the **Duck Commander Independence Bowl** (if either ACC or SEC does not have enough eligible teams).

The **GoDaddy Bowl** has first choice of a MAC bowl-eligible team, and the remainder of the selections will follow, with no particular set order of bowls. The MAC has 2014 tie-ins with **Popeyes Bahamas, Boca Raton, Famous Idaho Potato, GoDaddy** and **Raycom Media Camellia** bowls, with secondary tie-ins with the **San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl** (if Navy is not bowl-eligible), ESPN owned-and-operated bowls (such as **Gildan New Mexico, Bitcoin St. Petersburg** or **Birmingham** bowls) and the **Quick Lane Bowl** (if either ACC or Big Ten does not have enough eligible teams).

The participants for the **2014 Popeyes Bahamas Bowl** will be announced **Sunday, December 7**.

WEEK 10 INDIVIDUAL HONORS

QB Cody Sokol, Louisiana Tech: The senior completed 30-of-42 passes for 335 yards and five TDs and ran for a TD in a 59-10 win over WKU for C-USA Offensive Player of the Week honors.

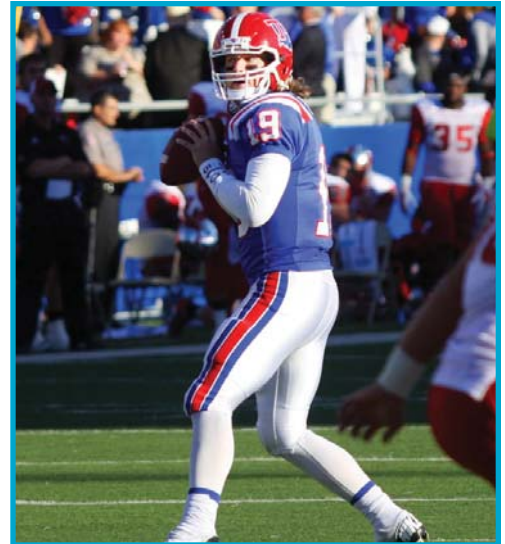
DE Zach Patt, Rice: The senior was credited with a school-record five sacks, three forced fumbles and one fumble recovery in a 31-17 win at FIU for C-USA Defensive Player of the Week honors.

KR Autrey Golden, UTEP: The junior returned a kickoff for a TD for the fifth time in his career, a 98-yard return in the third quarter, in a 35-14 victory over Southern Miss for C-USA Special Teams Player of the Week recognition.

The MAC will announce its Players of the Week on Thursday, November 6, taking into account the games played Nov. 1 and 4-5. The league will then return to a Monday announcement of the MAC Players of the Week on November 17.
