## POPEYES BAHAMAS BOWL WEEK 11 NOTEBOOK

### C-USA EDITION (November 8)

**PASSPORT STAMPED (BOWL ELIGIBLE):** Bowling Green (6-3), Central Michigan (6-4), Louisiana Tech (6-3), Marshall (8-0), Northern Illinois (7-2), Toledo (6-3), Western Michigan (6-3). **AT CUSTOMS (ONE WIN SHY):** Middle Tennessee (5-4), Ohio (5-5), Rice (5-3), UAB (5-4), UTEP (5-3).

**THIS SATURDAY:** All six Conference USA games are Saturday. No. 22 *USA Today*/No. 23 AP and East Division leaders Marshall (8-0, 4-0 C-USA) will try to keep its perfect season alive at Southern Miss (3-6, 1-4 C-USA). West Division leader Louisiana Tech (6-3, 5-0 C-USA) is at UAB (5-4, 3-2 C-USA). The Bulldogs have won four straight, and the Blazers need one victory for bowl eligibility. Rice (5-3, 3-1 C-USA), the hottest team in C-USA with a five-game win streak and needing one victory for bowl eligibility, hosts UTSA (2-6, 1-3 C-USA). UTEP (5-3, 3-1 C-USA), also one win shy of bowl eligibility, goes to WKU (3-5, 1-4 C-USA). FIU (3-6, 2-3 C-USA) heads to Old Dominion (3-6, 1-4 C-USA), and Florida Atlantic (3-6, 2-3 C-USA) plays at North Texas (2-6, 0-4 C-USA).

**MACTION RECAP:** Two MAC teams reached bowl eligibility Tuesday. Bowling Green (6-3, 3-1 MAC) beat Akron (4-5, 2-3 MAC) 27-10 on the road, and Toledo (6-3, 5-0 MAC) continues to lead the East Division after a 30-20 victory at Kent State (1-8, 0-5 MAC). Wednesday, Ohio (5-5, 3-3 MAC) beat Buffalo (3-6, 1-4 MAC) 37-14 at home, and Northern Illinois (7-2, 4-1 MAC) beat Ball State (3-6, 2-3 MAC) 35-21. The MAC has no Saturday games this week.

**TOSSING IT AROUND:** Conference USA is second in FBS in quarterbacks with 20 or more TD passes with four (Pac-12 has six); WKU's **Brandon Doughty** is tied for fourth with 25, Old Dominion's **Taylor Heinicke** is tied for eighth with 23, Louisiana Tech's **Cody Sokol** is 12th with 22 and Marshall's **Rakeem Cato** is tied for 18th with 20.

**YARDS IN CHUNKS FOR C-USA:** UAB has seven scrimmage plays of 70 yards or longer, the most 70+ in FBS. Marshall has nine scrimmage plays of 60 yards or longer, the most 60+ in FBS. Marshall (11), UAB (10) and Middle Tennessee (8) each have at least eight scrimmage plays longer than 50 yards.

**FRANKLIN MINT:** Western Michigan freshman RB **Jarvion Franklin** has 1,330 yards rushing, the second-most yards by a freshman in MAC history, trailing only former Temple RB **Bernard Pierce** (1,361) in 2009. Franklin leads the nation in both rushing TDs (22) and scoring (132 pts.; 14.7 ppg).

**POPEYES BAHAMAS BOWL PARTICIPANT SELECTION**

The highest-ranked conference champion by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee from the American Athletic, Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West or Sun Belt will play annually in one of the College Football Playoff bowls (**VIZIO Fiesta, Cotton & Chick-fil-A Peach** bowls for the 2014 season) if it is not selected for the Playoff Semifinals.

C-USA's champion will select which bowl it would like to attend, and the remainder of the selections will follow, with no particular set order of bowls. C-USA has 2014 tie-ins with the **Popeyes Bahamas, Boca Raton, Gildan New Mexico, Hawai'i** and **Zaxby's Heart of Dallas** bowls, with a secondary tie-in with the **Duck Commander Independence Bowl** (if either ACC or SEC does not have enough eligible teams).

The **GoDaddy Bowl** has first choice of a MAC bowl-eligible team, and the remainder of the selections will follow, with no particular set order of bowls. The MAC has 2014 tie-ins with **Popeyes Bahamas, Boca Raton, Famous Idaho Potato, GoDaddy** and **Raycom Media Camellia** bowls, with secondary tie-ins with the **San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl** (if Navy is not bowl-eligible), ESPN owned-and-operated bowls (such as **Gildan New Mexico, Bitcoin St. Petersburg** or **Birmingham** bowls) and the **Quick Lane Bowl** (if either ACC or Big Ten does not have enough eligible teams).

The participants for the **2014 Popeyes Bahamas Bowl** will be announced **Sunday, December 7**.

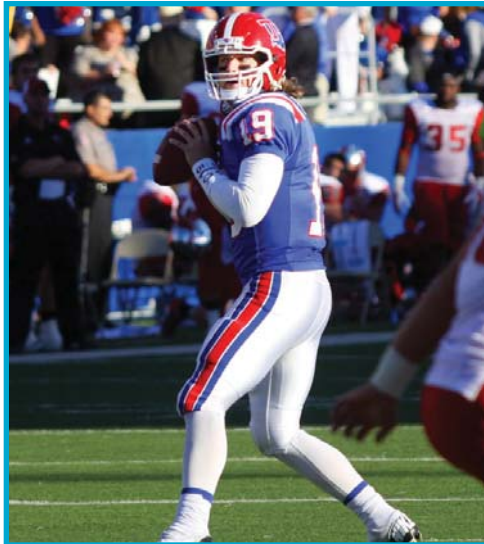

**WEEK 10 INDIVIDUAL HONORS**

**QB Cody Sokol, Louisiana Tech:** The senior completed 30-of-42 passes for 335 yards and five TDs and ran for a TD in a 59-10 win over WKU for C-USA Offensive Player of the Week honors.

**DE Zach Patt, Rice:** The senior was credited with a school-record five sacks, three forced fumbles and one fumble recovery in a 31-17 win at FIU for C-USA Defensive Player of the Week honors.

**KR Autrey Golden, UTEP:** The junior returned a kickoff for a TD for the fifth time in his career, a 98-yard return in the third quarter, in a 35-14 victory over Southern Miss for C-USA Special Teams Player of the Week recognition.

**RB A.J. Ouellette, Ohio:** The freshman had 155 rushing yards on 29 carries and two TDs and catcaught two passes for 11 yards in a 37-14 win over Buffalo for MAC East Division Offensive Player of the Week honors.

**DB Nick Johnson, Bowling Green:** The freshman had nine tackles, two interceptions and three pass breakups in a 27-10 win at Akron for MAC East Division Defensive Player of the Week honors.

**K Josiah Yazdani, Ohio:** The junior made all three of his field-goal attempts of 19, 28 and 33 yards and all three PAT kicks to help the Bobcats defeat Buffalo, 37-14 for MAC East Division Special Teams Player of the Week recognition.

**RB Jarvion Franklin, Western Michigan:** The freshman had 182 yards and three TDs on 29 carries in a 41-10 win at Miami for MAC West Division Offensive Player of the Week honors.

**DB Anthony Brooks, Northern Illinois:** The sophomore had four tackles, one pass break-up and a key interception return for a TD in a 35-21 win at Ball State for MAC West Division Defensive Player of the Week honors.

**K Jeremiah Detmer, Toledo:** The senior made all three of his field-goal attempts of 26, 28 and 45 yards and three PATs in a 30-20 win at Kent State for MAC West Division Special Teams Player of the Week recognition.
