PASSPORT STAMPED (BOWL-ELIGIBLE TEAMS): Bowling Green (7-2), Louisiana Tech (6-3), Marshall (8-1), Northern Illinois (6-3), Southern Miss (6-3), Toledo (7-1) and WKU (6-2). AT CUSTOMS (ONE VICTORY SHY): Central Michigan (5-4), Ohio (5-4) and Western Michigan (5-3).

THIS WEEK: The week began with a pair of MAC games. Tuesday night, Northern Illinois (6-3, 4-1 MAC) gave No. 20 Toledo (7-1, 4-1 MAC) its first loss as the Huskies won 32-27. Wednesday, Bowling Green (7-2, 5-0 MAC) took control of the East Division and kept Ohio from clinching bowl eligibility with a 62-24 victory over the Bobcats.

Thursday, a pair of MAC games start the weekend as Buffalo (4-4, 2-2 MAC) visits Kent State (3-5, 2-2 MAC) in an important East Division game and Ball State (3-6, 2-3 MAC) is at West Division leader Western Michigan (5-3, 4-0 MAC).

Friday, Rice (4-4, 2-2 C-USA) travels to UTEP (3-5, 1-3 C-USA), as both teams try to keep pace in Conference USA's West Division race.

Saturday in C-USA action, the East Division co-leaders are in action as Marshall (8-1, 5-0 C-USA) is at Middle Tennessee (3-5, 2-2 C-USA) and WKU (7-2, 5-0 C-USA) hosts Florida Atlantic (2-6, 2-3 C-USA). West co-leader Louisiana Tech (6-3, 4-1 C-USA) hosts North Texas (1-7, 1-4 C-USA). In other C-USA games, FIU (4-5, 2-3 C-USA) visits Charlotte (2-6, 0-5 C-USA) and Old Dominion (3-5, 1-3 C-USA) goes to UTSA (1-7, 1-3 C-USA).

Saturday in the MAC, Akron (3-5, 1-3 MAC) is at UMass (1-7, 0-4 MAC) and Ball State (3-6, 2-3 MAC) is at West leader Western Michigan (5-3, 4-0 MAC).

POLLING PLACE: Toledo (7-1) is No. 20 in the Associated Press Top 25 and the Amway USA Today Coaches' Top 25 poll. Marshall (7-1) and WKU (6-2) are receiving votes in the USA Today poll.

DOUGHTY DEALING: WKU senior QB Brandon Doughty leads the FBS in completion percentage (71.8) and TD passes (30) while ranking third in passing yards (3,330).

Conference USA has four quarterbacks that rank among the top 15 in the FBS in passing yards and all have topped the 2,400-yard mark already this season, more than any other league.

WKU senior **Brandon Doughty** is first (3,310 yards), followed by **Nick Mullens** in sixth (2,890), Louisiana Tech's **Jeff Driskel** in ninth (2,736) and Middle Tennessee's **Brent Stockstill** in 15th (2,445).

RB Anthony Wales, WKU: The junior rushed for 185 rushing yards and four touchdowns in a 55-30 victory at Old Dominion for C-USA Offensive Player of the Week honors.

S Kishawn McClain, North Texas: The sophomore had 11 tackles and returned a fumble 45 yards for a TD in a 30-23 victory over UTSA for C-USA Defensive Player of the Week honors.

DB Chad Davis, North Texas: The junior blocked an extra point 80 yards for a two-point conversion in a 30-23 victory over UTSA for C-USA Special Teams Player of the Week honors.

QB Joe Licata, Buffalo: The senior was 22-for-29 for 289 yards passing, two TDs and an interception in Buffalo's 29-24 win at Miami for MAC East Division Offensive Player of the Week honors.

DB Brison Burris, Miami: The senior had a 76-yard interception return for a TD and seven tackles in a loss to Buffalo for MAC East Division Defensive Player of the Week honors.

P Tyler Grassman, Buffalo: The senior had six punts for a 43.5-yard average in a 29-24 win at Miami for MAC East Division Special Teams Player of the Week honors.

QB Zach Terrell, Western Michigan: The junior threw for 252 yards and ran for 71 in a 58-28 win over Eastern Michigan for MAC West Division Offensive Player of the Week honors.

DL Blake Serpa, Central Michigan: The senior had six tackles (four for loss), two sacks and two forced fumbles in a 14-6 win at Akron for MAC West Division Defensive Player of the Week honors.

KR Darian Green, Ball State: The junior returned a kickoff 85 yards in a 20-10 win over UMass for MAC West Division Special Teams Player of the Week honors.

ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT

Each week in 2015, the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl will spotlight an alumni player from each of our partner conferences, Conference USA and the MAC.

BEN ROETHLISBERGER (MIAMI)



Ben Roethlisberger, the 2003 MAC Offensive Player of the Year and the 2001 MAC Freshman of the Year, played his college career at Miami from 2001-03.

Roethlisberger threw for 10,829 yards and 84 touchdowns in only three seasons from 2001-03. His junior campaign was one for the ages, throwing for 4,486 yards and 37 touchdowns, leading Miami to 12 consecutive victories, including a MAC Championship and GMAC Bowl victory.

Roethlisberger was a third-team *Associated Press* All-American in 2003 and Freshman All-American in 2001.

He was a three-time All-MAC selection, earning first-team honors in 2003 and second-team recognition twice.

He still ranks first in Miami history in completion percentage and touchdowns, and is second in pass attempts, completions, yards and total offense (11,075).

Roethlisberger gave up his final season of eligibility to enter the 2004 NFL Draft. He was the 11th overall selection by the Pittsburgh Steelers, the highest draft pick in program history.

He guided the Steelers to two Super Bowl titles (Super Bowls XL and XLIII), and he became the youngest quarterback in NFL history to win a Super Bowl during the 2005 season. A three-time Pro Bowl selection, Roethlisberger was selected as the 2004 NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year by the AP.

Roethlisberger has thrown for over 40,000 yards and 250 touchdowns in his NFL career. A 12-time AFC Offensive Player of the Week, he was inducted into the MAC Hall of Fame in 2015.

POPEYES BAHAMAS BOWL PARTICPANT SELECTION

The highest-ranked conference champion by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee from the American Athletic, Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West or Sun Belt will play annually in one of the College Football Playoff bowls (VIZIO Fiesta and Chick-fil-A Peach bowls for the 2015 season) if it is not selected for the Playoff Semifinals.

C-USA has 2015 tie-ins with the Popeyes Bahamas, Arizona, Gildan New Mexico, Miami Beach, R&L Carriers New Orleans, St. Petersburg and Zaxby's Heart of Dallas bowls, with a secondary tie-in with the Camping World Independence Bowl (if either the ACC or the SEC does not have enough eligible teams). There is no set selection order among C-USA's bowl partners

The GoDaddy Bowl has first choice of a MAC bowl-eligible team, and the remainder of the selections will follow, with no set selection order among the MAC's bowl partners. The MAC has 2015 tie-ins with Popeyes Bahamas, Famous Idaho Potato, GoDaddy, Marmot Boca Raton and Raycom Media Camellia bowls, with secondary tie-ins with the San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl (if Army is not bowl eligible), various ESPN ownedand-operated bowls and the Quick Lane Bowl (if either ACC or Big Ten does not have enough eligible teams).
