- First player in NCAA FBS history with eight or more receiving touchdowns in four seasons.
- The third Chippewa to collect All-MAC accolades in each of his four seasons, joining Dan LeFevour and Bryan Anderson. Earned first team honors in 2013 and 2014, second team honors in 2012 and third team recognition in 2011.
- Captured CMU's career receiving touchdown record earlier this season and currently has 33 TDs.
- Currently sits in second on CMU's career receiving yards list with 3,563 and needs 85 yards to move past Anderson (3,648) for first.

- Ranks fourth on the program's career receptions list with 198 catches.
- Davis ranks No. 1 in career receiving touchdowns (33) in the NCAA among active players .
- Is climbing up the MAC career record book in two categories, ranking fifth in receiving touchdowns and seventh th alltime in receiving yards.
- Won CMU's Herb Deromedi Most Valuable Player Award the past two seasons and is the sixth CMU player to win team MVP honors twice in his career.

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WESTERN KENTUCKY VS. CENTRAL MICHIGAN

Wednesday, Dec. 24, 2014 • 12 p.m. ET • ESPN Thomas A. Robinson National Stadium • Nassau, Bahamas

SETTING THE SCENE

- Central Michigan (7-5, 5-3) plays Western Kentucky in the inaugural Popeyes Bahamas Bowl on Wednesday, Dec. 24.
- The contest is scheduled for a 12 p.m. ET kickoff and will be broadcast on ESPN with Steve Levy (play-by-play), Lou Holtz and Mark May (color analysts) calling the action and Laura Rutledge handling the sideline duties.
- This is the eighth bowl game in Central Michigan history. The Chippewas are 3-4 after winning their last two postseason games. CMU was victorious in the 2006 Motor City Bowl (31-14 over Middle Tennessee State), 2010 GMAC Bowl (44-41 in 2OT over Troy) and the 2012 Little Caesars Pizza Bowl (24-21 over Western Kentucky). Central Michigan lost the 1990 California Raisin Bowl (48-24 to San Jose State), 1994 Las Vegas Bowl (52-24 to UNLV), 2007 Motor City Bowl (51-48 to Purdue) and the 2008 Motor City Bowl (24-21 to Florida Atlantic).

Dan Enos is just one of five active Division I coaches to win a bowl game both as a starting quarterback and a head coach. As a player, Enos quarterbacked Michigan State to back-to-back bowl victories, a 33-13 win over Hawaii in the 1989 Aloha Bowl and a 17-16 win over Southern California in the 1990 John Hancock Bowl. In 2012, he led the Chippewas to the program's third ever bowl win,

a 24-21 victory over Western Kentucky in the Little Caesars Pizza Bowl. Steve Spurrier (South Carolina), Steve Sarkisian (Washington), Kliff Kingsbury (Texas Tech) and Mike Gundy (Oklahoma State) have also accomplished the feat.

- This is CMU's first international game and the fifth MAC team to play a game outside of the United States. Western Michigan, Ball State, Buffalo and Northern Illinois took part in the International Bowl in Toronto from 2008-2010. It is the first postseason FBS bowl game outside of either the United States or Canada between two U.S. teams since the Jan. 1, 1937 Bacardi Bowl in Havana, Cuba, a 7-7 tie between Auburn and Villanova.
- CMU is 2-1 against current members of Conference USA in bowl games. The Chippewas defeated Middle Tennessee State in 2006 and Western Kentucky in 2012 and lost to Florida Atlantic in 2008.
- Central Michigan is bowl eligible for the seventh time in the last nine years, including three-straight seasons. CMU was bowl eligible last year but was not selected. Only Ohio (eight times) has been bowl eligible more times in that span.
- The victory over Miami gave the Chippewas seven wins in the regular season for the first time since 2009. CMU went 10-2 during the regular season that year, which was also the last time the Chippewas had six MAC wins.

- CMU has won seven regular-season games just nine times in the past 30 seasons.
- The Chippewas are 8-1 in games decided by seven points or less over the past three seasons (2012-14).

CENTRAL MICHIGAN-WESTERN KENTUCKY SERIES

- This is the second meeting between CMU and Western Kentucky with CMU winning the first meeting. That took place at the 2012 Little Caesars Pizza Bowl with the Chippewas winning 24-21.
- This is the first matchup between Dan Enos and Jeff Brohm. Lance Guidry was WKU's interim coach for the game in 2012.

ABOUT THE HILLTOPPERS

- Western Kentucky finished the regular season 7-5 overall and 4-4 in Conference USA after knocking off C-USA champion Marshall in the season finale, 67-66, in overtime.
- Jeff Brohm is in his first season at WKU. Prior to being named head coach, he is the assistant head coach/offensive coordinator for the Hilltoppers in 2013. Brohm was a threeyear starter at Louisville from 1989-93. He also played in the NFL from 1994-2000.
- For the fourth consecutive season, the Hilltoppers are bowl eligible and have at least seven wins. It is the longest active streak in Conference USA, both in bowl eligibility and consecutive winning seasons, and WKU is one of just nine 'Group of Five' schools to post such a streak.
- Western Kentucky has one of the top offenses in the nation, ranking in the top 10 in total offense (6th), scoring offense (6th), passing offense (3rd), team passing efficiency (6th) and first downs (8th).
- Quarterback Brandon Doughty leads the nation with 44 touchdown passes and 4,344 passing yards. He has nine 300-yard games, eight three-plus TD games, five four-plus TD games and four five-plus TD games this season.
- Leon Allen is WKU's leading rusher with 1,490 yards and 12 touchdowns. He led Conference USA and ranked 4th nationally with 1,921 yards from scrimmage in the regular season.
- WKU has a trio of receivers with at least 40 receptions this season: Jared Dangerfield, Willie McNeal and Taywan Taylor. Taylor has a team-high 739 receiving yards while Dangerfield has caught a team-best 10 touchdowns.
- The Western Kentucky defense ranks 119th in scoring defense and 120th in total defense. Nick Holt leads the team with 8.6 tackles per game.

THE LAST TIME CMU AND WKU MET

- Quarterback Ryan Radcliff threw a perfect strike to senior receiver Cody Wilson midway through the fourth quarter and Central Michigan's defense got a late fourth down stop to lead the Chippewas to a 24-21 victory over Western Kentucky to win the 2012 Little Caesars Pizza Bowl.
- Radcliff was named the game's Most Valuable Player while junior linebacker Shamari Benton was named the Outstanding Lineman. Benton led CMU in tackles for the seventh time this season, recording nine.
- The winning touchdown came on a second and goal with 5:11 left in the game. Radcliff threaded the needle between two WKU defenders to find Wilson in the corner of the end zone. The senior signal caller finished the game 19-of-29 for 253 yards, three touchdowns and no interceptions while Wilson had 10 catches for 101 yards and the one touchdown.
- After CMU scored, the Hilltoppers drove the ball down to the CMU 19-yard line where they faced a fourth and two with 51 seconds remaining. Western Kentucky ran a play-action pass to tight end Jack Doyle, but he was blanketed by CMU defenders and the pass fell incomplete. CMU then ran out the clock to secure the victory.

- CMU's winning touchdown drive began at the WKU 26-yard line after a blocked punt by junior safety Avery Cunningham.
- Central Michigan got off to a fast start after Radcliff connected on a 69-yard touchdown strike to redshirt freshman receiver Andrew Flory at 10:54 of the first quarter.
- Western Kentucky answered with a 6-yard quarterback run by Kawaun Jakes after he connected with Rico Brown for 70 yards on a trick play on the first offensive play of the game for the Hilltoppers.
- CMU responded with another Radcliff-to-Flory touchdown connection, this time from 29 yards out with 5:46 to go in the first quarter.
- After three straight punts, CMU got the running game going as Tipton had 40 yards on a drive that led to a 50-yard David Harman field goal, making it 17-7 CMU.
- The Hilltoppers answered with a touchdown midway through the second quarter on a 6-yard pass from Jakes to Doyle.
- Western Kentucky took its first lead of the game in the third quarter on a 16-play, 80-yard drive that lasted 9:23. The capper was a Kadeem Jones 1-yard rush, which was upheld upon review after it appeared he may have fumbled the ball before crossing the goaline.

MAC BOWL GAME LINE UP

- Northern Illinois (Boca Raton Bowl), Toledo (GoDaddy Bowl), Western Michigan (Famous Idaho Potato Bowl), Bowling Green (Raycom Media Camellia Bowl) and Central Michigan (Popeyes Bahamas Bowl) will represent the MAC in bowl games this season.
- Western Michigan kicks things off when it takes on Air Force in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl in Boise, Idaho on Dec. 20.
- The Raycom Media Camellia Bowl will pit Bowling Green against South Alabama in Montgomery, Ala., on Dec. 20.
- Northern Illinois takes on Marshall at the Boca Raton Bowl on Dec. 23.
- The GoDaddy Bowl is Toledo versus Arkansas State on Jan. 4, 2015, in Mobile, Ala.

OFFENSIVE TIDBITS

- CMU's starting offensive line has made a total of 142 starts led by guard Andy Phillips (42) and center Nick Beamish (37). CMU has started the same five players this year.
- The Chippewas have rushed for 203.3 yards per game in their seven victories and 96.2 ypg in their five losses.
- Wide receiver Jesse Kroll has earned a first down or scored a touchdown on 27 of his 32 receptions this season.
- Quarterback Cooper Rush is completing 68 percent of his passes on second down this season and just 54 percent on third down.
- Since scoring on just 2-of-5 opportunities in the red zone in the season opener against Chattanooga, CMU is 37-for-42 on red zone visits in its last 11 games.
- Three of tight end Ben McCord's 10 receptions have been for TDs. The junior has already doubled his TD production from his first two seasons.
- Senior wide receiver Courtney Williams reached 1,000 career receiving yards against Western Michigan. He now has 1,012 career yards.

DEFENSIVE TIDBITS

- Central Michigan has forced 13 turnovers (10 interceptions, 3 fumbles) in its seven wins and just seven turnovers (4 interceptions, 3 fumbles) in its five losses.
- CMU has allowed only one 100-yard rusher (Syracuse's Adonis Ameen-Moore with 106) this season.
- With Tyree Waller's interception against Western Michigan, CMU has had nine players create a turnover this season.
 Brandon Greer (3 INTs, 1 forced fumble), Tony Annese (3 INTs), Kevin King (2 INTs, 1 forced fumble), Justin Cherocci

DOMINANT DEFENSE 16[™] 1st 97

The Chippewas rank 16th nationally in total defense (331.2 yards allowed per game). The only Group of Five team ranked higher is UCF.

GAME HIGHLIGHTS

CMU leads the MAC in total defense (331.2), passing yards allowed (211.4) and rushing defense (119.8). The squad also leads the league in total defense and rushing defense in MAC games.

Central Michigan limited Eastern Michigan to just 97 yards of total offense. That is the lowest mark in Dan Enos' tenure and the ninth-lowest in the FBS this season.

- Versus Eastern Michigan, EMU finished with 97 total yards including 21 on the ground and 76 through the air. The Eagles also had just five first downs and averaged 2.0 yards per play. The Eagles started the game with four-straight three-and-outs and never had a drive longer then 22 yards.
- In the victory at Buffalo, Central Michigan limited the Bulls to just 38 yards rushing, 137 yards under UB's average entering the game. The Chippewas held Anthone Taylor to just 25 yards on 14 carries. Taylor entered the game ranked third in the MAC in both rushing yards per game (132.3) and rushing touchdowns (9).
- In the win at NIU, Central Michigan limited the Huskies to just 221 total yards minus NIU's first and last series of the game. Northern Illinois also was limited to 110 yards rushing, almost 150 fewer then its average entering the game.
- Versus Ohio, the Chippewas held the Bobcats to just 187 yards of total offense (89 rushing, 98 passing) and just 44 plays. CMU limited the Bobcats to just 24 yards on offense during the first half and controlled the time of possession 42:19 to 17:41.
- Against Purdue, the defense gave CMU an early 7-0 lead, courtesy of Brandon Greer's first career pick-6. The Chippewas
 forced three turnovers and limited speedy running back Raheem Mostert to 53 yards rushing on 19 attempts, an
 average of just 2.8 yards. Mostert rolled up 146 yards on 22 attempts in Purdue's 43-34 season-opening home win over
 Western Michigan.
- The Chippewas put on an impressive defensive performance against Chattanooga, limiting UTC to just 29 yards in the second half. In the final two quarters, the Mocs had just 23 rushing yards on 10 attempts and were 4-of-10 passing for six yards with two interceptions.

- CMU's longest play of the season was a 66-yard punt return by Titus Davis against Chattanooga.
- Ron Coluzzi has placed 18 of his 48 punts inside the
- opponent 20-yard line and has just five touchbacks this season.
- Sophomore Brian Eavey is 42-for-45 on place kicks this season. Eavey is 34-for-36 in PATs and 8-for-9 in field goals. His lone field goal miss was a 50-yard attempt at Northern Illinois. He had a career-long 43-yard field goal versus Western Michigan.
- Coluzzi was named the Mid-American Conference West Division Special Teams Player of the Week twice this season. He earned the honor for his performances at Toledo and at Buffalo. Against the Rockets, Coluzzi averaged 52.7 yards on three punts including a 55-yarder in the second quarter. Two of his punts landed inside the 20-yard line. On a windy day at Buffalo, Coluzzi averaged 47.2 yards per kick including a 54-yard boot into the wind. Coluzzi dropped one punt inside the 20 and averaged 42.2 net yards per punt.

CHIPPEWAS AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS IN RETURNING **STARTERS**

- · Central Michigan enters the 2014 season with the secondmost returning starters in Division I college football.
- The Chippewas bring back 20 starters: 10 on offense, eight on defense, and two on special teams.
- Texas-San Antonio leads the nation with 21 returning starters while CMU is tied with Indiana, Purdue, Florida
- International and Nevada for the second-most returnees.

CONSISTENCY IS THE KEY TO SUCCESS

- Coach Dan Enos has made player development a key element of his rebuilding efforts at Central Michigan.
- Recruiting strong student-athletes and retaining them is showcased by the fact that 63 of the 72 members of the past three recruiting classes (2011-13) are still with the program, a mark of almost 90 percent.
- In the previous three classes (2008-10), just 46 percent (33 of 71) of players finished their careers at Central Michigan.
- This allowed CMU to suit up 84 players during spring

practice.

• The Chippewas also were able to redshirt 18 of 19 true freshmen last season, with defensive lineman Joe Ostman the only first-year player to see action.

DAVIS CONTINUES RECORD-SETTING CAREER

- First Team All-Mid-American Conference wide receiver Titus Davis has made his mark as one of the top wide receivers in CMU history.
- Davis was named to the First Team All-MAC squad recently, making him just the third CMU player to earn All-MAC honors all four seasons. Dan LeFevour and Bryan Anderson were the other players.
- Davis was also presented with the program's top on-field honor, the Herb Deromedi Most Valuable Player Award. This is the second time he has won this award and is the sixth CMU player to win team MVP honors twice in his career.
- With three touchdown receptions against Miami, Davis became the first player in NCAA FBS history with eight or more receiving touchdowns in four seasons. Davis' three TDs also tied CMU's single game record and gave him nine this season.
- Davis captured CMU's career receiving touchdown record against Buffalo with a TD in the fourth quarter. He currently has 33 during his time at CMU and broke Bryan Anderson's mark of 28.
- Davis currently has 3,563 career receiving yards and moved into second past Reggie Allen (3,242) against Buffalo. The senior needs 85 yards to move past Anderson (3,648) to the top of the Chippewas' career receiving yards list.
- Davis also ranks fourth on the program's career receptions list with 198 catches. He needs 33 receptions to move into the third spot ahead of former teammate Cody Wilson (230).
- Davis ranks second in career receiving touchdowns (33) in the NCAA among active players . He is also third in career receiving yards (3,563) and is fifth yards-per-catch average (18.0) while ranking ninth in receiving yards per game (81.0).
- Davis is also climbing up the MAC career record book in two categories. He is fifth in receiving touchdowns and ranks seventh all-time in receiving yards.
- Davis dominated early in the Ohio game, scoring touchdowns on CMU's first two possessions, during which he caught four passes for 109 yards. He matched his careerhigh for catches (10) and TDs (2) in the win. He finished the game with 181 vards.
- Davis was named the MAC West Division Offensive Player of the Week for the first time in his career after his performance against Ohio.

- · Davis matched his career highs for receptions (10) and touchdowns (2) against Ball State, collecting a team-high 128 receiving yards.
- · After missing the three games, Davis returned against Toledo and tallied 128 yards on six catches.
- Davis was named by both Phil Steele and Athlon Sports as an All-MAC preseason first team pick, and was also named to the Biletnikoff Award Preseason Watch List.
- Davis earned the Herb Deromedi MVP award a year ago when he totaled 61 receptions for 1,109 yards and eight touchdowns. He led CMU in all-purpose yardage (1,301) in 2013.

RUSH NAMED AN ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICAN

- Central Michigan guarterback Cooper Rush has been named to the CoSDIA Capital One Academic All-America Second Team.
- Rush is majoring in actuarial science and maintains a 3.91 grade point.
- Just 50 players across the nation are named to the All-America first and second teams. They are selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). Rush was named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District IV first team earlier this season.
- Rush started all 12 of CMU's games this season, completing 215 of his 337 pass attempts (63.8 percent) for 2,664 yards and 20 touchdowns against 12 interceptions. He ranks sixth in the MAC in passing yards per game (222.0) and fourth in pass efficiency (142.7).
- · 15 CMU football student-athletes have earned Academic All-America honors a total of 20 times. The last person to receive this honor was Cody Wilson in 2012.

EIGHT CHIPPEWAS EARN ALL-MAC HONORS

- · Eight Central Michigan football players earned All-Mid-American Conference honors for the 2014 season.
- · Five Chippewas were selected to the first team: wide receiver Titus Davis, offensive linemen Nick Beamish and Andy Phillips, linebacker Justin Cherocci, and defensive lineman Leterrius Walton. CMU had more first-teamers than any other school in the league.
- · Running back Thomas Rawls was named to the second team, while Chippewa defensive lineman Joe Ostman and defensive back Tony Annese were named to the third team.
- Davis, a senior from Wheaton, Ill., led the Chippewas with 54 receptions for 843 yards and nine touchdowns despite missing three games because of injury. He earned all-conference honors for the fourth time and is just the third Chippewa to collect All-MAC accolades in each of his four seasons, joining Dan LeFevour and Brvan Anderson
- Phillips, a senior guard from Lansing, Mich., who was a second-team all-conference selection a year ago, has started 41 consecutive games and was named the Chippewas' Offensive Upfront Player of the Year.

 Beamish, a junior from Riverview, Mich., has made 37 consecutive starts at center.

- Cherocci led CMU and was fifth in the MAC with 107 tackles and he shared the team lead with four sacks and two forced fumbles. He was the team's co-Defensive Player of the Year, and ranks eighth in program history with 389 tackles.
- Walton, a senior from Clinton Township, Mich., established himself as a force on the defensive front, earning the team's Defensive Upfront Player of the Year Award while making 30 tackles including two sacks.
- Rawls shared the Chippewas' Offensive Player of the Year Award after rushing for 1,103 yards and scoring 10 TDs on 210 carries. He finished fourth in the MAC in rushing yards per game and in all-purpose yards per game.
- Ostman finished third on the team with 56 tackles including 10 tackles-for-loss, a total that ranked second on the team. He also had three sacks, forced two fumbles and recovered one.
- Annese was CMU's second-leading tackler with 65 stops and shared the team lead with three interceptions. He also led the Chippewas with 10 pass breakups, while making three tackles-for-loss and recovered a fumble.

CONTROLLING THE GAME

- · Central Michigan leads the MAC and ranks eighth nationally in time of possession with an average of 33:28 per game.
- CMU has dominated time of possession in its seven victories, holding the ball for 36:21 in those games compared to 23:39 for its opponents.
- The Chippewas have dominated in the second half of games this season, controlling the ball for an average of 17:40 compared to 12:20 for their opponents.
- Twice this season has CMU held the ball for more then 40 minutes in a games. The first was against Ohio (42:19) while the second was versus Eastern Michigan (40:06).

RAWLS SHINES

- · Senior running back Thomas Rawls has cemented his spot as one of the MAC's top running backs, earning second team All-MAC despite missing the majority of five games
- He ranks fourth in the MAC in rushing yards per game (122.6) and all-purpose yards per game (132.9), fifth in yards rushing (1,103) and eighth in rushing TDs (10).
- The senior is also 17th in the nation in rushing yards per game, and 30th in all-purpose yards per game.
- Rawls is the 23rd CMU student-athlete to rush for more than 1,000 yards in a season. Those 23 players have combined to reach this mark 35 times. The last was

Zurlon Tipton with 1,492 yards in 2012. AMONG THE NATION'S BEST Rawls needs 193 yards to break into CMU's top 10 list for rushing yards in a season. He is three touchdowns away from reaching CMU's top 10 list for rushing TDs, and 45 attempts from being listed on the season attempts chart. Rawls ranks highly in the MAC and nationwide despite missing most of the Buffalo game and all of the EMU game because of an injury. Rawls had just four yards on three carries at Buffalo before leaving the game. He saw limited action against Miami with three carries for 16 yards. Rawls rushed for a career-high 270 yards and two touchdowns on 40 carries in the victory at NIU. Rawls' 270-yard effort is the highest total by a MAC ball carrier this season, and the 10th-highest mark in the FBS. He became the first player to rush for 200 yards against NIU since 2010. The Huskies entered the game leading the conference in rushing defense at 107.6 yards per game. Rawls also had a 40-carry, 229-yard performance against Ohio. He is just the second CMU player to rush for 200-plus yards in back-to-back games. Silas Massey achieved the same feat in 1996 when he surpassed 200 yards in three out of four games. Rawls is one of seven CMU players to record two 200-yard rushing games in a season. Rawls has been named the MAC West Offensive Player of the Week twice this year. The first after the Purdue game and the second after the win at Northern Illinois. Rawls finished with 155 yards on 31 carries and scored two touchdowns at Purdue, and he added 50 yards on three receptions. In the season opener against Chattanooga, Rawls gained 91 of his 123 rushing yards after halftime. Rawls missed the Syracuse and Kansas games due to an off-the-field issue. He returned against Toledo and scored a pair of touchdowns. Rawls is a graduate transfer from Michigan, where he rushed for 333 yards in his career. CHEROCCI LEADS THE DEFENSE · Linebacker Justin Cherocci is fifth in the MAC in total tackles with 107 and tackles per game (8.9). The senior also ranks 48th nationally in stops per contest. Cherocci had a career-best 18 tackles including 12 solo stops against Kansas. He was named MAC West Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts. He has been CMU's leading tackler eight out of 12 games this season including in the season opener against Chattanooga and against Syracuse, when he made 11 stops in each game. He also had eight tackles, all solo, at Purdue and a team-best nine tackles at Buffalo. He has 389 career tackles and moved into eighth on CMU's top 10 list with 10 stops against NIU. He needs seven tackles to move into seventh. Cherocci ranks fourth in the country in career tackles among active players with 389. He is currently 11 stops behind Derrick Mathews of Houston for the third spot. Eric Kendricks of UCLA is the nation's leader with 470. He is the

national leader in assisted tackles with 231.

- · Central Michigan leads the MAC and is 24th in the FBS with 14
 - interceptions this season. CMU had four against Chattanooga, two versus Purdue, Buffalo and WMU, and one each versus Kansas, Toledo, Eastern Michigan and Northern Illinois.
 - In CMU's last 15 games, including the final three in 2013, the Chippewas have recorded 19 picks, four of which have been returned for touchdowns. Safeties Tony Annese and Kevin King joined the starting lineup at the beginning of that stretch.

RUSH TRIGGERS CMU OFFENSE

- Sophomore quarterback Cooper Rush took the reins of the CMU offense in the second guarter of week two last season and has started the last 22 games for CMU.
- · Rush moved into CMU's career top 10 list in three categories this season. He ranks fourth in touchdown passes (35), and is seventh in passes completed (392) and passing yards (5,013).
- The sophomore has also moved into CMU's single season top 10 in passing touchdowns (eighth, 20), completions (ninth, 215) and yards (10th, 2,664).
- Rush had a season-high 291 yards against Toledo, going 24-of-31 with two touchdowns. The 24 completions is a career-high, while Rush's passing total is the second-best mark of his career
- · The sophomore quarterback started off strong against NIU, going 10-for-11 for 137 yards in the first quarter before finishing 20-for-31 for 269 yards and two touchdowns.

150 TEAM RUSHING YARDS = VICTORY

- Central Michigan is 14-3 since 2011 when it rushes for at least 150 yards as a team.
- · CMU passed that mark in five victories this year with 161 rushing yards at Purdue, 234 against Ohio, 283 versus NIU, 278 at Eastern Michigan and 209 versus Miami. The Chippewas also came close against Chattanooga with 148 yards on the around.
- CMU's loss against Ball State (181 yards) was the first time the Chippewas have lost a game in which it surpassed 150 team rushing yards since a loss to Toledo (156 yards) in 2013.

SIX CHIPPEWAS ON ALL-MAC MID-SEASON SQUAD

- · Six CMU players were named to Phil Steele's All-Mid-American Conference Mid-Season team.
- The Chippewas' Thomas Rawls was named to the First Team Offense, while Titus Davis and Andy Phillips earned spots on the Second Team Offense. Joe Ostman, Justin Cherocci and Tony Annese were named to the First Team Defense.

ANNESE HONORED BY MAC

- Tony Annese was named the Mid-American Conference West Division Defensive Player of the Week after the Chattanooga game.
- · Annese, a sophomore safety from Hartland, Mich., led a Chippewa defense that limited Chattanooga to 29 total vards in the second half of a 20-16 season-opening victory.
- · Annese had two interceptions and two tackles. His first interception came on the second play of the game, the second with under two minutes remaining to seal the win.
- · In 15 career starts, Annese has five interceptions (2 vs. Chattanooga, 1 at Western Michigan, 1 vs. UMass and 1 at Northern Illinois)
- He is the first Chippewa player since Jahleel Addae in 2011 to make two interceptions in a game.
- He also earned this honor last season after CMU's victory over Western Michigan. In that game, he scored the game-winning touchdown late in the third quarter, intercepting Broncos quarterback Zach Terrell and returning it 34 yards for a score, providing CMU what would prove to be an insurmountable 27-16 lead.

FIRST CAREER STARTS

- Six Chippewas have made their first career starts this season: guard Kenny Rogers, wide receiver Jesse Kroll, linebacker Tim Hamilton, wide receiver Cory Willis, fullback Joe Bacci and defensive end Joe Ostman.
- A junior, Rogers has battled injuries during his career and switched from tackle to guard during the offseason to fill a need for CMU. He has started every game this year for Central Michigan.
- Kroll drew the first start of his career against Purdue.
 Kroll, who missed last season because of an injury, has 32 receptions for 473 yards this year.
- CMU's lone true sophomore, Ostman has recorded 10.0 tackles-for-a-loss along with three sacks this year. Ostman had 3.0 tackles-for-a-loss and two sacks against Purdue and tallied a career-high seven tackles and 1.0 tackles-for-a-loss at Kansas.
- Tim Hamilton saw his first action as a starter against Syracuse, racking up a career-best six tackles including two solo stops.
- Cory Willis got his first start against Kansas and had a breakout performance with five catches for 60 yards.
- Joe Bacci converted to fullback during the offseason and has been a steady force this year for CMU. Bacci got his first start against Ball State and caught his first career touchdown pass in that game.

TRIO BREAKS OUT

- A trio of true freshmen have seen action this year: running back Devon Spalding, defensive back Amari Coleman and defensive end Mitch Stanitzek.
- CMU played only one true freshman last year, defensive end Joe Ostman.
- Stanitzek saw his first action against Chattanooga, recording the first sack of his career. He also recorded his first interception at Kansas.
- Spalding and Coleman played for the first time against Purdue. Spalding rushed four times for 21 yards, an average of 5.2 yards per carry. Coleman played mainly on special teams, forcing a fumble while playing on the kickoff team.

BUTLER A "GOOD WORKS" NOMINEE

- Central Michigan senior Deon Butler has been nominated for the 2014 Allstate American Football Coaches Association Good Works Team.
- Butler, a tight end from Detroit, is one of 182 college football players from across the nation selected for their charitable involvement, community service contributions, volunteerism and leadership among their peers.
- Butler, a tight end, has been involved in several charitable volunteer efforts during his time at Central Michigan, including the PEAK Program, in which he mentors elementary-school students and aids with homework as well as enrichment activities from arts to sports.
- Butler has also volunteered at the Isabella Community Soup Kitchen, the Red Cross Food Pantry, the Special Olympics of Michigan, and at assisted-living homes.
- The Good Works Team, established in 1992, is intended to pay tribute to the "good" in college football that extends beyond the wins and the losses.

KINVILLE AMONG NATION'S TOP FOOTBALL SCHOLAR-ATHLETES

- CMU tight end Mike Kinville has been named as a semifinalist for the 2014 William V. Campbell Trophy.
- The award, which is selected by the National Football Foundation, goes to college football's premier scholarathlete. Candidates must be a senior or a graduate student in his final year of eligibility, maintain a grade point average of 3.2 or above, be a starter or a significant contributor, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship.
- Kinville is one of 167 nominees. On Oct. 30, 16 of those 167 will named as NFF Scholar-Athlete Award winners and will receive \$18,000 earmarked for postgraduate education.

CHIPPEWAS IN THE NFL

Nine former Chippewas currently reside on NFL rosters.
 Eric Fisher, the No. 1 pick in the 2013 NFL Draft, along with linebacker Frank Zombo, a former Super Bowl champion with the Green Bay Packers, are members of

the Kansas City Chiefs.

- Offensive tackle Joe Staley, CMU's first-ever first round draft choice, played in Super Bowl XVVII as a member of the San Francisco 49ers. He is a three-time All-Pro and Pro Bowl selection.
- Antonio Brown serves as the No. 1 receiver for the Pittsburgh Steelers and is quarterback Ben Roethlisberger's top target. Brown currently leads the NFL in receptions (105) and is second in receiving yards (1,375 yards).
- Former Super Bowl champion Cullen Jenkins is a starter at defensive tackle for the New York Giants.
- Linebacker Nick Bellore is a key special teams player and backup linebacker for the New York Jets.
- Safety Jahleel Addae, a three-time All-MAC selection, made the San Diego Chargers' 53-man roster as an undrafted rookie free agent in 2013 and has earned playing time in their nickel package and on special teams.
- Josh Gordy, who has also played for the St. Louis Rams and Green Bay Packers, is a reserve cornerback for the Indianapolis Colts.
- Running back Zurlon Tipton is currently a member of the Indianapolis Colts. Tipton joined the Colts this past offseason as an undrafted free agent and made the 53man roster to start the 2014 season. He was moved to the practice squad in week two and rejoined the 53-man roster in week 12.



HEAD COACH DAN ENOS

Fifth Season 26-35

In 2013, Dan Enos' fourth year at the helm of the Chippewa program, Central Michigan battled through adversity to win six games, including five in conference play, capture the Michigan MAC Trophy, and bring the Victory Cannon back home to Mount Pleasant.

CMU was hit hard by injuries from the season's outset, losing key offensive pieces in starting quarterback Cody Kater and Doak Walker Award nominee Zurlon Tipton to injury in the first guarter of the opener at Michigan. Redshirt freshman guarterback Cooper Rush took over the role of signal caller, throwing for 2,349 yards and 15 touchdowns, while sophomore Saylor Lavallii capably filled in at running back, rushing for 807 yards and five touchdowns, before Tipton returned for the final four games.

Early on, the Chippewas also lost veteran left tackle Jake Olson, a legitimate All-MAC candidate and NFL prospect, and budding young star defensive lineman Jabari Dean for the season. But quality depth resulting from strong recruiting allowed CMU to fill the gaps without missing a beat.

One of the major highlights of the conference schedule was CMU's 26-23 win over MAC East Division preseason favorite Ohio. The finale of a lengthy threegame road stretch, the Chippewas upset the Bobcats in thrilling fashion, getting a game-winning 5-yard touchdown pass from Rush to Courtney Williams with 22 seconds remaining. Central also swept in-state rivals Western Michigan, 27-22, in Kalamazoo; and Eastern Michigan, 42-10, in Kelly/Shorts Stadium to regain both the Victory Cannon and the Michigan MAC Trophy.

Four Chippewas received All-MAC recognition in 2013 — receiver Titus Davis (first team), guard Andy Phillips (second third) and linebackers Shamari Benton (third team) and Justin Cherocci (third team) — upping the total number of all-conference honors earned by Enos' players to 23 during his four-year tenure. Davis, who is ranked in the top 10 in the CMU record book in three career categories following his standout junior season, led the MAC in yards per catch (18.2), while Cherocci was the conference's top tackler with 121 total stops.

Enos' 2012 Chippewas won seven games overall, including four of their last five in the regular season, all in MAC play, to earn the program's fifth bowl bid in the last seven years. Central Michigan grabbed the national spotlight in week

four, scoring nine points in the game's final 45 seconds to knock off Iowa on the road, 32-31, in thrilling, come-from-behind fashion. CMU punctuated 2012 with a 24-21 victory over Western Kentucky in the Little Caesars Pizza Bowl in Detroit.

The CMU offense, which finished the regular season on a tear by scoring 30 or more points in six straight games, flourished in both phases in 2012. Behind a talented offensive line, led by All-American left tackle Eric Fisher, junior running back Zurlon Tipton rushed for 1,492 yards, the most by a Chippewa running back in 16 years. Senior quarterback Ryan Radcliff reached the 3,000-yard passing plateau for the third time in his career and posted the best touchdown-to-interception ratio of his career (23-9). Radcliff's top two targets excelled in 2012, as senior Cody Wilson solidified his status as one of CMU's all-time great receivers, finishing third in receptions and fifth in receiving yards, while sophomore Titus Davis was among the nation's leaders in yards per reception.

Enos had five Chippewas earn All-MAC recognition in 2012 — Fisher (first team), Tipton (second team), Jahleel Addae (second team), Davis (second team), and Wilson (third team). Fisher also received All-America recognition, earning second team honors from Sl.com and third team mention by the Associated Press.

One of Coach Enos' cornerstone messages to recruits and his players is that whatever you can dream, you can achieve at Central Michigan. The entire sports world witnessed the embodiment of that philosophy in April, 2013, when Eric Fisher made history by becoming the highest NFL draft pick ever from CMU and the Mid-American Conference when he was selected No. 1 overall by the Kansas City Chiefs. Three other Chippewas from the 2013 class, Addae (San Diego Chargers), Darren Keyton (Detroit Lions), and Cody Wilson (Detroit Lions), also signed NFL contracts.

Enos has also had a total of 16 Academic All-MAC selections and five academic all-district honorees in addition to three Academic All-Americans, including Cody Wilson in 2011 and 2012.

A young team playing close, competitive games came to define Enos' first season as the Chippewas' head coach in 2010.

A team that included just 13 seniors and 19 first-time starters found itself in six games decided by seven points or fewer. And while the Chippewas finished 3-9 overall, five of the losses were by a combined 19 points.

The highlight of the season was a 26-22 Senior Night victory over Western Michigan in front of a national television audience on ESPNU. The Chippewas' fifth straight win over their in-state rivals kept a pair of traveling trophies in Mount Pleasant: the Victory Cannon, presented to the winner of each year's CMU-WMU matchup, and the Michigan MAC Trophy, awarded to the winner of the round-robin competition between Central Michigan, Eastern Michigan and Western Michigan.

CMU opened the season with 33-0 win over Hampton at Kelly/Shorts Stadium, making Enos the first CMU head coach since Herb Deromedi in 1978 to win his debut.

The 2011 Chippewas featured 24 first-time starters and 10 true freshmen playing significant roles on offense and defense, while eight or fewer seniors were available to see playing time during each of the final six games of the season. Freshmen accounted for 10 of the final 11 touchdowns CMU scored in 2011, and on Nov. 10 against Ohio the Chippewas fielded an offensive starting lineup that included seven true or redshirt freshmen.

The Chippewas' season was highlighted by a 48-41 win over eventual MAC champion Northern Illinois at Kelly/ Shorts Stadium on Oct. 1. CMU led by as many as 22 points in the fourth quarter in handing NIU its lone conference loss of the season.

True freshman receiver Titus Davis earned Freshman All-America honors from Phil Steele's Magazine after catching 40 passes for 751 yards and eight touchdowns, a CMU freshman record for touchdown receptions and tied for the sixth most in a season in school history. Junior receiver Cody Wilson was named to the Capital One/ CoSIDA Academic All-America second team, marking the second straight year the Chippewas had produced an Academic All-American.

Enos was introduced as the head coach of the Central Michigan football program in a press conference on January 12, 2010.

Prior to CMU, he spent four seasons at Michigan State. He was the Spartans'

running backs coach from 2007-2009 after coaching the quarterbacks in 2006. The Spartans' backfield featured a pair of true freshmen in 2009, as Larry

Caper and Edwin Baker combined to rush for 895 yards and seven touchdowns. Caper was named to the Big Ten All-Freshmen Teams by ESPN.com and Sporting News.

In 2008, Enos worked directly with one of the nation's top running backs, Javon Ringer. Ringer led the nation in carries (390), scoring (132 points) and touchdowns (22) and ranked fourth in rushing (125.9 ypg) en route to being named a consensus first-team All-American. Ringer was the first Spartan running back to earn All-America honors since Lorenzo White in 1987.

In his first season coaching the Michigan State running backs, Enos mentored one of the top backfields in the Big Ten in Ringer and Jehuu Caulcrick. Michigan State ranked third in the Big Ten and No. 25 in the NCAA in rushing offense, averaging 198.2 yards a game, an improvement of 69 yards per game over 2006.

Enos began his tenure at Michigan State in 2006 coaching the Spartans' quarterbacks. He worked directly with Drew Stanton, who earned team MVP honors after accounting for 2,252 total yards and 17 touchdowns as a senior.

Enos spent the 2004 and 2005 seasons as the quarterbacks coach on Mark Dantonio's staff at Cincinnati.

In 2005, his pupil Dustin Grutza became the first freshman quarterback to start a Cincinnati season opener (vs. Eastern Michigan) since World War II. Grutza, a redshirt freshman, finished fourth in the Big East Conference in total offense, averaging 165.0 yards per game.

In 2004, Enos helped hone the talents of Gino Guidugli, who closed out his career as Cincinnati's all-time passing leader with 11,222 yards. As a senior, Guidugli completed 210-of-342 throws (.614) for 2,633 yards and a school-record 26 touchdowns while leading the Bearcats to a 7-5 record, including a 32-14 victory over Marshall in the Fort Worth Bowl.

Enos spent the 2003 season as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Craig Bohl at NCAA Division II North Dakota State, where he designed an offensive attack that averaged 30.1 points per game en route to an 8-3 record.

Prior to his appointment at North Dakota State, Enos worked for three years as the quarterbacks coach at Western Michigan (2000-02) under Gary Darnell. In 2002, the Broncos finished fifth in the Mid-American Conference and No. 30 nationally in passing offense, averaging 256.1 yards per game.

In 1999, Enos served as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Missouri State under Randy Ball. The Bears ranked among the NCAA Division I-AA leaders in passing offense (No. 22 at 258.8 ypg), scoring offense (No. 23 at 33.9 ppg) and total offense (No. 30 at 417.8 ypg).

His full-time coaching credits also include stops at Southern Illinois (quarterbacks and wide receivers, 1997- 98), Northern Michigan (offensive coordinator/backfield, 1996) and Lakeland College (offensive coordinator/ quarterbacks and wide receivers, 1994-95). He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant for George Perles at Michigan State (1991-93).

Enos was a four-year letterman (1987-90) and two- year starter (1989-90) at quarterback at Michigan State, compiling a 16-7-1 record (.688) as a starter. He led the Spartans to back-to-back bowl victories: a 33-13 win over Hawaii in the 1989 Aloha Bowl and a 17-16 win over Southern California in the 1990 John Hancock Bowl. As a senior, Enos threw for 1,677 yards and four touchdowns while helping the Spartans earn a share of the 1990 Big Ten championship. Enos still ranks among Michigan State's all-time top 10 in pass attempts (No. 10 at 478), pass completions (No. 10 at 297), completion percentage (No. 3 at .621) and passing yards (No. 10 at 3,837).

Enos earned his bachelor's degree in business administration from Michigan State in 1991 and received a master's degree in sports administration in 2006. A native of Dearborn, Mich., Enos earned all-state honors as a senior for Coach Jack Bridges at Edsel Ford High School. He accounted for 5,743 total yards and 46 touchdowns during his prep career.

Enos and his wife, Jane, are the parents of two children: Lia and Alex.

MOUNT PLEASANT, Mich. - It wasn't necessarily a thing of beauty.

But Central Michigan will happily take the result and move on.

Thomas Rawls was a smash in his CMU debut, rushing for 123 yards and a touchdown, and the Chippewa defense made four interceptions Thursday as CMU topped Football Championship Subdivision member Chattanooga, 20-16, in the season-opening football game at Kelly/Shorts Stadium.

"We are very fortunate we came out of their with a win. I think it was a great effort on the part our team," said Dan Enos, who improved to 4-1 in season openers as CMU coach."I give their coach and staff from Chattanooga a lot of credit. They're a well-coached and disciplined football team."

CMU trailed 16-0 until sophomore quarterback Cooper Rush tossed an 18-yard touchdown pass to Jesse Kroll with under two minutes to play in the first half to spark the Chippewas, who play at Purdue next week.

"Going into the second half, we just kept our cool," said CMU defensive tackle Leterrius Walton. "There was no `rah-rah' in the locker room. We knew we just had to focus, go through a little adversity. Coming out of the second half, we knew what to do."

CMU scored on its first two possessions of the third quarter - Rawls on a 6-yard run, Courtney Williams on a 26-yard pass from Rush - to surge ahead.

While the Chippewa offense struggled to find its rhythm throughout most of the first half, the defense was good despite surrendering a 70-yard TD pass play -- and got better throughout the evening.

Tony Annese made two interceptions, his second of which sealed the game with just over a minute remaining, and Blake Serpa and Kevin King had one each. Three of those picks came in the second half.

Chattanooga guarterback Jacob Huesman, the preseason Southern Conference Offensive Player of the Year and on the Walter Payton Award Watch List, completed 13-of-24 pass attempts for 150 yards and two touchdowns. He also rushed for 40 yards on 13 carries.

The Mocs, 8-4 a year ago, the reigning Southern Conference champions, and ranked 14th in FCS, finished with 256 yards, only 29 of which came in the second half. Eleven of Chattanooga's 14 first downs came before halftime.

Rush, who just one of his first seven passes, finished 15-for-26 for 173 yards. The Chippewas committed one turnover, a first-quarter fumble that led to a Chattanooga field goal, and their kicking game left plenty to be desired. Placekicker Ron Coluzzi missed a 43-yard field goal and an extra point and he had a field goal attempt blocked.

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. - From the start, the Central Michigan football team asserted itself.

The Chippewas built an early 14-0 lead behind two big plays - one from the defense, the other from the offense - then took command behind another big rushing day from Thomas Rawls Saturday in beating Purdue, 38-17, before 36,410 at Ross-Ade Stadium.

"We played a good game today, we executed well," said CMU coach Dan Enos, who both played and coached at Michigan State. "I thought our defense played very well and we were very physical. We knew we were going to have to be to win.

"It's tough to win on the road anywhere, but to come into a Big Ten stadium - I was in that league for a while - and it's very difficult."

CMU is 2-0 for the first time since 2002 and Saturday's victory was its first over a Big Ten foe since a 32-31 win at Iowa in 2012. The Chippewas are 6-23 all-time against Big Ten opponents, but 4-4 in their last eight meetings with teams from that conference.

Cornerback Brandon Greer returned an interception 57 yards for a touchdown to give CMU a 7-0 lead before the game was five minutes old, then quarterback Cooper Rush connected with Anthony Rice on a 65-yard TD pass play to extend CMU's lead to 14-0 with 7 minutes, 29 seconds to play in the first quarter.

Rawls continued his early season surge with 155 yards and two TDs on 31 carries, all career highs. The senior, who is in his first year at CMU after transferring from Michigan, ran for 123 yards a week ago in a 20-16 season-opening win over Chattanooga.

Rush completed 11-of-16 pass attempts for 172 yards and two touchdowns. He threw one interception, but that came in the fourth quarter with the Chippewas holding a 31-10 lead.

Central Michigan's defense surrendered 326 yards, but it forced three turnovers - cornerback Jason Wilson also had an interception - and never allowed speedy Purdue running back Raheem Mostert to get on track. The Chippewas were also credited with six pass breakups, and they recorded two sacks.

Mostert, a Big Ten sprint champion in track, finished with 53 yards rushing on 19 carries, and had 31 yards on five receptions. The Boilermakers finished with 122 yards on the ground, averaging just 3.6 yards per carry.

Quarterback Danny Etling was 17-for-32 with 126 yards. Austin Appleby, who relieved Etling in the fourth quarter, was 7-for-17 for 78 yards and a TD.

After CMU built its 14-0 lead, the Boilermakers (1-1) drew to 14-7 on Etling's 4-yard TD run early in the second quarter.

The Chippewas counter punched on their next possession, marching 73 yards in five plays with Rawls scoring on a 2-yard plunge. That re-upped the lead to two scores, 21-7.

A 42-yard Paul Griggs field goal capped Purdue's first drive of the second half and drew the Boilermakers within 21-10, but the Chippewas again answered, this time going 75 yards in seven plays with Rush hitting Ben McCord with an 11-yard TD pass to extend the lead to 28-10.

Redshirt freshman Brian Eavey's 23-yard field goal, the first of his collegiate career, increased CMU's lead to 31-10 early in the fourth guarter.

MOUNT PLEASANT, Mich. - A season that started with much promise took a step backwards Saturday at Kelly/Shorts Stadium.

Syracuse quarterback Terrel Hunt finished with 267 yards and scored three touchdowns as the Orange handed CMU a 40-3 loss before 25,531.

It was the first loss for CMU (2-1), which dominated Purdue a week ago in posting a 38-17 road victory. The Chippewas play at Kansas next week.

CMU entered the game averaging 154.5 yards rushing per game, but was held to 34. Chippewa guarterback Cooper Rush was 18-for-34 passing for 183 yards. He was sacked five times and was under heavy pressure for much of the game.

"They blitzed 60 to 70 percent of the snaps," Enos said. "It's feast or famine - it was feast for them."

The dangerous Hunt completed 20-of-30 passes for 175 yards and a touchdown, and he rushed for 92 yards on 13 attempts. His three rushing TDs are a career high, and his 92 yards on the ground matched his career best.

CMU moved the ball effectively on its first possession, which ended on Brian Eavey's 26-yard field goal for a 3-0 lead.

But it was all Syracuse after that. Ryan Nortan answered with a 23-yard field goal to tie it, then the Orange seized the lead on Margez Hodge's 36-yard fumble recovery for touchdown with 10 minutes, 43 seconds left in the first half.

The ball was jarred loose from Rush, who was scrambling in the backfield.

"He has to learn to just take the sack sometimes," said Enos, who played quarterback at Michigan State. "I played the position from fifth grade through college - it's tough to teach guys to do that because of their competitive nature. They want to continue make a play and not go down.

"As a coach, you don't want to kill their spirit. They have to be smart and learn how to do it. There's a fine line between being smart and being a playmaker. I think Cooper still has to figure that out where he's at this that. I thought that was a huge play - it could have been 10-3 at halftime. (Then) it's a different ball game."

Hunt hit Brisly Estime with a 4-yard TD pass with under 2 minutes left in the half to make it 17-3 at the break. The Orange recorded a safety on CMU's first possession of the second half when Rush, under heavy pressure from Cameron Lynch, was flagged for intentional grounding in the end zone.

Hunt scored on three short runs as the Orange won going away.

Syracuse finished with 464 yards in toal offense to CMU's 217, and had 25 first downs to the Chippewas' 14. Syracuse outrushed the Chippewas, 289-34.

LAWRENCE, Kan. - Kansas scored two fourth-quarter touchdowns Saturday to break a 10-10 tie and hand Central Michigan a 24-10 loss at Memorial Stadium.

It was the second straight loss for the Chippewas, who fell, 40-3, to Syracuse at home a week ago. They opened with a 20-16 win over Chattanooga, then won at Purdue, 38-17.

That first play was a momentum-grabbing 74-yard touchdown run by Tony Pierson, one of two home runs that eventually did in the Chippewas.

Despite falling in that early 7-0 hole, the Chippewas hung in and eventually tied the game 10-10 on sophomore Martez Walker's 18-yard touchdown run with under four minutes to play in the third quarter.

Kansas answered early in the fourth, when quarterback Montell Cozart hooked up with Justin McCay on a 60-yard TD pass play to break the tie. The Jayhawks sealed it on a Cozartto-Corey Avery 30-yard TD pass play with under two minutes remaining.

"It was 10-10 in the fourth quarter and up to that point they had the big play on the first play of the game and really mounted nothing after that," Enos said. "I thought both teams were pretty evenly matched. I thought our guys played extremely hard. They made a couple more plays than we were able to make, and that was the difference in the game."

Walker saw the first extended action of his career, finishing with 56 yards on 10 carries, both career-highs, all of which came in the second half.

"Coach says all the time, you've always got to be ready, no matter when it is in a game and once you get your opportunity, you've got to make the most of it," said Walker, who came into the game with just 19 yards on 12 attempts in his career.

Walker was a bright spot in a run game that finished with 101 net yards - included in that total is three sacks of quarterback Cooper Rush - and averaged 2.9 yards per carry.

Rush was 18-of-26 passing for 178 yards and one interception. The Chippewas, playing for the third consecutive game without injured standout wide receiver Titus Davis, committed three turnovers.

Brian Eavey's career-best 37-yard field goal midway through the second quarter drew CMU to 7-3 by halftime. Matthew Wyman answered with a 27-yarder early in the third to extend Kansas' lead to 10-3. Just over three minutes later, the Chippewas knotted it on Walker's TD run.

Cozert was 24 of 33 passing for 226 yards and one interception. The Jayhawks finished with 369 total yards, 134 of which came on their two big scoring plays.

"They score (early), and you could have seen the team get deflated," Enos said, "but I thought our defense responded, I thought our entire team did. Our defense played well. We gave up two big plays, but other than that I thought we tackled pretty well and did a nice job.

"It was a back and forth football game, good football game. They made more plays than we did, but there's a lot to build off of. We've got a good team. I'm going to be very interested to see when we get all our pieces back and we get healthy and get out guys back. How good we can be."

TOLEDO, Ohio - Central Michigan hung tough and hung in, but in the end could not get over the hump.

Logan Woodside threw for a career-high 339 yards and two touchdowns Saturday as Toledo handed CMU a 42-28 loss in the Chippewas' Mid-American Conference opener at the Glass Bowl.

It was the third consecutive loss for CMU (2-3), while Toledo improved to 3-2, 2-0 MAC.

Woodside, a sophomore, completed 23-of-34 pass attempts and triggered an offense that finished with 543 yards and 29 first downs.

"We certainly had our opportunities," said CMU coach Dan Enos, who saw his team pull to within six points in the fourth quarter after trailing by 20 at one point in the third. "We didn't make enough plays and I thought their offense basically just played better than ours did, just made more plays the end of the day."

Wide receiver Titus Davis and running back Thomas Rawls returned to the CMU lineup and both made major contributions.

Davis, who had not played since a 20-16 win over Chattanooga in the season-opener, made six catches for 128 yards. Rawls, who missed the last two games, carried 17 times for 65 yards and scored two touchdowns.

CMU quarterback Cooper Rush completed 24-of-31 passes for 291 yards and two touchdowns, both to Jesse Kroll. Kroll finished with seven receptions for 83 yards, and the Chippewas gained a respectable 386 yards in total offense and collected 20 first downs.

Down 20-7 at halftime, the Chippewas drew to 20-14 on a 4-yard Rush-to-Kroll touchdown pass to cap their first drive of the third quarter.

Toledo answered when Woodside hit Alonzo Russell with a 12-yard scoring strike to restore the Rockets' advantage to two TDs, 27-14.

On the ensuing kickoff, Toledo's Jeremiah Detmer hit a perfect chipshot onside kick that landed perfectly in teammate Christian Dukes' hands at midfield. Five plays later, Damon Jones-Moore scored on a 3-yard run to extend Toledo's lead to 34-14 with under two minutes remaining in the third guarter.

The Chippewas, however, rallied as Rawls scored on a 3-yard run with 3 seconds to play in the third quarter and on a 6-yarder midway through the fourth to draw CMU within 34-28

The Rockets, however, responded with a textbook clockconsuming scoring drive, finishing it with a 12-yard Woodside run. Terry Swanson, who led Toledo with 97 yards on the ground, set up the TD with a back-breaking 41-yard gain to CMU's 14-yard line.

Toledo used nearly five minutes of precious game time on the drive and scored with under three minutes remaining.

MOUNT PLEASANT, Mich. - The one-two punch of Titus Davis and Thomas Rawls, coupled with a staunch defensive effort, was exactly what the Central Michigan football team needed.

Rawls carried 40 times for 229 yards - both career highs - and Davis caught 10 passes for 181 yards as the Chippewas snapped a three-game losing streak with a 28-10 Mid-American Conference win Saturday over Ohio on Homecoming at Kelly/Shorts Stadium.

Both teams are 3-3 overall, 1-1 MAC. CMU goes to Northern Illinois next week.

Davis and Rawls scored two touchdowns apiece and CMU's defense set the tone, holding Ohio to 24 yards and two first downs in the first half.

CMU quarterback Cooper Rush completed 17-of-27 pass attempts for 233 yards. He connected with Davis on first-half touchdown passes of 4 and 32 yards, staking the Chippewas to a 14-0 lead before the Bobcats had even produced a first down.

The Chippewas rode Rawls and his career-best performance to a dominant day on offense.

CMU finished with 234 yards on the ground, 467 total yards and 24 first downs, all season-bests. The Chippewas dominated time of possession and ran 79 plays to the Bobcats' 44.

The game plan did not call for Rawls to tote it 40 times, Enos said, but Rawls made it difficult on the coaching staff to bring him off the field.

Ohio managed a Josiah Yazdani 24-yard field goal with 13 seconds left in the half to cut CMU's to 14-3. The play was set up by an Ohio fumble return – the game's only turnover – to the CMU 6-yard line.

The Chippewas responded, opening the second half with a 15-play, 75-yard scoring drive capped by Rawls' 15-yard TD run which increased the lead to 21-3. The drive consumed 7:26, CMU's longest drive, time-wise, of the season.

Ohio came to life in the early in the fourth guarter, when Tim Edmond capped an 86-yard, eight-play drive with a 1-yard TD plunge.

CMU answered with a seven-play, 68-yard drive with Rawls scoring from a yard out for the final margin.

Not just another win for the Central Michigan football team.

Rawls rushed for 270 yards on 40 carries and scored two touchdowns Saturday leading the Chippewas to a 34-17 upset of Mid-American Conference heavyweight Northern Illinois at Huskie Stadium.

The win, CMU's second straight, lifted the Chippewas to 4-3, 2-1 in the MAC. It snapped the Huskies' 28-game home win streak, and their 24-game regular-season MAC win streak. Northern Illinois (4-2, 1-1) has won four consecutive MAC West titles and captured the league championship twice in that span.

Rawls surpassed his career-high 229 yards rushing he set last week in a 28-10 win over Ohio. His 40 carries matched his career-high, also set against Ohio. His two-week total: 80 carries, 499 yards, four TDs.

As has been Rawls' pattern all season, he got stronger as the game progressed. He ran for 194 yards on 24 carries in the second half as the Chippewas salted the game away. CMU held a near 2-to-1 advantage in time of possession and rolled up 30 first downs while holding NIU to 19.

The Chippewas found themselves in a 7-0 hole before the game was two minutes old as NIU marched 71 yards in just five plays on the opening drive, scoring on a 20-yard pass from Drew Hare to Juwan Brescacin.

CMU responded immediately. Rawls capped the Chippewas' first possession - an 86-yard, 10-play drive - with a 5-yard TD run which tied it 7-7.

After forcing a punt, the Chippewas took over at their own 8-yard line and promptly marched 92 yards in eight plays to take a 14-7 lead on Rawls' 13-yard TD run. CMU's first two scoring drives were its longest of the season.

The Chippewas extended their lead to 21-7 when quarterback Cooper Rush tossed a 6-yard TD pass to Jesse Kroll midway through the second quarter.

Brian Eavey kicked two second-half field goals - a 25-yarder and a 23-yarder - and Rush connected with tight end Ben McCord for a 13-yard scoring play in the third quarter.

Rush completed 20-of-31 pass attempts for 269 yards. Kroll made six catches for 97 yards.

The Chippewas finished with a season-high 552 yards in total offense against the MAC's top-ranked defense. NIU entered the game allowing an average of 354.8 yards per game.

CMU's defense limited the Huskies to 341 yards, including 110 on the ground. The Huskies were averaging a MAC-best 256 rushing yards per game.

Linebacker Justin Cherocci led CMU's defense with 10 tackles, while defensive backs Brandon Greer and Kavon Frazier had eight apiece. Safety Tony Annese made his third interception of the season, and CMU's secondary was credited with seven pass breakups.

MOUNT PLEASANT, Mich. - Ball State's Scott Secor kicked a career-long 55-yard field goal with the wind at his back with 17 seconds remaining Saturday as Central Michigan fell to the Cardinals, 32-29, in a Mid-American Conference football game at Kelly/Shorts Stadium.

Central Michigan committed five turnovers and was penalized 10 times for 91 yards to drop to 4-4 overall, 2-2 in the MAC.

Ball State, 2-5, 1-2, snapped a five-game losing streak.

Thomas Rawls rushed for 167 yards and a touchdown on 32 carries and guarterback Cooper Rush completed 20-of-32 passes for 245 yards and three touchdowns to lead CMU.

Titus Davis matched his career-high with 10 catches for 128 yards and two TDs for the Chippewas.

Rush was intercepted twice and fumbled once, and Rawls fumbled twice.

Ball State quarterback Jack Milas, a freshman making just his second start, was 21-for-38 passing for 198 yards and a TD. Milas led the Cardinals on the game-winning drive, which began at their 34-yard line with 2 minutes, 16 seconds remaining.

That came after CMU had seized the momentum on Rush's 8-yard TD pass to Davis and his two-point conversion toss to Jesse Kroll that tied it at 29-29 with 2:22 to play.

Central Michigan outgained the Cardinals in total yardage, 426-287, but simply could not overcome the rash of early penalties and the turnovers.

CMU committed three penalties during Ball State's opening drive which resulted in a Jahwan Edward 7-yard TD run and a 6-0 lead.

The Chippewas answered on their opening drive, a six-play, 67-yarder that ended in a Rawls' 5-yard TD run. Brian Eavey's extra point kick gave CMU a 7-6 lead, their only advantage of the game.

Ball State took the lead for good, 13-7, when Milas connected with KeVonn Mabon on a 40-yard TD pass-play midway through the opening quarter.

A 39-yard Secor field goal on the second play of the second guarter extended the Cardinals' advantage to 16-7. Secor would later add a 37-yard field goal offset by a 1-yard Rushto-Joe Bacci TD pass that left Ball State up, 16-14, late in the second quarter.

With under two minutes remaining in the half, Rush was sacked by Darnell Smith and fumbled. Michael Ayers scooped up the ball at CMU's 13 and returned to the 1. Two plays later, Edwards, who finished with 98 yards on 32 carries, scored to extend Ball State's lead to 26-14 at halftime.

The Chippewas drew to 26-21 when Rush tossed a 27-yard TD pass to Davis to cap their opening drive of the second half. A 20-yard Secor field goal late in the third made is 29-21.

BUFFALO, N.Y. - Once again, Saylor Lavallii answered the call.

So did the Central Michigan defense.

Lavallii came off the bench to rush for 80 yards and two touchdowns and the Chippewa defense stymied Buffalo's strong run game Saturday as CMU defeated the Bulls, 20-14, in a Mid-American Conference football game at UB Stadium.

CMU quarterback Cooper Rush completed 14 of 24 pass attempts for 231 yards and a touchdown. The TD went to senior Titus Davis and it broke a 14-14 tie with just over eight minutes remaining.

It was Davis' 29th career TD reception, the most in CMU history. He finished with six catches for 100 yards, and he moved into second place on the school's reception vardage list with 3,322.

CMU lost running back Thomas Rawls, the MAC's leading rusher, to a knee injury early in the first quarter. That sent Enos to the bullpen where he summoned Lavallii and sophomore Martez Walker.

Both backs have had their moments in a Chippewa uniform, particularly Lavallii. Last season, he stepped into the starting lineup when then-senior Zurlon Tipton was injured in the season opener.

Lavallii started eight games in 2013, rushing for 807 yards and five TDs. This season, he had seen his carries dwindle as Rawls established himself as a productive workhorse.

Walker, who showed flashes of potential earlier this season when he carried 10 times for 56 yards at Kansas during Rawls' absence, finished Saturday's game with 57 yards on 16 attempts.

The Lavallii-Walker combo produced 137 yards on 37 carries, in the neighborhood of what a healthy Rawls has produced week in and week out this season.

The CMU defense limited Buffalo's Anthone Taylor to 25 yards rushing and the Bulls to 38 yards total on the ground, both season lows. Taylor entered the game averaging 132.3 yards per game, and the Bulls came in averaging 185.1 per game on the ground. CMU held Buffalo to 271 yards, also a season low.

UB quarterback Joe Licata completed 21 of 35 passes for 233 yards and two touchdowns. He was intercepted twice. Both picks - one by Josh Cox, the other by Brandon Greer - led to Chippewa touchdowns.

Greer's came late in the third quarter with Buffalo driving at the Chippewa 34. On second-and-9, Licata lofted a pass down the left sideline. Greer had perfect inside position on Buffalo receiver Devon Hughes and managed to secure the ball falling down near the 2-yard line.

CMU then went 98 yards in 16 plays, milking more then 9 minutes from the clock. It ended with Rush's 7-yard TD toss to Davis, putting CMU ahead for good.

The drive was CMU's longest of the season on all three fronts: number of plays, yardage and elapsed time.

Lavallii scored on two short bursts in the first half to stake the Chippewas to a 14-0 lead. Buffalo drew to 14-7 on a Licata 28-yard TD pass to Ron Willoughby with under two minutes to play in the half.

YPSILANTI, Mich. - Devon Spaulding and Saylor Lavallii combined to run for 259 yards and four touchdowns Saturday as Central Michigan dominated Eastern Michigan, 38-7, in a Mid-American Conference football game at Rynearson Stadium.

CMU took command early, scoring on its first two possessions, and it finished the day with 501 total yards while holding the Eagles to a season-low 97, including just 21 on the ground.

"I thought the story of the day was our defense," CMU coach Dan Enos said. "I thought our defense played extremely well, bottled up a very explosive offense and guarterback-run game. Our offense did a nice job of running the ball and staying balanced. It was a good team win."

Spalding, a freshman who had logged just 55 yards on 22 carries entering the game, finished with 154 yards on 18 attempts. He scored on runs of 42 and 6 yards, the latter of which came on the second play of the fourth quarter and made it 38-0.

Lavallii finished with 105 yards on 24 attempts, notching his first 100-yard game since October, 2013. Both of his TDs came in the first guarter -- the first covering 41 yards, the second 1 yard -- staking the Chippewas to a 14-0 lead.

"Saylor ran hard again, very effective," Enos said. "I've been telling everybody that Devon Spalding is going to be good. We've been waiting for that game from him and I was really happy for him."

CMU guarterback Cooper Rush turned in another efficient performance, completing 18-of-23 passes for 223 yards and a touchdown.

The TD pass covered 15 yards and went to a leaping Titus Davis. It was the 30th TD reception of Davis' brilliant CMU career.

It was another in a line of solid performances by Rush, a sophomore who continues to improve and become more consistent. He threw for 231 yards in last week's 20-14 victory at Buffalo in a game played, like Saturday's at Eastern, in very windy conditions.

"He's very efficient," Enos said. "He's done a nice job, made some big throws. That throw he made to Titus into this 30 mph wind, into traffic. Some of the throws that he's made into the wind have just amazed me the last two weeks. He just continues to get better."

As do the Chippewas, particularly on defense. The MAC's topranked defense limited the Eagles to five first downs, forced eight punts and held EMU to an average of 2 yards per play.

A 4-yard Rob Bolden-to-Darius Jackson touchdown pass with under 4 minutes to play spoiled CMU's shutout bid. The TD was set up by a blocked punt that gave the Eagles possession on the CMU 6-yard line.

"You know, at the end of the day, we just want to win," said CMU defensive tackle Leterrius Walton, who had one of the Chippewas' three sacks. "Regardless of the situation, we want to win the game. Our defense, we love it. We take pride in wanting to be the best defense in the MAC."

Senior tight end Deon Butler led the CMU receivers with a five catches for 95 yards, both career-bests.

MOUNT PLEASANT, Mich. - Cooper Rush threw three touchdown passes to Titus Davis and freshman Devon Spalding came off the bench to run for 147 yards and two scores Saturday as Central Michigan held on beat Miami, 34-27, in a Maid-American Conference football game at Kelly/ Shorts Stadium.

The Chippewas (7-4, 5-2 MAC) have won three straight games and five of their last six. They close the regular season on Saturday, Nov. 22, at home against rival Western Michigan (7-3, 5-1).

The Chippewa defense was again solid against the run, holding the RedHawks to 102 yards on the ground. But Miami quarterback Andrew Hendrix threw for 369 yards - the most by a CMU opponent this season - and two touchdowns to keep the RedHawks in it right to the very end.

And beyond.

"I'm proud of our guys - we found a way to win," CMU coach Dan Enos said. "It was ugly at times, but that's college football week to week. I have to give Miami a lot of credit. Their coaching staff did a great job, the guys played extremely hard. I thought their quarterback was very, very good. He made a lot of good plays for them."

Rush, who completed 16-of-23 passes for 218 yards, tossed a 9-yard TD pass to Davis with 10 minutes, 3 seconds remaining to break a 27-27 tie.

Davis finished with eight catches for 102 yards. His three TD receptions tied the CMU single-game mark.

Protecting that one-touchdown lead, Central Michigan faced a fourth down at the Miami 41 with 2:00 remaining. The Chippewas needed less than 2 feet for the first down, but Enos elected to punt. The punt went for a touchback and gave Hendrix and the RedHawks the ball at their own 20 with 1:52 remaining.

"If we would have been at the 30 or inside there, we probably would have gone for it (on fourth down)," Enos said. "But at the 41 -- and I know we hadn't been stopping them, but I thought we (could get) a punt down there inside the 10 and at least make them go 90 yards to score a touchdown to tie it. I thought that was a smart play at that time."

Hendrix drove Miami to the CMU 1-yard line with 10 seconds remaining. A sack by Justin Cherocci pushed Miami back to the 9, and four incompletions later, the game was over.

"They were first-and-goal on the 2 and Justin Cherocci makes that play," Enos said. "It was a great call by our defensive staff at that time. That, to me, was the big play of the game."

Three times in the game's final seven plays, CMU was flagged for pass interference in the end zone, the last time giving the RedHawks one final shot from the 2 with no time showing on the clock.

It was the second consecutive big week for Spalding, who had 154 yards and two TDs two weeks ago in a 38-7 win at Eastern Michigan. The freshman has yet to draw a start, but is firmly in the rotation of three or four featured backs that Enos employs on most weeks.

MOUNT PLEASANT, Mich. - Central Michigan jumped to a 14-0 lead on archrival Western Michigan after one quarter Saturday at Kelly/Shorts Stadium.

Then, things went south.

Western quarterback Zach Terrell threw for 222 yards and three touchdowns and the Chippewas committed three turnovers in falling to the Broncos, 32-20.

It was a bitterly disappointing loss for the Chippewas, who saw several seniors play their final game at Kelly/Shorts Stadium. Those seniors were introduced along with some of their respective family members on the field before the game.

Two critical plays helped swing the game in the Broncos' favor.

The first came with CMU holding a 17-15 lead, and Chippewa punter Ron Coluzzi pinned the Broncos on their own 2-yard line with just 1 minute, 39 seconds to play in the first half.

Terrell connected with wide receiver Daniel Braverman for a 63-yard gain to the CMU 33. Terrell then connected with Corey Davis on a 33-yard TD pass to put the Broncos in front, 22-17, swinging momentum to the Broncos' side.

The second critical play came with 3:21 remaining. With Western leading, 25-20, CMU freshman Amari Coleman attempted to field a punt inside his own 10-yard line.

Coleman muffed the punt and Western recovered at the Chippewa 2. Two plays later, Terrell and Davis connected again for a TD that effectively put the game out of reach. Davis, the brother of CMU wideout Titus Davis, finished with nine catches for 104 yards.

"Amari has done a fabulous job for us and he will have a future doing it. NFL players fumble punts, great players do, and it's just one of those things. It just happened at a very inopportune time, obviously."

Chippewa quarterback Cooper Rush completed 24-of-44 pass attempts for 248 vards and two TDs. His scoring strikes covered 18 yards to Deon Butler and 6 yards to Ben McCord and gave the Chippewas a 14-0 lead with just under three minutes remaining in the first quarter.

Butler finished with a career-best seven catches for 83 yards, while Titus Davis had 88 yards on five receptions.

The Broncos held CMU to 70 yards rushing -- the Chippewas' second-lowest output of the season – and it finished with net zero yards on the ground in the final two quarters. Thomas Rawls finished with 76 yards on 19 carries.

After the Chippewas dominated the first quarter, Western got a 2-yard TD run from Jarvion Franklin and a 9-yard Terrellto-Eric Boyden TD pass to seize a 15-14 lead as the Broncos converted a two-point conversion after their first score.

Brian Eavey put CMU back on top, 17-15, with a career-long 43-yard field goal with 4 minutes, 32 seconds to play in the first half.

California Raisin Bowl San Jose 48, CMU 24 December 8, 1990 Fresno, Calif.

The Central Michigan University Chippewas played in their first Division I bowl game in 1990 – California Raisin Bowl X.

San Jose State defeated CMU, 48-24, in Fresno.

CMU entered the game as one of the top defenses in the nation, allowing only 8.9 points per game during the season. The Chippewa defense would be tested as it faced a powerful San Jose State offense in guarterback Ralph Martini and running back Sheldon Canley.

The only scoring in the first quarter would come on the opening drive as San Jose scored on a 5-yard run by Canley.

The Spartans added a field goal after pinning CMU deep in its own territory and forcing the Chippewas to punt from the end zone. A surprise on-side kick attempt by San Jose then failed, and the Chippewas started a drive at the CMU 45-yard line. On the first play of that drive, Jeff Bender hit Ken Ealy along the sideline for a 55-yard touchdown. Central then had a great opportunity to take the lead when San Jose fumbled the kickoff at its own 14-yard line. However, on a fourth-and-1 at the 5-yard line, tailback Billy Smith was stopped for a loss of 1 yard. San Jose would manage to put 16 more points on the board in the quarter to take a 26-7 halftime lead.

After a CMU field goal early in the third quarter, Canley added two more rushing touchdowns and one receiving to give San Jose a 48-10 lead early in the fourth. Bender and Ealy later connected for touchdown strikes of 48 and 17 yards after the outcome had already been decided. Canley was named San Jose's game MVP, and Ealy earned the honor for CMU.


CMU could not capture the second meeting as the Chippewas fell to the Rebels, 52-24.

CMU entered the bowl game on a high note after defeating Bowling Green in a winner-take-all game for the MAC title. In preparing for the bowl game, however, All-American tailback Brian Pruitt suffered a bruised knee and was unable to play in the second battle with UNLV.

The Rebels jumped out to an early lead, scoring on their first two possessions. A Brad Blasy 20-yard field goal put CMU on the scoreboard with 3:44 left in the first quarter. On the last play of the quarter, Erik Timpf hit Terrance McMillan with a 53-yard touchdown pass, cutting the UNLV lead to 14-10.

The second quarter belonged to UNLV as three CMU turnovers resulted in 17 Rebels points. UNLV took a 31-10 lead into the locker room at halftime. The CMU offense struggled in the third quarter as starting quarterback Timpf was forced out of the game with an injury. The Chippewas were held scoreless while UNLV added two touchdowns.

The Rebels expanded the lead to 52-10 by scoring on the first possession of the fourth quarter. Chad Darnell then threw a 24-yard TD pass to Terrance McMillan with 8:10 left in the game. Damon Tolbert added a four-yard rushing TD with 1:33 left in the game before it ended, 52-24.

Motor City Bowl CMU 31, Middle Tennessee State 14 December 26, 2006 Detroit, Mich.

The Central Michigan University Chippewas won their first Division I-A bowl game in impressive fashion, and picked up their second victory at Ford Field in less than a month with a resounding 31-14 triumph over Middle Tennessee State in the Motor City Bowl in Detroit, Mich.

A Motor City Bowl-record crowd of 54,113, most of them clad in maroon and gold, saw CMU score touchdowns on its first two offensive possessions to grab a 14-0 lead less than 10 minutes into the game.

Ontario Sneed scored on a 1-yard run and on a 29-yard pass from redshirt freshman quarterback Dan LeFevour, the first of two scoring strikes from the record-setting Chippewa signal-caller.

After MTSU narrowed the lead to 14-7 on a touchdown run by Eugene Gross, LeFevour needed only 35 seconds to put CMU back up by two scores, capping a quick scoring drive with a 9-yard TD run of his own. CMU led, 21-7, at the half.

The defense took care of putting the game away early in the third quarter. Senior defensive end Dan Bazuin, who was named the game's UAW Most Outstanding Lineman, hit MTSU quarterback Clint Marks, forcing a wobbly pass that was easily intercepted by CMU linebacker Doug Kress. Kress raced up the left sideline and went 56 yards with the return for a touchdown, bumping the lead to 28-7 and burying MTSU's hopes for a comeback.

LeFevour was the Motor City Bowl MVP, going 16-of-26 for 162 yards and a TD through the air and adding another 69 yards and a score on 15 carries on the ground.

Bazuin led the defense with a pair of sacks among his eight tackles, while Kress and Red Keith both had nine tackles for CMU.

Motor City Bowl Purdue 51, CMU 48 December 26, 2007 Detroit, Mich.

Chris Summers' 40-yard field goal on the final play lifted Purdue to a 51-48 win over CMU in the highest scoring Motor City Bowl in history.

An MCB record crowd of 60,624 took in an offensive shootout that featured 1,022 yards of offense and saw the Chippewas twice tie the score after trailing by 21 points three times.

Dan LeFevour hit Bryan Anderson for a 19-yard touchdown with 1:09 remaining. Andrew Aguila's point-after evened the score at 48-48. Curtis Painter then completed 4-of-5 passes to set up the game-winning kick.

Nick Bellore, who finished with a game-high 11 tackles, intercepted a pass on the game's opening possession that led to a 27-yard Aguila field goal and a 3-0 CMU lead just over two minutes into the contest.

The Boilermakers scored on six straight possessions to close the first half. CMU, meanwhile, mustered a 47-yard field goal and a 49-yard scoring pass from LeFevour to Anderson and trailed 34-13 at halftime.

Antonio Brown scored on a 76-yard catch-and-run on the second play of the third quarter, but Painter threw a scoring pass to Jake Standeford with 12:53 remaining in the period.

LeFevour threw a 10-yard TD pass to Anderson and scored on runs of 9 and 4 yards to tie the score at 41 with 10 seconds left in the third quarter.

Purdue went back in front on Jaycen Taylor's 13-yard run with 8:19 left.

CMU took over on its own 34-yard line with 2:15 left. Facing thirdand-16 from the 28, LeFevour hit Duane Brooks for 24 yards, Anderson for 13 yards, ran for 16 yards and connected with Anderson for 19 yards in succession to draw the Chippewas even on the scoreboard for the final time.

Motor City Bowl Florida Atlantic 24, CMU 21 December 26, 2008 Detroit, Mich.

Rusty Smith threw for 306 yards and two touchdowns to lead Florida Atlantic to a 24-21 win in the Motor City Bowl.

Smith threw touchdown passes of 52 yards to Chris Bonner and 18 yards to Cortez Gent to give the Owls a 24-13 lead after the game was tied 10-10 at halftime.

The Chippewas drew within 24-21 on a 15-yard touchdown pass from Dan LeFevour to Antonio Brown and two-point conversion pass from LeFevour to Kito Poblah with 3:09 left. FAU, however, recovered the onside-kick and picked up three first downs to erase the clock.

Nick Bellore recovered a Smith fumble on the Owls' second possession to set up the Chippewas at their own 42-yard line, but LeFevour was intercepted on the next snap.Dilvory Edgecomb scored on a 1-yard dive six plays later to give FAU a 7-0 lead.

After the teams traded punts, CMU covered 75 yards in eight plays to tie the score. Poblah made a one-handed catch of a LeFevour throw for the score.

Brown's 29-yard punt return on the ensuing possession set up a 35-yard Andrew Aguila field goal that gave the Chippewas a 10-7 lead with 9:30 left in the half. Ross Gornall tied the score with a 36-yard field goal in the half's final minute.

The Chippewas punted to open the second half, and FAU went in front for good on the following possession. A roughing the passer penalty on third-and-5 extended the drive, and on the next snap Smith hit Bonner with a 52-yard scoring toss.

CMU drove inside Florida Atlantic's 20-yard line on the next possession, but had to settle for a 33-yard Aguila field goal.

Florida Atlantic was forced to punt, and Brown turned a reverse into a 72yard touchdown on the final play of the third quarter that momentarily gave the Chippewas the lead. An offsides penalty against FAU and a facemasking penalty against CMU negated the play, and CMU eventually had to punt. Smith's touchdown pass to Gent nine plays after the punt gave FAU a doubledigit lead with 10:17 left.

CMU then drove to the FAU 1-yard line, but a penalty and two incompletions ended the threat. The CMU defense forced a three-and-out to set up LeFevour's touchdown pass to Brown, but it was as close as the Chippewas would get.

The school-record tying 38th victory by Central Michigan's senior class may have been its most memorable.

Senior quarterback Dan LeFevour threw for a career-high 395 yards, and a trio of clutch special teams plays lifted the No. 25 Chippewas to a 44-41 double-overtime victory over Troy.

Andrew Aguila's school-record fifth field goal--a 37-yarder in the second overtime--capped a comeback that saw the Chippewas rally from a 12-point fourth-quarter deficit.

A game that featured two of the top statistical offenses in the country turned into a defensive slugfest in the first half. Levi Brown's 9-yard scoring pass to DuJuan Harris was the only touchdown in the first 30 minutes, and Troy took a 10-9 lead into halftime.

CMU's only punt of the game opened the fourth quarter, and Troy appeared to have taken control of the game when Harris scored on a 1-yard run with 8:01 remaining. His score stretched the Troy lead to 31-19.

Brown returned the ensuing kickoff 95 yards for a touchdown to jump-start the Chippewas' rally.

CMU regained possession at its own 15-yard line with 4:22 remaining, and LeFevour directed one of the most memorable drives of his career to give the Chippewas the lead. He hit Brown for 27 yards on second-and-15, Brown for 8 yards on third-and-2, Cody Wilson for 7 yards on third-and-4 and Brown again for 30 yards on the next snap before connecting with Bryan Anderson on a 4-yard touchdown pass. LeFevour then tossed a two-point conversion pass to Kito Poblah to give CMU a 34-31 lead with 1:17 remaining.

Jernigan returned the kickoff 32 yards to the Troy 37-yard line, and Brown completed a pair of passes to move the Trojans to the CMU 29-yard line. Michael Taylor's 46-yard field goal with 31 seconds remaining forced overtime.

CMU needed just three plays to score in the first overtime period. LeFevour rushed for no gain, threw to Anderson for 12 yards and scrambled for a 13-yard touchdown to put the Chippewas in front.

Brown hit Jason Bruce for 18 yards on third-and-5 from the 20-yard line on Troy's first possession, and two plays later Shawn Southward tied the score on a 1-yard run.

Troy's offense remained on the field to begin the second overtime period. After stalling the Chippewas' 14-yard line, and Taylor lined up for a 31-yard field goal attempt. CMU's Vince Agnew raced untouched around Troy's right end and blocked the field goal attempt, giving the Chippewas an opportunity to win the game.

Three-yard runs by Brown and Bryan Schroeder moved the ball to the Troy 19-yard line, and Aguila booted the game-winning field goal from 37 yards out.

LeFevour was named the GMAC Bowl Most Valuable Player. Brown was selected offensive MVP, Agnew defensive MVP and Aguila special teams MVP.

Little Caesars Pizza Bowl CMU 24, Western Kentucky 21 December 26, 2012 Detroit, Mich.

Quarterback Ryan Radcliff threw a perfect strike to senior receiver Cody Wilson midway through the fourth quarter and Central Michigan's defense got a late fourth down stop to lead the Chippewas to a 24-21 victory over Western Kentucky to win the 2012 Little Caesars Pizza Bowl.

Radcliff was named the game's Most Valuable Player while junior linebacker Shamari Benton was named the Outstanding Lineman. Benton led CMU in tackles for the seventh time this season, recording nine.

The winning touchdown came on a second and goal with 5:11 left in the game. Radcliff threaded the needle between two WKU defenders to find Wilson in the corner of the end zone. The senior signal caller finished the game 19-of-29 for 253 yards, three touchdowns and no interceptions while Wilson had 10 catches for 101 yards and the one touchdown.

After CMU scored, the Hilltoppers drove the ball down to the CMU 19-yard line where they faced a fourth and two with 51 seconds remaining. Western Kentucky ran a play-action pass to tight end Jack Doyle, but he was blanketed by CMU defenders and the pass fell incomplete. CMU then ran out the clock.

CMU's winning touchdown drive began at the WKU 26-yard line after a blocked punt by junior safety Avery Cunningham. The blocked punt capped off a string of controversial plays that began with a reversal of a Zurlon Tipton touchdown. The officials first ruled that Tipton had scored on a one-yard drive on fourth down but the replay official reversed the call. That gave the Hilltoppers the ball at the CMU half-yard line. CMU's defense tightened up, allowing just two yards to force a three-and-out. Cunningham blocked the punt after a low snap and the Chippewas were in business.

Central Michigan got off to a fast start after Radcliff connected on a 69-yard touchdown strike to redshirt freshman receiver Andrew Flory at 10:54 of the first quarter. Western Kentucky answered with a six-yard quarterback run by Kawaun Jakes after he connected with Rico Brown for 70 yards on a trick play on the first offensive play of the game for the Hilltoppers.

CMU responded with another Radcliff-to-Flory touchdown connection, this time from 29 yards out with 5:46 to go in the first quarter. After three straight punts, CMU got the running game going as Tipton had 40 yards on a drive that led to a 50-yard Davis Harman field goal, making it 17-7 CMU. The field goal set the CMU bowl record and tied the Little Caesars Pizza Bowl mark.

CMU's special teams played an important part in the victory. Junior punter Richie Hogan averaged 57.3 yards per punt including a bowl-record 82-yard boot in the first quarter. CMU also limited WKU's Antonio Andrews to just 40 kick return yards and four yards on punt returns. Andrews entered the game leading the FBS in all-purpose yards and was within reach to break Barry Sanders' NCAA record all-purpose yards but was held short of the record by CMU.
