2016 POPEYES BAHAMAS BOWL -- EASTERN MICHIGAN VS. OLD DOMINION

2016 POPEYES BAHAMAS BOWL: The 2016 Popeyes Bahamas Bowl features Eastern Michigan (7-5) from the Mid-American Conference and Old Dominion (9-3) from Conference USA. The game will be played Friday, December 23 (1 p.m. ET) in Thomas A. Robinson National Stadium (15,000). The game will be televised on ESPN (**Steve Levy** - play by play; analyst **Mack Brown**; sideline reporter **Kaylee Hartung**) and carried on the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl Radio Network (**Brian Hanni** - play by play; color analyst **Rob Best**).

TICKETS: Tickets to the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl are \$50 through the ticket departments of the two participating institutions. Local tickets are available through the Thomas A. Robinson National Stadium box office.

POPEYES BAHAMAS BOWL STORYLINES

2016 MATCHUP

For the third consecutive year, the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl features a Mid-American vs. Conference USA matchup as the Eastern Michigan Eagles (7-5, 4-4 MAC) takes on the Old Dominion Monarchs (9-3, 7-1 C-USA). The MAC and C-USA are both 1-1 in previous Popeyes Bahamas Bowl as WKU (C-USA) won the 2014 title with a thrilling 49-48 victory over Central Michigan and Western Michigan (MAC) captured the 2015 bowl with a 45-31 victory over Middle Tennessee.

This is the third straight season that Eastern Michigan and Old Dominion will play each other. The teams contested a two-game series in 2014 and 2015, and ODU leads the all-time series 2-0. The Monarchs got a 38-34 victory at EMU in the 2014 season opener (Sept. 5) as Monarchs RB **Ray Lawry** rushed 28 times for 223 yards and four touchdowns. In 2015 (Sept. 12), ODU won 17-3 in Norfolk, as the Monarchs defense held EMU to just 215 yards of total offense. **Ray Lawry** and **Antonio Vaughan** scored touchdowns for ODU.

MOST COMBINED VICTORIES

The **16** combined victories by Eastern Michigan (seven) and Old Dominion (nine) is the most going to the game in Popeyes Bahamas Bowl history. The bowl had a combined total of 14 victories in 2014 - Central Michigan (seven)/WKU (seven) - and 2015 - and Middle Tennessee (seven)/Western Michigan (seven).

NOT WASTING TIME

Eastern Michigan won only one game in 2015, and tied for the best FBS turnaround in 2016 at +6 victories (tied with UCF, Colorado and Wyoming) after posting seven victories in 2016. Two of the seven victories came against teams that played in their respective conference title games: Ohio (MAC) and Wyoming (Mountain West). It is the first bowl appearance for the Eagles since the 1987 California Bowl against San Jose State.

Old Dominion plays in the school's first-ever bowl game after only eight seasons of college football (and second with bowl eligibility) after a 69-year hiatus. In fact, the Monarchs, due to NCAA transition rules, have not been eligible for postseason play in four of their eight seasons, but either participated in the FCS playoffs or a FBS bowl in three of the four seasons they were eligible. The Monarchs come into the 2016 Popeyes Bahamas Bowl on a five-game win streak and have won eight of their last nine games.

LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD

In the first two years of the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl, there have been **173** points, the third-most among ALL bowl games played in 2014 and 2015. In points order, teams have scored 49, 48, 45 and 31 points in the two games.

Going into the 2016 bowl season, only the Dollar General (192) and Miami Beach (183) bowls have scored more points than the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl in the previous two years.

BOWL OF FUTURE CHAMPIONS

Each of the first two winners of the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl - WKU in 2014 and Western Michigan in 2015 - each went on to win their respective conference titles the following season. The Hilltoppers captured Conference USA in 2015 and 2016, while the Broncos won the MAC title in 2016 after an undefeated 13-0 regular season.

The Popeyes Bahamas Bowl is one of **three** bowls who have had its' previous two champions go on to earn a conference title the next season, along with the **Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic** (2014 Michigan State/2015 Big Ten and 2015 Alabama/2016 SEC) and the **Raycom Media Camellia Bowl** (2014 Bowling Green/2015 MAC and 2015 Appalachian State/2016 co-Sun Belt).

PURE MICHIGAN

For the third consecutive season, the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl has a MAC representative from the state of Michigan as Eastern Michigan makes the trip to the Bahamas. In 2014, Central Michigan played in Nassau, while in 2015, Western Michigan represented the MAC. Schools from Michigan are 1-1 in the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl.

GRASS IS GREENER

After the first two games were played on the original grass surface of Thomas A. Robinson National Stadium, the National Sports Authority-Bahamas installed a Celebration Bermudagrass field in November 2016.

THE PRIME MINISTER'S TROPHY

The Popeyes Bahamas Bowl renamed its championship trophy to the Prime Minister's Trophy this year, in honor of the highest elected office in the Bahamas. The current Prime Minister, the Rt. Hon. **Perry Christie**, helped present the title trophy to Western Michigan after the 2015 game. The media attending the bowl select an Offensive and Defensive Player of the Game.

LOVE THAT CHICKEN

The Popeyes Bahamas Bowl is in its third year of title sponsorship with Popeyes Louisiana Kitchen. There is one Popeyes restaurant and another about to open for business on New Providence Island (Nassau) in the Bahamas.

BOWL GAMES ARE BETTER IN THE BAHAMAS

The Popeyes Bahamas Bowl is the first FBS bowl game played outside of the U.S. or Canada since the 1937 Bacardi Bowl in Havana, Cuba (Jan. 1, 1937), a 7-7 tie between Auburn and Villanova. The last international bowl game outside the U.S. before the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl was the 2010 International Bowl in Toronto, won by South Florida 27-3 over Northern Illinois.

UNI-WATCH

Old Dominion is the designated home team and will wear dark jerseys. ODU will wear white helmets with a new blue & silver lion "shield" graphic, navy blue jerseys and white pants. Eastern Michigan, as the visitor, will wear light-colored jerseys. EMU will wear green helmets with the "diamond plate" Block E logo, white jerseys and green pants.

Both teams will wear the traditional Popeyes Bahamas Bowl patch on the jerseys. A new addition for 2016 is that both teams will wear flag stickers of the United States and the Bahamas on the rear of the helmets in a nod to the host country.

FROM SATURDAYS TO SUNDAYS

Four Popeyes Bahamas Bowl alumni are playing in the NFL: S **Kevin Byard** - Tennessee Titans (Middle Tennessee), S **Kavon Frazier** - Dallas Cowboys (Central Michigan), TE **Tyler Higbee** - Los Angeles Rams (WKU) and DE **Leterius Watson** - Pittsburgh Steelers (Central Michigan). In all, seven Popeyes Bahamas Bowl alumni were chosen in the 2016 NFL Draft.

**Nassau & Paradise Island**

With the lure of a big city and the ease of a tropical utopia, Nassau & Paradise Island are considered by many as, well, paradise. Nassau, the capital of The Bahamas, is a bustling metropolitan hub full of culture and modern amenities. To the north lies Paradise Island. Its name tells you everything. Junkanoo, a Bahamian national festival, is a kaleidoscope of colors and sound. The rhythmic sounds of cowbells, goat skin drums and whistles, accompanied by an array of brass instruments, create a sweet musical beat that will move you; while brilliantly colored costumes capture your eye, and bring much visual delight. This bi-annual cultural highlight takes place on Bay Street in New Providence and other Family Islands during the early morning hours, from 1-9 am on Boxing Day (the day after Christmas) and New Year's Morning.



- **Thursday, Dec. 222:00 p.m. – 5:00 p.m. (Lite fare/snacks available 2:30-4:30 pm)**

(NOTE: Credentials will also be available for pickup at the December 22 Press Conference at Thomas A. Robinson National Stadium from 10-11 a.m. prior to the start of the press conference)

Both press and photo credentials and other information must be picked up at the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl Media Center during hours of operation.

In order to serve the media in an efficient manner, the Media Information Center is equipped with a copier and telephone. For all outgoing long-distance calls, media will be required to use their calling cards or give the operator collect billing instructions. The operator cannot charge any calls to these phones. Drinks and snacks will be available. There will be workstations available and ample electrical power for computers and other electrical equipment. Internet service will be available. **Snacks & refreshments will be available each afternoon at times listed above.**

MEDIA HOSPITALITY SUITE: Media hospitality will be located at Atlantis (Coral Towers - Reef Wing - Room 3433). Drinks & snacks will be provided for credentialed media. Hours of operation are **9 p.m.-Midnight from Dec. 19-23.**

MEDIA HOTEL/TRANSPORTATION: The Atlantis Bahamas is the official media hotel of the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl. All media must make their requests for rooms through the online media credentialing process. There are an extremely limited number of media rooms at the Atlantis, and beat writers who staff their team's games during the 2016 season will have priority in the Atlantis media block.

The Popeyes Bahamas Bowl recommends using taxis or tour companies to travel throughout Nassau. All driving in the Bahamas is done from the left-hand side of the road.

The Popeyes Bahamas Bowl will provide transportation for traveling media representatives to the **Popeyes Bahamas Bowl Press Conference** on December 22 at Thomas A. Robinson National Stadium (bus leaves for stadium at 9:45 a.m.; returns to Atlantis at 1:00 p.m.) and the **2016 Popeyes Bahamas Bowl** (bus leaves for stadium at 9:00 a.m.; bus returns to Atlantis 3 hours after the conclusion of the game - approximately 7:00 pm). Media buses will be staged at the Atlantis (Coral Towers lobby). All media members must show their credentials in order to use the transportation service.

GAMEDAY MEDIA TRIBUNE/MEDIA BOOTHS/MEDIA CENTER: Entrance into the Thomas A. Robinson National Stadium Media Tribune and Media Center is by credential only for the news media and communications staff. A limited number of telephones (restricted long distance) and email/copy service will be available to the working press.

The media tribune, press booths and media center will be open to the media at 10:00 am (approximately three hours before kickoff). Press releases, statistics, media guides and flip cards will be available. A pregame meal will be served only to accredited media approximately two hours prior to kickoff (11:00 am) in the Media Center, located in the Southwest corner of the stadium below the media tribune. Beverages and snacks will be available throughout the game.

The Media Tribune at Thomas A. Robinson National Stadium is outside and under cover (similar to auxiliary press set-ups at Super Bowls and other major sporting events). Power, wireless and wired internet will be available to each individual seated in the media tribune. Booths for coaches, ESPN, institution radio networks and instant replay are located at the top of the Western Grandstand in the Media Booths. Seat and booth assignments will be assigned by the bowl.

2016 POPEYES BAHAMAS BOWL MEDIA INFORMATION

The media workroom at Thomas A. Robinson National Stadium will remain open for **at least three hours** after the conclusion of the game.

GAMEDAY MEDIA SERVICES: Flip cards, stats and game notes will be available prior to the start of the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl in the main press areas. Complete box scores and play-by-play will be distributed to the media at the end of each quarter. Coaches and student-athlete quotes will be distributed shortly after the conclusion of the press conferences. If you need a box score emailed to your news organization, please make your request to a member of the Communications staff.

INTERNET ACCESS: Wireless and wired access will be available to the media in Thomas A. Robinson National Stadium. The wireless access network and password will be distributed to the media on gameday at the stadium.

PHONES: A limited number of toll-restricted (calling card) phones will be available in the Press Tribune and workroom at Thomas A. Robinson National Stadium. BTC calling cards (\$10 for approximately 50 minutes) can be purchased at the Atlantis.

LIVE STATISTICS: The Popeyes Bahamas Bowl has contracted with StatBroadcast to provide instant stats information during the bowl to media in attendance in Nassau and back in the United States. To access the stat feed, point your browser to **bahamas.statbroadcast.com**.

PHOTOGRAPHERS/VIDEO: Popeyes Bahamas Bowl photo credentials must be visible at all times. Bowl organizers will adhere to the NCAA's sideline control policy, which states that:

Sideline photographers are restricted outside the 25-yard lines in the areas designated and are reminded to stay behind the dotted restraining line around the field. No media personnel, including journalists, radio and television personnel or their equipment, shall be in the team area or coaching box.

POSTGAME INTERVIEW POLICY: Following a 10-minute cooling-off period, postgame interviews will take place in the Media Center in the Thomas A. Robinson National Stadium. Only individuals displaying proper credentials will be permitted in the interview area. Security will be posted in these locations and will not allow anyone to obstruct entrances. The runner-up head coach and two student-athletes will go first, followed by the winning institution's head coach and three student-athletes. The game's Offensive and Defensive Players of the Game are required to attend as part of their team's student-athlete contingent. The Prime Minister's Trophy will be presented to the championship team along with awards to the offensive and defensive players of the game on field immediately following the game.

The cooling-off period for the runner-up team begins when the head coach enters the locker room immediately after the game. The winning head coach and student-athletes must proceed directly from the field to the interview room after the postgame trophy presentation unless requested for a short interview (not to exceed four minutes) by ESPN. Both teams' locker rooms are closed to the media.

Regardless of any personal regular-season radio or television contracts, the coach is first obligated to the entire media staffing the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl and must report to the interview room immediately after the 10-minute cooling off period. The coach cannot delay a postgame interview with the covering media to conduct a program for a single radio, newspaper, or television reporter unless requested to grant a short interview (not to exceed four minutes) by ESPN. After fulfilling the commitment to the entire media covering the game, the coach and student-athletes may participate in special interviews.

HELPFUL HINTS FOR THE MEDIA

PASSPORTS: The Popeyes Bahamas Bowl reminds all media that all U.S. citizens coming to the Bowl must have a valid United States Passport for the time of travel. It is possible to secure passports on short notice, but costs will be much higher for the individuals involved and delays in receiving passports are possible during the holiday season. For information on how to obtain a U.S. Passport, visit passports.state.gov. For obtaining an expedited passport in a hurry, visit <http://travel.state.gov/content/passports/english/passports/services/expedited.html>.

UNITED STATES EMBASSY: The United States Embassy in the Bahamas is located at **42 Queen Street** in Nassau. The American Citizen Services Unit stands ready to help American citizens in The Bahamas – and their loved ones – in emergency situations. American citizens overseas, of course, remain subject to the laws of the country they are in. The American Citizens Services Unit can assist in areas, including: illness/injury, lost/stolen U.S. Passport, arrest/detention, victims of crime, etc.

In case of emergencies involving the death, injury, welfare, or arrest of an American citizen in The Bahamas, please call **242-322-1181**, ext. 4406, 4547 or 4584 during business hours, or **242-322-1181 x 9** or **242-357-7004** at all other times. (Please note that the Duty Officer who answers this number will not be able to assist with visa or routine passport matters.) The U.S. Embassy website is nassau.usembassy.gov.

CELL PHONES/INTERNET: The Popeyes Bahamas Bowl staff reminds media that cell phone roaming rates for voice and data usage in the Bahamas can be extremely high per minute. All participants should check with their cell-phone service provider for pertinent information on current roaming rates. Phones can be used in “Airplane Mode” in the Bahamas (no data usage) in order to use phone cameras, etc. Atlantis Bahamas has wireless internet capability in rooms (free)/some public areas (daily fee if not staying at Atlantis). Calling cards for public phones located in the resort can be purchased at the Atlantis.

CURRENCY: The legal tender is the Bahamian dollar, which is equivalent to the U.S. dollar. U.S. currency is accepted throughout the Bahamas, as are most major credit cards and traveler’s checks. ATMs are located at both Paradise Island and Cable Beach casinos, Rawson Square, major banks and in most hotels.

ELECTRICITY: With standard North American 120-volt/60-cycle AC electrical current, you will be able to operate American laptops, electronics, hairdryers, shavers and other small electrical appliances without adapters.

GETTING AROUND: Taxi service is available from the Atlantis to take you into Nassau to visit tourist areas, restaurants, etc. Shared van rides into Nassau from the Atlantis run \$4 per person, and you will be dropped off in downtown Nassau near the Government House. Unshared rides from downtown Nassau back to the Atlantis are \$15 per person (not including the \$3 bridge toll for taxis to get back to Paradise Island).

Ferry boats (water taxis) can take you between Nassau and Paradise Island while at the same time giving you a waterfront view of Nassau Harbour. Tickets can be purchased at the tour desk at Festival Place and at Woodes Rogers Wharf right next door. Tickets cost \$4 per person (plus a suggested \$1 tip for the storyteller who usually accompanies the ride) and the trip is approximately 10 minutes each way. Ferries leave every half hour on the hour from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

City buses, known locally as “jitneys”, run in downtown Nassau and Cable Beach several times a day. The cost for a one-way ride is \$1.25 per person, and exact change is required. Pay as you exit the bus.

TIPPING: Restaurants and hotels **automatically add 15%** to all food and beverage checks in lieu of gratuity. For exceptional service you may wish to leave something extra. Bellboys, doormen and porters usually receive \$2 per bag. Taxi drivers should be tipped about 15% of the fare.

CUSTOMS: U.S. citizens out of the country for 48 hours are allowed up to \$800 worth of duty-free merchandise. Less than 48 hours, the duty-free exemption is \$200. Limitations include 32 ounces of tobacco for those over 21 and no more than two liters of alcohol. To make traveling easier, consider packing things you’re going to declare separately and keep all your sales receipts.

MEDICAL FACILITIES: Internationally trained doctors are available at the hotels and throughout the Nassau Paradise Island. Two hospitals are fully equipped to respond to emergency medical situations. Princess Margaret Hospital and Doctor’s Hospital are both located in Nassau.

The Prime Minister's Trophy

The Prime Minister's Trophy, the symbol of the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl championship, is presented to the winning team after the game each year. It is a unique creation that represents the Commonwealth of the Bahamas in several ways.

Bahamas Prime Minister the Rt. Hon. Perry G. Christie helped present the 2015 championship trophy to Western Michigan, and to honor the country's highest-elected office, the trophy was renamed The Prime Minister's Trophy by the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl in 2016.

Designed and manufactured by Levy Marketing & Awards of Tampa, Florida in consultation with the bowl's staff, the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl championship trophy stands 30 inches tall and weighs nearly 30 pounds.

The trophy has a tan Corian base that represents the sand and a pair of turquoise portions that represent the water. The trophy is mounted on black wood with black wood pillars used to support the football at the top of the trophy.

A conch shell, one of the main symbols of the Bahamas, is in the center of the base, and acrylic laser-cut palm trees adorn both sides of the pillars.

The Popeyes Bahamas Bowl logo is rendered in acrylic and mounted halfway up the trophy's center.

The bowl also awards distinctive Offensive Player of the Game and Defensive Player of the Game trophies.



2014 POPEYES BAHAMAS BOWL: WKU 49, CENTRAL MICHIGAN 48

WKU survived a furious Central Michigan fourth-quarter comeback, which included a 75-yard last-gasp relay play for a touchdown as time expired, but a broken-up 2-point conversion attempt following the improbable TD gave the Hilltoppers a 49-48 victory and the inaugural Popeyes Bahamas Bowl title.

The four-person relay by the Chippewas was an immediate hit on ESPN and social media. The final TD was named the play of the bowl season by ESPN's SportsCenter and was a finalist for a Best Play ESPY.

WKU (8-6) finally put an end to Central Michigan's 34-point fourth quarter with a defensive stop in the back corner of the end zone.

Trailing 49-42 with one second remaining, the Central Michigan offense lined up for one final prayer from its 25 that was answered.

Quarterback **Cooper Rush** heaved one last gasp pass 47 yards down the field where it was caught by Jesse Kroll at the Hilltoppers 28. Then chaos ensued. After laterals from Kroll, **Deon Butler** and **Courtney Williams**, **Titus Davis** raced 15 yards, dove and grazed the pylon - launching the crowd into pandemonium.

With the WKU lead trimmed to an unimaginably thin 49-48, the Chippewas (7-6) threw caution to the wind and tried for a 2-point conversion in hopes of winning the game. Rush threw for Kroll, but WKU defensive back **Wonderful Terry** broke up the fade-route pass to give WKU its first FBS bowl victory in school history under first-year head coach Jeff Brohm.

CMU head coach **Dan Enos** discussed the decision to go for two and the victory. "We didn't want to go to overtime because we had had trouble stopping them all day," explained Enos. "I looked at the players and said, 'What do you got?' and they said, 'Let's do it. Let's win this game.'"

Popeyes Bahamas Bowl Player of the Game honors went to WKU's **Brandon Doughty** (offense) and WKU defensive end **Derik Overstreet** (defense). Doughty threw for 486 yards, 350 in the first half with five touchdowns, all to different receivers. Overstreet recorded five tackles and 2.5 tackles for loss that included two second-half sacks.

Before the nightmarish fourth quarter, the Hilltoppers played as crisp and dominant a game as they had all season long.

WKU scored touchdowns on each of their six first-half possessions against the MAC's top defense, including twice in the final two minutes, as the Hilltoppers built a 42-14 halftime lead, an advantage that was extended to 49-14 after three quarters.

The fourth quarter was a different story, as Rush connected with Davis for touchdowns twice to cut WKU's lead to 49-28. Then defensive end **Joe Ostman** flipped a 52-yard completion to WKU's **Willie McNeil** inside out by forcing a fumble at the Central Michigan 13, which was recovered by Chippe was corner **Tony Annese**. Annese returned the fumble back to the CMU 36, and from there, Central Michigan marched down the field to score on a Rush TD pass to trail by 14.

WKU was forced to punt on their ensuing possession, and a four-play, 55-second drive capped by a 7-yard TD strike from Rush to **Anthony Garland** with 1:09 left gave Central Michigan hope.

WKU successfully recovered the CMU onside kick after the score and milked the clock before being forced to punt, which set up the final frenzied play for the Chippewas that left the stadium breathless and WKU in possession of the inaugural Popeyes Bahamas Bowl trophy.

Rush set FBS bowl records for touchdown passes with seven and most net passing yards with 255 in the fourth quarter alone. The combined 971 passing yards and 12 TD passes for Doughty and Rush also broke FBS two-team bowl records.

2015 POPEYES BAHAMAS BOWL: WESTERN MICHIGAN 45, MIDDLE TENNESSEE 31

Jamauri Bogan rushed 19 times for a career-high 215 yards and four touchdowns to power Western Michigan to a 45-31 victory over Middle Tennessee in the 2015 Popeyes Bahamas Bowl.

It was one big play after another in the contest, as the two teams combined for 1,055 yards of total offense and seven scoring plays of 29 or more yards.

But it was a pair of 1-yard plunges just 1:12 apart in the fourth quarter by the redshirt freshman Bogan that made the difference.

After his 61-yard run set Western Michigan (8-5) up in the red zone, Bogan banged in from a yard out with 6:12 left in the game to give the Broncos a 38-31 advantage.

Three plays later, safety **Rontavious Atkins** intercepted MTSU quarterback **Brent Stockstill** and returned the ball 29 yards to the 4-yard line. It took two runs for Bogan to find the end zone, gaining three yards on first down before finding paydirt on second down with 5:00 left to play.

The Bronco defense held on downs on Middle Tennessee's ensuing possession and the WMU offense ran out the clock to seal the victory.

"This is what 'Row the Boat' is all about," WMU head coach **P.J. Fleck** said. "This is why it was invented. This is what it's for. There was all types of adversity in that football game that our kids could have given up, could have folded. Two years ago, we probably would have. Last year, we would have done it some of the time. This year, no way."

Bogan was named the Offensive Player of the Game of the game for his efforts, while WMU linebacker **Grant DePalma** was named the game's Defensive Player of the Game. DePalma led all tacklers with 12 stops (five solo) and a tackle for loss.

WMU quarterback **Zach Terrell** was 18-of-26 passing for 297 yards and a pair of touchdowns. **Corey Davis** caught eight balls for 183 yards and a TD.

Stockstill had a solid day for Middle Tennessee (7-6), completing 26-of-39 passes for 327 yards and three scores to lead the Blue Raider offense. His top target was **James Richie**, who caught eight passes for 126 yards and two scores and ran twice for 61 yards and a third touchdown.

The two teams combined for 475 yards of total offense and 34 points in the first quarter.

It took MTSU only 1:17 to get on the board when James scored the first of his three touchdowns on a 46-yard run to quickly make it 7-0.

Bogan answered just three plays later, running up the middle for 62 yards and a TD, and it was 7-7 with only 2:17 gone in the contest.

Stockstill hit James on a 44-yard scoring pass just 1:39 later to put Middle Tennessee back on top 14-7.

Andrew Haldeman drilled a 47-yard field goal with 3:23 left in the first quarter to pull Western Michigan within 14-10.

Cody Clark kicked a 23-yard field goal on the Blue Raiders' next possession to extend the lead to 17-10 with 1:04 left in the quarter.

The Broncos quickly tied the game at 17-all when Terrell hit Davis on an 80-yard pass and run with three seconds left in the opening quarter. Davis caught the ball on a 5-yard hitch pattern, broke a tackle and raced the remaining 75 yards down the sideline for the score.

WMU struck quickly in the second half on another 46-yard run by Bogan to go up 24-17 with 2:57 gone.

After a short punt set MTSU up at the Western Michigan 32-yard line, it took just two plays for the Blue Raiders to tie the game. Stockstill hit **Christian Collis** on a 17-yard pass with 28 seconds left in the third quarter to tie the game at 24-24.

Terrell hit Braverman on a 68-yard scoring pass to put WMU back on top 31-24 with 12:47 to play in the game.

Again, MTSU answered when Stockstill hit James on a 29-yard pass with 9:41 left in the game to tie it at 31-31.

Western Michigan finished the day with an impressive 613 yards of total offense, and the Broncos, second in FBS in time of possession, held the ball for nearly 35 minutes.

Thomas A. Robinson National Stadium

The Popeyes Bahamas Bowl is played in Nassau's state-of-the-art Thomas A. Robinson National Stadium, located in the Queen Elizabeth Sports Centre.

The 15,000-seat stadium, a gift to The Bahamas from the People's Republic of China, was dedicated February 25, 2012 by former Prime Minister Hubert Ingraham in ceremonies witnessed by thousands of Bahamians. The original Thomas Robinson Stadium was built in 1981, and work on the new National Stadium at an adjacent site began in July 2009 at a cost of \$30 million.

The 190,452-square-foot facility features covered chairback seating on two sides, seating for disabled spectators, broadcast/coaches/game operations booths, a natural grass field for American football and soccer and an IAAF-certified track surface. Renovations to the stadium, including a new track and media tribune, were completed in May 2014. A brand-new Celebration Bermudagrass field

was installed in November 2016.

Robinson National Stadium is named after Thomas Augustus Robinson, MBE. Robinson was the sole competitor for The Bahamas on the world stage for many years. He competed in four Olympic Games, starting in 1956 in Melbourne, followed by Rome in 1960, Tokyo in 1964 and Mexico City in 1968. He became the first Bahamian to win a medal in international competition, a Bronze Medal in the 100-meter dash in the 1957 West Indian Federation Games in Kingston, Jamaica. He was also a part of the 400-meter relay team which also won a bronze medal.

At the 1958 British Empire Games in Cardiff, Wales, Robinson won a gold medal in the 220-yard dash and a silver in the 100-yard dash. He came back in the 1962 British Empire and Commonwealth Games to win a silver medal in the 100, a feat he repeated in the 1966 British Empire and Commonwealth Games. He also won a gold



medal at the 1962 Central American and Caribbean Games.

Robinson won nine Big Ten Conference titles as a sprinter at the University of Michigan from 1959-61. He was inducted into Michigan's Hall of Honor in 1985 and the inaugural class of Michigan's Men's Track and Field Hall of Fame in 2006.

Discussions on the new stadium had begun some nine years before, with Robinson himself chairing the initial and final committee on the stadium. Robinson died November 25, 2012, just two days after the celebration of his partici-



pation in the Melbourne Olympics and before he could see the facility that bears his name in use.

The facility has been the site for track (2013 Carifta Games and the 2014 and 2015 IAAF World Relays) and soccer (2018 FIFA World Cup qualifier - Bahamas vs. Bermuda, March 25, 2015).


The National Sports Authority, under chairman Lynden Maycock, manages the 450-acre Queen Elizabeth Sports Centre,

ESPN'S STEVE LEVY, MACK BROWN & KAYLEE HARTUNG RETURN TO CALL 2016 POPEYES BAHAMAS BOWL

NASSAU, Bahamas – Veteran ESPN *SportsCenter* anchor **Steve Levy**, former Texas head coach **Mack Brown** and sideline reporter **Kaylee Hartung** will return to call the 2016 Popeyes Bahamas Bowl between Eastern Michigan (7-5) and Old Dominion (9-3) for ESPN on Friday, Dec. 23 in Thomas A. Robinson National Stadium at 1 p.m. ET.

Levy will call the play-by-play for his third Popeyes Bahamas Bowl, while Brown (analyst) and Hartung (sideline) both called the 2015 game.

Steve Levy has been an anchor on *SportsCenter* since joining ESPN in August 1993. In addition to his *SportsCenter* duties, in 2016, Levy returned to the college football play-by-play booth to work an afternoon window on ABC or ESPN with Brian Griese and field analyst Todd McShay. He was also the lead play-by-play announcer for ESPN's telecasts of the World Cup of Hockey 2016.

Along the way, he has also handled play-by-play on the NHL (1995-2005) on ESPN, ESPN2 and ABC Sports, college football on ESPN2 (1999-2002) and the NCAA Division I men's hockey semifinals and finals – "The Frozen Four" – in 1998 and '99. The versatile Levy has also served as the studio host for ESPN's NHL telecasts and co-hosted The NFL on ESPN Radio – previewing, reviewing and updating National Football League games all day on Sundays throughout the season.

Mack Brown, former National Championship winning coach at Texas, joined ESPN in 2014. He works as a game analyst on ESPN Friday night college football and a studio analyst on college football Saturdays on ABC.

Brown was the head coach of the University of Texas Longhorns from 1998-2013, where he won the National Championship in 2005, played for the National Championship against Alabama in 2009, plus won two Big 12 Championships. Prior to that, Brown was the head coach at the University of North Carolina (1988-97), Tulane University (1985-87) and Appalachian State University (1983). He was named ACC Coach of the Year in 1996. He previously held assistant coaching positions at Oklahoma, LSU, Iowa State and Memphis State.

Brown compiled a 244-122 overall record as a collegiate head coach, and also won the Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year Award (2005), Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Award (2008) and was a two-time Big 12 Coach of the Year (2005, '09) while coaching the Longhorns.

Kaylee Hartung is an award-winning college sports reporter for ESPN. Hartung regularly appears on *SportsCenter* and contributes to ESPN's coverage of college football, basketball and baseball as an in-game reporter. She is currently the sideline reporter for SEC Network's Primetime Football Game with legendary broadcaster **Brent Musburger** and analyst **Jesse Palmer**.

Hartung joined ESPN in the fall of 2012 as an anchor and reporter for Longhorn Network. She hosted Longhorn Network's flagship program *Longhorn Extra*, reported for *Texas GameDay* and crafted feature stories – two of which garnered LoneStar Emmys. When SEC Network launched in the fall of 2014, Hartung was tabbed as a reporter for the channel's flagship college football program, *SEC Nation*.

2016 Popeyes Bahamas Bowl Preview: Eastern Michigan vs. Old Dominion

After a pair of exciting high-scoring games in Nassau, today's third edition of the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl will be contested between two schools that are familiar with each other, and whose styles promise another entertaining game in Thomas A. Robinson National Stadium.

Eastern Michigan won one game last season. But, behind a strong offensive effort, the Eagles tied the best turnaround in FBS in 2016, notching seven wins behind a prolific offense and they make their first bowl appearance since the 1987 California Bowl. This is the eighth season of collegiate play for Old Dominion, and the Monarchs will play in their first bowl game in the school's second full season of eligibility, thanks in large part to a high-scoring offense and an opportunistic defense.

Both teams are anxious to prove themselves on the bowl stage, after enjoying the sun, warm weather and hospitality that the Bahamas and the Atlantis resort is known for during bowl week. The schools are familiar with each other as they played a two-game series in 2014 and 2015. ODU won both games, each one a close affair.

Eastern Michigan and Old Dominion enter the bowl with a combined 16 victories, the most in the three years of the bowl. EMU went 7-5, 4-4 in the Mid-American Conference. Two of the Eagles' victories came against teams that played in conference championship games: Ohio (MAC) and Wyoming (Mountain West). ODU is the bowl's first nine-win team at 9-3, and the Monarchs' 7-1 league record was the same as East Division champ WKU, which took the division title based on a head-to-head victory. ODU has won five straight and eight of the last nine games.


For Eastern Michigan, the Eagles offense under head coach Chris Creighton (10-26 in three years at EMU; 149-72 in 20 seasons overall) set a school record for total offense yards (5,447), passing yards (3,549), total points (365) and touchdown passes (23). The Eagles are 36th in FBS total offense at 453.9 yards per game. Redshirt junior quarterback Brogan Roback has been chiefly responsible for the Eagles' success through the air as he has found a trio of junior receivers – Sergio Bailey II, Antoine Porter and Johnnie Niupalau – and a pair of redshirt freshmen: Nigel Kilby and Dieuly Aristilde. The five have caught 19 of the 23 Eagles passing TDs in 2016.

Roback, in just nine games and six starts, completed 193 passes for 2,394 yards and 16 touchdowns as the Eagles are 17th in FBS passing offense at 295.8 yards per game. Bailey caught 55 passes for 799 yards and six touchdowns, while Porter had 44 receptions for 491 yards and four TDs. Kilby added 437 reception yards and four TDs.

The Eagles also get it done on the ground, averaging 158.2 yards per game behind redshirt sophomore Ian Eriksen, who rushed for 741 yards and nine touchdowns and redshirt freshman Breck Turner, who added four rushing TDs. Five players have 40 or more carries this season.

EMU's very experienced offensive line has combined to allow the 12th-fewest sacks and second-fewest tackles for loss in FBS.

Eastern Michigan has been very successful in the red zone, scoring on 47 (34 touchdowns/13 field goals) of 52 trips inside the opponents' 20-yard line, good for 19th in FBS.

The Eagles defense have forced 23 turnovers, which is 20th in FBS and second in the MAC. Redshirt sophomore linebacker Kyle Rachwal led EMU with 101 tackles, while redshirt senior defensive lineman Pat O'Connor posted eight sacks on the way to first-team All-MAC honors. Senior defensive back DaQuan Pace led the Eagles with three interceptions.

Old Dominion is led by head coach Bobby Wilder (66-30 in eight seasons overall and at Old Dominion), the only coach the school has had since re-starting the football program in 2009. The Monarchs offense has nine games of 30 or more points, including each game of the current five-game win streak as ODU averages 36 points per game overall.

The Monarchs average 433.9 yards per game on offense with a balanced attack. Redshirt senior quarterback David Washington has completed 191 passes for 2,648 yards, 28 touchdowns and only four

interceptions. He is one of four quarterbacks in FBS to have more than 25 TDs and four or less interceptions.

Washington's top three receivers have accounted for 23 of his 28 TD passes in 2016. Redshirt senior Zach Pascal caught 63 passes for 893 yards (14.2 yards per catch average) and eight touchdowns while extending his streak of consecutive games with a catch to 48, tied for the second-longest streak in FBS. Junior Jonathan Duhart had 45 receptions for 690 yards (15.3 yards per reception) and eight TDs, while seven of redshirt sophomore Travis Fulgham's 28 catches have been for touchdowns.

Old Dominion's rushing attack averages 196.1 yards per game, paced by junior Ray Lawry. Lawry rushed for 1,122 yards (102 yards per game) and 11 touchdowns. He rushed for over 100 yards in six games in 2016, including a 27-carry, 209-yard effort against Marshall. Sophomore Jeremy Cox ran for 685 yards and led the Monarchs with 13 rushing TDs.

Defensively, the Monarchs are led by senior linebackers TJ Ricks and Anthony Wilson. Ricks paced ODU with 93 total tackles (44 solo) on the way to first-team All-Conference USA honors. Wilson added 90 total tackles (49 solo), including five sacks. Redshirt sophomore defensive end Oshane Ximines set a school season record with 7.5 sacks and redshirt junior defensive end Bunmi Rotimi added seven sacks. ODU is fourth in FBS in turnover margin at +13 (22 takeaways/9 giveaways). Six players have recorded an interception, led by senior cornerback Aaron Young with three picks.

There will be plenty of talented players to watch when Eastern Michigan and Old Dominion take the field, and if history holds, the team holding The Prime Minister's Trophy at the end of the game will have earned the title in a hard-fought game that will add to the lore of the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl.

THE SERIES

» The 2016 Popeyes Bahamas Bowl will be the third meeting between Eastern Michigan and Old Dominion. In the 2015 season opener (Sept. 5), ODU won on the road 38-34 as Monarchs RB **Ray Lawry** had 28 carries for 223 yards and four TDs. The other meeting was in 2014 (Sept. 13) as ODU came away with a 17-3 home victory.

THE COACHES

» **CHRIS CREIGHTON** is in his third season as Eastern Michigan head coach and his 20th as a collegiate head coach and has a 149-72 career record, 10-26 with the Eagles. The 2016 Popeyes Bahamas Bowl is the first bowl appearance for EMU since the 1987 California Bowl and the third in school history. Creighton previously was a head coach at Drake, Wabash College and Ottawa (Kan.). He was a college assistant for six seasons at Manchester (Ind.) and Concordia (Ill.). Creighton was a four-year letterman (1987-90) at quarterback at Kenyon, where he earned All-America honors in 1989.

» **BOBBY WILDER** is in his eighth season as Old Dominion head coach and has a 66-30 record, all with the Monarchs, and is the school's only head coach since restarting the program in 2009. The 2016 Popeyes Bahamas Bowl is the school's first bowl appearance since moving to the FBS level. Wilder spent 17 seasons as a college assistant at Maine after two years as a graduate assistant at Boston College. He was a four-year letterman as a quarterback at Maine (1984-87).

Eastern Michigan University

Eastern Michigan University is located in historic Ypsilanti, about 10 miles east of Ann Arbor, 40 miles west of Detroit and just 20 minutes from Detroit Metropolitan Airport. It is an area rich in academic, research, technological and recreational resources. The University also has sites in Livonia, Jackson, Traverse City, Flint, Detroit and Monroe.

EMU's 800 plus-acre campus of scenic flora and wooded areas includes 18 miles of walkways and jogging trails and has 122 buildings throughout the academic and athletic campuses. Eagle Crest – Eastern Michigan's conference center, golf course, and resort – is located on the banks of nearby Ford Lake.

Ypsilanti plays a leading role in industry and education. The city and the University have forged close ties that have lasted more than 160 years.

Since its inception, Eastern Michigan, first as a Normal School, then as a College and finally as a University, has grown and developed to respond to the ever-changing needs of society. Over the years, EMU has educated thousands of sons and daughters of Michigan, the nation, and the world.

The university currently serves 22,000 students who are pursuing undergraduate, graduate, specialist, doctoral and certificate degrees in the arts, sciences and professions. In all, more than 200 majors, minors and concentrations are delivered through the University's Colleges of Arts and Sciences; Business; Education; Health and Human Services; Technology, and its graduate school.

Eastern Michigan's exceptional faculty, students and alumni include CEOs from major businesses, a National Student Teacher of the Year, National Teacher of the Year, numerous Fulbright Scholars and Milken Family Foundation National Educators award winners, and several Michigan Teachers of the Year.

EMU is regularly recognized by national publications for its excellence, diversity, and commitment to applied education.



TOUGH

Toughness. Pride. Resilience. Those key words describe the EMU football program under Head Coach Chris Creighton. They are also terms befitting the proud residents of southeastern Michigan and their hard-working demeanor.

Inspired by this region of the state and the student-athletes' own backgrounds, the team challenged itself to be "E Tough," committed to great effort, sacrifice and triumphing in the face of adversity. In this spirit, the team nicknamed Rynearson Stadium "The Factory," a place where coaches and staff go to work each day to help "E Tough" student-athletes become scholars, leaders, champions and impact men. "The Factory" is highlighted by Division I Football's first gray FieldTurf playing surface.

Since taking over reigns of EMU Football in December 2013, Creighton has rallied the program to "close the gap" between its current status and the pursuit of its true potential. He studied the school, its surroundings, recruiting base and the current student-athletes. The one common thread throughout has been an uncommon 'toughness' that permeates the program.

In this spirit, the program's E Tough mentality represents:

- Team first
- Obsessed with getting better
- Unwavering in adversity
- Great effort
- Hearth

The new look within Rynearson Stadium, and moniker, "The Factory" serves as visual and name recognition for the program's ideals. They are a constant reminder to the student-athletes that being E Tough means coming ready to roll up their sleeves and to never give in or let up.

James Smith

President

Dr. James M. Smith is the 23rd president of Eastern Michigan University. He began his duties July 1, 2016.

Before coming to EMU, Smith served as president of Northern State University (NSU) in Aberdeen, South Dakota since June 2009. For the past seven years (2008-2015), NSU has been named by US News and World Report as one of the best undergraduate public institutions in the Midwest.

He has been an active fundraiser and was instrumental in helping NSU obtain the largest donation in its history, a \$15 million gift.

Another NSU success was collaborating with the University of Jinan, in Jinan, China, to develop the first and only Confucius Institute in the Dakotas. The Confucius Institute has a specific three-part focus dedicated to the teaching of Chinese language, culture, and business practices. In addition to the traditional start-up funding provided, he was able to gain local and regional support of nearly \$500,000 to launch the initiative.

Smith, 60, who grew up near Columbus, Ohio, in Washington Court House, knew early on he wanted to be a teacher. He always had admired teachers and enjoyed school. He became an elementary and middle school teacher after earning his Bachelor of Science degree in Elementary Education, from Miami University in Oxford, Ohio, in 1979. He would go on to earn a Master of Education, Educational Administration, from Xavier University in Cincinnati and a Doctor of Philosophy, Educational Leadership, from Miami University.

Over the next 28 years, he served as an elementary school principal, a teaching fellow and assistant professor at Miami, director of the Experiential Program for Preparing School Principals at Butler University in Indianapolis, and director of the Educational Leadership Program and coordinator of doctoral studies at West Texas A&M University. Smith was also vice president for Economic Development at Bowling Green State University in Bowling Green, Ohio, before heading to NSU.

Smith's wife, Dr. Connie Ruhl-Smith, has an impressive resume of her own. She has been a teacher, author and administrator, and has done extensive work in student retention and student academic support, introduction of international partnerships, and much more.



Heather Lyke

Vice President / Athletic Director

Heather Lyke is in her fourth year at Eastern Michigan University having been named EMU's Vice President/Director of Athletics on July 1, 2013. Lyke has more than 20 years of experience in intercollegiate athletics administration - 15 of which were at The Ohio State University.

The 13th athletic director in Eastern Michigan history, Lyke is the first woman to hold the full-time AD position at EMU.

Under Lyke's leadership, the EMU athletics department has thrived, compiling a total of 13 MAC Team Championships and 70 individual MAC titles. Concurrent to athletic excellence, the Green and White have seen remarkable academic achievement by its student-athletes during Lyke's tenure. The overall student-athlete graduation success rate (GSR) has climbed to 81 percent, the highest all-time in department history. Additionally, the average cumulative grade point average (GPA) is 3.252, while 69 percent of student-athletes maintain a 3.0 GPA or better.

In terms of department culture, Lyke and her staff developed a "blue print" which illustrates who the department is and the six core values that guide daily decisions. Those six pillars are: integrity always, powered by passion, student-athlete 365, impact people, inspired to innovate, and expect to win.

In regards to revenue generation and fundraising, the department has posted a 42 percent increase in revenue in terms of multi-media rights, licensing, Adidas, Pepsi, and game day revenues. Furthermore, over the past three years fundraising has grown 51 percent which represents the Eagles Pride annual fund, major gifts, and football and men's basketball premium seating.

She has overseen three key facility improvement projects at EMU during her tenure including: the installation of a new gray football field in 2014 that was recognized as the second-best field in the country by an online fan vote by USA Today; the addition of soccer bleachers in the fall of 2014; and the opening a new boat-house on Ford Lake for the rowing team in the spring of 2015. She has also renegotiated a seven-year apparel contract with adidas, while coming to terms with IMG to manage EMU's multimedia and corporate sponsorships.

Lyke and her husband, David Catalano, have three children, Elle, Sophie and Eli.



Chris Creighton

Head Coach

Chris Creighton was named the 37th Head Football Coach at Eastern Michigan University, Dec. 11, 2013, by Vice President/Director of Intercollegiate Athletics Heather Lyke. Creighton is in his third season as the head man at EMU in the 2016 season.

During his 20-year head coaching career, the 46-year-old Creighton has accumulated eight conference titles and an all-time record of 149-72 (.674 winning percentage). He departed Drake with the highest winning percentage in school history (.667) after also posting 63 wins as the head coach at Wabash College and 32 at Ottawa University.

Creighton has guided the Eagles to one of its most successful seasons in its 125-year history in 2016. EMU finished with a winning record for the first time since 1995, most wins (seven) since 1989, and its first bowl appearance since 1987 when EMU won the California Bowl. The Eagles tied the FBS mark for biggest turnarounds in 2016, improving on its win total from one win

in 2015, to its seven this season.

As an All-America quarterback, Creighton led Kenyon (Ohio) College to its only North Coast Athletic Conference title in 1989 and was named conference player of the year after setting single-season conference records for passing yardage (2,843) and touchdowns (29). He was inducted into the Kenyon College Athletic Hall of Fame in 2008.

Creighton earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from Kenyon College in 1991 and a master's degree from Concordia (Ill.) University in 1993.

Creighton is the first active head coach to be hired at Eastern Michigan since Jim Harkema in 1983. Harkema was the head coach at Grand Valley State University (1973-82) before taking over the EMU program and leading it to its only Mid-American Conference Championship in 1987 and last bowl appearance.

Chris and his wife, Heather, have two daughters, Hallie and Kate, and a son, Luke.



Old Dominion University

Old Dominion University is Virginia's forward-focused doctoral research university, emphasizing rigorous academic programs, strategic partnerships and active civic engagement. ODU contributes \$2.1 billion in GDP annually to Virginia's economy.


ODU was founded in 1930 as a two-year extension of the College of William and Mary and Virginia Tech. Its mission initially was to train teachers and engineers. It evolved into a four-year institution and won independence in 1962 as Old Dominion College. It attained university status in 1969.

Today, Old Dominion enrolls about 25,000 students, including nearly 5,000 graduate students, who are enrolled in about 140 academic programs. Twenty-nine faculty members have won the Outstanding Faculty Award given by the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia, including three in the past three years.

The university's entrepreneurial approach to problem solving drives cutting-edge research and fuels partnerships with government, business, industry and the community. Old Dominion has won worldwide recognition for its work in such fields as sea level rise and bioelectrics, where researchers are succeeding in killing cancer cells with lightning-fast electrical pulses.

The campus represents a rich tapestry of backgrounds, cultures and ages. Old Dominion boasts one of the most diverse student bodies in Virginia, with students from all 50 states and more than 100 countries. ODU's graduates include a Rhodes Scholar and the first undergraduate in Virginia to earn a patent. This year, four students won the State Department's prestigious Gilman Scholarships to study abroad.

Situated on 251 acres on the waterfront near downtown Norfolk and featuring garden



areas, reflecting pools and spacious green lawns, the campus offers the best of both worlds – a beautiful, serene setting within the bustling Hampton Roads metro area. Prospective students and families are welcome to visit the campus Monday through Saturday throughout the year.

John R. Broderick

President

John R. Broderick has served as Old Dominion University's eighth president since 2008. Under his leadership, Old Dominion has forged progress in areas from research to diversity, with an emphasis on solving real-world problems and building on the region's strengths.

During his tenure, the university established the Center for the Study of Sea Level Rise, the Strome Entrepreneurial Center and a comprehensive student success model, which has led to historic highs in retention and graduation rates.

President Broderick has presided over an increase in public and private funding to the university. Under his leadership, Old Dominion has received more than \$660 million in new resources.

This year, the university announced the largest gift in its history, a \$35 million donation from Richard and Carolyn Barry, to create the Barry Art Museum in 2018. In October, the university opened the Kate and John R. Broderick Dining Commons. Student leaders requested that the state-of-the-art dining hall be named after the President and First Lady to recognize their commitment to inclusion and student success.

President Broderick has emphasized diversity and community service during his tenure. In athletics, he oversaw the return of football to Old Dominion in 2009 after a 69-year absence, adding a rush of excitement and a burst of spirit to campus.

President Broderick is chairman of Conference USA's Board of Directors and past chairman of the Virginia Council of Presidents of colleges and universities and the Virginia Space Grant Consortium.

The Brodericks are proud Monarch parents. They have three sons. Two are graduates. The other is a student at Old Dominion.



Dr. Camden Wood Selig

Athletic Director

Dr. Camden Wood Selig begins his seventh year as Director of Athletics at Old Dominion University, where his "Championship Effort" philosophy has helped to guide the department as one of the most respected and successful intercollegiate programs in the nation.

During his tenure, Selig has directed the University's move to Conference USA, overseen the transition of the football program to the FBS level, and led major athletic facility expansion and enhancement for virtually all 18 programs.

One of the most dramatic and gratifying accomplishments for Selig has been the academic success of the 18 intercollegiate teams. In 2015-16, 140 student athletes (31%) earned Dean's List honors with a 3.4 or higher GPA. ODU led all C-USA schools, for the third straight year, with 261 student athletes on the league's honor roll with a 3.0 or higher. Women's lacrosse and women's soccer were recognized by the NCAA for perfect four-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) scores, while six teams earned one-year scores of 1000, and all teams scored above 950.

One needs only to visit the ODU campus to see Selig's contributions to the growth and improvement of athletic venues including The Bernett & Blanche Mitchum Basketball Performance Center, a privately funded \$8.5 million state-of-the-art facility.

Selig has placed a high priority on increasing revenue, with a goal of 10 percent annual growth. Since his arrival in 2010, athletics has exceeded those goals every year. Donations to support the Old Dominion Athletic Foundation annual fund have jumped from \$2.73 million in 2010 to \$4.72 million in 2015-16.

Selig and his wife Ellen of Annapolis, MD, have three children, Lex, 19, a sophomore at Western Kentucky University, Nick, 17, and Julianna, 12, who both attend Norfolk Collegiate School.



Bobby Wilder

Head Coach

Bobby Wilder was hired 10 years ago as Old Dominion's first football coach and restarted the program after a 69-year hiatus in 2009. Wilder has led the Monarchs to a 17-5 record in its first two years, the best record by an FCS start-up program, led ODU to a Colonial Athletic Association Championship in 2012 and a final ranking of No. 6 in the FCS polls, and following the Monarchs' transition to FBS, the first bowl game in school history in just the second year of bowl eligibility.

Wilder and the Monarchs enter the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl with a 9-3 record and 7-1 mark in Conference USA. The Monarchs lead Conference USA in rushing offense, turnover margin and have the fewest penalties in the league. Wilder has tutored quarterback David Washington, a quarterback turned wide receiver and now quarterback again, to be protective of the football. Washington is one of four quarterbacks to have thrown 25

or more touchdown passes and four or less interceptions this season. Ray Lawry rushed for a second-straight 1,000-yard season, while TJ Ricks and Anthony Wilson have combined for 183 tackles on defense.

ODU has a 66-30 record in eight seasons of play under Wilder and is an impressive 21-16 in three years playing an FBS schedule.

Prior to his arrival at ODU, Wilder served on the Maine staff for 17 years and was promoted to assistant head coach and offensive coordinator in 2000, before moving to associate head coach in 2001.

A 1987 graduate of Maine with a degree in physical education, Wilder captained the Black Bears to the Yankee Conference Championship his senior year. An All-New England quarterback in 1985, he left Maine as the school's all-time leading passer with 4,493 yards, and is currently sixth on the career passing list.





MID-AMERICAN CONFERENCE 2016 BOWL SCHEDULE

Dec. 17: Raycom Media Camellia Bowl -- Montgomery, Ala.; 5:30 pm ET (ESPN); Toledo (9-3, 6-2 MAC) vs. Appalachian State (9-3, 7-1, Sun Belt)
Toledo finished second in the MAC West Division. First-year head coach Jason Candle will be leading the Rockets to his second-bowl game, as last year Candle replaced Matt Campbell as Toledo defeated Temple, 32-17, in the 2015 Marmot Boca Raton Bowl. Toledo will be making its third consecutive bowl appearance and its Conference leading 16th bowl appearance in program history (11-4 record).

Dec. 19: Miami Beach Bowl -- Miami, Fla.; 2:30 pm ET (ESPN) Central Michigan (6-6, 3-5 MAC) vs. Tulsa (9-3, 6-2, American Athletic)
Second-year head coach John Bonamego led Central Michigan to non-conference wins over Oklahoma State and UNLV. The program will be making its third consecutive bowl appearance and its fourth in the last five years. Quarterback Cooper Rush ranks second in MAC history in career passing yards (12,390), third in total offense (12,291) and tied for fifth in career passing touchdowns (90).

Dec. 23: Popeyes Bahamas Bowl -- Nassau, Bahamas, 1:00 pm ET (ESPN) Eastern Michigan (7-5, 4-4 MAC) vs. Old Dominion (9-3, 7-1, C-USA)
Eastern Michigan is making its first bowl appearance since 1987 and had the program's first winning season since 1995. Head coach Chris Creighton led the Eagles and were tied for the biggest turnaround in FBS by improving its win total from one win in 2015 to seven this season. This is Eastern Michigan's second bowl appearance (30-27 win vs. San Jose State in 1987 California Raisin Bowl).

Dec. 23: Dollar General Bowl -- Mobile, Ala. 8:00 pm ET (ESPN) Ohio (8-5, 6-2 MAC) vs. Troy (9-3, 6-2, Sun Belt)
Ohio are the MAC East Division Champions and suffered a 29-23 loss to Western Michigan in the Marathon MAC Football Championship Game. Head coach Frank Solich is the third-winningest head coach in MAC history with an 88-66 record. The Bobcats have been bowl eligible in 10 of the 12 years under Solich and will be making their eighth bowl appearance during his coaching tenure.

Dec. 26: St. Petersburg Bowl -- St. Petersburg, Fla., 11:00 am ET (ESPN) Miami (6-6, 6-2 MAC) vs. Mississippi State (5-7, 3-5, SEC)
Miami set an FBS record as the first program to win six consecutive games after starting the season with an 0-6 record. Third-year head coach Chuck Martin and the RedHawks will be making the program's first bowl game since 2010. This will be Miami's 11th overall bowl appearance (7-3 bowl record).

Jan. 2: Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic -- Arlington, Texas, 1:00 pm ET (ESPN) #15 Western Michigan (13-0, 8-0 MAC) vs. #8 Wisconsin (10-3, 7-2, Big Ten)
Western Michigan is one of two programs undefeated in FBS this season and has the second-longest current winning streak in the nation (15 games). Western Michigan won the 2016 Marathon MAC Football Championship Game with a 29-23 win over Ohio, the program's first MAC Championship since 1988. Broncos' 13-0 record set a school mark and making its first ever New Year's Six Bowl appearance.

MAC Storylines

• Western Michigan won the 2016 Marathon MAC Football Championship Game with a 29-23 win over Ohio on Dec. 2. The win was Western Michigan's first championship since 1988 and the second football title in program history.

• **Western Michigan is ranked No. 12 in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll and No. 14 in the Amway/USA Today Coaches Poll.** The No. 12 AP ranking is the highest in the MAC since Ball State was ranked No. 12 on Nov. 30, 2008 after a 12-0 start.

• **The Broncos were also ranked No. 15 in the sixth and final College Football Playoff ranking on Dec. 4.** Western Michigan is one of only two teams (Alabama 13-0) that remain undefeated. Western Michigan is bowl eligible for the third straight year.

• Western Michigan's 13-0 mark is the first for the MAC since former member Marshall finished the 1999 season with a 13-0 record and a No. 10 ranking in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll.

• Six MAC programs received bowl invitations this 2016 bowl season -- Western Michigan (13-0), Toledo (9-3), Ohio (8-5), Eastern Michigan (7-5), Central Michigan (6-6) and Miami (6-6). The MAC record for bowl invitations in a single-season is seven in both the 2012 and 2015 bowl seasons.

• Western Michigan (Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic), Ohio (Dollar General Bowl), Toledo (Raycom Media Camellia Bowl), Eastern Michigan (Popeyes Bahamas Bowl), Central Michigan (Miami Beach Bowl) and Miami (St. Petersburg Bowl) will represent the MAC this 2016 bowl season.

• This marks the ninth time in MAC history to have five or more programs receive a bowl invitation (2004, 2008, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016) in a single-season.

• In the previous five bowl seasons, the MAC has a record of 11-18 in 29 bowl games -- 2015 (3-4); 2014 (2-3); 2013 (0-5); 2012 (2-5); 2011 (4-1) as ten different MAC programs have appeared in a bowl game during this span (2011-15).

• Ohio (8-5, 6-2 MAC) won the MAC East Division for the fourth time in the last 11 seasons under head coach Frank Solich. The Marathon MAC Football Championship Game with Western Michigan and Ohio ended a streak of the previous three games (2013-2015) featuring Northern Illinois vs. Bowling Green.

MAC BOWL HISTORY

Since the conference inception in 1946, the MAC has played in 100 bowl games with a 42-58 (.420) overall bowl record. In the early years, bowl games were few and far between before the consistency of a single-bowl game became into existence in 1981. However, over the last decade the MAC has witnessed a significant increase in the number of bowl invitations both from primary and secondary bowl partnerships, but also several at-large bowl selections as well.

From 1946 to 1980, the MAC appeared in a total of 17 bowl games in the first 35 years of the Conference in operation. Then from 1981 to 2000, the MAC witnessed twenty consecutive years of receiving only one bowl invitation each football season.

The MAC forged a bowl partnership with Detroit from 1997-2013 (Motor City Bowl and Little Caesars Pizza Bowl). The MAC added Mobile in 2001 (GMAC Bowl, GoDaddy Bowl and now Dollar General Bowl) and Boise in 2010 (Humanitarian, now named Famous Idaho Potato Bowl) as primary bowl partners.

Beginning in 2004, the Conference witnessed increased bowl participation in at-large selections as the 2004 bowl season witnessed five MAC programs receive a bowl invitation and that number was matched during the 2008, 2009, 2011, 2013 and 2014 bowl seasons. The Conference sent four programs to bowls in 2006 and 2010. The MAC set a Conference record with seven bowl invitations in both the 2012 and 2015 bowl seasons.

MAC Commissioner Dr. Jon Steinbrecher joined the Conference in 2009 and added Boise as a primary bowl partner in 2010, while adding secondary bowl agreements ranging from Gildan New Mexico; St. Petersburg and the Birmingham Bowl in order to provide MAC members the opportunity to represent the Conference and receive additional bowl invitations.

The 2012 bowl season witnessed the conference earn its first BCS Bowl invitation with Northern Illinois gaining a No. 15 BCS ranking and an invite to the Discover Orange Bowl to face Florida State.

In 2014, the MAC announced primary bowl partnerships with the newly created Raycom Media Camellia Bowl (Montgomery, Ala.), Popeyes Bahamas Bowl (Nassau, Bahamas), Marmot Boca Raton Bowl (Boca Raton, Fla.) and Miami Beach Bowl (Miami Beach, Fla.). In addition, the MAC secured a six-year partnership with the San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl as a primary and secondary partner and a secondary bowl partnership with the Quick Lane Bowl (Detroit) during this span.

Western Michigan's invitation to the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic to face Wisconsin on Jan. 2nd is the MAC's second New Year's Six Bowl Game appearance.

In the last five bowl seasons, the MAC has an 11-18 overall bowl record in 29 bowl games -- 2015 (3-4); 2014 (2-3); 2013 (0-5); 2012 (2-5); 2011 (4-1). In 2011 the MAC won the ESPN Challenge Cup with a 4-1 record for the best FBS Conference record in bowl games.

Eastern Michigan will come into the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl following one of the most successful seasons in its 125-year history. Eastern Michigan finished with a winning record for the first time since 1995, most wins (seven) since 1989, and its first bowl appearance since 1987 when Eastern Michigan defeated San Jose State 30-27 in the California Bowl. The Eagles tied the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) mark for biggest turnarounds in 2016, improving on its win total from one win in 2015, to seven this season.

Eastern is led on offense by redshirt junior quarterback Brogan Roback, who has put up gaudy numbers in his nine appearances this season, totaling six starts. He finished the regular season with 193 completions for 2,394 yards and 16 touchdowns. He had five 300+ yard games and a season-high of 468 yards. For his efforts, he was named MAC West Offensive Player of the Week three times. The offense gets its start up front from the experienced offensive line, which has 161 combined starts under its belt. The group has combined to allow the 13th fewest sacks in the nation, as well as the second fewest tackles for loss. On the ground, redshirt sophomore Ian Eriksen led the rushing attack with 741 yards on 175 carries and nine scores. Junior Sergio Bailey II was the leading pass catcher with 55 receptions for 799 yards and six touchdowns.

Defensively, the Eagles forced 24 turnovers, good for 29th in the nation and second in the MAC. Redshirt sophomore Kyle Rachwal led Eastern Michigan in tackles with 101 stops, while redshirt senior Pat O'Connor had 8.0 sacks, good for 38th in the nation and fourth in the MAC.

Tracking The Miles: The voyage from Ypsilanti, Mich. to Nassau, Bahamas is a whopping 1,240-mile journey. For comparison's sake, Eastern Michigan traveled 1,911 total miles in six road games this season, including just 659 for the four road trips within the Mid-American Conference.

Roback Rising: Redshirt junior Brogan Roback has put up gaudy numbers in his nine appearances this season, totaling six starts. He finished the regular season with 193 completions for 2,394 yards and 16 touchdowns. He had five 300+ yard games and a season-high of 468 yards. For his efforts, he was named MAC West Offensive Player of the Week three times. For his career, he has 5,463 yards and 36 passing touchdowns, which ranks fourth and third all-time in program history, respectively, while his 474 completions rank fourth as well.

Historic Offensive Season: The Eastern Michigan offense attained one of the biggest offensive seasons in its history in 2016. The team set the single season record for total offense (5,447), passing offense (3,549), total points (365), touchdown passes (23), and extra points (40), while finishing second in total plays (914), completions (283), and first downs (275) and third in total touchdowns (45).

O'Connor The Sack King: Senior Pat O'Connor finished the regular season at 19.5 sacks for his career, making him the program leader since 1998. Former Eagle Kevin Howe previously set the record with 17.5 from 2003-06. O'Connor's eight sacks rank 38th in the nation and fourth in the MAC.

Road Graders: The offense gets its start up front from the experienced offensive line, which has 166 combined starts. The group has combined to allow the 12th-fewest sacks in the nation, as well as the second fewest tackles for loss. Anchoring the line are four redshirt seniors who have combined to make 141 of the starts, including Andrew Wylie (45), Jake Hurcombe (36), Cole Gardner (31), and Darien Terrell (29).

Old Dominion Notes:

• Old Dominion finished the regular season with a 9-3 overall record, and 7-1 Conference USA record, the same record as Western Kentucky. Western Kentucky advanced to the conference championship game due to its head-to-head victory over the Monarchs.

• The Monarchs have won five-straight games and eight of their last nine contests.

• Old Dominion is bowl bound in its eighth season of football and just second full season of bowl eligibility. Due to NCAA transition rules, the Monarchs have not been eligible for postseason play in four of the eight seasons since restarting the program after a 69-year hiatus.

• The Monarchs are 66-30 all-time since 2009, and are 20-16 in three years playing a full FBS schedule. Head Coach Bobby Wilder is the only head coach Old Dominion has ever known since restarting the program.

• Senior quarterback David Washington completed 191-of-320 passes for 2,648 yards, 28 touchdowns and four interceptions. He is one of four quarterbacks in the country to have thrown more than 25 touchdown passes and four or less interceptions.

• Junior running back Ray Lawry leads the offense with 177 carries for 1,122 yards and 11 touchdowns, while sophomore Jeremy Cox has 685 yards and 13 rushing touchdowns.

• Senior linebackers TJ Ricks and Anthony Wilson have combined to make 183 tackles on the year. Ricks leads the squad with 93, while Wilson has 90, five sacks and 8.5 tackles for loss.

• Sophomore defensive end Oshane Ximines set an Old Dominion single-season record with 7.5 sacks, while junior Bunmi Rotimi has seven sacks.

• Head Coach Bobby Wilder is the 14th longest tenured head coach in the FBS and the third longest in Conference USA. David Bailiff of Rice was hired one month before Wilder. Rick Stockstill of Middle Tennessee leads all C-USA coaches. Stockstill is in his 11th season with the Blue Raiders. Bob Stoops and Kirk Ferentz are the two longest tenured coaches in FBS at 18 years apiece at Oklahoma and Iowa, respectively.

Stay To The End: Old Dominion has made it a habit to not only play close games, but win them. The Monarchs are 20-7 all-time in games decided by one score and 7-2 since turning FBS in 2014. Head Coach Bobby Wilder has the best winning percentage of any active FBS head coach in games decided by one score. Old Dominion has not played a one score game this season after playing four last season and going 3-1.

First Bowl Game: After a 69-year layoff, Old Dominion restarted football in 2009 and in its eighth season is playing in its first bowl game against Eastern Michigan. The bowl game is the first for Old Dominion, but the postseason is not. The Monarchs made the FCS playoffs in 2011 and 2012. In 2014, Old Dominion went 6-6, but was in the second season of transition and not bowl eligible.

Monarchs Making Good: Old Dominion quickly became an FCS power, going 38-10 from 2009-12, twice making the FCS Playoffs and producing a pair of 10 win seasons. The Monarchs have a chance to become the third program to win 10 games by its second year of bowl eligibility. Appalachian State won 11 games last season in its first year of eligibility, while Marshall won 10 games its first year in 1997.

True Team Effort: Old Dominion ranks in the top-20 nationally in nine statistical categories, and just two individual categories, both by quarterback, David Washington. Washington is 15th in the country in pass efficiency at 155.6, and 12th in touchdown passes with 28. As a team, Old Dominion is second in the country in turnovers lost and fourth in turnover margin, and rank in the top-10 in tackles for loss allowed, least interceptions thrown, kick return defense and fumbles recovered and lost.

MAC Announces 2016 Post Season Awards

Western Michigan WR Corey Davis Named MAC Offensive Player of the Year and All-MAC First Team Selection

A total of 29 repeat selections from last year's All-MAC teams highlight this year's postseason football awards in the Mid-American Conference and Western Michigan and Ohio swept the postseason awards. Western Michigan senior wide receiver **Corey Davis** was named the MAC Offensive Player of the Year and Broncos Head Coach **P.J. Fleck** was named the MAC Head Coach of the Year, while Broncos junior kick returner **Darius Phillips** was named MAC Special Teams Player of the Year. Ohio senior defensive end **Tarell Basham** was named MAC Defensive Player of the Year, while Bobcats freshman safety **Javon Hagan** was named MAC Freshman of the Year. In addition, Western Michigan senior quarterback **Zach Terrell** was tabbed as the winner of the 35th Vern Smith Leadership Award.

A native of Wheaton, Ill, Davis started all 13 games this season and has 91 receptions for 1,427 yards and 18 touchdowns. His 18 touchdowns ranks first in the nation and his 1,427 yards is seventh in the country. This season Davis has set the MAC career receiving records for receptions (326), yards (5,212) and touchdowns (51). In addition, he became the all-time leader in FBS history with 5,212 receiving yards. He is the only player in FBS history with 300+ catches, 5,000+ yards and 50+ receiving TDs.

Fleck led the Broncos to the program's first outright West Division title and the first 13-0 mark and 8-0 record in the MAC in program history. The Broncos are just one of two programs in FBS that remain undefeated this season. Western Michigan's current 15-game winning streak is the second longest current streak in the nation. This marks the second-time Fleck has won MAC Coach of the Year, as he earned the honor in 2014 for at the time leading the best turnaround in the country from one win in 2013 to eight wins in 2014. Fleck, who turned 36 on Nov. 29, is the second youngest head coach in FBS.

Basham, a native of Rocky Mount, Va., started all 13 games this past year and led the Ohio defense as the Bobcats won the MAC East Division for the first time since 2011 with an 8-5 record, 6-2 MAC. Basham led the MAC with 11.5 sacks and was second with 15.5 tackles for loss. Basham ranks 16th in the nation with his 11.5 sacks. Basham added 49 tackles, two passes defensed and two forced fumbles and became the all-time sack leader in Ohio history with 30.5 career sacks.

Hagan, a native of Jacksonville, Fla., ranked fifth on the Bobcats with 50 tackles and led the team with five forced fumbles and three interceptions. Hagan added three tackles for loss and 11 passes defensed. Hagan's five forced fumbles tied for the lead in the MAC and ranked tied for fourth in the nation.

Phillips, a native of Detroit, Mich., has been an electrifying runner throughout his collegiate career and has both a punt return and kickoff return for a touchdown during the 2016 season. Phillips has 18 punt returns for 222 yards (12.3 avg.) and one return for a touchdown this season. In addition, Phillips has 36 kickoff returns for 818 yards (22.7 avg.) and one touchdown this year.

A native of Fort Wayne, Ind., Terrell was voted by the Conference head coaches as the 35th Vern Smith Leadership Award winner. The award is presented annually in honor of Vern Smith, the former University of Toledo Athletic Director. Terrell has started all 13 games and has thrown for 3,376 yards on 247-349 passing and 32 touchdowns. Terrell ranks fourth in the nation in passing efficiency with a 180.6 rating on his 32-to-3 touchdowns-to-interception ratio. His 32 touchdowns are 10th in the nation. Terrell ranks fourth in MAC history with 95 career passing touchdowns and fourth in MAC history with 11,931 passing yards.

Toledo led the way in 2016 with seven First-Team selections, followed by Western Michigan and Ohio with four First-Team selections each. Overall, Western Michigan set the pace with 14 All-MAC honorees, followed by Toledo with 12 honorees and Ohio with 10 honorees.

Western Michigan's Corey Davis was the only three-time First Team All-MAC honoree in this year's honors. There were a total of five students named to their second consecutive First-Team selection: offensive lineman Storm Norton (Toledo), wide receiver Corey Davis (Western Michigan), defensive lineman Terence Waugh (Kent State), punter Joe Davidson (Bowling Green) and kick returner Aregeros Turner (Northern Illinois).
