BAHAMAS BOWL WEEK 1 NOTEBOOK

SINCE WE LAST VISITED: The Bahamas Bowl begins the road to its' 2017 game this weekend. As with the first three editions of the bowl, this year's game will feature teams from Conference USA and the Mid-American Conference on Friday, Dec. 22 at 12:30 p.m. ET in Thomas A. Robinson National Stadium. The game will be televised for the fourth straight year on ESPN. Old Dominion won the 2016 game, 24-20 over Eastern Michigan.

BOWL GAMES ARE BETTER IN THE BAHAMAS: *In the first three years, the Bahamas Bowl has ...*

- *Become the bowl of future champions.* The first two champs - WKU (2014) and Western Michigan (2015) - won their respective league titles the next year. WKU won C-USA in 2015 & 2016, while WMU won the MAC in 2016 with an undefeated regular season and played in a New Year's Six bowl.
- *Been a springboard to the next level.* A total of 14 alumni have been selected in the NFL Draft, including Western Michigan WR Corey Davis (2015 alumni), who went No. 5 overall to the Tennessee Titans in the 2017 NFL Draft. Six alumni were taken in the 2017 Draft and seven in 2016.

C-USA NOTES: In a vote of the conference's media, WKU (East) and Louisiana Tech (West) were selected to win their respective divisions. Louisiana Tech received votes in the preseason *Amway Coaches Poll*. WKU QB **Mike White** was selected as the C-USA preseason Offensive Player of the Year by the media. There are three new head coaches in C-USA: **Butch Davis** (FIU), **Lane Kiffin** (Florida Atlantic) and **Mike Sanford** (WKU).

WELCOME BACK UAB: A positive story in college football for 2017 is the return of the UAB Blazers to the football field after the program was shutdown for six months after the 2014 season. Head coach **Bill Clark**, who coached UAB in 2014 and spoke at the 2015 Bahamas Bowl Kickoff event, brings the Blazers back to the FBS and Conference USA as a full member this year.

MAC NOTES: Ohio (East) and Toledo (West) were selected to win their divisions by both the media and the league's head coaches. Western Michigan and Toledo received votes in the preseason Coaches Poll. The MAC has one new head coach at Western Michigan (**Tim Lester**). In 2016, the MAC had four 'Power Five' victories -- two each against the Big Ten and the Big 12.
