BAHAMAS BOWL WEEK 4 NOTEBOOK

THIS WEEKEND: Saturday, there are 19 total games in Conference USA and the MAC, including three between the two conferences. C-USA has two league games on the schedule as UAB (2-1) goes to North Texas (1-2) in a Western Division matchup and FIU (1-1) is at Rice (1-2, 1-0). There are also a pair of key non-conference games in C-USA as Old Dominion (2-1) visits Virginia Tech and Louisiana Tech (2-1) is at South Carolina. In the MAC, conference play gets underway with a pair of contests. Ohio (2-1) is at undefeated Eastern Michigan (2-0) and Miami (1-2) goes to Central Michigan (2-1). In non-conference action, Toledo (3-0) visits Miami (Fla.) and Kent State (1-2) is at Louisville.

C-USA VS. MAC: The two participating conferences in the 2017 Bahamas Bowl, Conference USA and the MAC have split the first four games between the leagues, 2-2. Saturday, the last three games between the two leagues before bowl season will take place as Ball State (2-1) visits WKU (1-2), Florida Atlantic (1-2) is at Buffalo (1-2) and Bowling Green (0-3) goes to Middle Tennessee (1-2).

MAC WEEK 3 REVIEW: The MAC went 6-5 during Week Three and picked up four FBS wins, including wins over Big Ten (Nebraska) and Big-12 (Kansas) opponents. The MAC also defeated Tulsa (American Athletic) and Idaho (Sun Belt) ... The NIU 21-17 victory over Nebraska win was the program's sixth win in the last 10 games against Big Ten opponents since 2009 and the fourth in five games under Huskies head coach **Rod Carey** ... Ohio beat Kansas 42-30 in Athens, behind QB **Nathan Rourke**, who threw for 152 yards and two TDs ... Toledo rallied from a 28-7 deficit to beat Tulsa 54-51 when kicker **Jameson West** made a 33-yard field goal as time expired ... the Rockets are 3-0 for the third straight season.

C-USA WEEK 3 REVIEW: Louisiana Tech rallied from a nine-point deficit to beat WKU 23-22 in a rematch of the 2016 C-USA title game, thanks to a game-winning 21-yard FG by the Bulldogs' **Jonathan Barnes** with :02 left ... FAU set records for margin of victory and posted its first shutout since 2007 with a 45-0 win over Bethune-Cookman, thanks to a school-record 439 rush yards ... Marshall beat Kent State 21-0, the third shutout by the Herd in the last 18 games, behind seven sacks ... North Texas senior QB **Mason Fine** is C-USA's leading passer, averaging 271.7 yards per game with six passing TDs ... UTSA senior QB **Dalton Sturm** had a record-setting performance in a 51-17 victory over Southern as he completed 19-of-22 passes for 292 yards and four TDs and rushed for a score.

AROUND THE CONFERENCES

- UTSA scored touchdowns on its first seven possessions for the first time in school history and held Southern to just 149 yards of total offense in cruising to a 51-17 victory.
- After a 21-17 victory over Nebraska in Lincoln on Saturday to secure its fourth win over a Big Ten Conference opponent in the last five years, Northern Illinois was selected as the National Team of the Week by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA).

• Southern Miss senior RB **Ito Smith** set a career high with 27 carries for 219 yards and a TD in a 28-17 win at Louisiana-Monroe. Smith became the first Golden Eagle to run more than 200 yards in over two years. Smith, who caught three passes for 13 yards, also reached the 5,000-yard mark for all-purpose yardage.

• Northern Illinois RB **Jordan Huff** had a season-best 105 yards on 16 carries and the game-winning 2-yard TD run in the 4th quarter for a 21-17 win at Nebraska.

• UAB is the only Conference USA team that has scored at least 30 points in all three games this season.

Southern Miss RB **Ito Smith**: The senior had 219 yards on 27 carries, 13 receiving yards and 22 kickoff return yards in a 28-17 victory over Louisiana-Monroe.

Defensive Player of the Week

Louisiana Tech DE **Jaylon Ferguson**: The junior had six total tackles and two sacks in a 23-22 victory over WKU.

Special Teams Player of the Week

Louisiana Tech K **Jonathan Barnes**: The senior kicked a game-winning 21-yard field goal and two other FGs in a 23-22 victory over WKU.

Northern Illinois LB **Jawuan Johnson**: The junior intercepted a pass and returned it 25 yards for a touchdown in a 21-17 victory over Nebraska.

West Division Special Teams Player of the Week

2017 BAHAMAS BOWL PARTICIPANT SELECTION

The highest-ranked conference champion by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee from the American Athletic, Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West or Sun Belt will play annually in one of the College Football Playoff bowls (Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic, PlayStation Fiesta Bowl or Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl for the 2017 season) if it is not selected for the Playoff Semifinals.

Conference USA has secured guaranteed commitments with six bowl partners for the 2017 season, as well as one secondary agreement: **Bahamas, Bad Boy Mowers Gasparilla, Boca Raton, Gildan New Mexico, Lockheed Martin Armed Forces and R+L Carriers New Orleans** are primary agreements. The **Independence Bowl** is a secondary agreement, should the ACC or SEC not be able to provide a bowl-eligible team. There is no set selection order among C-USA's bowl partners.

The MAC has 2017 primary bowl tie-ins with **Bahamas, Dollar General, Famous Idaho Potato and Raycom Media Camellia Bowls**. The MAC has secondary 2017 bowl agreements with **Boca Raton, Frisco and Quick Lane Bowls**. The Dollar General Bowl has first selection in 2017, and there is no order of selection for the remaining three primary MAC tie-ins.

The **2017 Bahamas Bowl** participants – selected from among bowl-eligible teams in Conference USA and the Mid-American Conference – will be announced by the bowl, ESPN Events and conference partners once finalized.
