BAHAMAS BOWL WEEK 10 NOTEBOOK

PASSPORT STAMPED (BOWL-ELIGIBLE TEAMS): C-USA (1): Marshall (6-2); MAC (3): Northern IIlinois (6-2), Ohio (7-2), Toledo (7-1). AT CUSTOMS (ONE VICTORY SHY): C-USA (7): FIU (5-2), Florida Atlantic (5-3), North Texas (5-3), Southern Miss (5-3), UAB (5-3), UTSA (5-2), WKU (5-3); MAC (3): Akron (5-4), Central Michigan (5-4), Western Michigan (5-4).

There are a combined 14 teams either bowl eligible or one victory away from eligibility from Conference USA and the MAC. If all 14 reached eligibility, it would mark the largest pool of bowl candidates in the four years of the Bahamas Bowl.

THIS WEEK: #MACtion begins Thursday with a huge game in the West as co-leaders Northern Illinois (6-2, 4-0) and Toledo (6-2, 4-0) showdown in a game that could decide the division representative to the Marathon MAC Championship Game. Also on Thursday, Ball State (2-6, 0-4) visits Eastern Michigan (2-6, 0-4). Tuesday, Nov. 4 has two games on the schedule in the East Division: Division leader Akron (5-4, 4-1) will try to reach bowl eligibility with a victory at Miami (3-6, 2-3), and Bowling Green (2-7, 2-3) is at Buffalo (3-6, 1-4). There are three MAC games on Wednesday, Nov. 5. Eastern Michigan is at cross-state rival Central Michigan (5-4, 3-2) as the Chippewas need one victory to be bowl eligible. Toledo is at East co-leader Ohio (7-2, 4-1), and Kent State (2-7, 1-4) visits Western Michigan (5-4, 3-3), as the Broncos need a victory for bowl eligibility.

Friday in Conference USA, there is a big game in Boca Raton as Marshall (6-2, 3-1) battles for the East Division lead at Florida Atlantic (5-3, 4-0). The Owls need one victory for bowl eligibility. Saturday, Rice (1-7, 1-3) is at UAB (5-3, 3-1). The Blazers are one win shy of bowl eligibility. West Division leader North Texas (5-3, 4-1) needs a victory for bowl eligibility as the Mean Green go to Louisiana Tech (4-4, 2-2). The winner of UTSA (5-2, 2-2) and FIU (5-2, 3-1) will be bowl eligible. Charlotte (1-7, 1-3) plays at Old Dominion (2-6, 0-4) and UTEP (0-8, 0-4) is at Middle Tennesse (3-5, 1-3). In C-USA vs. SEC non-conference action, WKU (5-3) can be bowl eligible with a victory at Vanderbilt, and Southern Miss (5-3) can do the same with a victory at Tennessee.

AROUND THE CONFERENCES

- Akron senior QB **Thomas Woodson** threw for 286 yards and three TDs in a 21-20 comefrom-behind win over Buffalo. His performance moved him into second place in school history with 6,829 career passing yards, behind only **Charlie Frye** (11,049, 2001-04).
- Florida Atlantic, averaging 51.8 points in four C-USA games and 39.1 for the season, is eighth in the FBS in rushing yardage at 295.8 per game. In October, the Owls led the FBS with a 56.3 scoring average.
- Three MAC defensive ends continue to lead the nation in sacks. Central Michigan senior **Joe Ostman** leads the nation with 10 sacks (1.25 per game), while Ball State senior **Anthony Winbush** has 9.5 sacks (1.19 per game) and is tied for second in the country with Northern Illinois sophomore **Sutton Smith** with his 9.5 sacks (1.19 per game).
- UTSA is now 11th in the FBS in total defense (294.7) and 12th in scoring defense (17.4). Additionally, the Roadrunners now have the top-ranked rushing defense (122.3 yards per game) and pass defense (172.4 ypg) in C-USA.
- Louisiana Tech unior transfer WR **Teddy Veal** reeled in a career-best 11 catches for 118 yards and now leads C-USA with 50 receptions in a 42-28 victory over Rice. Five of the last six Bulldogs contests have not been decided until the final minute of play. Louisiana Tech is two victories shy of bowl eligibility.

ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT

During 2017, the Bahamas Bowl will spotlight an alumni player from our partner conferences: Conference USA and the Mid-American Conference.

BEN ROETHLISBERGER (MIAMI)

Ben Roethlisberger, the 2003 MAC Offensive Player of the Year and the 2001 MAC Freshman of the Year, played his college career at Miami from 2001-03.

Roethlisberger threw for 10,829 yards and 84 touchdowns in only three seasons from 2001-03. His junior campaign was one for the ages, throwing for 4,486 yards and 37 touchdowns, leading Miami to 12 consecutive victories, including a MAC Championship and GMAC Bowl victory.

Roethlisberger was a third-team *Associated Press* All-American in 2003 and Freshman All-American in 2001.

He was a three-time All-MAC selection, earning first-team honors in 2003 and second-team recognition twice.

He still ranks first in Miami history in completion percentage and touchdowns, and is second in pass attempts, completions, yards and total offense (11,075).

Roethlisberger gave up his final season of eligibility to enter the 2004 NFL Draft. He was the 11th overall pick by the Pittsburgh Steelers, the highest draft pick in Miami history.

He guided the Steelers to two Super Bowl titles (Super Bowls XL and XLIII), and he became the youngest quarterback in NFL history to win a Super Bowl during the 2005 season. A three-time Pro Bowl selection, Roethlisberger was selected as the 2004 NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year by the AP.

Roethlisberger has thrown for over 48,000 yards and 310 touchdowns in his NFL career. A 14-time AFC Offensive Player of the Week, he was inducted into the MAC Hall of Fame in 2015.
