BAHAMAS BOWL WEEK 11 NOTEBOOK

PASSPORT STAMPED (BOWL-ELIGIBLE TEAMS): C-USA (5): FIU (6-2), Florida Atlantic (6-3), Marshall (6-3), North Texas (6-3), UAB (6-3); MAC (5): Central Michigan (6-4), Northern Illinois (6-3), Ohio (8-2), Toledo (8-2), Western Michigan (6-4). **AT CUSTOMS (ONE VICTORY SHY):** C-USA (3): Southern Miss (5-4), UTSA (5-3), WKU (5-4); MAC (1): Akron (5-5).

There are a combined 14 teams either bowl eligible or one victory away from eligibility from Conference USA and the MAC. If all 14 reached eligibility, it would mark the largest pool of bowl candidates in the four years of the Bahamas Bowl. Three other C-USA teams and two additional MAC schools remain in contention for bowl-eligible status.

THIS WEEK: #MACtion begins Thursday in the West as Northern Illinois (6-1, 4-1) will try to keep pace with division leader Toledo as the Huskies host Ball State (2-7, 0-5). Next Tuesday, there is a big game in the East Division as current division leader Ohio (8-2, 5-1) visits Akron (5-5, 4-2), which trails the Bobcats by one game and needs a victory for bowl eligibility. Also on Tuesday, Central Michigan (6-4, 4-2) heads to Kent State (2-8, 1-5). Wednesday, Nov. 15, there are three games on the schedule. West leader Toledo (8-2, 5-1) is at Bowling Green (2-8, 2-4). Eastern Michigan (3-7, 1-5) goes to Miami (4-6, 3-3), and Western Michigan (6-4, 4-2) visits Northern Illinois (6-3, 4-1).

The entire Conference USA schedule will take place Saturday. East Division leader Florida Atlantic (6-3, 5-1) goes to Louisiana Tech (4-5, 2-3). West leader North Texas (6-3, 5-1) hosts UTEP (0-9, 0-5). WKU (5-4, 3-2) needs a victory at Marshall (6-3, 3-2) to be bowl eligible. Southern Miss (5-4, 3-2) also needs a victory at Rice (1-8, 1-4) for bowl eligibility. UTSA (5-3, 2-3) is one victory shy of bowl eligibility as they host UAB (6-3, 4-2). Middle Tennessee (4-5, 2-3) is at Charlotte (1-8, 1-4) and Old Dominion (3-6, 1-4) goes to FIU (6-2, 4-1).

AROUND THE CONFERENCES

• In Conference USA, Florida Atlantic (5-0) controls its destiny to win the East Division. The Owls can clinch the East crown with victories over Louisiana Tech on Saturday and FIU on Nov. 18. They can also clinch the division title with victories over FIU and Charlotte on Nov. 25. In the West, North Texas (5-1) controls its destiny and can win the division with one victory over either UTEP on Saturday or Rice on Nov. 25.

• Central Michigan scored 21 points in the fourth quarter to turn a 28-14 deficit into a 35-28 win at Western Michigan on Nov. 1 to win the "Battle of the Cannon Trophy". Central Michigan QB **Shane Morris** found WR **Corey Willis** for a 77-yard TD pass with 2:37 left in regulation for the victory.

• After not playing football for two seasons, UAB became bowl eligible with a 52-21 victory over Rice to go to 6-3 overall. The Blazers, who reached bowl eligibility in the program's last season in 2014 are eligible for the fifth time in school history.

• Ohio posted a 45-28 win over Miami to win the 94th meeting for the "Battle of the Bricks". Bobcats QB **Nathan Rourke** accounted for six touchdowns (three passing and three rushing). He threw for 294 yards and rushed for 54 yards in the victory.

ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT

During 2017, the Bahamas Bowl will spotlight an alumni player from our partner conferences: Conference USA and the Mid-American Conference.

WILLIE ROAF (LOUISIANA TECH)



Former NFL offensive lineman and a member of the Pro Football Hall of Fame **Willie Roaf** was a consensus All-American during his college career at Louisiana Tech from 1989-92.

A four-year letterman, Roaf became the program's first consensus All-American in his 1992 senior season.

During his college career, Roaf was selected All-South Independent and All-Louisiana in 1991 and 1992. Louisiana Tech had a record of 25-16-3 during his four seasons, and the Bulldogs did not lose at home during that time.

During his time in Ruston, he blocked for two of the top five career rushers in Louisiana Tech history (Jason Cooper, Jason Davis). His No. 71 jersey is one of two retired by the school.

Roaf was drafted No. 8 overall in the first round of the 1993 NFL Draft by the New Orleans Saints, and he was an All-Rookie selection at right tackle. He moved to left tackle the following season, and he became of the most dominant players at his position.

An 11-time Pro Bowler and a seven-time All-Pro, Roaf played nine seasons with the Saints. Traded to Kansas City prior to the 2002 seasons, Roaf played four years with the Chiefs and retired after the 2005 season.

He was voted to both the 1990s and the 2000s NFL All-Decade Team by the Pro Football Hall of Fame's Selection Committee.

Roaf was elected to the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2012, and he was named to the 75th Anniversary All-America Third Team by the Football Writers Association of America in 2015.
