# **BAHAMAS BOWL WEEK 12 NOTEBOOK**

PASSPORT STAMPED (BOWL-ELIGIBLE TEAMS): C-USA (6): FIU (6-3), Florida Atlantic (7-3), Marshall (7-3), North Texas (7-3), Southern Miss (6-4), UAB (7-3); MAC (6): Akron (6-5), Central Michigan (7-4), Northern Illinois (8-3), Ohio (8-3), Toledo (9-2), Western Michigan (6-5). AT CUSTOMS (ONE VICTORY SHY): C-USA (2): UTSA (5-4), WKU (5-5).

There are a combined 14 teams either bowl eligible or one victory away from eligibility from Conference USA and the MAC. If all 14 reached eligibility, it would mark the largest pool of bowl candidates in the four years of the Bahamas Bowl. Two other C-USA teams and one additional MAC school remain in contention for bowl-eligible status.

THIS WEEK: #MACtion begins Thursday as Buffalo (4-6, 2-4) goes to Ball State (2-8, 0-6). The Bulls need victories in their final two games to be bowl eligible. The following Tuesday (Nov. 21), Kent State (2-9, 1-6) goes to East leader Akron (6-5, 5-2), Miami (4-7, 3-4) is at Ball State and Bowling Green (2-9, 2-5) visits Eastern Michigan (4-7, 2-5).

Conference USA has a single game on Friday as Middle Tennessee (5-5, 3-3) plays at WKU (5-5, 3-3). The winner of the rivalry game will be bowl eligible. Saturday, there are five conference and a pair of non-league games. The biggest game is in Boca Raton where Florida Atlantic (7-3, 6-0) will try to wrap the East Division title and the host spot in the C-USA title game with a victory over FIU (6-3, 4-2) in the Shula Bowl rivalry game. Three league games have bowl implications as Marshall (7-3, 4-2) goes to UTSA (5-4, 2-4). The Roadrunners need a victory for bowl eligibility. Rice (1-9, 1-5) heads to Old Dominion (4-6, 2-4), which needs a pair of victories to be bowl eligible. The same situation is in place for Louisiana Tech (4-6, 2-4), which is at UTEP (0-9, 0-5). Charlotte (1-9, 1-5) is at Southern Miss (6-4, 4-2) in the other conference game. West Division champ North Texas (7-3) hosts Army, and UAB (7-3) is at SEC foe Florida.

# **AROUND THE CONFERENCES**

- In Conference USA, Florida Atlantic (6-0) controls its destiny to win the East Division and host to the C-USA Championship Game. The Owls can clinch the East crown with a victory over FIU or Charlotte on Nov. 25. In the West, FIU needs a victory over Florida Atlantic and WKU on Nov. 25, and a loss by Florida Atlantic at Charlotte to clinch the East. North Texas (6-1) has clinched the West Division title. The Mean Green could host the C-USA title game with a victory over Rice on Nov. 25 and a pair of Florida Atlantic losses.
- Western Michigan senior CB **Darius Phillips** tied the all-time FBS record with his fifth career interception return for a TD in a 48-20 win over Kent State.
- UAB true freshman RB **Spencer Brown** recorded his sixth 100-yard rushing game of the season and his third straight with 27 carries for 128 yards against C-USA's No. 1 rush defense at UTSA Saturday night. He is the nation's second-leading rusher among freshmen with 1,177 yards and ranks third all-time at UAB in single-season rushing yards..
- Northern Illinois S **Jackson Abresch** tied the NCAA record for most touchdowns scored on blocked punts in a game when he scored two touchdowns on blocked punt returns in a 63-17 win over Ball State. Abresch is just the third player all-time to score two touchdowns in a game off of blocked punts, and the first to do so since Nov. 1, 1997.



# **ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT**

During 2017, the Bahamas Bowl will spotlight an alumni player from our partner conferences: Conference USA and the Mid-American Conference.

#### **JOE GREENE (NORTH TEXAS)**



Pro Football and College Football Hall of Famer Joe Greene, a 1968 consensus All-American, played his college career at North Texas from 1966-68.

Greene, whose iconic nickname of "Mean Joe" referenced the Mean Green nickname of the then-North Texas State, was part of a 23-5-1 record by the school in his three seasons as a defensive tackle.

In his 29 games at defensive tackle, North Texas held the opposition to 2,507 yards gained on 1,276 rushes, a per-carry average of less than two yards per attempt.

A consensus All-American in his senior season of 1968, Greene was selected No. 4 overall by the Pittsburgh Steelers in the 1969 NFL Draft.

Greene was the NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year in 1969, and was selected to the Pro Bowl that same season.

A dominant defensive tackle, Greene became the lynchpin of the Steelers' famed Steel Curtain defense during the 1970s.

He was the NFL Defensive Player of the Year in 1972 as the Steelers advanced to the AFC Championship Game. In 1974, he won the honor again as Pittsburgh won the first of four Super Bowls with Greene, beating Minnesota in Super Bowl IX. He was also part of the Steelers' title teams in Super Bowls X, XIII and XIV.

He was a five-time All-NFL performer, 11-time All-Conference pick and a 10-time Pro Bowler.

The 13-year pro (1969-81), a 1970s NFL All-Decade Team and NFL 75th Anniversary Team selection, was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1984 and the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1987.
