BAHAMAS BOWL WEEK 13 NOTEBOOK

PASSPORT STAMPED (BOWL-ELIGIBLE TEAMS): C-USA (8): FIU (6-4), Florida Atlantic (8-3), Marshall (7-4), North Texas (8-3), Southern Miss (7-4), UAB (7-4), UTSA (6-4), WKU (6-5); MAC (6): Akron (7-5), Central Michigan (7-4), Northern Illinois (8-3), Ohio (8-3), Toledo (9-2), Western Michigan (6-5). AT CUSTOMS (ONE VICTORY SHY): C-USA (3): Louisiana Tech (5-6), Middle Tennessee (5-6), Old Dominion (5-6); MAC (1): Buffalo (5-6).

There are a combined 18 teams either bowl eligible (14) or one victory away from eligibility (four; maximum of three can qualify) from Conference USA and the MAC. This is the deepest pool of teams by number to be bowl eligible in the four years of the Bahamas Bowl. C-USA can have a maximum of 10 teams qualify, while the MAC could have as many as seven teams eligible.

THIS WEEKEND: The final weekend of regular-season play in the MAC takes place with three games Friday. Up for grabs is the West Division crown, and Toledo (9-2, 6-1) can clinch outright with a victory at home over Western Michigan (6-5, 4-3). Northern Illinois (8-3, 6-1) can win the division with a victory at Central Michigan (7-4, 5-2) and a Toledo loss. The other MAC game Friday has bowl eligibility on the line as Buffalo (5-6, 3-4) needs a victory over Ohio (8-3, 5-2) at home. Akron has clinched the East Division title, and will play in the MAC Championship Game on Dec. 2 at Detroit's Ford Field.

The Conference USA Championship Game is set for Dec. 2 in Boca Raton as Florida Atlantic (8-3, 7-0), the East Division champion, will host West champ North Texas (8-3, 6-1). Three teams still have bowl dreams to play for Saturday, two of which will play for the all-important sixth victory as 2016 Bahamas Bowl champion Old Dominion (5-6, 3-4) is at Middle Tennessee (5-6, 3-4). Louisiana Tech (5-6, 3-4) would also reach bowl eligibility with a home victory over UTSA (6-4, 3-4). The division champs will be in action as North Texas is at Rice (1-10, 1-6) and Florida Atlantic is at Charlotte (1-10, 1-6).

AROUND THE CONFERENCES

- In Conference USA, Florida Atlantic's 52-24 win over FIU in the Shula Bowl last Saturday night meant that the Owls (7-0 in C-USA) had clinched the East Division Championship and the right to host the 2017 Dynacraft Conference USA Football Championship Game on Saturday, Dec. 2. North Texas (6-1 in C-USA) punched its ticket as West Division Champion back on Nov. 11. The C-USA title game is on ESPN2 at Noon ET.
- In the MAC, Akron (6-2) has clinched the East Division and will play in the 2017 Marathon MAC Football Championship game on Saturday, Dec. 2 at Noon ET at Detroit's Ford Field on ESPN. In the West Division, both Toledo (6-1) and NIU (6-1) are tied for first, with Toledo holding the tiebreaker. A Toledo victory over Western Michigan on Nov. 24 or a Northern Illinois loss at Central Michigan (5-2) the same day clinches the West for the Rockets. If Toledo and NIU both lose, there would a three-win tie for the division. Toledo would win the tiebreaker with a 2-0 record among tied teams.
- Florida Atlantic RB **Devin "Motor" Singletary** has been named one of 11 semifnalists for the Doak Walker Award, given annually to the nation's top running back. He has a nation-leading 24 rushing TDs this season.
- Western Michigan senior offensive tackle **Chukwuma Okorafor** is one of six semifinalists for the Outland Trophy, given to the nation's best interior lineman.

West Division Offensive Player of the Week

Toledo RB **Terry Swanson**: The senior rushed for for 192 yards on 23 attempts in a 66-37 victory over Bowling Green.

Northern Illinois DE **Sutton Smith**: The sophomore had six tackles, 2.5 sacks, 5.5 tackles for loss and returned a fumble for a TD in a 35-31 victory over Western Michigan.

ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT

During 2017, the Bahamas Bowl will spotlight an alumni player from our partner conferences: Conference USA and the Mid-American Conference.

JOE STALEY (CENTRAL MICHIGAN)



Current San Francisco 49ers offensive tackle **Joe Staley** was an All-MAC performer during his college career at Central Michigan from 2003-06.

Staley worked on the Chippewas offensive line that produced a 1,000yard rusher during three of his four seasons at CMU.

As a senior in 2006, he started all 14 games and was a consensus All-MAC at left tackle. He was one of three co-captains that helped lead the Chippewas to their first MAC title in 12 seasons and the 2006 Motor City Bowl title, the school's first bowl victory.

In his junior season of 2005, he did not allow a sack in 11 starts at left tackle and helped CMU average 418.8 yards per game of offense.

After playing the 2007 Senior Bowl, he posted the fastest 40-yard dash time (4.7) by any offensive lineman at the 2007 NFL Combine.

Staley was drafted in the first round of the 2007 NFL Draft by the San Francisco 49ers in 2007 He became the first Central Michigan player to be selected in the first round.

He played right tackle in his rookie season with the 49ers and became the first San Francisco rookie offensive lineman to start every game in a season since 1968.

He moved back to left tackle in 2008, and he has started all 152 games he has been available to play in his 11-season career.

A five-time Pro Bowler (2011-15), Staley was selected All-NFL in 2013 by the Pro Football Writers of America.
