CREDENTIALS

Working media hoping to attend UAB football games should apply for credentials at www.sportssystem.com/uab. Credentials will be approved based on space limitations and demand. Credentials for the Bahamas Bowl should be submitted at www.sportssystem.com/bahamasbowl.

UNAUTHORIZED USE OF MEDIA CREDENTIAL

Credentials will be issued to working media only. Media credentials are not transferable and use by anyone other than members of the working media is unauthorized. Media credentials used in an unauthorized manner will be revoked immediately. News organizations allowing unauthorized individuals to use credentials will have their credentials revoked for the remainder of the year.

WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCE

Head Coach Bill Clark will hold his weekly press conference every Monday of game week at 10 a.m. in the Football Operations Center multi-purpose room. Selected players will be available during that window as well. Following the press conference, the UAB Athletic Communications Office will post a transcript on uabsports.com.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

All player interviews must be coordinated through the Athletic Communications Office. Media is forbidden to contact student-athletes without the permission and knowledge of Ted Feeley or Josh Brunner. During game week, Wednesday will be the final day for media to conduct student-athlete interviews.

LEGION FIELD PRESSBOX

The Legion Field Press Box opens three hours prior to game time. Media will be provided with a meal and complimentary wifi on gameday in the pressbox.

Media information sheets, game notes and flip cards are provided to all media members at their press box seat prior to the game. Final statistic books will be available approximately 15 minutes after the game.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

UAB is committed to a policy of equal access for both male and female reporters and photographers, therefore, the UAB locker room is closed to the media. Interviews with Head Coach Bill Clark and players will be conducted following the NCAA-mandated 10-minute cooling-off period.

A member of the Athletic Communications staff will collect postgame interview requests with approximately 10 minutes remaining in the fourth quarter. The postgame press conference will be held in the media room behind the North endzone.

PHOTOGRAPHY

UAB follows NCAA rules regarding media representatives photographing games. Only properly credentialed photographers will be allowed in the designated photo area of Legion Field as specified by the NCAA. Photo credentials are subject to revocation by the UAB Athletic Communications Office at any time.

WEBSITES & NEW MEDIA

Web-based media sites affiliated with established, nationally-recognized news-gathering organizations are eligible for media credentials.

Online media with an emphasis on recruiting of potential student-athletes that meet the above qualification can request one (1) credential if the purpose of attending is writing a game/event recap. Credentials will not be granted to any online agency operating sites that are in any way affiliated with gambling. Nor will credentials be granted to "freelance" or "fan-based" sites that are not affiliated with an established news-gathering organization and/or sites whose sole entity is fan-generated message boards that allow the posting of anonymous comments.

THOMAS A. ROBINSON MEMORIAL STADIUM

Thomas A. Robinson Stadium is named after Thomas Augustus Robinson, MBE who competed in four Olympic Games and numerous World Championships for the Bahamas. The facility has been the site for track (2013 Carifta Games and the 2014, 2015 and 2017 IAAF World Relays) and soccer (2018 FIFA World Cup qualifier - Bahamas vs. Bermuda 2015). The stadium has Olympic and international certification and has been designed to host a variety of sporting events, including football, rugby, soccer and track & field. It has a seating capacity of 13,676.



FACTS ON THOMAS A. ROBINSON MEMORIAL STADIUM

Thomas A. Robinson Stadium was opened in 2011 and has been the home of the Bahamas Bowl since 2014.

SETTING THE STAGE



CLARK NAMED C-USA COACH OF THE YEAR

- Head Coach Bill Clark was named the 2017 C-USA Coach of the Year on Dec. 5 after leading UAB to an 8-4 overall record and a 6-2 mark in conference play, the first season back after a two year hiatus, both setting FBS program records for wins in a single season.
- Clark has also been nominated for multiple coach of the year awards including the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year (FWAA) and the George Munger National Coach of the Year (Maxwell Football Club).



BROWN RUNNING THROUGH THE COMPETITION

- Freshman running back Spencer Brown was named the C-USA Freshman of the Year and earned Second Team All-Conference honors after rushing for 1,292 yards and 10 TDs breaking the previous freshman rushing record held by Jordan Howard.
- Brown needs just 97 yards in the Bahamas Bowl to set the C-USA freshman rushing record currently held by Damion Fletcher who ran for 1,388 yards in 2006.
- His 10 touchdowns are the seventh most in a single season.



WILLIAMS LEADING THE DEFENSE

- Redshirt senior corner Darius Williams has been a playmaker all season totaling 49 tackles, five interceptions, one interception return for a touchdown and 15 pass breakups.
- Williams recorded an interception in four straight games earlier this season.
- He was named a Pro Football Focus First Team All-American and First Team All-Conference USA.
- He is tied for second nationally in passes defended (20).



- In one of college football's biggest stories this season, the UAB football team will cap off its historic 2017 season by playing Ohio University in the 2017 Bahamas Bowl. The Blazers are playing in just their second bowl game in program history along with the 2004 Sheraton Hawaii Bowl. If UAB wins, it will be its first bowl victory ever.
- Returning to the field after a two year hiatus, the Blazers re-wrote the record books this season, highlighted by setting a program record for single season FBS wins (8) and Conference USA wins (6). Not only did Birmingham help reestablish the program by raising over \$45 million, the Blazer faithful led Conference USA in attendance with a school record average of 26,375. Included in that was a record-setting crowd of 45,212 to witness UAB's first game back, a 38-7 victory over Alabama A&M on Sept. 2. The Blazers finished 6-0 at home for the first time ever.
- Senior cornerback Darious Williams was named a Pro Football Focus First Team All-American. The Jacksonville native finished the regular season ranking second nationally in passes defended with 20 (1.7/game). He led Conference USA in both interceptions (5) and pass breakups (15). His five interceptions are tied for seventh nationally. Williams had a career-high four pass breakups at Florida.
- Conference USA Freshman of the Year Spencer Brown shattered the UAB record books in his first collegiate season. Brown is the nation's third leading rusher among freshmen averaging 107.7 yards per game. His rushing total of 1,292 yards ranks third in a single season at UAB and he needs 97 yards to set the C-USA freshman rushing record held by Damion Fletcher of Southern Miss in 2006 (1,388 yards). Brown has six 100-yard rushing games this year with a career high of 209 yards coming at Southern Miss.
- Quarterback A.J. Erdely accounted for 29 total touchdowns in the regular season with 16 through the air and 13 on the ground. He completed 61.8 percent of his passes with just four interceptions. His 13 rushing TDs are tied for the most in a single season with Jordan Howard and Darrin Reaves. He needs four total touchdowns in the bowl game to set the UAB single season record for most touchdowns accounted for (32 by Joe Webb in 2009).
- The Blazers have 15 players on this year's roster that were members of the 2014 team. Those players include: #1 Darious Williams (CB), #6 Wally Adams (WR), #13 Collin Lisa (WR), #17 Jordan Petty (S), #19 Nick Vogel (PK), #23 Tevin Crews (LB), #24 T.K. Lowe (S), #42 Shaq Jones (LB), #53 Zach Sims (OL), #63 Brad Minor (OL), #72 Lee Dufour (OL), #74 Bryant Novick (OL), #80 Stephen Pickren (TE), #82 Vernon Chatman (WR) and #92 Roderick McKinney (DL).
- UAB has made national headlines with #theReturn of its program. National media outlets that have done stories or features on the Blazers include: ESPN, ESPN.com, CBS Sports Network, Associated Press, USA Today, NCAA Champion Magazine, NCAA.com, The Players' Tribune, Raycom, Paul Finebaum Radio Show, Mel Kiper Jr. Radio Show, Washington Post, Bleacher Report, NBC Sports Radio, SB Nation, IMG College Sports Now, UNISWAG, Saturdays Down South, The All-American, AL.com, Orlando Sentential, Kansas City Star, 247 Sports, beIN, Stadium, Uproxx and Conference USA.

- The Blazers will not shy away from the competition upon their return. Along with participating as members of Conference USA in the West Division, UAB has at least one SEC team on its schedule for four of the next five years: Florida in 2017, Texas A&M in 2018, Tennessee in 2019 and Georgia in 2021.
- UAB is one of the older teams in the NCAA this season. UAB has three players who are 26 years old (P Joel Dixon, LB Eric Ramsey, DL Darryl Waters) and of the players on the 2-deep, 30 of them are at least 22 years of age or older.

- In UAB's Homecoming game vs. LA Tech, the Blazers wore special uniforms to honor the patients at nearby Children's Harbor. Each player had the last name of a patient from Children's Harbor on the back of his jersey. It garnered national headlines and UAB won the game 23-22.
 - Senior linebacker Shaq Jones was one of 22 college football players named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team which is one of college football's most prestigious off the field awards for community service. The

preseason list of 146 members was narrowed down to 11 FBS members and 11 FCS, Division II, III and NAIA members.

- Jones has been a staple in the Birmingham community since his arrival at UAB. Along with being heavily involved with the Big Brothers Big Sisters of Greater Birmingham program, Jones helped build a house for Habitat for Humanity's 30th Anniversary build. He and his Dad have also started a non-profit organization that helps foster children who turn 18 and are not adopted find jobs or enroll in school.
- Jones and the 22-member team will be honored at halftime of the Allstate Sugar Bowl.

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?

True freshman Spencer Brown shattered the UAB record book in his first collegiate season. It took Brown just eight games to set the single season freshman rushing record which was previously held by Jordan Howard and he now has his sights set on Howard's overall single season rushing record. Brown had 209 yards at Southern Miss which was the seventh best rushing performance in school history and just the eighth time a UAB running back has eclipsed 200 yards rushing in a game. The 209 yards was a freshman record.

Brown has six 100-yard rushing games this season and in four of those six games he has gone over 150 yards. He is averaging 108.5 yards per game.

Almost as impressive is that Brown has only been stopped behind the line of scrimmage six times this season for a loss of 13 yards. He has gained 1,305 total yards and has a net of 1,292 yards. Brown's weight room heroics were well documented throughout the summer as the freshman came in and impressed right away with a max squat of 600 lbs, bench of 365 lbs and power clean of 345 lbs.

Brown set the single season freshman rushing record and his 1,292 yards ranks third overall in a single season. He is also tied for seventh in single season rushing touchdowns with 10.

BROWN AMONG NATION'S BEST

Spencer Brown ranks third in the nation among freshman running backs averaging 107.7 yards per game and ranks 24th overall with 1,292 yards.

ERDELY AS A DUAL THREAT

Quarterback A.J. Erdely has accounted for 29 touchdowns this season with 16 through the air and 13 on the ground. His 13 rushing touchdowns are the most on the team this year and established a new program record for single season rushing TDs by a quarterback. He is currently tied for the overall school rushing TD record with Jordan

Howard and Darrin Reaves.

Erdely ran for a career high 77 yards and three touchdowns at Ball State, while his career passing game came at North Texas throwing for 321 yards and four touchdowns.

ERDELY IN THE RECORD BOOKS

A.J. Erdely's 13 rushing touchdowns are tied for the most in school history in a single season and are the most by a quarterback. Erdely now shares the overall record with Jordan Howard and Darrin Reaves, while Erdely broke Joe Webb's previous QB record of 11. Erdely has had a rushing touchdown in eight games this season and multi-touchdown games in four of those games. His 29 total touchdowns are second most in a season (Joe Webb 32 in 2009).

ERDELY SETS CONFERENCE USA RECORD

A.J. Erdely set a Conference USA record for completion percentage against Rice, finishing the game 20-of-21 for 197 yards and three touchdowns. His completion percentage of 95.2 percent broke the previous record of 94.7 (18-of-19) which was done twice, the last in 2006.

For his efforts, he won multiple national weekly awards, including CFP National Performer of the Week and the Manning Star of the Week presented by the Allstate Sugar Bowl.

GROUND GAME

The UAB rushing attack ranks second in C-USA. The Blazers went for a season-high 336 rushing yards at Ball State and have scored at least two rushing touchdowns every game this season except at Florida and UTEP. The Blazers' 27 rushing touchdowns are the second most in C-USA.

With one game remaining this season, the Blazers are tied for the most team rushing touchdowns in a season and are moving up the charts for the most rushing yards in a single season.



WILSON AND LISA GO OVER 100

Andre Wilson (150) and Collin Lisa (105) each had their first career 100-yard receiving games at North Texas. Wilson hauled in five catches for 150 yards and two touchdowns, while Lisa had four catches for 105 yards. Those two are UAB's top receiving targets as Wilson leads the team with 48 catches for 619 yards (51.6/game) while Lisa has 29 catches for 384 yards (32.0/game).

Wilson had back-to-back 100-yard receiving games as he followed up his North Texas performance with eight catches for 105 yards vs. Louisiana Tech. His eight catches were a career high.

30+ POINTS

The UAB offense is on pace to put together one of its most prolific offensive seasons in program history. The Blazers are averaging 29.6 points per game and have scored at least 30 points in six of 12 games. The 2014 team has the record for averaging 33.2 points per game.

REDZONE EFFICIENT

The Blazers have made 45 trips to the redzone this season and have come away with points on 41 of those trips, good for an 91 percent conversion rate. Of those 45 trips, 34 have resulted in touchdowns. UAB ranks 18th nationally in redzone offense.

Conversely, the UAB defense has also been very good in the redzone and ranks 25th nationally in that category. Opponents have made 37 trips to the red zone and have scored on touchdowns on 19 of those trips.

MOVING THE CHAINS

UAB has done a tremendous job moving the chains on third down this season, converting 48 percent of its attempts. The Blazers are tied for 7th nationally in third down conversion percentage and are 81-for-170 overall. UAB leads Conference USA in that category and was 10-of-16 in its last game out vs. UTEP.



BEHIND THE LINE

The UAB defense has been very disruptive this season and ranks 34th nationally in tackles for loss (81 total for 274 yards, 6.8 per game). In the season opener vs. Alabama A&M, the Blazers tallied 12 TFL and have had no fewer than four in every game this year. UAB had a 10 TFL performance at UTSA which was its most in a C-USA game this season.

Individually, UAB has three players who rank in the top 15 in tackles for loss in Conference USA, led by Shaq Jones and Tevin Crews.

CREWS' BREAKOUT SEASON

Senior All-Conference USA linebacker Tevin Crews has led UAB in tackles in eight games this season. He is the only player in the league to rank in the top 10 in both tackles per game (7.9) and tackles for loss (12.0). He finished the regular season with 95 tackles, 12.0 TFL, three sacks, three pass breakups, one interception and a forced fumble.

JONES' SAFETY - FIRST SINCE 2008

Midway through the first quarter vs. Middle Tennessee, Shaq Jones sacked quarterback John Urzua in the end zone to give the Blazers a 9-7 lead. It was UAB's first safety since Oct. 18, 2008 against Marshall. Jones is also having a monster season and shares the team lead with 12.0 TFL to go along with 55 tackles.

NO FLY ZONE

The Blazer defense ranks third in C-USA with 14 interceptions. They have returned three of those 14 interceptions for touchdowns which is tied for the most in C-USA.

The Blazers have especially been ball hawks of late with 10 interceptions in their last seven games. Overall, UAB has four multi-interception games this season; three vs. Coastal Carolina, two vs. Middle Tennessee, two vs. Charlotte and two vs. Rice.

WILLIAMS DEFENDING THE PASS

Cornerback Darious Williams is playing the best football of his career. He currently leads

Conference USA and ranks second nationally in passes defended with 20 (15 PBU, Five INT, 1.7/ game). Williams' five interceptions are tied for the seventh most in the NCAA and he leads Conference USA in pass breakups and interceptions as well.

RUSH-ing TO THE END ZONE

The defensive highlight of the game in the season opener vs. Alabama A&M came midway through the third quarter with UAB leading 17-7. Defensive tackle Anthony Rush, standing at 6-foot-5, 340 lbs, deflected Aqeel Glass' pass and returned it 27 yards for a touchdown to put the game out of reach at 24-7. His play garnered national attention as No. 6 on ESPN's Top-10 as well as @ESPNCFB and @SI tweeting the play. The play was also recently named a nominee for the third annual Piesman Trophy given out by SB Nation.

THOMAS A CONSISTENT FORCE AT SAFETY

Free safety Broderick Thomas, who has started every game this season, is second on the team with 91 tackles and has been a consistent force in the secondary. The redshirt junior has had no less than seven tackles in nine of 12 games and has three TFL, two interceptions, a forced fumble and a pass breakup. He had a career-high 12 tackles at Florida. Thomas was a nominee for C-USA Newcomer of the Year.

KEELY'S BLOCK GIVES UAB WIN OVER LA TECH

With UAB leading Louisiana Tech 23-22 with three seconds left in the game, junior Stacy Keely, standing at 6-foot-7, blocked a game-winning 30-yard field goal attempt and made the ensuing tackle to secure the victory. It was UAB's first blocked field goal since Nov. 1, 2014 vs. FAU. Keely was named Conference USA Special Teams Player of the Week for his play.

VOGEL IN THE KICKING GAME

Kicker Nick Vogel is 11-of-14 on field goal attempts and has made 38-of-40 point after attempts. He connected on a career long 48-yard field goal in the fourth quarter at UTSA which proved to be crucial in UAB's 24-19 victory.

UAB Defeats Alabama A&M, 38-7

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (AP) — UAB needed a half to shake off more than 1,000 days of rust before pulling away from Alabama A&M 38-7 on Saturday in the Blazers' first game following a two-season hiatus.

A.J. Erdely threw two touchdown passes and ran in another as the Blazers (1-0) scored 28 unanswered points in the second half against the FCS Bulldogs (0-1).

School officials shut down the UAB program at the end of the 2014 season for financial reasons, but it was reinstated six months later after a fundraising effort generated what eventually became more than \$44 million in contributions. The Blazers then sat out the 2015 and 2016 seasons in order to rebuild their roster.

The Blazers were greeted Saturday by an announced crowd of 45,212, the largest in program history. UAB often played in front of home crowds of less than 10,000 before the temporary shutdown. And there was a true game-day atmosphere outside Legion Field in the hours before kickoff, something the program lacked when going through nine consecutive losing seasons.

Linebacker Tevin Crews, who led UAB with six tackles, is one of 15 players on this year's team who are holdovers from 2014. He admits being caught up in the emotion of the moment when he ran onto the field before the game and saw the size of the crowd.

The Blazers broke the game open midway through the third quarter on a 26-yard touchdown pass from Erdely to Sederian Copeland, followed less than a minute later by a 27-yard interception return for a touchdown by Anthony Rush.

The only score for Alabama A&M came on a 46-yard pass from Aqeel Glass to Rod Randolph.

UAB Falls at Ball State, 51-31

MUNCIE, Ind. – Quarterback A.J. Erdely rushed for three touchdowns and freshman running back Spencer Brown had 151 yards on the ground, but the UAB football team fell to Ball State 51-31 on Saturday at Scheumann Stadium.

Erdely set career bests in rushing touchdowns, rushing yards (77), passing yards (168) and completions (15). The Cumming, Ga., native is now the first quarterback to rush for three scores in a game since Joe Webb scored three times at Tulane on November 15, 2008.

Brown also had a career day, becoming the Blazers' first rusher to eclipse the 100-yard mark this season with 151 total yards against the Cardinals. Brown had 42 yard in the season opener vs. Alabama A&M.

UAB outgained Ball State 504-377 and had 336 yards rushing while scoring all four of its touchdowns on the ground.

On the defensive side of the ball, linebacker Tevin Crews made his presence known on the field, recording a career-best 15 tackles in the game. His previous career high was 10 tackles against Louisiana Tech in 2014.

The Blazers return to action on September 16 when the team hosts Coastal Carolina at historic Legion Field. Tickets for the game can be purchased here.

UAB Downs Coastal Carolina, 30-23

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. – Four rushing touchdowns and three interceptions propelled the UAB football team to its second win of the season as the Blazers defeated Coastal Carolina 30-23 on Saturday at Legion Field.

The defense played a big role in securing the team's second win of the season, holding Coastal Carolina to a season-low 23 points. The defensive effort was paced by Broderick Thomas who recorded a team-high nine tackles. Fellow defensive back Darius Williams also had a big day, accounting for eight total tackles and a career-best three tackles for loss.

Tevin Crews, Fitzgerald Mofor and Mar'Sean Diggs each recorded an interception in the victory, marking the first time a Blazer defense posted three interceptions since Sept. 13, 2014 against Alabama A&M.

Offensively, the Blazers were once again propelled by their running game as three separate rushers found the end zone. Quarterback A.J. Erdely ran for 38 yards and scored his Conference USA-leading fifth rushing touchdown. Erdely is now tied with Thomas Cox and Rodney Hudson for the fifth-most single-season rushing touchdowns by a quarterback in school history.

Freshman running back Spencer Brown added two touchdowns on 16 carries for 51 yards, while fellow rusher Carlos Stephens recorded his first rushing touchdown as a Blazer to compliment 44 yards on the day. Andre Wilson led all receivers with three receptions for 43 yards.

UAB compiled 274 yards of total offense with 169 of those coming on the ground. Coastal Carolina had 327 yards of offense, but the UAB defense tallied nine tackles for loss and had six pass breakups.

UAB Drops Heartbreaker at North Texas, 46-43
DENTON, Texas – A.J. Erdely threw for a career high 321 yards and four touchdowns to pace the UAB football team's offense but the Blazers fell to North Texas 46-43 at Apogee Stadium on Saturday night.

Erdely is now the first Blazer quarterback to throw for over 300 yards in a Conference USA matchup since Cody Clements threw for 320 yards against North Texas on October 11, 2014 and the first with four touchdowns since Jonathan Perry tossed for four scores on Nov. 12, 2011.

UAB (2-2, 0-1 C-USA) was unable to slow down C-USA's leading offense on Saturday as North Texas compiled 548 total yards. The Blazers posted 395 yards of total offense, with 321 yards coming through the air.

Two Blazer receivers played a major role in the success of the passing game on Saturday. Andre Wilson had a career game, hauling in a career-best 150 yards with two touchdowns to lead the receiving corps. Fellow receiver Collin Lisa also eclipsed the 100-yard mark after totaling 105 yards on four receptions.

Freshman Spencer Brown rushed for 50 yards on 17 attempts and tallied his fourth rushing touchdown of the season, while fellow running back Lucious Stanley recorded his first rushing touchdown in the Green and Gold and added a receiving touchdown with 27 second to go in the fourth quarter to tie the game.

On the defensive side of the ball, Broderick Thomas led the way for the Blazers in tackles for the second straight game with eight against the Mean Green, one shy of matching his career high.

Four other defenders added six tackles.

Blocked Field Goal Propels UAB to 23-22 Win Over Louisiana Tech

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. – A blocked field goal by redshirt junior Stacy Keely as time expired propelled UAB to its first Conference USA win of the 2017 season as the Blazers downed Louisiana Tech, 23-22, at Legion Field on Saturday afternoon.

Keely blocked a 30-yard field goal attempt from Louisiana Tech's Jonathan Barnes and then made the tackle after the ball landed back in Barnes' hands, sending the 27,213 fans in attendance into a frenzy.

The win is the first over Louisiana Tech in program history after entering the game 0-5 overall against the Bulldogs, while it is also the Blazers' first C-USA win since defeating Southern Miss 45-24 on Nov. 29, 2014.

The defense held Louisiana Tech to just 22 points on the night. Fitzgerald Mofor led the charge for the defensive unit, recording a career-best 10 tackles on the night. Shaq Jones and Broderick Thomas posted nine tackles apiece in the win.

On the offensive side of the ball, A.J. Erdely tacked on two scores on the ground to improve his season total to seven rushing touchdowns. He was also efficient in the air, going 21-of-32 for 188 yards. Erdely has now accounted for 13 touchdowns this season.

Freshman Spencer Brown had a career game in the win, running for a career-best 165 yards and scoring his fifth rushing touchdown of the season. His impressive performance on the ground also set a UAB freshman record for most yards in a game, topping the previous record of 159 held by Jordan Howard.

Andre Wilson hauled in a career-best eight passes for 105 yards to post his second-straight 100-yard game.

Vogel's Field Goal Gives UAB 25-23 Win Over Middle Tennessee

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (AP) - Nick Vogel drilled a 33-yard field goal late in the fourth quarter and UAB hung on for a 25-23 victory over Middle Tennessee Saturday night at Legion Field.

Middle Tennessee's Canon Rooker hit a 41-yard field goal with 10:30 left in the third to put the Blue Raiders ahead 23-22. That held until Vogel booted his game winner with 8:16 remaining in the contest to give UAB (4-2, 2-1 Conference USA) two straight wins for the first time this season.

The point difference came with 1:23 left in the first quarter when UAB's Shaq Jones sacked John Urzua in the end zone for a 9-7 lead. It was the first safety forced by UAB since Oct. 18, 2008 against Marshall.

Spencer Brown rushed for 167 yards and one touchdown, bringing his season total to six scores on the season. It was Brown's second straight game with over 150 yards on the ground.

UAB quarterback A.J. Erdely threw for 174 yards and a score while rushing for 61 yards. He has now accounted for 14 touchdowns this season, with seven coming through the air.

The defense also played a major role in the contest, forcing two interceptions including one by Broderick Thomas to seal the victory for the Blazers.

Thomas and linebacker Tevin Crews paced the Green and Gold's defense on the night, accounting for 11 tackles apiece, while fellow linebacker Fitzgerald Mofor added nine tackles on the evening.

Senior cornerback Darius Williams also added an interception in the victory.

Blazers Fall to Charlotte in Overtime, 25-24
CHARLOTTE – A successful two-point conversion pass from Chris Montgomery to Hassan Klugh on the final play of the game proved to be the difference as Charlotte defeated UAB 25-24 in overtime on Saturday at Jerry Richardson Stadium.

The 49ers scored the final 17 points in regulation to force the Blazers into its first overtime game since Aug. 13, 2013 against Troy.

A.J. Erdely continued to be the Blazers’ offensive catalyst, scoring twice on the ground and throwing for one. The redshirt junior has now accounted for 17 touchdowns this season, with nine of his scores coming on the ground.

Wide receivers Andre Wilson and Ronnie Turner, Jr. both caught five passes for 45 yards and 39 yards, respectively. Freshman Spencer Brown led all UAB rushers in the game with 71 yards on 16 carries.

Turnovers were huge for the Blazers on the defensive side of the ball as Darius Williams and Chris Woolbright each picked off Klugh in critical situations in the first half. Williams’ INT on the UAB 1-yard line halted a 49ers drive in the first quarter, while Woolbright’s pick set up UAB’s first score.

The Blazers now have eight interceptions this season.

Will Dawkins and Tevin Crews led the defense with nine tackles apiece, while Broderick Thomas and Fitzgerald Mofor each added seven.

The Blazers finished the game with 344 total yards and were relatively even on the ground (162) and through the air (182). The 49ers finished the game with 376 total yards, 222 of which came in the rushing game.

Brown's Record Setting Night Leads UAB Past Southern Miss, 30-12

HATTIESBURG, Miss. – Freshman Spencer Brown used a 209-yard performance on the ground and broke Jordan Howard's single season freshman rushing record to lead UAB past Southern Miss 30-12 at M.M. Roberts Stadium on Saturday night.

Brown's 209 yards were the seventh most in school history and just the eighth time ever a UAB running back has eclipsed the 200-yard mark in a single game. His total yardage and 33 attempts are both career highs, while he recorded his seventh rushing touchdown of the season.

Brown needed just eight games to break Howard's freshman rushing record of 881 yards set back in 2013. The Birmingham native now has 909 rushing yards this season and is averaging 113.6 yards per game.

UAB (5-3, 3-2 C-USA) has now outscored the Golden Eagles 75-36 in its last two meetings and has won six of the last seven games against Southern Miss.

The Blazers' defense played a huge role in the victory, shutting out Southern Miss (5-3, 3-2 C-USA) in the second half and only allowing the Golden Eagles to gain just 128 yards in the final 30 minutes. The 12 points allowed in the game were the fewest points scored by Southern Miss in a Conference USA game this season.

Senior Tevin Crews had a team-high nine tackles, the fourth time he has led the defense in tackles this season. Broderick Thomas and Shaq Jones each recorded seven tackles apiece to help lead the defensive efforts.

Cornerback Darius Williams recorded UAB's ninth interception of the season at the end of the game with a pick-six to seal the victory.

UAB Tops Rice 52-21 to Clinch Bowl Eligibility
BIRMINGHAM, Ala. –The UAB football team picked up its sixth victory of the year to gain bowl eligibility for the second consecutive season and the fifth time in program history after a dominating 52-21 victory over Rice at historic Legion Field on Saturday.

The Blazers (6-3, 4-2 C-USA) scored touchdowns on their first six possessions behind a nearly flawless performance from quarterback A.J. Erdely and the hard running of freshman Spencer Brown.

Brown amassed 140 yards for the game - including 129 in the first half – and notched a career high three rushing touchdowns to bring his season total to 10. He now stands at 1,049 rushing yards on the season. He became just the fifth player in program history to rush for 1,000 yards in a season.

Erdely finished 20-of-21 for 197 yards and three touchdown passes - two to Andre Wilson and one to Donnie Lee – to bring his season total to 12 touchdown passes in addition to 10 rushing scores. His .952 completion percentage is a C-USA record, eclipsing the previous high of .947.

The Blazers' defense continued their consistent play by forcing three Owls turnovers and accounted for a pick-six for the second consecutive week (Brontae Harris, 64 yards) and third time this season (Anthony Rush, Alabama A&M; Darius Williams, Southern Miss). Williams snatched an interception for the fourth consecutive game while the defense tallied six tackles for a loss, including a sack from Stacy Keely, who now leads the club with three sacks through nine games.

Lee led the way with five receptions for 84 yards and a score while Wilson finished with seven receptions for 68 yards to supplement his two touchdown receptions. Nine different Blazers notched a reception during the game, while James Noble III complemented Brown's performance with 73 rushing yards.

UAB Tops Rice 52-21 to Clinch Bowl Eligibility

SAN ANTONIO – A.J. Erdely set the UAB single season record for rushing touchdowns by a quarterback and UAB matched a program record for FBS victories with a 24-19 win at UTSA on Saturday night at the Alamodome.

The Blazers are now 7-3 on the season and 5-2 in C-USA play. The five conference wins also match a program record.

UAB has won three straight and five of its last six games.

Facing the league's No. 1 ranked rush defense, true freshman Spencer Brown had 27 carries for 128 yards for his sixth 100-yard rushing game of the season.

In the process, Brown moved into third place on UAB's single season rushing list and now has 1,177 yards this season.

The Blazers rushed for 216 yards overall and have now tallied at least two touchdowns on the ground in every game this season.

Erdely scored both rushing touchdowns to bring his season total to 12, passing Joe Webb's previous QB record of 11 which he did in 2008 and 2009.

UAB's defense was lights out with three takeaways and 10 tackles for loss. Tevin Crews had a team-high eight tackles and a sack, while Broderick Thomas and Fitzgerald Mofor each had seven tackles.

The Blazers held the league's most efficient passer Dalton Sturm to 17-of-37 for only 162 yards.

The Blazers now head to The Swamp for a non-conference game next Saturday against Florida. Kick is set for 4 p.m. EST/3 p.m. CST on the SEC Network.

UAB Falls at Florida, 36-7

GAINESVILLE, Fla. – Despite a valiant effort from the defense, the UAB football team fell to the Florida Gators 36-7 at Ben Hill-Griffin Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

The Blazers finished the non-conference portion of its schedule at 2-2 with its two losses coming on the road.

Senior Tevin Crews led the way for the Blazers with 13 tackles, while junior Broderick Thomas recorded a career-high 12 tackles. It is the seventh time this season that Crews has led the team in tackles and now has 91 total tackles on the season, while Thomas is second on the team with 88.

Darius Williams also starred for the Blazers against Florida, recording a career-high four pass breakups while also tacking on six tackles. Williams leads Conference USA in pass breakups with 14 on the season.

UAB (7-4, 5-2 C-USA) recorded four tackles for loss which included sacks by Craig Kanyangarara and Chris Woolbright.

Kanyangarara finished with a career-best six tackles along with his first career sack, while Woolbright added two tackles.

Quarterback A.J. Erdely went 14-of-19 for 177 yards and a touchdown to lead the UAB offense.

Wideout Xavier Ubosi made the play of the game for the Blazers, hauling in a career-long 74-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter. The 74-yard score was UAB's longest of the season.

The Gators were +4 in the turnover battle (two fumbles, two interceptions) and outgained UAB as a whole 409-180.

UAB Defeats UTEP 28-7; Sets Program Record for Wins

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. – UAB set two program records with its 28-7 victory over UTEP Saturday at Legion Field as it finished the regular season at 8-4 overall and 6-2 in Conference USA.

The Blazers' eight overall victories are a single season FBS record, surpassing the 2000 and 2004 teams who each won seven, while the six conference wins outdid the 2004 team who won five.

The win also gave UAB a perfect 6-0 record at home this season, marking the most wins at Legion Field in a season in program history.

The Blazers finished 2017 second in the West Division and will play in their second ever bowl game, joining the 2004 team who played in the Hawaii Bowl.

Quarterback A.J. Erdely powered the offense with 159 yards through the air and two passing touchdowns. He added a rushing touchdown and 29 yards on the ground. Erdely has 13 rushing touchdowns, which ties him with Jordan Howard and Darrin Reaves for the UAB single-season record.

Erdely finished the regular season accounting for 29 touchdowns (16 passing, 13 rushing).

Spencer Brown had 98 yards on 22 carries and moved his season rushing total up to 1,292 yards.

As a team, the Blazers have rushed for 27 touchdowns and are tied with the 2014 team for the most rushing touchdowns in a single season.

SECOND SEASON AT UAB JACKSONVILLE STATE '90

2017 C-USA Coach of the Year

Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Finalist

Head Coach **Bill Clark** made it evident he was dedicated to rebuilding UAB football into a nationally recognizable program.

Clark led the Blazers out of the tunnel for their return to the football field on September 2, 2017 against Alabama A&M, just as he did in UAB's last game, a 45-24 victory at Southern Miss on November 29, 2014.

In Clark's first season as head coach of the Blazers in 2014, he turned around a program that was 2-10 the year before into a team that finished 6-6 and earned bowl eligibility for the first time since 2004.

Clark's loyalty to the program has been paid back by the UAB Department of Athletics, Board of Trustees, donors and the city of Birmingham. Since 2015, UAB has raised over \$43 million to reinstate Football, Bowling and Rifle, and Clark has helped engineer a \$22.5 million state-of-the-art Football Operations Center.

The Football Operations Center is UAB Football's new home to coach's offices, meeting and film rooms, athletic training facilities, locker rooms, a weight room, a nutrition station and three practice fields. One of those practice fields is a pioneering open-air covered pavilion made possible by Legacy Community Federal Credit Union.

Legacy Credit Union announced the largest-ever sponsorship with UAB, a 20-year, \$4.2 million naming right agreement for Legacy Pavilion, and in the process, became the official credit union of UAB.

Clark also proved that UAB will be a contender from the moment the Blazers return to the field in 2017 as he signed the No. 2 rated recruiting class in Conference USA in 2016.

In 2014, the Blazers had a school record 15 players earn All-Conference USA honors, including three first team selections (RB Jordan Howard, DE Diaheem Watkins and KR J.J. Nelson). Nelson was also named the school's first Walter Camp First Team All-American.

The Blazers also experienced the country's second-highest increase in home attendance average, growing by more than 130 percent.

Prior to UAB, Clark was the head coach at Jacksonville State in 2013 and led the Gamecocks to an 11-4 record, their most victories since the 1992 campaign when JSU won the NCAA

Division II National Championship. That number set an Ohio Valley Conference record and was also the most wins by a first-year head coach.

Jacksonville State earned an at-large berth in the FCS Playoffs and captured two victories -- including a second-round win over No. 6 McNeese State to reach the quarterfinals. The wins were the Gamecocks' first-ever in the NCAA Division I playoffs.

JSU concluded the 2013 season ranked No. 10 in the final FCS poll. The Gamecocks, who ranked sixth in the nation in FCS attendance, set 49 school records in 2013 and broke 13 OVC marks, as well as three NCAA records. JSU had two players earn All-America honors and nine selected for All-Ohio Valley Conference accolades.

Clark became Jacksonville State's head coach after five outstanding seasons at South Alabama as the Jaguars' defensive coordinator.

Clark's defense at USA finished second in the Sun Belt Conference in total defense in 2012 as the Jaguars completed their first full season of competition in the league. South Alabama posted the best record of any Division I FCS Independent in 2011 after winning the first 17 games in the program's history in 2009 and 2010.

During the 2010 season, South Alabama allowed only 13 points and 254.6 yards per game en route to a 10-0 record. In 2009, the Jags allowed only 5.9 points and 234 yards per game when the defense forced 25 sacks and forced 23 turnovers in only seven games.

Clark joined South Alabama in 2008 after spending nine years as head coach at Prattville (Ala.) High School where he led the Lions to national prominence. He won a pair of Class 6A State Championships as his last two teams won 30 straight games, while the 2007 squad was ranked No. 2 in USA Today's national high school poll.

Following his final season at Prattville High School, he was named the Alabama High School Athletic Association Coach of the Year and was also selected as the Schutt Southeast Regional Coach of the Year.

He first led the Lions to the Class 6A state playoffs in 2000, his second season guiding the program. Clark earned his first postseason victory a year later, helping Prattville advance to the quarterfinals before falling to the eventual state champion, which is where the Lions' season would end each of the next two falls.

Prattville made its first state championship game appearance under Clark in 2004, with the team allowing three touchdowns in four postseason contests, including a pair of shutouts. The Lions advanced to the quarterfinals of the 2005 playoffs before dropping a two-point decision.

Clark posted a 107-11 (90.7 percent) overall record during his tenure, suffering his last regular-season loss during the second week of the 2002 season.

Clark served on the staff of the Alabama-Mississippi All-Star Classic three times, including as head coach in the summer of 2007. He also served as head coach in the 2004 North-South All-Star Game. Clark began his coaching career as an assistant at Piedmont High School (1990-91) and also has coaching stints at Tuscaloosa County High School (1992-94), Coffee County (Ga.) High School (1995-96) and Dothan High School (1997-98).

He graduated from Jacksonville State in 1990 with a degree in physical education. Clark and his wife, Jennifer, have two children: daughter, Katie and son Jacob. Jacob is a long snapper for the Blazers.

LES KOENNING

OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR/QBs

FIRST SEASON AT UAB UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS '80

A veteran coordinator with more than 35 years of experience, **Les Koenning** was named UAB's Offensive Coordinator and Quarterback Coach in January of 2016.

Prior to his arrival in Birmingham, Koenning served as wide receivers coach at the University of Texas in 2014. In his lone year with the Longhorns, Koenning guided John Harris to all-conference recognition as Harris hauled in 68 catches for 1,051 yards and seven touchdowns.

Prior to joining the Texas staff, Koenning spent time as the offensive coordinator at Mississippi State (2009-13), South Alabama (2008), Texas A&M (2003-07) and Alabama (2001-02).

In five seasons at Mississippi State, Koenning elevated the offense to its highest levels in school history in addition to helping the Bulldogs play in four straight bowl games for the first time in school history.

During that time, Koenning orchestrated what was then the top four seasons in school history in total offensive yards, the top two in passing yards and scoring, the top four in passing TDs, and two of the top four in rushing TDs.

Koenning also coached the top four quarterbacks on the career completion percentage chart in MSU history in Tyson Lee, Tyler Russell, Dak Prescott and Chris Relf.

In 2013, the Bulldogs set a then single-season record for total offense with an average of 434.4 yards per game, bettering the previous record of 422.0, set in 1982. Three of the top five averages in MSU history have fallen under Koenning's guidance (2013, 2010 and 2012). Mississippi State also set a then school record in total yards with 5,647, passing yards with 3,178, completion percentage (.590) and completions (253), all of which were marks set previously by offenses under Koenning.

Koenning came to Mississippi State from South Alabama, where he spent 2008 helping to establish the foundation for the newly developed Jaguars program that began play in 2009. Current UAB head coach Bill Clark was the defensive coordinator for USA while Koenning led offense.

Prior to that, Koenning spent five years on the Texas A&M staff, serving as offensive coordinator and working with the quarterbacks. During his time there he oversaw the development of both Reggie McNeal and Stephen McGee.

McNeal set a then single-season school record with 2,791 passing yards in 2004, while McGee put together two seasons that ranked in the top 10 at that time in 2006-07. McNeal also finished his career as Texas A&M's career passing leader with 6,992 yards and rushed for 1,889 yards, while McGee left in fourth place with 5,475 passing yards combined with 1,750 rushing yards. Both players would go on to be drafted with McNeal selected in the sixth round of the 2006 draft by Cincinnati, and McGee chosen in the fourth round of the 2009 draft by Dallas. Seven other Aggies were also drafted who played under Koenning.

Koenning went to Texas A&M from Alabama where he was offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for two seasons (2001-02). Alabama split time between Tyler Watts and Andrew Zow in 2001, however Ahmaad Galloway led a rushing attack that ranked ninth in the nation (226.4 ypg). The 2002 team ranked 18th in rushing (213.2 ypg) while posting a 10-3 record. Shaud Williams and Santonio Beard carried the load with 921 rushing yards and 811, respectively, while Tyler Watts and Brodie Croyle shared time at quarterback. Center Alonzo Ephraim was a two-time First Team All-SEC honoree in the two years.

Before Alabama, Koenning spent one season as passing game coordinator and quarterbacks coach at TCU in 2000. He was the offensive coordinator at Houston in 1999 and Duke in 1998 following a one-year stint in the NFL as an offensive assistant with the Miami Dolphins. Koenning had also served previously at Texas A&M as wide receivers coach from 1994-96, and he briefly held the same position at Duke in December of 1993 after also coaching wide receivers at Rice from 1990-93. His first experience at Mississippi State came from 1986-89 as running backs/wide receivers coach.

A native of Houston, Koenning began his career with graduate assistantships at Texas and Alabama before being named wide receivers coach and recruiting coordinator at Louisiana-Lafayette in 1985. He graduated from Texas in 1981 with a degree in health and physical education, and added a master's degree in sports management two years later. He played at Memorial High School in Houston for his father, Les Koenning Sr., who was a longtime Texas high school and college coach.

Koenning and his wife, Lisa, have two children, Les and Lana.

David Reeves was named UAB's Defensive Coordinator in June of 2016. Prior to his appointment as the Defensive Coordinator, Reeves was the Blazers' defensive line coach since 2014.

Reeves was an integral part of UAB's remarkable turnaround in 2014 in which the Blazers finished 6-6 after being 2-10 the year prior.

The Blazers improved 44 spots in total defense in 2014, spearheaded by the defensive line. Reeves' unit helped UAB tally 34 sacks in his first season, which was 16 more than the year before. The Blazers also finished with 81 TFLs with Reeves, a +21 difference from the 2013 campaign.

At the conclusion of 2014, the UAB defense allowed 29.9 points against, which was an average of 14 points better from 2013 when UAB allowed 43.8 points against.

Leading the way for the defensive front was senior end Diaheem Watkins, who was named a First Team All-Conference USA selection for tallying a team-high 10 sacks. Additionally, Interior lineman Chris Walton earned C-USA Honorable Mention.

Reeves joined the Blazers in 2014 following a year-long stint at Jacksonville State where he also coached the defensive line under the direction of head coach Bill Clark.

In 2013 at JSU, Reeves' unit ranked first in the Ohio Valley Conference in sacks (52) and third in the league in scoring defense (23.6 ppg). Under Reeves' guidance, two Gamecocks earned All-Ohio Valley Conference honors, including second team selection defensive lineman Caleb Lawrence. Jacksonville State defensive end Chris Landrum was named to the OVC Newcomer squad.

Reeves was the secondary coach at UT Martin in 2012, after coaching the previous five seasons at Southern Arkansas where he was the defensive coordinator his final two years. Reeves was a graduate assistant at the University of Alabama from 2005-06 and was the defensive coordinator at Athens (Ala.) High School from 2000-05.

He is a 1991 graduate of Athens State University.

Hindley Brigham was named UAB's running backs coach in May of 2017 after spending the previous year as the Blazers' Offensive Analyst.

A standout running back for local Mountain Brook High School, Brigham began his playing career at Baylor and was a second team Academic All-Big 12 performer following his sophomore season. Trey Clark, who helped guide Jacksonville State to the 2015 FCS national title game, was named UAB's offensive line coach in June of 2016.

Clark joined the Blazers after three years at JSU where the Gamecocks experienced unprecedented success during that time.

Clark served as a graduate assistant in 2013 under current UAB head coach Bill Clark and helped JSU finish 11-4 en route to reaching the quarterfinals of the FCS playoffs, marking the school's first-ever victories in the NCAA Division I playoffs.

He was then promoted to offensive line coach in 2014 and the team was a combined 23-4 in his two years overseeing that unit.

Kyle Tatum was named UAB's defensive line coach in February of 2017 following his time as the Blazers' strength and conditioning assistant since the Fall of 2016.

Tatum began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Texas State from 2011-2012 under the direction of head coach Dennis Franchione. In 2012 he coached tight ends and was subsequently promoted to defensive tackles coach from 2013-2015.

During the 2013 season, defensive lineman Michael Odiari was named Third Team All-Sun Belt. Ray L. Watts, M.D., UAB's seventh president, has demonstrated visionary leadership in education, research and clinical care throughout his career.

A Birmingham native and graduate of West End High School, Dr. Watts earned a bachelor's degree in engineering at UAB in 1976. The collaborations he had with biomedical engineering students as an undergraduate inspired him to expand his career horizons and, four years later, he graduated from Washington University School of Medicine in St. Louis as valedictorian of his class.

Dr. Watts completed a neurology residency, medical internship, and clinical fellowships at Harvard Medical School and Massachusetts General Hospital, followed by a two-year medical staff fellowship at the National Institutes of Health. Before returning to UAB in 2003, he was part of a team that helped to create an internationally renowned research and clinical center for Parkinson's disease and other movement disorders at Emory University in Atlanta.

At UAB, Dr. Watts served as the John N. Whitaker Professor and Chairman of the Department of Neurology. There he led the development of an interdisciplinary research program aimed at translating scientific breakthroughs into promising new therapies for neurodegenerative diseases and played a key role in the establishment of the UAB Comprehensive Neuroscience Center. He also was named president of the University of Alabama Health Services Foundation.

In 2010, Dr. Watts accepted the position of Senior Vice President and Dean of the School of Medicine at UAB, and later was named to the James C. Lee Jr. Endowed Chair. As dean, Dr. Watts – in partnership with UAB Health System and Health Services Foundation leaders – initiated the AMC21 comprehensive strategic plan, encompassing education, research, clinical care and primary care. AMC21 aims to make UAB “the preferred academic medical center of the 21st century,” and has led to the recruitment of outstanding faculty, the launch of programs to accelerate research and drug discovery, and the development of a third regional medical campus in Montgomery, among other successes.

He has been tireless in his efforts to enhance medical student training—from increasing available scholarships to supporting Equal Access Birmingham, a volunteer organization in which students provide care to under-served patients—and to foster stronger relationships with medical alumni throughout the state.

“People want to invest in the future—in solutions that will have a real impact on our health, education and our economy,” Dr. Watts has said. “So the state and community want us to develop our ideas and capitalize on opportunities to lead. UAB can be one of the most dynamic and productive universities of the 21st century, and that is our vision.”

Dr. Watts and his wife Nancy, who worked at UAB as a nurse before retiring, have five grown children.

Mark Ingram, a veteran administrator with an extensive background in athletic development, was named UAB's Director of Athletics in May of 2015.

Ingram has guided the UAB Department of Athletics through its most unique and unprecedented era of collegiate athletics with the reinstatement of Football, Bowling and Rifle, while experiencing record-setting performances on the fundraising trail and in the classroom.

In two years under Ingram's leadership, the UAB Department of Athletics has:

- » Reinstated UAB Football, Rifle and Bowling
- » Raised more than \$45 million in cash and pledges for UAB Athletics
- » Received approval from the University of Alabama Board of Trustees for a \$22.5 million football practice facility, which includes a \$4.2 million sponsorship and naming agreement with Legacy Credit Union – the largest of its kind in UAB Athletics history
- » Received approval from the University of Alabama Board of Trustees for the expansion of UAB Softball's grandstands and pressbox
- » Fall of 2016 overall student-athlete GPA of 3.14, which is the highest ever on record, surpassing the Fall of 2015 GPA of 3.13, which also fell under Ingram's watch
- » The Blazers had 13 of their sports teams record a perfect 1,000 APR multiyear rate for the 2015-16 academic year
- » UAB student-athletes compiled 3,595 community service hours in 2015-16, which was the most in the program's history
- » Competitively, men's basketball won the 2015-16 C-USA regular season title. Softball won the 2016 C-USA Western Division regular season title
- » The 2016-17 season marked the seventh-consecutive season UAB has had representation in the Men's Golf NCAA Tournament.

Ingram helped engineer the 46,000 square foot Football Operations Center which features an open-air pavilion covering the turf practice field, making UAB a pioneer in this architectural design. The football project, along with the softball complex expansion, are just a few in Ingram's overall facilities master plan.

Along with a tremendous fundraising effort and facility upgrades, Ingram also played an instrumental part in helping the 2017 Conference USA Men's and Women's Basketball Championships return to Birmingham for a third straight year.

Prior to arriving in the Magic City, Ingram was most recently the Associate Vice President/Executive Senior Associate Athletics Director at Temple University.

Ingram spent three years at Temple and two as Associate Vice President/Executive Senior Associate Athletics Director. He served as sport administrator for Men's Golf and Women's Lacrosse. Ingram joined Temple from the University of Tennessee, where he was Senior Associate Athletic Director.

In five years at Tennessee, his alma mater where he was a two-year starter for the Vol's football team, Ingram was responsible for the planning and strategy for the department's Capital Campaign that raised \$336 million during his tenure.

Before joining the Tennessee staff, he served as Assistant Athletics Director for Development at the University of Georgia for two years and Assistant Athletics Director for Development at the University of Missouri.

Ingram, a Winston-Salem, N.C., native, graduated from the University of Tennessee in 1996 with a bachelor's degree in sports management and minors in business and psychology. As a student-athlete, Ingram was a two-time Academic All-SEC honoree and was twice awarded the Volunteer award, given to the most valuable player who was formerly a walk-on. Also a member of the SEC Good Works Team, Ingram earned his master's degree in sport administration from Tennessee in 1997.

Ingram and his wife Amy have four children: John, Anne Lauren, Charlie and Audrey.


