## MAKERS WANTED BAHAMAS BOWL WEEK 2 NOTEBOOK

WEEK 2 PREVIEW: MAC programs face three Power 5 conference opponents Saturday as Kansas (Big 12) will travel to Central Michigan, Maryland (Big Ten) will head to Bowling Green and Utah (Pac-12) will visit Northern Illinois as part of a 10-game slate. In Conference USA, 13 games are scheduled with 10 C-USA squads playing at home. The first conference game sees FIU travel to Old Dominion in a East Division matchup. C-USA has one game vs. a Power 5 opponent as Baylor (Big 12) visits UTSA.

**C-USA WEEK 1 NOTES:** North Texas opened the season with a dominating 46-23 win over rival SMU. The Mean Green allowed the Mustangs just two first downs and 46 yards total offense through the first three periods. North Texas forced six three-and-outs in the game. Charlotte used 21 unanswered points in the second half to beat Fordham 34-10. UAB senior WR Collin Lisa had a careerhigh 10 catches for 93 yards and a TD in a 52-0 victory over Savannah State in the 2017 bowl participant's season opener. FIU redshirt junior LB Sage Lewis posted 18 total tackles against Indiana, tied for fifth-most in FIU single-game history.

MAC WEEK 1 NOTES: MAC teams went 5-6 in 11 contests. Ohio senior WR Papi White had a careerhigh 154 receiving yards on a career-high eight receptions with a TD as 2017 bowl champion Ohio held off Howard 38-32 in the Bobcats season opener. Eastern Michigan won its opener, 51-17 over Monmouth behind 473 yards of offense. Toledo junior Mitchell Guadagni completed 11-of-16 passes for 265 yards and three TDs in his debut as the Rockets beat VMI 66-3. Ball State had a schoolrecord 652 yards in a 42-6 victory over Central Connecticut State.

## MAKERS WANTED BAHAMAS BOWL PARTICIPANT SELECTION

The highest-ranked conference champion by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee from the American Athletic, Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West or Sun Belt will play annually in one of the College Football Playoff bowls (PlayStation Fiesta Bowl or Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl for the 2018 season) if it is not selected for the Playoff Semifinals.

Conference USA has secured guaranteed commitments with six bowl partners for the 2018 season, as well as two secondary agreements: The Makers Wanted Bahamas, Cheribundi Tart Cherry Boca Raton, Gildan New Mexico, Hawai'i, R+L Carriers New Orleans and either the Bad Boy Mowers Gasparilla or the SERVPRO First Responder Bowls are primary agreements. The Walk-On's Independence Bowl in Shreveport, La., is a secondary agreement (should the ACC or SEC not be able to provide a bowl-eligible team), as is the DXL Frisco Bowl. There is no set selection order among C-USA's bowl partners.

The MAC has 2018 primary bowl tie-ins with Makers Wanted Bahamas, Dollar General, DXL Frisco, Famous Idaho Potato, and Raycom Media Camellia Bowls. The MAC has secondary 2018 bowl agreements with the Quick Lane Bowl (should the ACC or Big Ten not be able to provide a bowl-eligible team) and other ESPN owned-and-operated bowl games.

The **2018 Makers Wanted Bahamas Bowl** participants – selected from among bowleligible teams in Conference USA and the Mid-American Conference – will be announced by the bowl, ESPN Events and conference partners once finalized.
