## MAKERS WANTED BAHAMAS BOWL WEEK 5 NOTEBOOK

**WEEK 5 PREVIEW:** Conference USA has nine games Saturday, including five league matchups. North Texas, 4-0 overall and receiving poll votes, hosts Louisiana Tech in a key West Division game. Florida Atlantic goes to Middle Tennessee in a East Division tilt. Charlotte, which co-leads the East Division, travels to UAB. UTEP heads to UTSA, and Marshall is at WKU. In non-conference action, West leader Southern Miss heads to No. 10 Auburn. In the MAC, three league games head up the schedule with East Division co-leader Miami hosting Western Michigan, West leader Northern Illinois is on the road at Eastern Michigan and Kent State is at Ball State. In non-conference action, Bowling Green is at Georgia Tech and Central Michigan visits Michigan State.

**MORE BIG WINS OVER POWER 5:** Once again, both Conference USA and the MAC posted victories over Power 5 opponents last week. In C-USA, 206 bowl champion Old Dominion stunned No 10 Virginia Tech out of the ACC, 49-35. The victory was ODU's first over a Power 5 school and a ranked team since the university re-started football in 2009. For their efforts, the Monarchs were named the National Team of the Week by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA). Also last Saturday, for the third consecutive week, the MAC defeated a Big Ten school as Buffalo ran its overall record to 4-0 with a 42-13 victory at Rutgers.

**C-USA vs. MAC:** WKU defeated Ball State 28-20 to give Conference USA a sweep of the two games it played against the MAC this season. Both conferences will match up for the fifth-consecutive year in the Makers Wanted Bahamas Bowl on December 21.

**MAKERS WANTED BAHAMAS BOWL PARTICIPANT SELECTION**

The highest-ranked conference champion by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee from the American Athletic, Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West or Sun Belt will play annually in one of the College Football Playoff bowls (**PlayStation Fiesta Bowl** or **Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl** for the 2018 season) if it is not selected for the Playoff Semifinals.

Conference USA has secured guaranteed commitments with six bowl partners for the 2018 season, as well as two secondary agreements: The **Makers Wanted Bahamas, Cheribundi Tart Cherry Boca Raton, Gildan New Mexico, Hawai'i, R+L Carriers New Orleans** and either the **Bad Boy Mowers Gasparilla** or the **SERVPRO First Responder Bowls** are primary agreements. The **Walk-On's Independence Bowl** in Shreveport, La., is a secondary agreement (should the ACC or SEC not be able to provide a bowl-eligible team), as is the **DXL Frisco Bowl**. There is no set selection order among C-USA's bowl partners.

The MAC has 2018 primary bowl tie-ins with **Makers Wanted Bahamas, Dollar General, DXL Frisco, Famous Idaho Potato, and Raycom Media Camellia Bowls**. The MAC has secondary 2018 bowl agreements with the **Quick Lane Bowl** (should the ACC or Big Ten not be able to provide a bowl-eligible team) and other ESPN owned-and-operated bowl games.

The **2018 Makers Wanted Bahamas Bowl** participants – selected from among bowl-eligible teams in Conference USA and the Mid-American Conference – will be announced by the bowl, ESPN Events and conference partners once finalized.
