MAKERS WANTED BAHAMAS BOWL WEEK 7 NOTEBOOK

WEEK 7 PREVIEW: The MAC has six conference games Saturday. One of the top games on the MAC schedule features Ohio at West Division leader Northern Illinois in a division crossover game. Western Michigan will try to keep pace with Northern Illinois as the Broncos go to Bowling Green. Buffalo, which leads the East Division, hosts Akron. Also in the West, Toledo is at Eastern Michigan and Ball State visits Central Michigan. In the East, Kent State plays at Miami.

In Conference USA on Saturday, West Division co-leader UAB goes to Rice after the Blazers picked up a key victory over Louisiana Tech last week. The other co-leader, UTSA, hosts Louisiana Tech in the Alamodome Also in the West. Southern Miss visits North Texas as both the Golden Eagles and the Mean Green try to keep pace in the division standings. East Division leader Middle Tennessee, which got a big victory over Marshall last Friday, has a huge division game at FIU. Marshall, part of a group with 1-1 conference records in the East, will try to rebound as the Herd heads to Old Dominion in a East matchup. One of the other 1-1 East teams, Charlotte, will host WKU.

IN THE POLLS: UAB (4-1 overall, 2-0 C-USA) is receiving votes in the Amway Coaches Poll.

CONFERENCE USA NOTES: IMiddle Tennessee graduate QB Brent Stockstill became the 11th player in C-USA history to pass the 10,000-yard mark in passing yards last Friday against Marshall. He became the third active FBS player to reach that mark and the 24th all-time. UTSA is 2-0 in C-USA play for the first time after the Roadrunners beat Rice 20-3. The three points are the fewest that UTSA has allowed to an FBS team. UAB ranks second nationally in passing yards allowed (134.2 yards per game), Florida Atlantic junior RB Devin "Motor" Singletary leads the FBS ranks with 14 rushing TDs.

MAC NOTES: Ohio head coach Frank Solich earned his 100th career victory with the Bobcats after a 27-26 victory at Kent State. Solich ranks third all-time in the MAC in career coaching wins. Northern Illinois is off to a 3-0 start in MAC play after a 24-16 win at Ball State. The Huskies lead the MAC in scoring defense at 23.7 points per game. Toledo won the I-75 Trophy with a 52-36 victory over rival Bowling Green for the ninth consecutive year. Toledo WR Cody Thompson and Ohio WR Papi White (35 games) are tied for third in the country in consecutive games with a reception.

Offensive Player of the Week

Middle Tennessee QB Brent Stockstill: The graduate threw for 317 yards and two TDs, and ran for a score in a 34-24 victory over Marshall.

Defensive Player of the Week

Middle Tennessee S Jovante Moffatt: The senior had 17 total tackles and a forced fumble in a 34-24 victory over Marshall.

Special Teams Player of the Week

Florida Atlantic KR Kerrith White Ir.: The junior returned a kickoff 100 yards for a TD in a 52-33 victory over Old Dominion.

East Division Offensive Player of the Week

Ohio OB Nathan Rourke: The junior completed 18 of 20 passes for 284 yards and a TD, and ran for a score in a 27-26 victory over Kent State.

East Division Defensive Player of the Week

Miami LB Brad Koenig: The senior had four tackles, two interceptions and a fumble recovery in a 41-17 victory over Akron.

East Division Special Teams Player of the Week Kent State K Matthew Trickett: The freshman

made four field goals and averaged 40.5 yards on two punts in a loss to Ohio.

West Division Offensive Player of the Week

Toledo QB Eli Peters: The sophomore completed 17 of 35 passes for 184 yards and three TDs in a 52-36 victory over Bowling Green.

West Division Defensive Player of the Week

Western Michigan DT Ralph Holley: The sophomore had six tackles (2.5 for loss), a sack and a forced fumble in a 27-24 victory over Eastern Michigan.

West Division Special Teams Player of the Week

Eastern Michigan P Jake Julien: The sophomore had four punts inside the 20-yard line in a loss to Western Michigan.

FATHERS AND SONS

There are currently nine FBS schools where a player is playing for his head coach father and four of those are in Conference USA. Middle Tennessee coach Rick Stockstill and graduate QB Brent Stockstill, Old Dominion head coach Bobby Wilder and senior LB Derek Wilder, UAB coach Bill Clark and sophomore LS Jacob Clark, and UTEP coach Dana Dimel and graduate FB Winston Dimel are the three C-USA family duos. The Stockstill (2015) and Clark (2017) duos have participated in the Makers Wanted Bahamas Bowl.

MAKERS WANTED BAHAMAS BOWL PARTICIPANT SELECTION

The highest-ranked conference champion by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee from the American Athletic, Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West or Sun Belt will play annually in one of the College Football Playoff bowls (PlayStation Fiesta Bowl or Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl for the 2018 season) if it is not selected for the Playoff Semifinals.

Conference USA has secured guaranteed commitments with six bowl partners for the 2018 season, as well as two secondary agreements: The Makers Wanted Bahamas, Cheribundi Tart Cherry Boca Raton, Gildan New Mexico, Hawai'i, R+L Carriers New Orleans and either the Bad Boy Mowers Gasparilla or the SERVPRO First Responder Bowls are primary agreements. The Walk-On's Independence Bowl in Shreveport, La., is a secondary agreement (should the ACC or SEC not be able to provide a bowl-eligible team), as is the DXL Frisco Bowl. There is no set selection order among C-USA's bowl partners.

The MAC has 2018 primary bowl tie-ins with Makers Wanted Bahamas, Dollar General, DXL Frisco, Famous Idaho Potato, and Raycom Media Camellia Bowls. The MAC has secondary 2018 bowl agreements with the Quick Lane Bowl (should the ACC or Big Ten not be able to provide a bowl-eligible team) and other ESPN owned-and-operated bowl games.

The **2018 Makers Wanted Bahamas Bowl** participants – selected from among bowleligible teams in Conference USA and the Mid-American Conference – will be announced by the bowl, ESPN Events and conference partners once finalized.
