# MAKERS WANTED BAHAMAS BOWL WEEK 12 NOTEBOOK

PASSPORT STAMPED (BOWL-ELIGIBLE TEAMS): C-USA (6): FIU (7-3) Louisiana Tech (7-3), Marshall (6-3), Middle Tennessee (7-3), North Texas (7-3), UAB (9-1); MAC (5): Buffalo (9-2), Eastern Michigan (6-5), Northern Illinois (7-4), Ohio (7-4), Western Michigan (6-5). AT CUSTOMS (ONE VICTORY SHY): C-USA (1): Florida Atlantic (5-5); MAC (2): Miami (5-6), Toledo (5-5).

WEEK 12 PREVIEW: Tuesday, midweek MACtion got off to a strong start as Ball State upset Western Michigan 42-41 in overtime. The loss by the Broncos clinched the MAC West title for Northern Illinois. Wednesday, Ohio beat East leader Buffalo 52-17 to pull within one game of the division lead, and Miami upset West champion Northern Illinois 13-7. Thursday, Toledo will try to get bowl eligible as the Rockets visit Kent State. Saturday, Bowling Green is at Akron.

Thursday in Conference USA, Florida Atlantic will look to gain bowl eligibility as the Owls travel to North Texas. Saturday, FIU, which controls its destiny in the C-USA East race, goes to Charlotte. The Panthers clinch the East with two more victories, while the 49ers need to win their last two to become bowl eligible. Southern Miss, still harboring bowl hopes, hosts Louisiana Tech. In other league games, UTSA visits Marshall and UTEP is at WKU. There are three non-conference games against SEC foes as C-USA West champ UAB visits Texas A&M, Middle Tennessee goes to Kentucky and Rice visits LSU. Also in non-conference action, Old Dominion hosts VMI.

IN THE POLLS: In Conference USA, UAB (9-1 overall, 7-0 C-USA) is No. 25 in the Amway Coaches Poll and receiving votes in the Associated Press poll. In the MAC, Buffalo (9-2, 6-1 MAC) is receiving votes in both the Associated Press and the Amway Coaches polls.

CONFERENCE USA NOTES: Florida Atlantic junior RB Devin Singletary leads the FBS in rushing TDs (20) and total TDs (20). Old Dominion senior WR Travis Fulgham and senior WR Jonathan Duhart rank one-two in the C-USA rankings for receiving yards and receiving yards per game.

MAC NOTES: Eastern Michigan won its fourth consecutive MAC game and became bowl eligible with a 27-7 win over Akron on Nov. 10. In 2018 MAC crossover games, the East and West are tied 7-7.





# **AROUND THE CONFERENCES**

- UAB, which clinched its first division title last Saturday, has been led by the defense as the Blazers lead the FBS in sacks (38), third-down conversion percentage (24.2) and fourth-down conversion percentage (21.4). The Blazers are third in total defense (260.8), fourth in scoring defense (13.3) and passing yards allowed (154.2).
- Buffalo rushed for a season-high 358 yards in a 48-14 win over Kent State on Nov. 6 and improved to 6-0 in league play for the first time since joining the MAC in 1999.

# MAKERS WANTED BAHAMAS BOWL PARTICIPANT SELECTION

The highest-ranked conference champion by the College Football Playoff Selection Committee from the American Athletic, Conference USA, Mid-American, Mountain West or Sun Belt will play annually in one of the College Football Playoff bowls (PlayStation Fiesta Bowl or Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl for the 2018 season) if it is not selected for the Playoff Semifinals.

Conference USA has secured guaranteed commitments with six bowl partners for the 2018 season, as well as two secondary agreements: The Makers Wanted Bahamas, Cheribundi Tart Cherry Boca Raton, Gildan New Mexico, Hawai'i, R+L Carriers New Orleans and either the Bad Boy Mowers Gasparilla or the SERVPRO First Responder Bowls are primary agreements. The Walk-On's Independence Bowl in Shreveport, La., is a secondary agreement (should the ACC or SEC not be able to provide a bowl-eligible team), as is the DXL Frisco Bowl. There is no set selection order among C-USA's bowl partners.

The MAC has 2018 primary bowl tie-ins with Makers Wanted Bahamas, Dollar General, Famous Idaho Potato and Raycom Media Camellia Bowls. The MAC has secondary 2018 bowl agreements with the Quick Lane Bowl (should the ACC or Big Ten not be able to provide a bowleligible team), the DXL Frisco Bowl and other ESPN owned/operated bowl games.

The **2018 Makers Wanted Bahamas Bowl** participants – selected from among bowleligible teams in Conference USA and the Mid-American Conference – will be announced by the bowl, ESPN Events and conference partners once finalized.
