# CHARLOTTE 49ERS GAME NOTES



**CHARLOTTE 49ERS (7-5; C-USA: 5-3)**

**vs. Buffalo Bulls (7-5; MAC: 5-3)**

**MAKERS WANTED BAHAMAS BOWL**



The 49ers have used a current school-record five-game win streak to record the best season in school history and advance to its first-ever bowl game. Charlotte will face Buffalo (7-5; MAC: 5-3) in the Makers Wanted Bahamas Bowl, Friday, Dec. 20 at 2 p.m. (ESPN). Charlotte concluded the regular-season with school records for wins (7) and Conference USA wins (5) along with a slew of offensive and defensive team and individual records.

## WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Charlotte is headed to its first bowl in the program's seven-year football history (five years at the FBS level) ... After a 2-5 start, Charlotte has won five in a row, the longest win streak in school history ... three 49ers were named first team all-C-USA by the league's coaches: RB Benny LeMay, OL Cam Clark, DE Alex Highsmith ... Charlotte set a single-season record with 36.0 sacks ... former walk-on DE Alex Highsmith leads C-USA and ranks 2nd in the FBS with a school-record 14.0 sacks and owns the school's single-game (4.5), season (14.0) and career (20.0) sack records ... Charlotte leads C-USA in rushing offense (213.3/gm) ... RB Benny LeMay leads C-USA in all-Purpose Yards (127.9/gm) and ranks second in rushing (103.7/gm) ... LB Jeff Gemmell is the 49ers all-time leader in career tackles (300).

## REYNOLDS KEYS WIN STREAK

In the last five wins, QB Chris Reynolds has thrown for 1214 yds (242.8/gm) and nine TDs while rushing for 531 yds (106.2/gm) and three TDs ... he's completed 66.1% (80-121) of his passes ... Reynolds has twice set school FBS records for passing yards (336 v. NT; 354 at UTEP) and total offense (432 v. NT; 445 at UTEP) and has run for at least 90 yards in each game, with a career-high 145 v. Marshall ... he has averaged 349.0 yards of total offense.

## MR. 3,000

Sr. RB Benny LeMay (3187 career rushing yards) joined Kalif Phillips (career record 4,020 yards) as the only two 49ers that have eclipsed the 3,000-yard plateau. LeMay (1,037 rushing yds) has had back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons and is the first 49er to reach that milestone, twice. LeMay has tied the school-record with seven 100-yard games, this year.

## SACK ATTACK

DEs Alex Highsmith (14.0) and Markees Watts (9.5) rank 1-3 in C-USA in sacks. The league-leading duo has led Charlotte to a school-record 36 sacks (3.0/gm), blistering the previous record of 21.0. The 49ers rank 15th in the nation with Highsmith second, individually.

After going a perfect 4-0 in November, the 49ers will play in December for the first time in school history.

Charlotte has two players from Buffalo, N.Y.: DT Tommy Doctor (Grand Island H.S.) and WR Tyler Ringwood (Bishop-Timon-St. Jude H.S.). Ringwood served a redshirt season at UB in 2016 before transferring to Erie C.C.

Charlotte has won five straight games and two consecutive road games after a 2-5 start.

OL Cam Clark, a two-time co-captain, owns the 49ers school-record for games played. The Bahamas Bowl will be, fittingly, his 49th career game.

**EIGHT STRAIGHT GAMES WITH A PASSING TD**

R-So. QB Chris Reynolds, who began his career as a walk-on, has emerged as one of C-USA's top QBs. Reynolds has completed 62.2% of his passes (166-267) for 2,366 yards (197.2/gm). He leads C-USA in passing efficiency (155.07), ranks 2nd in yards/completion (14.25) and third in passing TDs (21). He is fourth in points responsible for (166) and has had a TD pass in the last eight games.

**OFFENSIVE OUTPUT**

Charlotte leads C-USA in rushing and time of possession and ranks in the top four in scoring and passing efficiency. The 49ers rushed for 200+ eight times and scored 40+ points three times. 49ers are on pace to shatter existing FBS records for rushing (176.2, 2016) and scoring (25.2; 2016) in a season.

RB **Benny LeMay**, a Doak Walker candidate and preseason all-C-USA selection, has 100+ yards in a school-record seven games, leads C-USA in all-purpose yards (127.9/gm), is 2nd in rushing (103.7/gm) and total TDs (13 TD: 9 rushing; 4 receiving), despite missing two games.

R-Sr. DE **Alex Highsmith** is the 49ers all-time sack king, with school records for career (20.0), single-season (14.0) and single-game (4.5) sacks. A Bednarik Watch Lister and preseason all-C-USA choice, Highsmith leads C-USA with 14.0 sacks and ranks 2nd in the nation.

**COMEBACK KIDS**

Charlotte staged second-half comebacks in wins over North Texas, UTEP and Marshall and scored the game-winning touchdown in the fourth quarter, each time.

**vs. Marshall (W, 24-13), Trained 13-10 after three quarters:**

Charlotte was down 10-0 in the first half and trailed 13-10 heading into the fourth quarter before outscoring Marshall 14-0 in the final frame to clinch bowl eligibility with a 24-13 victory.

- Charlotte outscored Marshall 17-3 in decisive second half
- Chris Reynolds (career-high 145 yds rushing); Benny LeMay (100 ru.); Victor Tucker (121 rec)
- Victor Tucker scores 2 TDs (1 rush; 1 rec) in 4th quarter
- Defense held Marshall to 230 yards of total offense (98 in 2nd half)
- Tucker pulls in clinching TD pass with 00:48 left on 4th and 10 from the MU 25.

**vs. North Texas (W, 39-38), Trained 35-21 after three quarters:**

Charlotte rallied from a 14-point deficit in the fourth quarter to overtake North Texas, 39-38, in the 49ers largest fourth-quarter comeback at the FBS level. Charlotte scored three touchdowns to outscore North Texas 18-3 in the fourth quarter and won the game on Chris Reynolds' 34-yard TD pass to Victor Tucker with 18 seconds left. Here's the rest of the story:

- Reynolds put up 432 yds of total offense (336 passing yards; 96 rushing yards)
- Reynolds passed for three touchdowns and ran for another
- RB Benny LeMay posted a season-high 155 rushing yards and three TDs
- WRs Victor Tucker (144 yds); Tyler Ringwood (110 yds) posted career-high 100-yd games
- Charlotte DT Timmy Horne blocked a 43-yard FGA in the 4th quarter
- Markees Watts tied a school-record with 2.0 sacks, including a strip sack on the final play
- Jeff Gemmell led the 49ers with a team-high 12 tackles and recovered the final fumble

**at UTEP (W, 28-21), Tied 21-21 after three quarters:**

Trailing 21-7 at the half, Charlotte had three, third quarter scoring drives (2 FG; TD) to tie the score at 21. In the fourth quarter, DT Timmy Horne stopped the Miners on 4th-and-one from the CHA 4-yard line to extinguish a potential go-ahead scoring drive. The 49ers took the ensuing possession 95 yards and scored the game-winning TD on a 19-yard pass from Chris Reynolds to Jacob Hunt. More news:

- Reynolds broke his own school-record with 445 yds of total offense  
School FBS record 354 passing yards; 91 rushing yards
- Reynolds passed for two touchdowns
- WR Cam Dollar had a career-high 157 receiving yards
- Charlotte DT Timmy Horne stopped a 4th-and-one at the CHA 4 with the score tied 21-21
- Charlotte drove 95 yards on the ensuing possession for GW TD
- With UTEP in the red zone, Henry Segura had an INT at the CHA 16 with 1:03 left to seal the W.

**Highsmith a PFF All-America**

R-Sr. DE **Alex Highsmith** was named third-team all-America at Defensive End by Pro Football Focus.

**Highsmith On Burlsworth****Watch List**

R-Sr. DE **Alex Highsmith (Wilmington, N.C.)** has been nominated for the Burlsworth Trophy which is awarded to the most outstanding football player who began his career as a walk-on.

Highsmith joined the 49ers as a walk-on in 2015 and was awarded a scholarship in the summer of 2017, following his red-shirt freshman season.

He has since gone on to become the 49ers all-time sack king, earn first team all-Conference USA honors, land on the Chuck Bednarik Watch List and be tabbed by every preseason publication as one of the top players in C-USA.

**Gemmell Breaks Record for Career Tackles**

With his 268th career tackle in Charlotte's 34-20 C-USA victory over Middle Tennessee, R-Sr. LB **Jeff Gemmell (Wake Forest, N.C.)** became the 49ers all-time leader in career tackles.

Gemmell has 300 career tackles, breaking the previous record of 267, set by Karrington King from 2014-17.

The three-year starter and two-time co-captain has been either first or second for the 49ers in tackles in each of the last two years.

**O-Line Earns Spot on Moore Award Midseason Honor Roll**

Charlotte's O-Line was one of 24 to be named to the Joe Moore Award Mid-Season Honor Roll. The award is presented to the Most Outstanding Offensive Line Unit.

Charlotte, which leads C-USA in rushing offense and is second in sacks allowed, was the lone C-USA school listed.

# WILL HEALY

The sitting area in Will Healy's office is lit up by two lamps. Converted trophies, really. One is an MVP trophy presented by the Atlanta Touchdown Club to the top player in the Southeastern Conference. The other is for the SEC's Most Valuable Offensive Lineman, presented by the Birmingham TD Club.

Both were presented in 1948.

And both were awarded to Healy's grandfather, Bill Healy, an all-America tackle at Georgia Tech.

For Healy, football is a family affair. His father, uncle and grandad all played at Georgia Tech. Another uncle played at Vanderbilt and another uncle at The Citadel. He brought those family ties with him to Charlotte.

"I come from a football family," Healy explains. "I grew up around the game."

In addition to the two lamps and, of course, several family pictures, Healy also has images of players he has recruited who are "unbelievable examples of why you coach." A good mix of reminders of those who have had an impact on his life, and those whose lives he has impacted.

Through football.

"My Mom and Dad missed one college football game and I didn't play a whole lot," Healy notes. "I have unbelievably supportive parents and family but I still have coaches who have made a tremendous impact. We have a lot of players who don't have that structure and stability. If I had coaches that made that big of an impact in my life, imagine the opportunity for me to make an impact for guys who don't have that in their lives."

And while coaching is often about wins and losses, game-winning drives and third-down stops, Healy knows there can and should be another level.

"If we are doing it the way I would like, it has so much more to do with who I want them to be after football than it does with winning football games," Healy said. "Sometime you lose sight of that. We pride ourselves on teaching life lessons that transcend the game of football. I love trying to make an impact and a difference. I love having the opportunity to provide consistency, love and discipline to some guys who need it, want it, crave it and will be better for it."

Healy, an Eddie Robinson Award winner as the National FCS Coach of the Year in 2017, has led the 49ers to their first winning season, their most wins and their first-ever bowl bid in his first season as head coach.

Along the way, he led chants, crowd-surfed in his locker room and ignited Club Lit after victories.

He was selected as head coach for the 49ers in December, 2018. Known for infusing energy and enthusiasm into his programs, he engineered one of the greatest turnarounds in college football history during his three years at Austin Peay. A gifted recruiter, he helped attract top five FCS recruiting classes in four of his last five years at the FCS level.

"I am very pleased to welcome Will and Emily Healy to the UNC Charlotte community," said UNC Charlotte Chancellor Phil Dubois. "Will's energy, coaching success, and passion for this job make him an excellent choice to lead the Charlotte 49er football program."

"We are thrilled that Will and his family will be joining Niner Nation," said 49ers Director of Athletics Mike Hill. "When we set out to hire a coach, our goal was to find

someone who will energize and transform the 49ers into a championship program. Will is that man. Across the country he is recognized as one of the top up-and-coming coaches in the nation. His name came up time and again throughout our search as someone who is a relentless, proven recruiter who has seen remarkable success. On top of that, he places a high value on culture and developing student-athletes."

Head coach Will Healy introduced a high-energy; high-enthusiasm atmosphere to the program in spring ball.

"In my first conversation with Mike Hill, I told him that I would walk to Charlotte to talk to him about this job," said Healy. "This is a special place – a young football program with tremendous University leadership located in a first-class city. We can recruit and develop excellent student-athletes here and we can compete at a very high level."

Again, Healy was part of a big turnaround, helping the Mocs jump from 1-11 prior to his arrival to a 6-5 mark in his first season.



The Mocs won or shared Southern Conference Championships in each of Healy's last three seasons and made the FCS playoffs in 2014 and 2015. In his final season with the team, Chattanooga went 9-4 and defeated Fordham, 50-20, to advance to the FCS Quarterfinals.

A native of Chattanooga, Healy served as quarterbacks coach, wide receivers coach, passing-game coordinator and recruiting coordinator for the Mocs.

Healy joined Austin Peay in 2016, and, according to Yahoo Sports, signed the FCS's number one recruiting class in 2017. He parlayed that talent into an 8-4 season that included a 7-1 mark in the Ohio Valley Conference. The Governors, who had gone 1-45 over the previous four seasons, snapped a 29-game losing streak, which was the longest in the nation. Three of the Governors' four losses came to FBS schools and the team tied the school record for most wins.



Austin Peay broke a slew of records during the 2017 season, especially on the offensive side of the ball. The Gobs finished sixth in the nation and set a school record with 3,105 yards rushing. They also set records for rushing touchdowns (32), total touchdowns (45), yards per game (387.2), total offense (4,646), and total points (327).

Healy received the 2017 STATS FCS Eddie Robinson Award as the National FCS Coach of the Year and was named the OVC's Roy Kidd Coach of the Year.

In 2018, the Governors (5-6) posted a five-win season in back-to-back years for the first time since 1984-85 and a two-year record of 13-6 vs. FCS opponents. In the 25 years prior to 2017, APSU won at least five games just twice.

Healy spent seven years as an assistant coach at Chattanooga before taking over as head coach at Austin Peay.

In addition to his recruiting skills, Healy has shown a penchant for developing quarterback talent. As passing game coordinator, he helped develop Jacob Huesman into a three-time Southern Conference Offensive Player of the Year and a STATS FCS Second-Team All-America. As QB coach in 2009, he worked with BJ Coleman, who went on to pass for more than 2,300 yards and 17 touchdowns with just four interceptions. Coleman was a seventh-round selection of the Green Bay Packers in the 2012 NFL Draft.

Healy was a two-time all-state quarterback at Chattanooga's Boyd-Buchanan High School. He was named all-state honorable mention twice and was a four-time all-region selection. A Tennessee "Mr. Football" finalist as a senior, Healy holds the Chattanooga area career passing record with more than 7,700 yards.

A 2008 graduate of the University of Richmond, he was a team captain on the Spiders' 2008 FCS National Title team.

Healy's father, Rob, was a star at Georgia Tech and his uncle, Chip, was an All-America linebacker at Vanderbilt.

Healy received his bachelor's degree from Richmond in Rhetoric and Communication Studies in December 2008. Healy married the former Emily Broyles in 2012. They have two children: Eli and Wynn.

He welcomes the families of his staff to practice and the facility. He wants them around. This spring, he conducted more than one interview with Eli on his shoulders or Wynn in his arms.

First game of the Will Healy Era

49ers scored 49 points, their most at the FBS level



Charlotte scored five touchdowns in the first half as Will Healy notched an appropriate 49-28 victory over Gardner-Webb before a sellout crowd of 16,119 in his first game as the 49ers' head coach.

Senior running back Benny LeMay and red-shirt sophomore quarterback Chris Reynolds both had a pair of touchdown runs and Reynolds also threw for a three-yard score as Charlotte (1-0) put up its most points in the FBS era.

LeMay had 16 carries for 120 yards and the two TDs, including a 65-yard burst to close the first half. That 65-yard TD run is the ninth-longest in school history and the longest of LeMay's career. It was his eighth career 100-yard rushing performance.

Reynolds was 14-of-20 for 136 yards, a TD and one interception. He split time, as scheduled, with starter Brett Kean, who was 4-of-8 for 50 yards with a TD and two picks. Kean threw a 31-yard touchdown pass to Fr. Micaleous Elder for Charlotte's final score.

Elder and Rogers scored TDs in their first collegiate game.

Charlotte held the Bulldogs (0-1) to 56 yards of total offense in the first half and gave up just 60 yards passing for the game. The 49ers rushed for 322 yards, fourth-most in school history.

**28 SECOND-QUARTER POINTS**

Charlotte scored 28 points in the second quarter to break open a 7-0 game for a 21-point halftime advantage, 35-14.

On his second possession as QB, Reynolds scored on a three-yard run to complete a 12-play, 79-yard drive. He hit RB Aaron McAllister for a three-yard touchdown on his next possession. The 49ers scored on a blocked punt when Solomon Rogers scooped up BJ Turner's block and raced 16 yards for the TD. LeMay closed out the second quarter scoring with his 65-yard run with 40 seconds left in the half. The 28 points match the most by the 49ers in the second quarter of a game in school history.

Fight as they did, and they did fight, the 49ers came out on the short end of a high-scoring battle, 56-41, at Appalachian State.

Charlotte (1-1) is the first Mountaineer opponent to score over 19 points in Boone since 2017. App State had gone nine straight home games allowing 19 points or less and the last team to score over 40 in Boone was Miami in 2016.

R-So. QB Chris Reynolds threw for career highs with 296 yards and four touchdowns -- 49er highs against an FBS opponent -- and Benny LeMay rushed for 118 yards and scored three TDs.

"We responded to adversity and there's a lot of fight in this football team," said head coach Will Healy. "We never laid down and that will be an MO of our football team. We've got a group of really competitive coaches and players and were going to fight for 60 minutes. We did that today against a great football team in a great environment and gave ourselves an opportunity to win late."

The Mountaineers (2-0) scored on the first play from scrimmage, on an 87-yard run, but first half touchdowns by LeMay of three and 58 yards had the 49ers within one, 14-13, late in the first half.

A strip sack recovered by App State deep in Charlotte territory set up a 10-yard score on one possession and a blocked punt was returned for a TD on the next to give App a 28-13 halftime cushion.

Charlotte scored four second half touchdowns and clawed as close as eight with 3:17 to play. Reynolds threw four TD passes in the second half, including two to Victor Tucker in the fourth quarter to keep the 49ers within striking distance.

App State scored two third quarter TDs to open up a 42-20 lead but Reynolds found LeMay for a five-yard TD and hit Tucker for a 23-yard score with 8:20 to play to cut the lead to 42-34. The teams traded TDs again to make it 49-41 with 3:17 to play.

**LEMAY'S SCORING STREAK**

C-USA scoring leader Benny LeMay scored a touchdown for the fourth straight game. With three TDs, he has multiple touchdowns in both games of 2019 and has 20 career touchdowns, passing Hasaan Klugh (19 TDs) for third all-time.

Third straight game scoring 40+ points



Charlotte set school records, posted an array of firsts and piled up 31 first half points in its 52-17 home victory over visiting UMass.

The 52 points are the most scored by the 49ers against an FBS opponent. Charlotte has now scored over 40 points in three straight games for the first time in school history. WR Tyler Ringwood and RB Ishod Finger both scored two TDs - the first of their careers.

Charlotte (2-1) scored on its first three offensive possessions and added a pick-six by r-so. linebacker Henry Segura to race to a 28-0 lead just minutes into the second quarter. Even after UMass (0-3) scored a touchdown with 17 seconds left in the half, Charlotte responded with a 26-yard rush by Benny LeMay to set up a 53-yard field goal by So. Jonathan Cruz as time expired.

Leading 31-10 at the half, Charlotte scored on its first possession of the second half and added two more TDs to run its total to 52 points. The 49ers finished with seven touchdowns and have now scored 20 on the young season.

## 28-0; 1:03 INTO 2ND QTR:

R-So. Cameron Dollar pulled in a 46-yard TD catch just 1:38. On the next possession, QB Chris Reynolds was 6-for-8 for 46 yards to set up Ishod Finger's first career TD on a one-yard run. After Segura's 49-yard interception return, Reynolds found Micaleous Elder for a 39-yard strike to set up a five-yard touchdown pass to Ringwood for the junior's first career score.

49ers First Game Against Nation's Top-Ranked Team

Alex Highsmith Ties Single-Season Record with 5th Sack



Charlotte (2-2) dropped a 52-10 decision at #1/#1 Clemson (4-0). It was the 49ers first game against the nation's top-ranked team.

The defending national champs ran out to a 38-3 halftime lead thanks in part to two Trevor Lawrence TD passes and a 66-yard interception return. Lawrence hit Tee Higgins for a 58-yard TD on the Tigers second play and K'Von Wallace added his 66-yard pick six to put the Tigers ahead 14-0, 4:36 into the game.

"They came out and got after us," said 49ers head coach Will Healy. "I'd loved to have played better today. I think we made huge strides last week. I think we have the pieces to be a really good football team and compete with everybody that's on our schedule the rest of the way but we cannot continue to make the same mistakes and expect a different result"

The Tigers added three second-quarter touchdowns while Charlotte drove 68 yards for a 24-yard field goal from Jonathan Cruz.

Charlotte finished with 153 rushing yards, led by Benny LeMay's 81-yard performance. It was the most rushing yards that Clemson has allowed to an opposing player, this year. The Tigers only allowed 68 rushing yards combined in its previous two games (53, Texas A&M; 15, Syracuse). Aaron McAllister added 36 rushing yards to eclipse 1,000 career rushing yards.

Charlotte scored its touchdown in the third quarter after recovering a muffed punt on the Tiger 12-yard line. QB Chris Reynolds scampered in from eight yards out to make it 45-10.

**HIGHSMITH'S SACK ATTACK:** Alex Highsmith had his fifth sack, tying the season record set by Larry Ogunjobi in 2014, in game 4. It was his 11th career sack, two shy of Ogunjobi's mark of 13.0.

**RUNNING OF THE BULL:** Benny LeMay (@32Youngbull) rushed for 81 yards, tying his own mark for rushing yards against a Power 5 opponent. Last year, LeMay rushed for 81 yards at Tennessee.

Alex Highsmith breaks season sack record in game 5  
WR Victor Tucker Notches First 100-Yard Game of Year



Each time Charlotte (2-3; C-USA: 0-1) closed to within striking distance, Florida Atlantic (3-2; C-USA: 1-0) mustered an answer on its way to a 45-27 win in the Conference USA opener for both teams.

As the first half was winding down, Chris Reynolds hit Jacob Hunt for a one-yard TD pass to pull the 49ers within three, 17-14 with 3:26 to play. But FAU was able to drive for a score in the final minute to extend the lead to 10 at the half.

Charlotte scored on its first possession of the second half on a 16-yard pass from Reynolds to Aaron McAllister, to, again, make it a three-point game, 24-21. FAU, however, scored on its next two possessions to extend its lead to 38-21 by the end of the third quarter. Both teams tacked on a touchdown in the fourth quarter.

**STATS THAT MATTER:** FAU put up 557 yards of total offense, including 321 in the passing game (QB Chris Robison 20-of-27, 312 yards, 2 TD, 1 INT), and Charlotte was held to a season-low 52 yards rushing.

**TRICK PLAY:** Chris Reynolds (15-of-28, 208 yards, 3 TD, 2 INT), who threw three touchdown passes, nearly caught one as well. Late in the first half, with Charlotte inside the FAU 30, wideout Cameron Dollar came around the right side on a reverse and threw to Reynolds who rambled to the one-yard line for a 28-yard completion. Reynolds rolled out and hit TE Jacob Hunt on the next play to pull Charlotte within three, 17-14.

**SACK RECORD:** DE Alex Highsmith, who ranks sixth in the FBS in sacks, broke the 49ers single-season sack record in just the fifth game of the season. Highsmith recorded his sixth sack to snap Larry Ogunjobi's single-season record of 5.0, set in 2014.

**PASSING TOUCHDOWNS:** Charlotte scored four touchdowns, three through the air. The 49ers now have 12 passing TDs through five games. Last year, they finished with the season with 10. Reynolds threw TD passes to Victor Tucker (24 yards), Jacob Hunt (one yard) and Aaron McAllister (16 yards).

Charlotte standout running back Benny LeMay put up a career-best 234 yards from scrimmage, including his fourth 100-yard rushing game of the year, but FIU was able to score seven touchdowns to pull past the 49ers, 48-23.

Charlotte (2-4; 0-2) took a 10-7 lead into the second quarter, but FIU (3-3; 1-2) ran off 21 points to take a 28-17 lead into the half.

LeMay's 48-yard burst on the first possession led to a Jonathan Cruz field goal. Later in the first quarter, he pulled in a 35-yard pass to set up Aaron McAllister's eight-yard TD run to give the 49ers a 10-7 lead.

In the second quarter, he caught a 43-yard TD pass from Chris Reynolds to bring the 49ers within four, 21-17.

Charlotte rushed for 217 yards for its fourth game this season with over 200 rushing yards.

The Panthers added three second-half TDs to outdistance the 49ers.

**KEY PLAY:** Holding a four-point lead in the final two minutes of the half, FIU QB James Morgan was sacked by Markees Watts and fumbled. The ball squirted out of the ensuing scrum and D'Vonte Price scooped it up and ran for 34 yards to set up the Panthers' touchdown just before the half.

RB Benny LeMay Scores on Season-Best 47-Yard Catch



Charlotte battled through a tight first half before homestanding WKU pulled away to remain unbeaten in league play, 30-14.

"Once we did settle in, we did some really good things on defense," said coach Will Healy. "I've never had a concern about how we were going to be defensively - never had a concern about how our players play or how our coaches coach. Today I think you saw a little more of what the standard should be here on defense."

The 49ers took the early lead, 7-0, on Ishod Finger's fourth TD of the season. Finger rushed in from four yards out following an opening 7:48 minute drive that covered 75 yards on 14 plays. It was the longest drive in terms of time of play for the 49ers this season. WKU answered with a pair of TDs to go ahead 14-7. The second score came on a 69-yard TD pass in which QB Ty Storey handed off, but received a pitch back and threw long to Lucky Jackson.

WR Victor Tucker pulled in Chris Reynolds 34-yard pass with 18 seconds left to give Charlotte a dramatic, 39-38, come-from-behind win over North Texas. Charlotte trailed by 14 in the fourth quarter but scored 18 points to claim its first C-USA victory.

"To be rewarded with a game like tonight, when it's 14 points most of the game and the belief these guys have," said Will Healy. "We talk about it all the time. Belief before behavior. If you put a lot into it, then its going to mean so much more to you when you win. That sums up tonight. These guys put a lot into it."

RB Benny LeMay ran for a season-high 155 yards and scored three times, Reynolds threw for a career-high 336 yards and three TDs and the 49ers blocked a 43-yard FGA in the fourth quarter and strip-sacked QB Mason Fine on the final play of the game.

Reynolds connected with LeMay on a 31-yard TD pass to start the fourth and bring the 49ers within eight, 35-27. 49ers defensive back Marquill Osborne blocked Ethan Mooney's 43-yard field goal attempt on the ensuing NT drive. Charlotte answered with a 77-yard drive, capped by LeMay's five-yard TD run to make it 35-33.

Mooney kicked a 51-yard FG with 1:12 to play to make it 38-33.

Facing 2nd-and-20 on the final drive, Reynolds hit Tyler Ringwood for a 37-yarder in North Texas territory. On the next play, Reynolds scrambled before sending his 34-yard pass towards Tucker in the end zone.

Gemmell Breaks All-Time Record for Career Tackles  
McAllister (104); Reynolds (103) Rush for over 100

"From start to finish this is probably the best we have played all year," said head coach Will Healy. "Great team win. Huge win."

Charlotte scored TDs on its first three possessions to pull away from Middle Tennessee for its second straight victory. The 14-point win is the 49ers' second largest against a C-USA opponent.

Despite missing C-USA's top rusher Benny LeMay, who was sidelined with injury, Charlotte piled up 248 rushing yards and three touchdowns against the Blue Raiders. RB Aaron McAllister, who started in place of the injured LeMay, rushed for 104 yards and two TDs. QB Chris Reynolds rushed for a career-high 103 yards and a TD. He also threw for 192 yards (14-of-21) and completed a TD pass for the 5th straight game.

Defensively, Charlotte surrendered a touchdown on the opening drive but held the Blue Raiders to just 47 yards the rest of the half in building a 24-7 lead at the break. Charlotte's defense teamed for a combined 8.0 tackles for loss by seven different players and two turnovers. Safety Marquavis Gibbs led the 49ers with eight tackles while Jeff Gemmell added seven to become the school's all-time leader with 269 career takedowns.

**GOLD RUSH:** Charlotte's first three TDs all came on the ground. RB Aaron McAllister scored on a two-yard run and a five-yard rush while Reynolds scored on a 19-yard scamper. The duo combined for 207 rushing yards. The last time Charlotte had two 100-yard rushers in a game was at FAU in 2018 when Benny LeMay (173) and Hasaan Klugh (102) doubled up in Charlotte's 27-24 victory.

**GEMMELL'S CAREER MARK:** LB Jeff Gemmell had seven tackles to give him 269 in his career, breaking the all-time record of 267 held by Karrington King.

**DUNK CAN:** Charlotte broke out its turnover Dunk Can, twice. S Jacione Fugate had his first career INT. LB Brelin Faison-Walden raced down QB Asher O'Hara on a 26-yard run deep into 49ers territory to force a fumble recovered by Nafees Lyon.

Niners Post Third Straight C-USA Win

Reynolds Breaks 49ers FBS record with 354 passing yds



R-So. QB Chris Reynolds threw for a school FBS record 354 yards, four shy of the overall record, and two touchdowns to lead the 49ers to a thrilling second half comeback in their 28-21 victory over UTEP.

The win, Charlotte's third straight, was the 49ers first road win of the year. In two of the the three wins, Charlotte rallied from 14 points down in the second half.

Charlotte trailed 21-7 at the half but posted three scores in a dominant third quarter to tie the game at 21-21. The 49ers put up 192 yards of offense and scored 14 points while holding the Miners scoreless with just 19 yards in the frame. So. K Jonathan Cruz kicked a pair of field goals in the third and Ishod Finger added a three-yard touchdown run to help Charlotte knot the score.

In the fourth, DT Timmy Horne shut down a 4th-and-1 from the CHA4 to stop the Miners' potential go-ahead scoring drive. On the ensuing possession, Reynolds led a game-winning 95-yard drive, capped by a 19-yard TD pass to Jacob Hunt. Henry Segura's INT at the CHA16 with 1:03 left ended the Miners' final drive.

Reynolds threw a TD pass to Tyler Ringwood in the first half and finished the day with 445 yards of total offense (354 passing; 91 rushing) to break his own school record.

"The resiliency of our football team showed once again," said 49ers head coach Will Healy. "We made some huge plays down the stretch. Our defense pitched a shut out in the second half. Crucial interception to end the game when they're driving and a lot of fun to celebrate with these guys because they've worked really, really hard at establishing a culture."

**DOLLAR'S DAY:** R-So. WR Cameron Dollar set career highs with 9 receptions and 157 receiving yards. The 157 yards are the most by a 49ers' receiver this year. Charlotte has had six 100-yard receiving games this year, including four in the last four games.

School-Record Sixth Win; Bowl Eligible for First Time  
LeMay Cracks 3,000 Career Rushing Yards



Bowl eligible. Six Wins. Four in a row. Senior Day. Add in the enthusiastic home crowd despite the constant rain and this had all the makings of the greatest day in Charlotte 49ers football history.

And Victor Tucker's 25-yard touchdown catch in the final minute on fourth and 10, with his helmet being ripped off, to seal the deal, has all the makings of one of the biggest plays.

Charlotte's 24-13 victory over C-USA frontrunner Marshall (7-4; C-USA: 5-2) included yet another come-from-behind effort, another virtuoso performance from quarterback Chris Reynolds, who keeps finding ways to win and a stout defensive effort that saw the Thundering Herd held to 13 points, the second-fewest points Charlotte (6-5; C-USA: 4-3) has ever allowed in a C-USA game.

Charlotte rallied from a 10-0 deficit to tie the score in the third quarter. Marshall regained the lead 13-10 and held that edge going into the fourth quarter. But Tucker scored a pair of touchdowns Charlotte's third come-from-behind win in the last four games.

Charlotte has now won four straight and snapped Marshall's five-game win streak. Charlotte has notched a school-record six wins and reached bowl eligibility for the first time in school history.

**TUCKER'S TOUCHDOWNS** Victor Tucker scored on a five-yard run to give Charlotte its first lead and pulled in an acrobatic 25-yard catch in the end zone on 4th-and-1 to ice the victory with :48 left.

"We can run it and try to waste a little more time or we can go for the jugular. I think that's our mentality right now. We're not going to be passive. We're not going to hope that we can hold them. Let's go after them," said head coach Will Healy.

**REYNOLDS STAYS HOT** QB Chris Reynolds threw a touchdown pass for the seventh straight game, rushed for over 100 yards for the second time in three games and engineered a pair of fourth quarter touchdown drives. He finished with a career-high 145 rushing yards and threw for 166 yards.

**LEMAY CLEARS 3000** With 100 yards rushing, RB Benny LeMay became the second 49er to rush for 3,000 yards in his career.

**DEFENSE LOCKS DOWN**

Charlotte held Marshall to just 230 yards of total offense, the second-fewest total yards Marshall has put up this season, and held Marshall without an offensive touchdown.

The stars shined in Charlotte's final regular-season game, a 38-22 victory at Old Dominion, Saturday. None more brightly than redshirt senior defensive end Alex Highsmith, who finished the day with a team-high 12 tackles, a school-record 4.5 sacks, a school-record 5.0 tackles for loss along with a forced fumble, QB hurry and a pass break-up.

Highsmith's defensive effort complemented an offensive outing that included 100-yard performances from running back Benny LeMay and wideout Victor Tucker. R-So. quarterback Chris Reynolds threw for 166 yards and two touchdowns and ran for another 96 yards.

The win was the 49ers (7-5; C-USA: 5-3) fifth straight and gave the 49ers school records for wins in a season and C-USA wins in a season and guaranteed Charlotte's first winning season.

And to bring to life the grandeur of this quarter-century milestone, the league also unveiled a special edition of the C-USA logo and its signature stark with a silver metallic finish to represent its 25th anniversary and the magnitude of its illustrious history.

## Building The Next Generation of Great College Programs

Conference USA continues to compete and promote the success of its student-athletes. The league has adapted to the ever-changing landscape of collegiate athletics in its 25-year history, but the commitment to excellence, integrity, leadership and its student athletes in competition, academics and community is unwavering.

Debating in 1995, Conference USA teams have combined for 106 bowl appearances in football, 108 NCAA Tournament appearances in basketball, including three Final Fours, 73 NCAA baseball appearances including six College World Series berths, 92 NCAA soccer tournament appearances including four trips to the College Cup, and 40 individual national champions in track and field and cross country.

Success is not limited to athletic achievement as more than 237 Conference USA student-athletes have garnered Academic All-America honors, and more than 794 have achieved academic all-district laurels and thousands of student-athletes have earned a college degree.

Conference USA sponsors competition in 19 sports – nine for men (baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, soccer, tennis, and indoor and outdoor track and field) and 10 for women (basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, tennis, indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball).

The league promotes the scholar-athlete ideal, honoring outstanding academic achievement with numerous conference-sponsored awards, including the Commissioner's Honor Roll and the Commissioner's Academic Medal as well as sport-specific All-Academic teams.

A native of Oakland, Calif., Philip L. Dubois attended the University of California, Davis, where he graduated in 1972 with highest honors with an undergraduate degree in political science, including election to Phi Beta Kappa. He then earned master's (1974) and doctoral (1978) degrees in the field from the University of Wisconsin-Madison.

Dubois began his academic career in 1976 at the University of California, Davis. Over the next 15 years, he rose through the faculty and administrative ranks to full professor and held various administrative posts, including associate vice chancellor for academic affairs.

In 1991, Dubois was recruited to UNC Charlotte, where he spent the next six and a half years as provost and vice chancellor for academic affairs. Under his leadership, UNC Charlotte opened its first classroom facility in Uptown Charlotte and launched its first doctoral programs.

In 1997, Dubois was named president of the University of Wyoming. In that role, he led the development and implementation of comprehensive academic, support services, and capital construction plans for Wyoming's only university. Private contributions to the institution more than quadrupled during his tenure.

He was honored in 2004 by the Council for Advancement and Support of Education (CASE) with its District VI Chief Executive Leadership Award.

On March 18, 2005, Dubois was named UNC Charlotte's fourth chancellor, and he assumed that role on July 15. As the University's leader, Dubois has focused his efforts on building UNC Charlotte's visibility and support in the greater Charlotte region; has led long-range planning to accommodate expected enrollment of 35,000 students; has championed a number of key capital construction projects, including completion of EPIC and UNC Charlotte Center City, located in the heart of the Queen City; has improved the efficiency and effectiveness of critical business processes; and implemented an intercollegiate football program that began in the fall 2013.

Dr. Dubois and his wife, Lisa Lewis Dubois, have three adult children: Logan, Taylor, and Ali. They are the first family to occupy the chancellor's official campus residence, Bissell House.

On July 30, 2019, Dubois announced that he would be retiring, effective June 30, 2020.

Mike has been a key member of our team at Florida since 1993 and over the years, we worked side by side on everything from developing a vision for the athletic department, to hiring coaches, to making daily decisions within the organization. He has worked hard for this opportunity and he is one of the brightest people I have been around in this business."

Mike Hill became the seventh director of athletics in Charlotte 49ers' history, Feb. 28, 2018 and has had a busy start to his tenure.

Professionally, Hill has hired six new head coaches, a Deputy A.D. for External Affairs and an Executive A.D. He has also begun a 10-year athletics facility master plan as well as an athletics brand assessment. In May 2019, he brought the inaugural "Next Chair" national basketball coaching symposium to campus.

Personally, he married Jessica James-Hill, welcomed a daughter, Ellie, and watched his son, Luke, graduate high school and enroll at Florida.

Hill was formerly the Executive Associate Athletics Director for External Affairs at the University of Florida.

"Mike has a deep background in a highly successful athletic program from a 'Power Five' conference, so he has played lead roles in hiring and working with highly successful head coaches, negotiating multi-million dollar media agreements and facilities naming rights, and being on point in external relations for the Gators. But we were equally impressed by his sports administration experience and his dedication to the welfare and personal development of student-athletes," Chancellor Philip Dubois said of Hill's hiring.

Hill comes to the 49ers after a nearly 25-year career with the University of Florida Athletic Association. He spent the last six years as the Gators' Executive Associate Athletics Director for External Affairs. As a primary advisor to the Director of Athletics, he helped lead searches in the hiring of head coaches. He either led searches, helped hire or managed several head coaches, including Mike White and Billy Donovan (men's basketball), Urban Meyer and Dan Mullen (football) and Amanda Butler (women's basketball). He was the direct supervisor for men's basketball and men's tennis at Florida. He served on the administrative fundraising team that developed strategies, cultivated donors and secured major gifts. He chaired the 100 Years of Florida Football fundraiser, coordinated marketing and promotions campaigns for 21 sports and managed corporate partner relationships with Nike, Pepsi and Gatorade.

In his capacity in the Gators' Department of Athletics, Hill served on the University of Florida Branding Steering Committee, had a six-year stint as the chair of the Southeastern Conference Marketing Directors and served on the SEC Fan Experience Working Group. He has been on the Climb for Cancer Board of Directors since 2009.

Prior to joining the University of Florida, Hill was an Assistant to the Athletics Director at Ball State University and served as Assistant Executive Director of the Blockbuster Bowl from 1990-92. A 1990 graduate of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, he earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in Political Science and Communications. He was a student assistant in the school's Sports Information Office from 1988-90.

For his part, Hill, who has a personal background with the Carolinas, saw the move to the 49ers program as a trip home.

"This is personal for me," noted Hill, who grew up in Clemson, S.C., and attended the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. "This is home."

He attended the Charlotte Hornets first basketball game. He's a Carolina Panthers football fan. He watched the 49ers 1977 Final Four game vs. Marquette from his grandparents living room, in Charlotte. He's seen the Avett Brothers perform 16 times (Seth Avett attended UNC Charlotte).

"We're not in it to be ordinary. We're in it to be extraordinary," Hill said. "Gold is the standard."

# MEDIA PARTNERS 730 THE GAME

The Charlotte 49ers partner with 730 The Game ESPN Charlotte as the flagship radio station for the Charlotte Sports Network from Learfield IMG College. 730 The Game carries all football and men's basketball games, selected women's basketball and baseball games and is the home of Niners Live, the Charlotte 49ers Coaches Show.

The radio crew for 49ers football is made up of the longtime Voice of the 49ers, Matt Swierad and former Carolina Panther Al Wallace as analyst. Bobby Rosinski and Walker Mehl, who co-host 730 The Game's Wake Up Call, weekday mornings, split time as the sideline reporter. 730 The Game's college football hour will be broadcast from the 49ers tailgate area on home Saturdays followed by the 49ers pre-game show, one hour before kick.

Charlotte's C-USA games are broadcast by Conference USA's broadcast partners. Four of the 49ers six home games can be seen on either ESPN3 or ESPN+ with Rosinski providing play-by-play. Reggie Walker serves as analyst. C-USA broadcast partners NFL Network and Stadium will broadcast the other two home games.

The Charlotte 49ers also receive significant coverage from their local media outlets, including *The Charlotte Observer*, which is the nation's 50th largest daily circulation. Local affiliates WBTV (CBS), WCNC (NBC), WSOC (ABC), Spectrum News, WCCB (Independent) and WJZY (FOX) also cover the 49ers in the nation's 22nd largest TV market. UNC Charlotte's student media provides regular coverage.

Charlotte hosts a weekly press conference from 12-1 each Tuesday during the season.
